Since the current boundaries were established in August of 1964, the Land Use Commission is about to reestablish these district boundaries. A meeting has been scheduled for July 8 at the Wilcox Elementary School Cafetorium at 7:00 p.m., Lihue, Kauai, to consider and enact the Kauai district boundaries. Since you requested and received a reclassification of your lands from Agricultural to Urban since the establishment of the permanent district boundaries in 1964, the Commission would like to receive a progress report on the development of this property before reclassifying the lands in the County of Kauai in the appropriate district. You may submit a written statement to the Commission or appear at the Land Use Commission meeting on July 8 at Lihue, Kauai, and present a verbal status report. 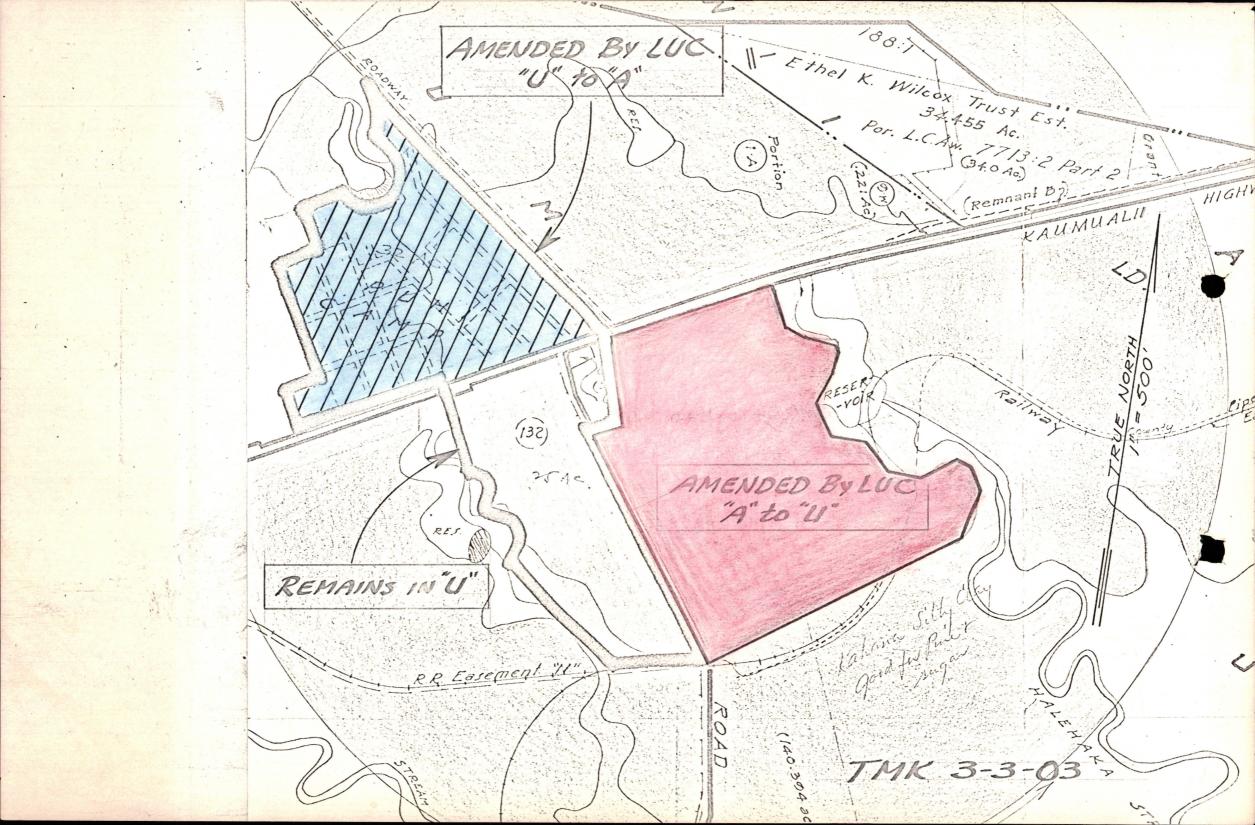

#### 1. Shimizu Associates, Inc. (A65-95)

A petition to change the district designation of certain lands at Waialae-Nui Valley, Oahu, from a Conservation to an Urban District, involving approximately 7 acres, was heard by this Commission on November 27, 1965. At that time, the staff noted that although the need for urban lands in the area was substantiated by the petitioner, the subdivision as designed would scar the topography extensively and unnecessarily and, therefore, approval of the petition should be considered only after redesign of the subdivision in order to minimize scarring.

Since that time the petitioner has submitted a revised grading plan which substantially improves the grading design. Therefore, it is recommended that 4.75 acres of the original 7 acres involved in this petition be approved for change from the Conservation District to an Urban District.

#### Lewers & Cooke Development Corp. (A65-99)

A public hearing was held on this petition, which involves a change in classification of approximately 25 acres of land at Puuloa, Oahu from an Agricultural District to an Urban District. During the public hearing held on December 17, 1965 and up to this date, the Commission has received no adverse comments on the petition.

In response to an inquiry from this Commission, Mr. E. C. Bryan, Vice President and Manager of Ewa Plantation Company, has commented as follows:

- 1. Ewa Plantation can use additional agricultural land if it is available at a reasonable purchase price or rental.
- 2. On the basis of the price paid for the parcel in question, a reasonable rate to the owner would require a rental rate in excess of what we could justify for agricultural uses.
- 3. We do not believe the land in question can be considered prime agricultural land under the terms or intent of the land use law.
- It would not be practical for Ewa to try to improve this land by the use of mill wastes or top soil since most of this material comes from Campbell Estate land and must be returned to Campbell Estate land.

On the basis of testimony received at the public hearing and from Ewa Plantation Company, the staff maintains its original recommendation for approval of the petition.

#### 3. Grove Farm Co., Inc. (Puhi) (A65-93)

During the public hearing held on November 27, 1965 on the subject petition, the staff recommended that the entire Puhi Camp Urban District be reclassified into an Agricultural District, and that the subject lands of the petition itself be reclassified from an Agricultural District into an Urban District, involving approximately 44 acres. Since that time, Grove Farm Co., Inc. has submitted a supplementary petition in support of the staff's recommendation.

Therefore, the staff maintains its original recommendation to:

- Reclassify the entire existing Puhi Camp urban area from the highway to the cemetery into an Agricultural District.
- Reclassify approximately 44 acres of agricultural lands immediately adjacent and on the Lihue side of the Puhi Post Office from an Agricultural District into an Urban District.

#### 4. Grove Farm Co., Inc. (Koloa) (A65-94)

A petition by Grove Farm Co., Inc. to reclassify approximately 8.5 acres of land presently within the Agricultural District to an Urban District at Koloa, Kauai was heard by the Land Use Commission on November 27, 1965.

The staff, at that time. recommended that the urban boundaries in the area be modified to fit the proposed subdivision, which would involve reclassification of approximately  $8\frac{1}{2}$  acres from an Agricultural District to an Urban District, and reclassification of approximately  $5\frac{1}{2}$  acres from an Urban District to an Agricultural District. This would result in a net increase to the Urban District of approximately 3 acres.

Since that time, the petitioners have modified their petition to conform with the staff's recommendation. Therefore, the staff maintains its original recommendation for approval of the petition.

#### STAFF REPORT

A65-93 - GROVE FARM COMPANY, INC. (PUHI)

#### Background

The Grove Farm Company, Inc. has submitted a petition to change the district designation of a portion of parcel 1, Tax Map Key 3-3-03 at Puhi, Kauai, from an Agricultural District to an Urban District. The subject portion involves approximately 44 acres immediately adjacent to the existing Urban District at Puhi. It is approximately two miles from the town of Lihue.

The petitioners have indicated that they intend to raze the present Puhi Village which is opposite the subject lands in order to plant the area to cane. Therefore, in order to relocate personnel presently living in Puhi Village, the additional urban area is needed.

The petitioners propose to initiate approximately half of the 44 acre portion for development immediately, with the remaining half to be developed as required. The subject lands are entirely planted in cane at present.

#### Analysis

The Kauai Planning and Traffic Commission has recommended approval of the peti-

- The proposed development will provide homesites for plantation employees in fee and will replace sub-standard plantation houses.
- The subdivision, as proposed, will be adjacent to the Urban District
  and would lend itself to the continuity of urban development and activities.

3. The proposed development will greatly help to eliminate sub-standard homes and further prevent the blighted conditions of the area.

4. To promote the health, safety and general welfare of the people in the community, the change in boundary should be granted.

Inspection of the present Puhi Village area has found that the residences are in an extremely dilapidated condition. These can be considered to be beyond reasonable repair or salvage. The residences are very small in floor area and considerably congested from the standpoint of land use density.

The existing streets in the Puhi Village area are in disrepair in addition to being narrow. Storm waters flow along the streets, through garages, through yards, and through other areas, generally without direction. Present conditions present an extreme fire hazard.

The present post office, service station, store, and park area are located on the opposite side of Puhi Village, with the main highway as a divider. Residents are forced to cross this high-speed highway to reach the community facilities. The Grove Farm office and shop area are located opposite Puhi Village also.

#### Recommendation

Puhi Village, without doubt, is a dilapidated residential area unfit for continued use as such. The need for additional urban lands can be justified by the need to replace the present Puhi Village. It is the petitioners' expressed intent to raze Puhi Village and to plant it to cane. Therefore, it is the staff's recommendation that the Commission reclassify the Puhi Village urban area to an agricultural area (upon consent of the petitioners to modify the original petition), and to grant the petitioners' request for an Urban District expansion of 44 acres immediately adjacent the present Puhi service station and post office area.

Dear Mr. Moriguchi:

We enclose a map of our proposed Puhi subdivision which is located in our canefield H-7 adjacent to our Puhi shops. We originally planned to raze and re-subdivide our Puhi Village, however, the personnel problems involved in moving people around and the cost problems in building new streets and water-lines, etc. in an old village were such that it is much to the benefit of our employees that we build a new subdivision in a new area. This would apply both in respect to cost and in the quality of the final subdivision layout.

We intend to raze the present village after the new subdivision is completed and will plant this area to cane. Our Field H-7 consists of an area of 44.22 acres. The area in our old Puhi Village, including the gardens and surrounding area above, which will be planted to cane, is approximately 49.6 acres, as indicated on the enclosed map.

The first phase of the new subdivision is outlined in red and we wish to proceed on this as soon as possible. The second phase will be the remainder of the area indicated and will remain in cane until demand is sufficient to add additional lots to the subdivision. It is quite possible that the area in question will remain in cane for many years as, at this point, we plan only to sell to employees.

We feel that a new subdivision in the area indicated will be a step in the right direction as our shops, our main hauling system, the community store and our employees will all be on the same side of the main cross-island highway.

We have discussed our Field 7 subdivision with Mr. Wong of the local Planning Commission and the County Engineering Department and have incorporated their suggestions in our final plan.

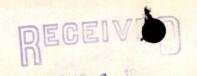
