ACTION PETITION BY HERBERT AND DOROTHY MIYAHARA (A68-196) TO RECLASSIFY 13 ACRES FROM AGRICULTURAL TO RURAL AT OMAO HOMESTEADS, KOLOA, KAUAI Mr. Leong informed the Commission of the location of the property under discussion on the district map and delivered the staff memorandum in which the staff again recommended that this petition be approved. (See copy of memo on file.) Directing his reply to Commissioner Kido, Mr. Leong reported that the area below the proposed Rural District is presently zoned agricultural. Staff has recommended that parcels 14 and 61 and several small parcels across the road from the subject property be considered for inclusion in the Omao Rural District when the district boundaries are reviewed in the near future. Mr. Leong then pointed out the location of parcels 14 and 61 on the map.

The petitioner did not wish to submit any further testimony. Therefore, Commissioner Kido moved that the Commission grant approval of the boundary amendment. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Inaba and was unanimously carried.

PETITION BY JOSEPH S. BRUN (A68-199) TO RECLASSIFY 6 ACRES FROM AGRICULTURAL TO URBAN AT KALAHEO HOMESTEADS, KOLOA, KAUAI

In the staff memorandum presented by Mr. Leong, the staff maintained its original recommendation for approval of Urban Districting the property under consideration.

Executive Officer, Mr. Duran, advised Commissioner Kido that should this request be approved, no conditions can be placed on the approval. The Commission only has the petitioner's word that he will cease to operate his slaughterhouse at such time as he develops his property. Once his property is placed in the Urban District, it will be the County of Kauai's responsibility to plan and zone the property for whatever use they deem appropriate.

Chairman Nishimura informed Commissioner Wung that the nearest slaughterhouse is located on Mr. Andrade's property approximately one mile away from Mr. Brun's slaughterhouse and is also situated in an Agricultural District. The location of this slaughterhouse was pointed out on the district map. It is situated in an Agricultural District and is not within proximity of an urban development. The urban boundary line would be about 3.000 feet away from the agricultural line.

Commissioner Wung was of the consensus that there is a definite need to protect slaughterhouses. In the event that this petition is approved and the petitioner razes his slaughterhouse to develop his property and should Mr. Andrade also decide to discontinue the operation of his slaughterhouse, there will be no slaughterhouse in the area.

Frances Suelto representing the petitioner, Mr. Brun, apprised Chairman Nishimura that she had no idea when Mr. Brun will develop his property.

When questioned by Mr. Duran as to whether or not there is a need for slaughterhouses on Kauai at present, Frances Suelto stated that there are presently three slaughterhouses on the island. The petitioner is the only proprietor of a slaughterhouse on Kauai that slaughters both cattle and hogs.

The petition submitted by Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Miyahara for a boundary change from Agriculture to Rural was heard on October 18, 1968. The property consists of 6 parcels totaling approximately 13 acres. The soil is classified "D", poor, except for a narrow portion bordering the road which is classified "B", good.

The staff and Kauai County both recommended the petition be approved. In addition, the staff recommended that parcels 14 and 61, TMK 2-7-06 and several small parcels across the road from the subject property be considered for inclusion in the Omao Rural District when the district boundaries are reviewed in the near future. The extension of the zone southward would then include all the existing rural developments on both sides of the road and the subject property into one contiguous district which is already served by a fairly high standard road and the necessary utilities.

Chairman Burns called the meeting to order and swore in persons wishing to testify at the hearing.

HEARINGS

PETITION BY HERBERT AND DOROTHY MIYAHARA (A68-196) TO RECLASSIFY 13 ACRES FROM AGRICULTURAL TO URBAN AT OMAO HOMESTEADS, KOLOA, KAUAI

Staff's recommendation to approve this request was presented by Mr. Leong on the basis that the extent of existing rural-type developments beyond the present Omao Rural District and the restriction on development imposed by Omao and Poeleele Streams to the east and west lead to the conclusion that the Omao Rural District should extend southward to include the existing rural developments adjacent to the subject property. (See copy of report on file.) In addition, it was recommended by the staff that parcels 14 and 61 (TMK 2-7-06: 14 and 61 - 2.846 acres) and the small parcels across the road from the subject property be considered for inclusion in the Omao Rural District when the district boundaries are reviewed in the near future.

October 18, 1968

In reply to Chairman Burns' question regarding the ownership of TMK 2-7-06: 14, Mr. Leong replied that parcel 14 is owned by Mr. and Mrs. Charles H. McAlister and that parcel 61 is owned by the Yamamoto family. Mr. Leong also stated that neither the owners of parcel 14 or 61 have indicated any interest in the rezoning of their land.

Pursuant to Commissioner Murakami's inquiry as to the approximate slopes of the property in question, Mr. Leong stated that roughly 50% of the subject property contains slopes of approximately 21 to 35%.

Since there was no further testimony, the hearing was closed.

PETITION BY JOSEPH S. BRUN (A68-199) TO RECLASSIFY 6 ACRES FROM AGRICULTURAL TO URBAN AT KALAHEO, KAUAI

Executive Officer, Mr. Duran, gave a detailed account of the property in question and also of the surrounding areas.

On the basis that the property in question abuts the Kalaheo Urban District; is poorly suited for agricultural use; and since it was proposed for inclusion within the Urban District when the "final" district boundaries were being considered in 1964, the staff recommended that this petition be approved.

The petitioner, Mr. Brun, reported that at the present time he has no plans to discontinue the operation of the slaughterhouse.

Mr. Brian Nishimoto, Director of the Kauai County Planning & Traffic Commission, informed the Land Use Commission that in the event that Mr. Brun subdivides his property in whole or if the County considers the slaughterhouse to be a nuisance factor, Mr. Brun will be required to raze his slaughterhouse.

Commissioner Murakami related his understanding of the matter that should the petitioner sell all of the lots on his property, he would not have to rid himself of the slaughterhouse.

Mr. Nishimoto replied that the slaughterhouse is to be removed if the petitioner decides to subdivide his property.

Mr. Duran announced that the staff was in receipt of a letter from Mr. Brun in regard to the specific use of his land. The letter from Mr. Brun dated October 14, 1968, and read by Mr. Duran stated in part:

A petition has been submitted by Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Miyahara to amend the district boundaries from Agricultural to Rural for approximately 13 acres of land situated at Omao Homesteads, Koloa, Kauai, involving parcels 12, 13, 32, 33, 71, and 75 of TMK 2-7-06.

In justification of their request, the petitioners submit that:

- The lots listed above are contiguous parcels which are not used for agricultural purposes and which immediately abut the Omao Rural District.
- The primary reason for rezoning the land is that they desire to build some rental units to satisfy the big demand for such units in West Kauai.
- 3. Conditions and trends of development at Omao have changed since many new homes have been constructed in recent years and that Omao is now considered more as a residential than an agricultural area.

County Recommendation

At a meeting held on August 8, 1968, the Kauai Planning & Traffic Commission accepted the recommendations of the

Planning Director and voted to recommend approval of the petition.

The comments and recommendations of the Kauai Planning
Director are as follows:

"The staff finds the area reasonable for low density residential use. The area abuts an existing Rural District and the desired use is compatible to the existing uses in the immediate neighborhood.

The staff therefore recommends approval of the subject petition. In addition, the staff recommends that the State Land Use Commission consider placing the properties (TMK 2-7-06: 14 and 61 - 2.846 ac.) between Omao Road and the Miyahara properties into the rural designation to prevent isolating an Agricultural District within a Rural District."

The existing Omao Rural District extends southward from Kaumualii Highway to the land under consideration. However, the pattern of land development to the east and west is restricted by the Omao and Poeleele Streams, respectively. Principal land uses within the confines of these streams are rural-type developments and agricultural pursuits involving mostly pasturelands. The subject property is vacant with the exception of an old dwelling which has been vacated and a new one which is being constructed. The urban center of Koloa is approximately 1 mile to the southeast of the property.

Most of the subject land is classified "D" by the Land Study Bureau, indicating "poor" suitability for overall agricultural use. These lands are poorly suited for machine

tillage, are non-stony, deep and well drained, and contain slopes of 21 to 35%. A narrow strip of the property bordering Omao Road is rated "B" or "good" for agricultural use and is characterized by deep, non-stony, well drained soils with 0-10% slopes. Rainfall in the area approximates 56 inches annually. Basic utilities are available with the exception of sewers.

Analysis

The extent of existing rural-type developments beyond the present Omao Rural District and the restriction on development imposed by the two streams to the east and west readily lead to the conclusion that the Omao Rural District should extend southward to include the existing rural developments adjacent to the subject property. Such a configuration of the Rural District would merely embrace all rural developments to date into one contiguous district which is presently served by a fairly high standard road and the necessary utilities. The result would not be one of contributing to scattered developments with resultant high costs to government but instead would effect a consolidation of existing rural-type developments. A reasonable and logical land use pattern would include the 6 parcels under petition within the Rural District in addition to the parcels already in rural use presently situated in the Agricultural District.

BACKGROUND:

The subject properties are a portion of Omao Homesteads and are situated approximately 3,900 feet southeast of the centerline intersection of Kaumualii Highway and Oamo Road.

Land Use survey conducted in 1959 and 1960 for this area indicates the following:

Both State Land Use Commission interim boundaries established on April 21, 1962, and the final amended boundaries established on August 23,1964, classified this subject area in agricultural status. Petitioners Reasons for Requesting Boundary Change: (See reasons attached).

ANALYSIS:

Master Plan Designations:

The County General Plan indicates that the area in question will fall within a residential classification in the future.

The proposed comprehensive zoning map indicates agricultural classification as established on August 23, 1964, by the State Land Use Commission.

Public Facilities:

Water Supply: The main water source feeding the Omao area is a well located in the Lawai area, on the south boundary of Kaumualii Highway, approximately 1,950 feet east of the centerline intersection with Koloa Road. The main line along Kaumualii Highway to Omao Road is an 8-inch C.I. pipe. A 6-inch C.I. pipe runs along Omao Road to the area in question.

Sanitary Sewerage Disposal: With the absence of a sewer system in the Omao area, all sewage and waste disposal method must adhere to the Department of Health standards and regulations.

Public Roadway and Drainage: Omao Road which serves the subject lots is a Type "I" road with a right-of-way of 30 feet and pavement width of 18 feet.

Topography:
Topography of the area varies. Slopes range from 0% to 10%; in some areas 21% to 35%.

Land Type:
The subject area has soil classification productivity rating of B-24 and D-80.

B-24 are lands that are well suited for machine tillability, non-stony, deep soil (over 30"), with slopes of 0% to 10%, moderately fine soil, well drained, with median annual rainfall of 50-75 inches, generally at elevation of about 200-750 feet, with reddish brown color soil, and of the "Kalaheo" soil series.

D-80 are non-irrigated lands poorly suited for machine tillability, non-stony, deep soil (over 30"), with slopes of 21-35%, moderately fine soil, well drained, with median annual rainfall of 50-75 inches, very dark brown to brown color soil, generally at elevation of about 150-500 feet, and of the "Puhi" soil series.

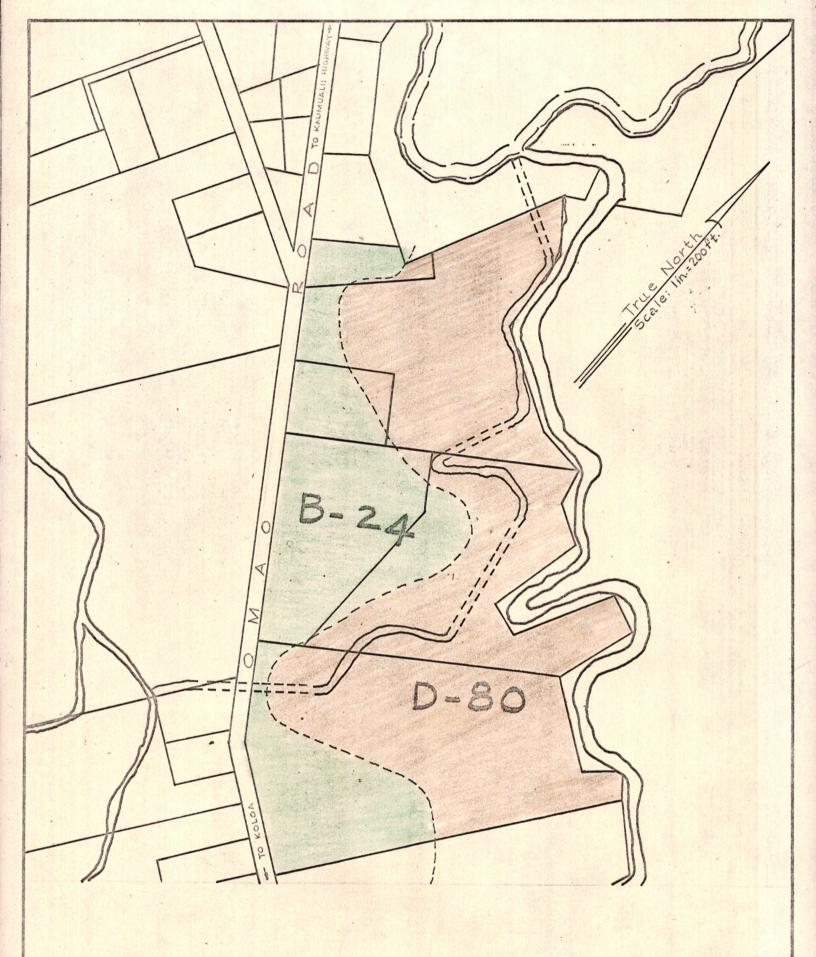

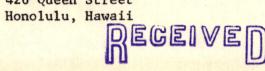

Petitioner's reason for requesting boundary change:

The above land are contiguous parcels and they adjoin the "Rural" boundary in Omao. The land is not being used for agriculture and I believe it conforms with the standards for rural classification. The immediate surrounding areas of this property is being used mostly for residential purposes.

The primary reason for rezoning this land is because I am hoping to build some rental units on parcel 75 and 32. A new dwelling is now being built on parcel 32; there is also an old dwelling on this same lot which cannot be used for rental purposes unless the land is rezoned. Since the former tenants of this old dwelling moved out in April, I have had at least 15 requests to rent this building. Depending on financing, I am planning to build 2 new rental units on parcel 75 within a year and 2 more later on.

- (1) The subject property is needed for use other than agriculture, mainly for low density residential lots. Due to the big demand for rental units in West Kauai, the land can be of better use for residential purposes than for agriculture.
- (2) (b) Conditions and trends of development have changed since adoption of the present classification. Many new homes have been built in Omao in the past few years. It is now considered more as a residential area than agricultural. The proposed classification is reasonable since the land has not been used for agricultural purposes for many years.
