The Ahupuaa of Holualoa 1st District of North Kona
Island of Hawaii 3d J.C.

On this 11th day of August A.D. 1873 the Commission of Boundaris for the 3d J.C. met at Kailua North Kona Hawaii for the hearing of the application of J.O Dominis acting for J. Kekuanaoa for the settlement of the boundaries of Holualoa 1st situated in North Kona Hawaii. Notice to all parties interested in the settlement of boundaries of lands, in North and South Kona Hawaii, that the Commissioner of Boundaries for the 3d J.C. would be prepared to receive applications for the settlement of boundaries of lands in said Districts at the Court House in Kona on August 2nd A.D. 1873 served by publication in the Hawaiian Gazette of July 16 and Kuokoa of July 19th 1873 and adjourned till the 11 instant at Kailua. Due notice personally served on owners or Agents of adjoining lands as far as known. Present J.G. Hoapili for applicant and Hawaiian Government and Nakapaalani k. for owners of Pupuaa.

Testimony

Keliikanakaole k. Sworn

I was born at Holualoa North Kona Hawaii at the time or building Kiholo. Have always lived there and know the boundaris of Holualoalst

Holualoa 1st joins Kaumalunalu at Kahiika's large ohia trees covered with ie on the old road between Kaumalumu and Holualoa I have often been there, catching birds; know a place called mawaiwai, it is on Holualoa 2d. From Kahiihii the boundary between these two lands runs mauka, along the old trail to Kalokau, a pali and kulana kauhale kauwilimanu, thence to Kauoa a kulana kauhale (bird catchers houses) Kanoa is between Kahaluu and Kaumalumu, (a place where a fire was set, and kept burning) from whence it took its name, this is another place of same name.

Thence mauka along old trail to Kalaenaia where Naia trees are growing, in Koa wood
 Thence to Huaikaumaina, a kualapa, from which a big tree was taken, where Kau-
 malumalu is cut off by Keauhou 2, thence the mauka boundary of the land of Holualoa
 runs mauka along Keauhou 2nd to ke apiipii, to where apiipii grows. The aa is on
 Keauhou Thence towards Hualalai along Keauhou to Puulalaa, a hill covered with
 trees. On the North side of this hill comes the land of Honuaua, on the makai side
 Puaa. Thence turn makai along Puaa, rather towards the South to Kahawai, where
 water flows in wet weather, Then is a small water fall and bathing place at the
 junction. Thence along the Kahawai to Palule, the boundary following up the centre
 of gulch; Palule is the place where we used to saw lumber here the boundary leaves
 the gulch and runs makai to Puuokaloa, the boundary running along the edge of gulch
 to said pali, Thence makai to Waikee where the gulch turns to the west. the land
 of Waiaha joins Holualoa a little makai of Puuokaloa to Waikee, when the land of
 Kahalui 2nd corners on Holualoa and the boundary runs South to Pohaku o kahano the
 mauka corner of Puapuaa. This is in fern below the edge of the woods, a few rocks
 a sort of ahua. Thence makai along iwi aina to the mauka Government road, to a
 place called Kauhiahulu, Thence makai to Pahoa a kulana kauhale, makai of a bread
 fruit grove, Thence makai to oiaina Puupelu a grove of kukui trees, above Gov
 Adam's wall, Thence makai following an iwi aina to a place at shore called Kuapae,
 a rocky point in the sea, with sand each side of it. The boundary at shore between
 Puapuaa and Holualoa 1st Ancient fishing rights extending out to Sea.

Kaumalumalu and Holualoa, do not reach out to the mawae above Hiinau Kei a water
 hole is near Hiinau also a cave where my parents used to live when they caught
 birds on Keauhou.

Ohihi k. Sworn

I was born at Kikaha North Kona Hawaii at the time of Kiholo, and have lived at
 Holualoa from the time I was small to the present time. Know the place in the woods
 called Kahiihiie it is the junction of Kaumalumalu and Holualoa 1st Thence the
 boundary runs mauka along old trail to Kalokau, a grove of banana trees on a pali,

Thence to Kanoa, an old kauhale kaauwilimanu, Thence to Kalaenaia an ahua and
kualapa, Thence to Kuaikaumauma a kualapa, Thence to Apiipii where Keauhou 2 cuts
these lands off. From thence the boundary turns North to Puulalaau Keauhou cuts
Kaumalumalu off at Puaiki and from thence Huaikaumaumu and boundary of this &
Keauhou run up in the middle to Hiinau This is what the bird catchers say, as I
hear now. Kaumalumalu runs to Pukaika and Huaikaumauma. Holualoa runs along Kea
from Apiipii to Puulalaau, Puaa corners there on the boundary of Keauhou and Holu
loa, and Holualoa turns makai to the kahawai and the boundary follows along the
land of Puaa, along the centre of gulch to Palule, the mauka corner of Kahului,
thence along to Puu-o-kaloa, a puu, thence to Waikee where the gulch turns and Pua
puaa corners, Thence along to Pohakuhanu, the mauka corner of Puapuaa in the fern
below the woods, thence along Puapuaa to the iwi aina; on the Government road,
thence makai to Pahoa a kuleana kauhale, thence makai to Puuopelu an oiaina Kukui
Thence makai along the iwi aina to Kuapae a puu pahoehoe with sand on Kailua side
and sea on the makai side Ancient fishing rights extending out to sea.

I live at Holualoa. have heard from my brother about the line being surveyed be-
tween Puapuaa and Holualoa. I do not know the name of the person who surveyed it
but it was the same person who surveyed Kauaima's Lands. The name of my brother
was Halinapaa (now dead) He said they run the line from shore. They went up on
Puukekoi on Kahului 2nd sighted to boundaries. Heard that the chain was taken
along the boundary towards the shore to Kualapa. There is said to be a stone buried
on the boundary there.

Testimony

Keliikanakaole k. Sworn (Same witness as on Holualoa 1st)

I know the boundaries of Holualoa 2nd. Napali, Kanakaoka and another bird catcher told them to me; and afterwards I went into the woods and saw them. I know where the mauka corner of Pilipa's land is, it is on Holualoa 3rd adjoining Holualoa 2nd at Puupueo a hill with koa trees. one of these trees is marked but I do not remember the mark. I went with the surveying party when the land was surveyed. This place Puupueo is in the woods, from thence the boundary runs mauka to Ipiipii, a deep hole, where Holualoa 2 is cut off by Holualoa 1st. thence along Holualoa 1st to Keakuamakela a water hole and heiau in the woods. the mauka corner of Ili aina Laua 1st Government Ili. Thence along Laua 1st (It is a long distance from Apiipii to the water hole in a bee line towards Kohala). Thence makai along Laua 1st to Hoeo, said place being in a banana grove (John Davis land on Laua 1st reaches a

little mauka of Hooe. thence makai along the land of John Davis, to a water hole called Makapailu, thence along an iwi aina to the Government road and thence along the land of Kahihoku's. Thence the boundary makes a crook, at a place called Umilolele a bread fruit and Puuhala tree grove, and the junction of Holualoa 1st and Holualoa 2nd thence to Kukuihalou where Holualoa 1st leaves Holualoa 2nd a kukui grove and Laua 1st bounds it said place is a kukui grove thence from the kukui grove the boundary runs along Laua 1st, along an iwi aina to Hananai a pali with a grave. thence to Paoki Governor Adams big wall at junction of Lelea's Land.

Ihiihi k. Sworn (Same witness as on Holualoa 1st)

I know the boundaries of Holualoa 2nd Old kamaainas (now dead) pointed out the iwi aina to me. know the mauka corner of Pilipas land in Holualoa 3rd adjoining Holualoa 2nd. It is at Puupueo a hill covered with koa trees on the edge of the woods I went with the surveying party and saw the land surveyed One of the trees on the boundary was cut into Thence the boundary runs mauka along the Government portion of Holualoa 3rd to Ipiipii a round deep hole not very large around at which place Holualoa 2nd is cut off by Holualoa 1st thence along Holualoa 1st towards Hualalai to Keakuamakela, the mauka corner of Kailihewa's land. (Kailihewa is the wife of John Davis) thence makai along land sold to Hooe, a banana grove, thence to Makapailu, a water hole, thence along an iwi aina to the Government road. Thence along Kahihoku's land to Umilolele, the junction of Holualoa 1st with Holualoa 2nd, thence along said land to Kuikuihalou, where the lele of Laua 1st comes between Holualoa 1st and Holualoa 2nd Thence along the Government Ili, Laua 1st the boundary following the iwi aina to Paoki, a big wall, at the mauka corner of Lelea's Land From thence along Lelea's Land to Sea Shore.

Testimony

Kea k. Sworn

I was born at Holualoa 4th North Kona Hawaii at the time of Ka Oku, have always lived there and am a kamaaina of the land my parents (now dead) who were also kamaainas pointed out the boundaries to me, at that time all lands had different konohiki. Kaumalumalu bounds Holualoa 4th on the South side. the sea on the makai side. Ancient fishing rights extending out to where it is hard to see bottom. Commencing at the sea shore, the boundary between Kaumalumalu and Holualoa 4th is at a large mound of pahoehoe called hopieilua, thence the boundary between these lands runs mauka along an iwi aina to Kamuku, a large puuhala tree, the trunk of the tree being on Holualoa, thence mauka to Puu-o-Holualoa kihapai koele mauka of the mauka Government road, Thence mauka to Leihia a small hill, thence to Kahiihia

some large ohia trees where Holualoa 4th is cut off by Holualoa 1st and Kaumalumalu the boundary at the mauka Government road between Holualoa 3rd and Holualoa 4th is at Puuhonua a place which was formerly called Kukuilauliihi on the mauka side of the Government road. This is as far as I know the boundaries

The Kaheka is dry, Napililua; Kahuapilo is the name of the wall on the mauka side of the Government road. Kalau o naniu is in Holualoa some way from the boundary. The iwi aina from Gov Adama road, mauka, is very distinct.

Kaoiwi k. Sworn

I was born at Holualoa North Kona Hawaii at the time of the death of Haahana, and have always lived there. my adopted parents Mooliole (now dead) pointed out the boundary at shore between Kaumalumalu and Holualoa 4th said place is a puu pahoehoe, thence the boundary runs mauka to Kamuku a puuhala, on iwi aina from makai running on the South side of the tree thence along the iwi aina to South side of Laia, thence, the boundary still following the iwi aina, to Puu o Holualoa, a kihapai the iwi aina being on the South side, thence to Lehia a hill near the woods, thence to Kahiihie, a grove of ohia trees a short distance inside of the woods where Kaumalumalu and Holualoa 1st cut off Holualoa 4th The mauka corner of Pilipo's land is on a huli pali, Maialoa on Holualoa 3rd. I have heard of a place called Kanuikauwaa, it is opposite to Kahiihia, where Holualoa 2nd ends.

Keliikanakaole k. Sworn

I was born at Holualoa North Kona Hawaii at the time of building Kiholo. have always lived there and am kamaaina of the land and its boundaries. my uncle (now dead) pointed them out to me, another kamaaina Kanakaokae a bird catcher also pointed out the boundaries to me. I did not go up then as I was too young but afterwards I went bird catching myself and saw the boundaries. Know Pilipo's land, it is at the mauka corner adjoining Holualoa 4th said land is at Nalapa a banana grove in the edge of

the woods, thence the boundary runs mauka to Maialoa above grove of banana trees where Holualoa 1st on North of land cuts it off and runs across the head to Kahiihiia, where Holualoa joins Kaumalumalu. Maialoa is some distance mauka of Nalapa. C.X.^d

This land does not run very far into the woods a man standing at the corner of Pilipo's land can hear a man shout at Maialoa.



Kea k. Recalled

I went and made a road before Wiltse surveyed the land, we went up to Kahiihiia, and then across to a huli pali at the head of Holualoa 2nd. I did not go up with Wiltse but my brother Kulou pointed out the boundaries to them.



P. Bright Sworn

I acted as interpreter for Mr. Wiltse, when he surveyed the line between Holualoa and Kaumalumalu Kulou pointed out the boundaries and I told Wiltse the names, and he wrote them down. I do not remember the names of the points. Think I might recollect some of the,, if I heard the, the line was run as pointed out by kamaaina. C.X.^d
