DR21-73 Honoipu Hideway, LLC, (Civil Case 3CCV-22-0000088).

Dwight J. Vicente representing the Sovereignty of the 1840 Hawaiian Kingdom Constitution and the 1848 Mahale (Kanaka Land Trust). The January 17, 1893 Queen LiLiukalani's Protest Against Nefarious U. S. Minister Stevens, this has yet to make its way to the U.S. Supreme Court, Article 3 Sec. 2 Clause 2. Do this Jurisdiction Under Protest.

History; The 1840 Hawaiian Kingdom Constitution created a civilized government. In 1848 the Mahale created the Kanaka Land Trust under the Hawaiian Kingdom jurisdiction of over 4.2 million acres of what was to be titled Crown and Government Lands. These Lands were Leased to generate revenue to support this Kingdom. These Lands were to be Leased under Common Law. In 1890 under King Kalakaua, he leased over 2.2 million acres of Crown and Government Lands for 30 years, From 1890 to 1920. It is my understanding that these Lands are the Lands that were under King Kalakau's 30 year Lease. Therefore fall under the jurisdiction of the Hawaiian Kingdom.

The 1875 Reciprocity Proclamation/Northwest Ordinance July 1787 was done by three U.S. Citizens Fish, Allen and Carter in D.C.. This is Not a Treaty. This was to apply the Northwest Ordinance directly to the colonization of this Kingdom without an amendment to the Northwest Ordinance and To the Sept. 17, 1787 U.S. Constitution Article 4 Sec.3 Clause 2, (Marbury v. Madison), (Downs v. Bidwell), (Sai v. Obama), (Sai v. Trump),(New York State Rifle & Pistol Association v. Bruen). The legitimacy of the 1959 Admissions Act Hawaiian Homes/equal footing State of Hawaii, (State v. Jim 2004) the State of Hawaii Supreme Court Ruling that limited the State of Hawaii jurisdiction to the 1898 Joint Resolution Ceded Crown and Government Lands 1.750 million acres of Crown and Government Lands.

As stated herein No Action to be taken in DR21-73 Honoipu Hideway for lack of jurisdiction to these Lands.
