

Submitted herewith is a report with comments on an application submitted by Mr. Robert Y. Hawamura to the State Land Use Commission for special permit to relocate ten single-family dwellings onto two parcels of land totaling approximately 4 acres within the Agricultural District, at Anahola, County of Kauai.

Tax Parcel 50 as shown on Tax Map Key 4-8-11 is situated along the East side of the new Kuhio Highway approximately 300 feet Southeast of the Anahola Post Office and South of a 40 foot Drainage Canal in the town of Anahola, having an area of 1.171 acres with two single-family dwellings and related accessory buildings located on filled area of the lot.

Tax Parcel 27 as shown on Tax Map Key 4-9-04 is situated along the South of Aliomanu Road in proximity to Aliomanu Bay at Anahola, being portion of Molosa Hui Lands. The property is vacant and at a low elevation but with some filling of the low spots it could be utilized to a good advantage for proposed use.

Both parcels involved are non-productive agricultural lands and do not possess significant capacity for agricultural production present or future and yet have rural and suburban characteristics.

To promote the general welfare of the areas and encourage an appropriate use of land, it is recommended that the application be granted as requested, subject to the various regulations of the County of Kauai.

Reference: Public hearing 3 January 1963, Kauai County Board Room, conducted by Mr. Mike Mullahey regarding the request of Robert Mamamura, Anahola, Kauai, for a special permit to relocate ten houses from Moleaa to two parcels of land in Anahola.

Although I represented Miss Jahne Hupy (Ref. no. LUC 284, 308) at the hearing. I also speke on my own behalf and herewith submit in writing my comments.

As I understand it, Miss Hupy requested that Mr. Hamamura's request for a special permit be considered in two sections: (1) 1.18 acres on Kuhio Highway in Anahola and (2) 3.00 acres in Aliomanu, on the basis that there is already a water shortage for the present residents in the area (2-Aliomanu) without further taxing the antiquated water line.

In addition to the above, I feel that the two areas under question differ greatly and that one permit for both areas is not, at this time, in the best interests of the residents, present and/or projected. From the 1.18 acres on Kuhio Highway (6 houses) (1) residents can walk to the store and post office, (2) children can walk to school or be picked up by bus, (3) working persons can 'catch a ride' to work right outside their fromt doors, and (4) all families in this area have adequate water due to the large water main running along the highway.

But for the Aliemanu area (4 houses projected), none of the above four points hold true, as it is an isolated area and now has inadequate water for the present year-round residents.

As stated at the hearing by Morris Shinsate, attorney for Mr. Hamamura, there are less than six families left in Moloaa Camp that require housing and thet Mr. Hamamura has purchased only five houses. With these statements in mind, it would appear that the section of the request by Mr. Hamamura for a special permit to place four (or 3 or 2) houses in Aliomanu is, in effect, not necessary at all; and that should be in the future wish to place multiple housing in this area, that he could then comply with the rules and regulations in effect at that time.

I respectfully reiterate my request that Anahola and Aliomanu not be treated as similar areas and that the overall planning of the area in Aliemanu development be considered. Thank you.

There are 4 dwellings on this parcel of land. With the addition of 4 dwellings it would make a total of 8 dwellings, which in the opinion of the field staff may create a sewage disposal problem. The subsoil is not good for the construction of cesspool for the disposal of domestic sewage.

A(T) 62-21 Cadinha Investment Company 8-7-03: 10

Change from an Agricultural district to an Urban district designation.

Water table is about 5 feet below ground elevation. Cesspool construction is feasible. This area is located near a dairy farm and two large commercial poultry farms. These two uses are not compatible with residential use.

Lualualei, Oahu

A(T) 62-17 Joe Drake, Et. Al. 8-7-22: 2, 3, 5-11, Change from an Agricultural district 13 and 14 to an Urban district classification.

Subsoil formation is suitable for cesspool construction.

No health and sanitation implications should develop if the following conditions are complied with by the applicant:

Reference: The request of Robert Hamamura, Anahola, Kauai, for special permission through a variance in the interim regulations to: (1) lecate six homes on a 1.18 acre parcel of agricultural land on Kuhie Highway and (2) locate four homes on a three acre parcel of agricultural land in Aliomanu.

Regarding item (1): ne comment.

Regarding item (2): We respectfully request you consider as a separate matter the relocation of four Moleaa houses into the Aliomanu area:

A. This area is more isolated (than the area in item (1), the read is undeveloped and at times becomes almost impassible;

B. The water line is so old and so small that even the present homes have difficulty at times obtaining sufficient water:

1. one user on the line had to buy a wooden tank (which fills at night) in order to have enough water,

2. we have had to carry water from friends homes three times in the past year due to line breakage and washouts,

3. it is often difficult to wash clothes and run bath er shower water at the same time,

4. toilets sometimes flush incompletely from lack of water in the tank - thus creating a possible health problem if more houses were to be added,

5. there is no fire hydrant of any type.

C. Subdivision of property in this area has previously been rejected because of lack of sufficient water - and no change has occurred in this water line since that rejection;

D. The single rural Hawaiian Telephone Company line into Aliomanu is already leaded and service to additional homes in this isolated area might not be possible immediately;

E. All home owners in Aliomanu using electricity have signed an agreement with Kauai Electric in conjunction with approval of the Public Utilities Commission, to pay a minimum of \$15.00 per month for five years to help underwrite the cost of putting in this line all the way from Kuhio Highway.

Thank you for your consideration of this matter.






