STAFF REPORT

SP71-97 - HAWAIIAN TELEPHONE COMPANY (Pahoa, Puna, Hawaii)

A special permit request to allow the expansion of an existing communications equipment building situated within the State's Agricultural District at Pahoa, Puna, Hawaii, has been submitted by the Hawaiian Telephone Company. The property is described as TMK 1-5-02: 18, comprising 1.05 acres.

A 5,500 square foot portion of the subject parcel is situated within the Pahoa Urban District. However, the remaining 40,000 square foot portion, which was acquired by the petitioner in May, 1970, and containing the existing communications building, is situated within the Agricultural District. Abutting the east boundary of the lot is the Pahoa Fire Station. Other land uses in the adjacent Urban District are commercial and residential developments.

The petitioner has submitted a statement indicating that:

1. Under Section 2.14 (g) of the State Land Use District Regulations, "Public, private, and quasi-public utility lines, transformer stations, etc., and appurtenant small buildings . . ." are permitted within the Agricultural District.

- However, the size of the proposed structure requires a special permit.
- 2. Presently existing on the site are a mobile communications van, a transmission tower, and a 260 square foot communications building. The communications building will be expanded by another 2,025 square feet to serve present and future needs of the community. The expansion will also permit the removal of the mobile van.
- 3. There will be no detrimental effect on surrounding properties, as only maintenance personnel will visit the site occasionally. Traffic will also be minimal. The building will be one story only, and future expansion may be required beyond 1990.
- 4. Service and economic penalties will be incurred by the public should existing facilities be required to be relocated. It is noted that the subject site falls within the "economic wire center"—an area where service can be most economically discharged.
- 5. Approval of the request would not be contrary to State or County plans. As recommended by

the Land Use Commission staff, the petitioner will eventually apply to rezone the parcel from Agricultural to Urban.

Land Study Bureau classification indicates that the soil is poorly suited for agricultural use and located in an area where the rainfall ranges between 125 to 175 inches annually.

County Recommendation

At its March 18, 1971, meeting, the Hawaii County Planning Commission decided to recommend approval of this special permit based on the following:

- "1. That the proposed use will make the use of the land involved for the public welfare by providing an essential service to residents of the area.
- "2. That the use would not unreasonably burden public agencies to provide essential services."

Approval by the County is subject to the following conditions:

- "1. That the area be extensively landscaped.
- "2. That all other applicable regulations shall be complied with.
- "3. That construction shall begin within one year of the date of approval, should the

State Land Use Commission grant such, or the special permit shall be deemed null and void."

The staff finds that the request substantially meets the State guidelines established in the/Land Use District Regulations for determining an "unusual and reasonable use" within the Agricultural District.

It is therefore recommended that the special permit be approved subject to the County's conditions.

CHANGE OF ZONE RICHARD SMART/BOISE CASCADE RECREATION COMMUNITIES

A discussion followed on the pending application of Richard Smart and Boise Cascade Recreation Communities for a change in zoning of approximately 504 acres of land located

in the Anaehoomalu Bay area in South Kohala from Open to Resort, Multiple Family Residential and Village Commercial.

The Chairman called for background information.

The Staff Planner gave a review of the background information as presented at the public hearing of the last meeting. The Commission had deferged action for further negotiations on the second incremental zoning proposed/the applicant.

Mr. Veriato requested for staff recommendation.

- The proposed land use designations conform to the General Plan of the area.

During the 1969 five-year boundaries amendment, this area was proposed for a change from Agriculture to Urban. However, many of the residents in the area petitioned the State Land Use Commission to request that the area retain its Agricultural designation. - 3. The essential utilities are located within close proximity of the subject area.

It was moved by Mr. Veriato, seconded by Mr. Nagata and approved unanimously that the change in boundaries be recommended for approval based on Staff's recommendation.

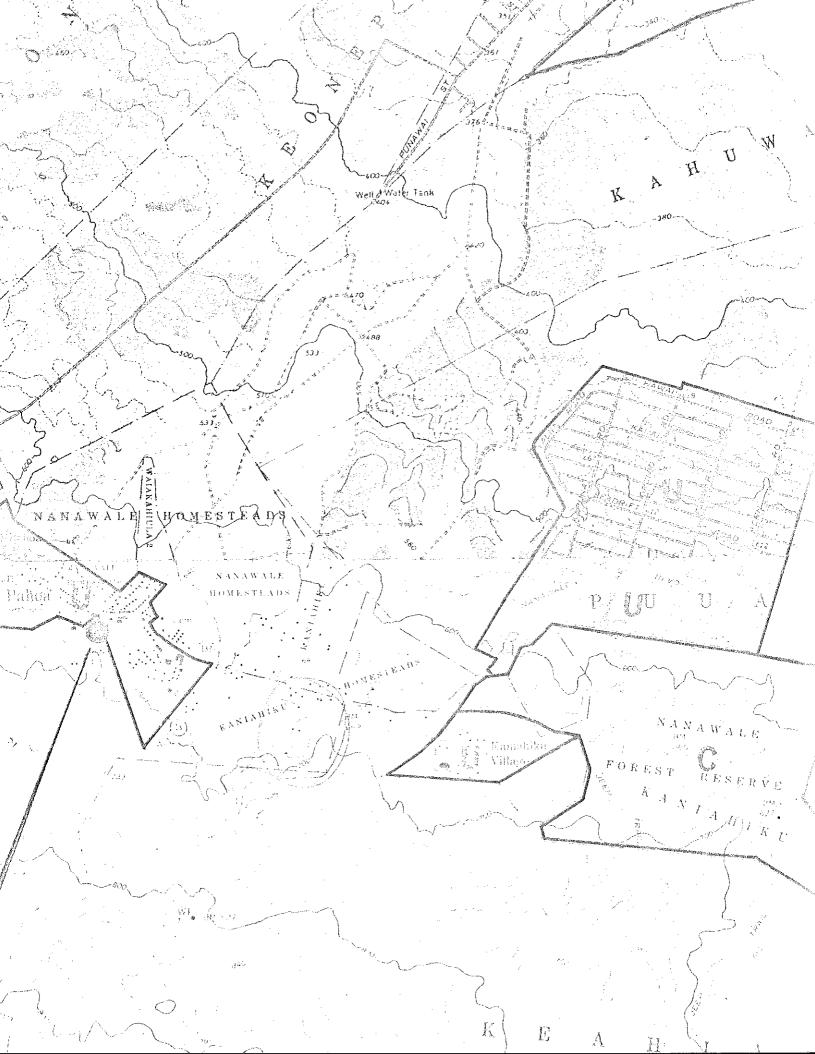

Hawaiian Telephone Company has existing on the subject parcel a mobile communications van, a transmission tower, and a 260 square feet communications building. We need to use the existing facilities and to expand the communications equipment building to provide the Pahoa residents with telephone and communication services. The present mobile van is inadequate to serve the needs of the community and the equipment to be installed in the proposed structure will replace the van plus provide for future growth of the community. "2. There should be no detrimental effect on the intent of the land usage as the building is occupied by equipment and the only personnel on the premises will be those who will install the equipment and others who will occasionally maintain the equipment. In addition, the first 177 feet (depth) of our property is zoned (CV) Village Commercial and our structure will be located only approximately 15 feet away from the (CV) Village Commercial boundary. With our minimal traffic there should be no detrimental effect on the surrounding properties which are zoned either commercial or residential. "The building will be one story high and measure approximately 45 feet by 45 feet or a total of 2,025 square feet of floor area. See attachment A. Our forecasted figures show that we will require another addition sometime beyond 1990. Service and economic penalties would be incurred to duplicate and relocate the existing facilities elsewhere. Service to the subscribers would be affected in that the delay to duplicate the facilities will necessitate a restriction of phone service until adequate facilities are constructed and installed. In addition the location of this communications equipment building falls within the 'economic wire center.' Any other location would also cause economic penalties. In other words, we can serve the Pahoa residents most economically from the proposed site thus benefiting the public. "4. Granting of a special use permit will not be contrary to State or County plans. The State Land Use designation is Agricultural for the parcel and under its - 2 -

regulations, a communications equipment building is a permissive use. However, our structure is of substantial size to require a special use permit.

"The Hawaii County General Plan designates the area as Public Use. Granting of a special use permit will not be contrary to the County plans because the Hawaii County Ordinances permit public utilities under any zoned designations.

"Per recommendation of the State Land Use Staff, Hawaiian Telephone Company will eventually apply to redesignate the subject parcel within the urban district. However, during this transition period, it is recommended that the Commissioners look favorably upon our request for a special use permit so that service may be provided as soon as possible."

CHAIRMAN: Commissioners, you heard the presentation on the background information by the staff. You have any questions to the staff concerning this application?

If not, we have a representative of Hawaiian Telephone Company to give comments on behalf of this application?

FRANK CHANG: My name is Frank Chang, Hawaiian Telephone Company Planning Department.

Mr. Chairman and Commissioners, I really don't have anything to add except to say that we are permitted under the State Land Use designation. Permitted use in Agriculture except that our size is a little larger to be directly permitted and we have to come through this process. We are also permitted under the County regulation and again the Agricultural designation.

One more thing I would like to add is that we are planning to apply for rezoning of that parcel based upon the recommendation by the State Land Use staff and this will be done very shortly also.

Naoshi Watanabe and myself would be glad to answer any questions that you may have.

CHAIRMAN: Commissioners have any questions?

KAWASAKI: Mr. Chairman, if this special permit is approved by the State Land Use Commission, how soon after that would they start construction?

CHANG: We would like to start as soon as possible. We have our plans basically ready and we would like to begin as soon as we can. We realize we have a timetable to meet and there is service demand in this area and we are anxious to go ahead.

CHAIRMAN: You have any further questions?

WATT: If you are going through that, you are going to ask for change in zoning? Why?

CHANG: We are taking the recommendation of the State Land Use Commission. They feel that because the parcel is put into two different areas - Agricultural and Residential-10 right now, their recommendation is that we would like to have the parcel in one complete zoned area instead of a split, the way we have now. So, we will file also for a rezoning. We are just taking it directly from that agency.

WATT: Could I ask Raymond a question?

SUEFUJI: Yes.

WATT: Is it possible for us to recommend on a split proposition - for an Urban and Agricultural? This building seems to sit on both zoning. There is no problem there?

SUEFUJI: No problem.

CHANG: May I make a very short statement. The proposed building that we are intending to construct is in Agricultural area right now. We have our facilities under different zoning. We have a van that's presently in RS-10 I believe. We have a tower that in Agricultural area and our proposed building is in the Agricultural area.

WATT: Oh I see, you have a diagonal piece.

CHAIRMAN: May I ask you a question? If the Land Use makes a recommendation to private developers to put the parcel under one classification, why did you not initiate this? Is this basically to expedite this construction?

CHANG: Yes, basically our request to the Land Use Commission is that they estimated the minimum number of months it will take before any action is taken, which is about six months. We felt that it was too long to wait for any action to be taken and we felt that the special permit process would be the most fastest from our experience anyway.

CHAIRMAN: Do the Commissioners have any more questions? If not, thank you very much.

CHANG: Thanks very much.

CHAIRMAN: This being a public hearing, is there any other testimony that's to be given? Anyone who wishes to speak in favor of this proposal? Any opposition? Testimony to be given in opposition?

If not, Commissioners this is a public hearing on a special permit application. This cannot be acted upon within 15 days. Do I hear a motion to close the public hearing?

VALERA: I so move.

VERIATO: Second.

CHAIRMAN: Okay. Motion made that the public hearing be closed. All those in favor, will you please say aye.

MEMBERS: Aye.

CHAIRMAN: Who are opposed say no. Motion carried.

The public hearing was adjourned at 3:28 p.m.

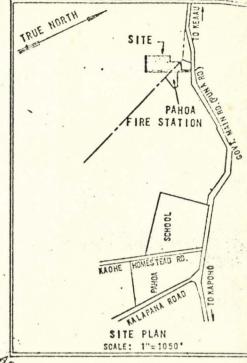

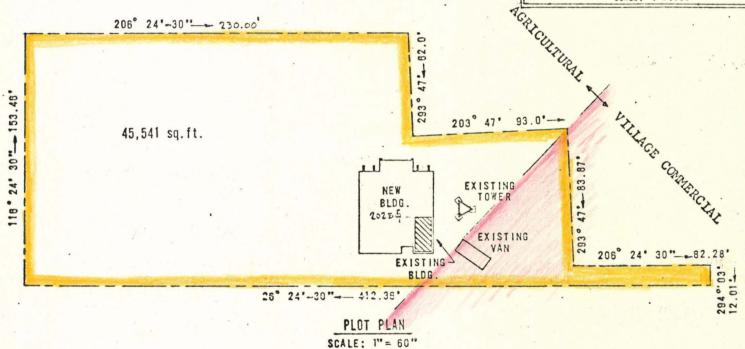

ATTACHMENT TO PAHOA SPECIAL USE PERMIT APPLICATION

It is our understanding that the use of the proposed communications equipment building at Pahoa is considered a permissive use under the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the County of Hawaii under Section 30, Sub-Section B, Paragraph 10, provided the Director does not find said use hazardous, dangerous, or a nuisance to the surrounding area and grants the "Plan Approval". It is further understood that, under the State Land Use District Regulations Part II, Sub-Part C Paragraph 2.14 subparagraph (g), a communications equipment building is considered a permissive use; however, the size of our proposed structure is of substantial size to require a special use permit.

The following reasons justify our request for a special use permit:

- I. Hawaiian Telephone Company has existing on the subject parcel a mobile communications van, a transmission tower, and a 260 square feet communications building. We need to use the existing facilities and to expand the communications equipment building to provide the Pahoa residents with telephone and communication services. The present mobile van is inadequate to serve the needs of the community and the equipment to be installed in the proposed structure will replace the van plus provide for future growth of the community.
- 2. There should be no detrimental effect on the intent of the land usage as the building is occupied by equipment and the only personnel on the premises will be those who will install the equipment and others who will occasionally maintain the equipment. In addition, the first 177 feet (depth) of our property is zoned (CV) Village Commercial and our structure will be located only approximately 15 feet away from the (CV) Village Commercial boundary. With our minimal traffic there should be no detrimental effect on the surrounding properties which are zoned either commercial or residential.

The building will be one story high and measure approximately 45 feet by 45 feet or a total of 2,025 square feet of floor area. See Attachment A. Our forecasted figures show that we will require another addition sometime beyond 1990.

3. Service and economic penalties would be incurred to duplicate and relocate the existing facilities elsewhere. Service to the subscribers would be affected in that the delay to duplicate the facilities will necessitate a restriction of phone service until adequate facilities are constructed and installed. In addition the location of this communications equipment building falls within the "economic wire center". Any other location would also cause economic penalties. In other words, we can serve the Pahoa residents most economically from the proposed site thus benefitting the public.

4. Granting of a special use permit will not be contrary to State or County plans. The State Land use designation is Agricultural for the parcel and under its regulations, a communications equipment building is a permissive use. However, our structure is of substantial size to require a special use permit.
