The Department of Agriculture has reviewed the subject application and has the following comments to offer.

According to the application, the applicant seeks to expand its religious activities to include a weekday school.

The parcel is not classified according to the Agricultural Lands of Importance to the State of Hawaii (ALISH) system.

The Soil Conservation Service Soil Survey identifies the soil as Aa lava flows (rLV) with a soil capability classification of VIIIs (soils with very severe limitations, such as stoniness).

The parcel has a Land Study Bureau Overall Productivity Rating of E319. By this method of classification, the parcel has poor productivity potential for most agricultural uses.

# Land Use Commission Approves Ouarry Permit For North Kona

LIHUE, Kauai—The State Land Use Commission last weekend approved a special permit for a controversial quarry at Kalaoa, North Kona.

The commission, in a meeting Saturday morning here, also authorized construction of a church in Hawaiian Ocean View Estates subdivision in Ka'u.

On the quarry permit, the commission attached three new conditions in addition to those previously recommended by the County Planning Commission. The applicant, J. M. Tanaka Construction, must:

—Maintain a 2,000 foot setback from Mamalahoa Highway;

-Limit operations, including

loading and hauling, to 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and

—Comply with State and County air, noise, drainage and safety regulations.

The Planning Commission had earlier recommended that the quarry be shut down when wind makes dust a problem and that the permit be subject to cancellation if it proves a nuisance to area residents. The commission's stipulation of a three-year time limit for the permit was accepted as well.

The proposed quarry, adjacent to several new subdivisions in North Kona, had been vigorously protested by nearby residents at a June 17

hearing in Waimea. No hearing by the Land Use Commission in addition to the Planning Commission hearing was legally required, according to a planner, but testimony is accepted at action meetings.

The church to be built in Hawaiian Ocean View Estates is located on a 44,214 square foot parcel without utilities, owned by Hawaiian Ocean View Evangelical Community Church.

A special permit application has been submitted by

Mr. Elden Roth to construct a church within the State Land Use

Agricultural District in the Hawaiian Ocean View Estates

Subdivision, Kau, Hawaii. The 44,214 square foot property

is identified as Tax Map Key 9-2-13: 71 and is owned by

The property fronts Leilani Circle within the Hawaiian Ocean View Estates Subdivision and is situated approximately 3/4 mile mauka of the Belt Road. Surrounding land uses within the Hawaiian Ocean View Estates include two churches, one of which is approximately 300 feet to the east; a four-unit motel; and a bar-restaurant-office complex. At the present time approximately 75 single-family dwellings units have been constructed within this subdivision. Utilities to the subject property are not readily available.

The Land Study Bureau indicates that the soil is very poor or "E" for overall agricultural productivity, unsuited for machine tillage, and consists mostly of sharp as clinkers with little or no soil material. The general slope of the

property is below 20 percent, and the land is located at the 2,200 foot elevation.

## County Recommendation

At its meeting on June 24, 1971, the Hawaii Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of this special permit based on the County Zoning Ordinance, Section 30-B-3a, which permits this use in an Agricultural District. However, the recommendation for approval was contingent on the following conditions:

- "1. That the development be in accord with all other pertinent regulations of the State and County including plan approval.
- "2. That construction begin within one year of approval by the State Land Use Commission, should the body approve this application, or the permit shall be declared void."

County zoning for the area is Ag-1 acre, and there is presently no General Plan by the County covering the area.

Upon evaluation of this request, staff finds that it is generally in conformance with the guidelines established by the Land Use District Rules and Regulations, Sub-part E, Special Permits, in that:

 The desired use will not adversely affect surrounding property.

- The land upon which the proposed use is sought is very poorly suited for agricultural production.
- Unusual conditions, trends, and needs have arisen since the district boundaries and regulations were established.
- 4. The proposed use will not substantially alter or change the essential character of the land.
- 5. The proposed use will make the highest and best use of the land involved for the public welfare.

Based on the above findings, staff recommends approval of this request, subject to the conditions set forth by the Hawaii County Planning Commission.

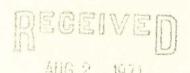

SP 71-103 J. M. Tanaka Construction, Inc.

Soils are shallow over pahoehoe lava offering site suitable for quarrying operations. All state and county requirements should be complied with. On the termination of the operation, all areas should be levelled or backfilled.

SP 71-107 Jay J. Otsuka

Soils are deep and well drained. Caution should be exercised to see that all health requirements are met.

The properties under consideration are located in the Waimea Homesteads area, So. Kohala, and are portions of TMK: 6-5-04:25, 35 & 36 and TMK: 6-5-07:12 & 25. The areas under consideration are zoned "A-la" and within the SLU "urban" districts. The County has general planned these areas for "single-family residential development."

The proposed subdivision of parcel 25 (12.97 acs) of TMK: 6-5-04 would result in four (4) lots, two of which are 15,000 square feet in area and the remaining lots 13,125 square feet and 16,875 square feet. The proposed subdivision of parcel 35 (14.4 acs.) would result in a 16,625 square feet lot and the proposed subdivision of parcel 36 (2.2 acs.) would result in an 11,000 square foot lot. The above-mentioned parcels front on Kapiolani Road and are surrounded by lots averaging two acres in size.

Parcel 12 (2.3 acs.) of TMK: 6-5-07, fronting Hokuula Road and adjacent to the Morimoto subdivision (average lot sizes 9 - 10,000 square feet) is proposed to be subdivided into three lots, each approximately 7,800 square feet in size. Parcel 25 (1.322 acs.), fronting Lindsay Road, is proposed to be subdivided into one 10,000 square foot lot. Surrounding lot sizes range in size from one to four acres with the exception of the Morimoto Subdivision and adjacent lot at the corner of Hokuula and Lindsay Road.

Utilities are available to the subject parcels. The lots are presently served by a public water system and each lot is provided with a sewage cesspool.

being Further information was/received on the application of J. M. Tanaka Construction, Inc., for a special permit to allow a temporary quarry site located on approximately 52 acres of land in Kalaoa 4th, North Kona.

Mr. Cyril Kanemitsu submitted to the Commission a series of snapshots taken showing the Matsumoto property, which is the property in question, showing the views of the land where the bulldozer has leveled the land. He showed also the pictures of the Kona Highlands where the rock has been removed He explained that the owners of this land are the Matsumotos in Kona; and the son of the owner Mr. Carl Matsumoto was deeply shocked at the kind of response that Tanaka Construction Company received from some of the adjoining lot owners. The owner has obtained the signatures of many of the present lot owners adjoining these lands who favor very much the granting of the request of J. M. Tanaka Construction, Inc. He stated that there are those who live immediately adjacent to the area who has signed this petition. For the Commission's he submitted a petition with 35 signatures.

Mr. Kanemitsu expressed that at the last hearing, it was made very obvious that this probably was not a quarrying operation but rather a leveling operation where a portable crusher would go immediately alongside the piles of gravel that would be pushed by the bulldozer. Most of the subdivisions in the adjoining areas utilize a method that is being proposed right here stated the representative.

The Deputy Director pointed out to the members that this is the area where the Commissioners have recommended for urban development to the State Land Use Commission.

No action on this item was taken at this time.
