Pursuant to your letter dated January 22, 1987, addressed to Goodsill Anderson Quinn & Stifel, this is to clarify the conditions for the subject Special Permit as reflected in the Land Use Commission records.

The conditions imposed by the Land Use Commission on the original permit on December 17, 1971, are as follows:

- 1. That all State and County standards and appropriate safety measures be taken by the applicant to safeguard vehicular traffic during the entire period of the operation, 24 hours a day.
- That the applicant shall take every precaution not to create any inconvenience from noise and dust problems during the operation.
- 3. That the operation be confined within the metes and bounds descriptions as submitted.
- 4. That this permit shall expire within 5 years from the date of approval by the State Land Use Commission should the agency approve this request. If, at the end of 5 years, the applicant reapplies for the special permit and is denied, or if the applicant fails to reapply for the special permit, then all temporary support facilities, along with equipment, will be removed. A grading plan will then be done and the natural contours will be restored. At the end of quarrying operations, the site shall appear as natural open space and not as a scar on the landscape.

On November 9, 1976, the Land Use Commission approved a 5 year extension for the special permit with the following additional condition:

5. Petitioner shall comply with all applicable Department of Health regulations.

Should the stated conditions not be met, the Special Permit shall be deemed null and void.

On May 15, 1981, the Land Use Commission approved a 10-year extension to the subject permit to expire on December 17, 1991, subject to the following additional condition:

That approval of the extension request is subject to all conditions stipulated in the granting of the original Special Permit, except for those references in Condition Number 4 relating to the five year expiration date, but including compliance with applicable Department of Health regulations. In addition, every precaution must be taken by the applicant so as not to create any inconvenience to surrounding properties in regard to traffic, noise and dust problems during the quarrying operations. Should the quarrying operations have an adverse effect on surrounding properties, sufficient and documented evidence may be submitted to the Planning Director to support any claims which are made that the applicant is creating an inconvenience. If the Planning Director finds that the evidence submitted shows sufficient cause to reevaluate the Special Permit, he shall transmit such evidence to the Planning Commission who shall hold a public hearing to gather evidence relative to the impact of the quarrying operations on surrounding lands. Upon receiving any complaint which is accompanied by documented evidence relative to the impact of the quarry operations, the applicant shall cease operations until a determination is made as to whether operations can continue or the Special Permit is to be revoked.

That should the stated conditions not be met, the Special Permit may be deemed null and void.

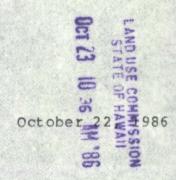

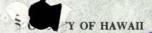

We wish to request the following amendments to the Special Permit for our makai quarry:

- Clarification of "allied uses" to include AC batching plant, concrete batching plant, and precast/prestressed concrete facilities as well as the stated screening plant, rock crusher and scales. And,
- 2) Deletion of Condition #5 which reads: "The materials removed from the subject site shall be restricted to use within their own development.".

The ambitious Hyatt Regency Waikoloa Hotel (HRW) project is proposed to be consructed within a very short 28-month building schedule. Due to the complexity of the improvements at the hotel site, it is not possible to allocate areas for the facilities to produce the paving, concrete, and structural concrete members on site. To meet the tight schedule and control the costs of the hotel, the contractors are proposing to produce the aggregates, concrete, paving, and structural concrete products all at the site of our makai quarry, which has ready access to existing roadways and to the development site. An operation independent of the hotel construction is proposed. The efficiencies of locating these "allied uses" near the production of the aggregates they require is a valuable element in the success of the HRW project.

The principle focus of our quarrying and allied uses is to provide products required for our own projects as part of the long-range development of Waikoloa. The ability to sell products to off-property projects will allow the operator of the quarry to even out production levels to maintain cost efficient operations and to amortize the set up costs over a broader base. The state-of-the-art equipment required to meet the exacting needs of complex construction projects necessitates level production rates for cost efficient operation.

No condition limiting off-property sales exists in our other special permit No. 70-85 for our mauka quarries. In November 1974, subsequent to the original approval of S.P. No. 71-117, the Planning Commission approved our request to delete this limiting condition. The State Land Use Commission, however, did not feel that our original application adequately addressed the need for off- property sales and upheld the condition. We believe that the market conditions have changed sufficiently to warrant deletion of this restriction. The growth of the South Kohala Coast is beginning to mature and an efficient operation for the production of the needed rock products will be an economic benefit for all of the developments along the coast. This full product facility, within a few miles of the majority of pending construction in West Hawaii, is definitely needed.

Once established, it is our intention to have the facilities retained at the quarry throughout the life of the permit to accommodate future development at Waikoloa and neighboring resorts. We request that, when approved, these changes become incorporated as part of our original permit.

Further, we believe that the reasons for approval of the original Special Permit are still valid. The permitted area is unsuited for agricultural ventures and we are not proposing to alter the essential character of the land or its use. As such, the quarry is not contrary to the objectives of the Land Use Law and Regulations. No health regulation, infractions, or adverse effects on adjoining properties due to quarrying operations have occured to date. We are the owner of all adjoining properties and have a vested interest in continuing to minimize inconveniences to surrounding properties.

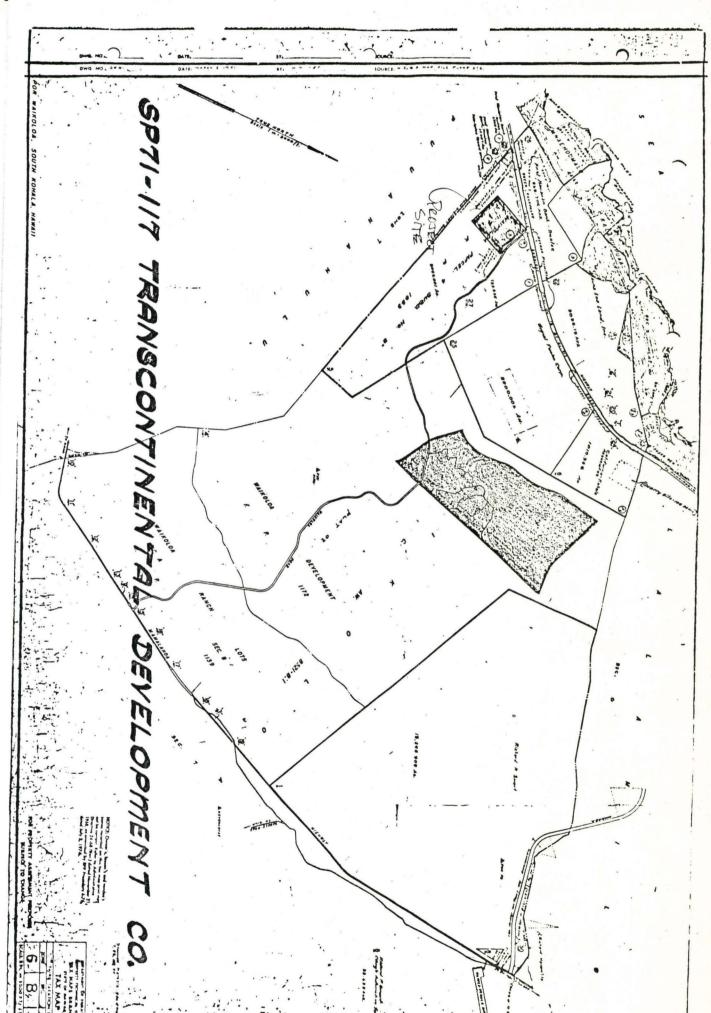
The quarrying and allied uses will not unreasonably burden public agencies. In fact, in the past, the public has benefited by controlled costs in the construction of Queen Ka'ahumanu Highway as a result of aggregates produced at this quarry. Water is available nearby, from the Waikoloa Water Company, a privately-owned public utility. The roadway adjacent to the quarry is designed to safely handle the increased traffic and the intersection of Waikoloa Road and Queen Ka'ahumanu Highway will soon be improved using private funds.

In anticipation that a public hearing will be required, the filing fee of \$100 is attached. As the commencement of construction for the HRW hotel is imminent, we would like to ask for an expeditions disposition of this amendment request. FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND DECISION AND ORDER

The Land Use Commission of the State of Hawaii, having duly considered the entire record in the above entitled matter, makes the following findings of fact and conclusions of law.

### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Petitioner has filed for a ten (10) years time extension of the Special Permit which allows quarry operations and allied uses on 309 acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District at Waikoloa, South Kohala, Hawaii, Tax Map Key 6-8-01: portion of 5.
- 2. The subject site, identified as the Makai Quarry, is located approximately 2,000 feet <a href="mauka">mauka</a> (southwest) of the Queen Kaahumanu Highway where it intersects Waikoloa Road. It consists of a rectangular area 3,350 feet by 4,020 feet, situated at an elevation of 200 feet above sea level.
- 3. The Special Permit was originally granted on December 17, 1971 by the Land Use Commission, with a condition that it would expire within 5 years from the date of approval. On November 9, 1976, the Land Use Commission granted a time extension of five (5) years which extended the expiration date to December 17, 1981.

- 4. The Petitioner has stated that completion of all three development increments at Waikoloa will take at least ten more years and will require construction material from the subject quarry for the duration.
- the Hawaii County Planning Commission at a public hearing on November 25, 1980. Claude Jenkins, representing the Petitioner, spoke in support of the request. The Hawaii County Planning Department recommended that the time extension request be approved subject to all the conditions that were stipulated in granting the original Special Permit, including compliance with applicable Department of Health regulations and with an added condition to further protect surrounding properties from traffic, noise, or dust problems that may result from quarrying operations. No other persons testified concerning the request.
- 6. Based upon the reasons cited by the Petitioner, and the findings and recommendations of the Planning Department, the Hawaii County Planning Commission voted unanimously to forward a favorable recommendation to the State Land Use Commission subject to the added condition outlined by the planning staff.
- 7. The complete record of the Special Permit petition was received at the Land Use Commission office on January 14, 1981. The Land Use Commission took action on the request on February 25, 1981 by approving the time extension request subject to the conditions stipulated in the granting of the original Special Permit including compliance with applicable Department of Health regulations, and subject to the additional condition proposed by the Hawaii Planning Commission.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. As required under Rule 9-3 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Land Use Commission, the Petitioner has shown that unusual circumstances warrant the granting of the requested time extension.
- 2. The granting of the time extension is not violative of <u>Hawaii Revised Statutes</u>, Chapter 205-6 and State Land Use Commission District Regulations, Part V.

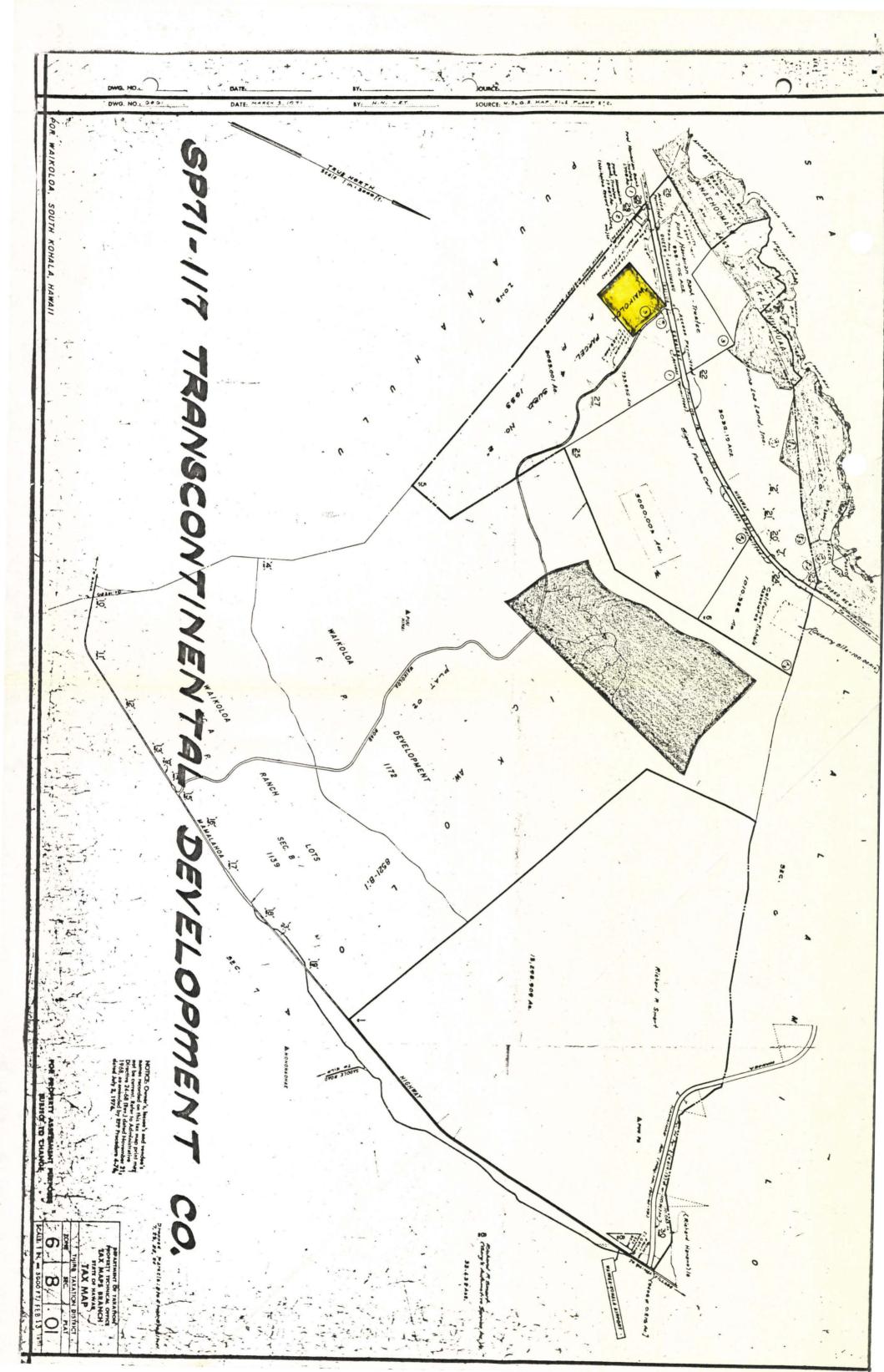

Transcontinental Development Company (TDC) is requesting a time extension to Special Permit 71-117 which was originally approved by the Land Use Commission on December 17, 1971, allowing the establishment of quarry operations and allied uses on 309 acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District at Waikoloa, South Kohala, Hawaii, Tax Map Key 6-8-01: Portion of 5. For the Commission's information, a location map is attached. (Attachment #1).

The subject Site #3, identified as the Makai Quarry, is located approximately 2,000 feet mauka of the Queen Kaahumanu Highway. It consists of a rectangular area 3,350 feet by 4,020 feet, situated at an elevation of 200 feet above sea level. The Anaehoomalu Urban District is located about 1.5 miles west of the subject area, and the Waikoloa Urban District is approximately 3.5 miles toward the northeast. Basalt (blue rock) and 'a'a cinders are the primary products of this quarry. The basalt from this site is of better quality (harder) than that found in the mauka Village Quarry. Location wise, this site has the advantage of being closer to the developing resort areas along the beach.

The orginal petitioner, Boise Cascade, has transferred its development holdings and their relate permits to Transcontinental Development Company.

A condition of approval of the orginal SP71-117 was that it was to expire within 5 years from the date of approval by the State Land Use Commission. However, as recommended by the County Planning Commission, the Land Use Commission granted a five (5) year time extension at its meeting on November 9, 1976.

By letter dated September 26, 1980, Mr. Willis H. Sanburn, petitioner's Director of Business Relations, has requested that the expiration date of December 17, 1981 be extended to December 17, 1991. In support of this 10-year extension request, Mr. Sanburn stated the following:

"This quarry is currently supplying the material for the development of the infrastructure and golf course and Waikoloa Beach Resort. We anticipate the work on the first increment of development will be completed in the summer of 1981. However, there remains at least three more increments to be completed, which will be done as the resort developes (sic). They are the balance of Increment 1, Waikoloa Beach Resort; Increment 2 for which incremental zoning has already been approved; and finally Increment 3 which lies between the Kaahumanu Highway and the King's Trail.

"This phased development was contemplated at the time our SMA and related permits were received.

"As you know, the 548-room Sheraton Royal Waikoloa Hotel is now under construction, along with the Robert Trent Jones golf course, roads and related infrastructure. We have just received the final bids on the golf course clubhouse and that should be under construction shortly.

"We look forward to a gradual development of Waikoloa Beach Resort over the next several years with the completion of Increment 1 followed by the development and completion of Increment 2 and finally Increment 3. This development will take at least 10 years. Therefore, we respectfully request a 10-year extension of Special Permit SP71-117 from December 17, 1981 to December 17, 1991. All the conditions established by the Planning Commission at its meeting on October 14, 1971 and adopted by the Land Use Commission are being adhered to."

For the Commission's information, the Special Permit form which lists the findings and conditions of the original SP71-117 approval is attached. (Attachment #2)

At its meeting on November 25, 1980, the Hawaii County Planning Commission voted to recommend in favor of the ten year extension based on the following findings:

"That the subject quarry site is a necessary and integral part of the applicant's overall development. The material which is obtained from the site is used to meet various construction needs. The subject quarry is currently supplying the material for the development of the infrastructure and golf course at the Waikoloa Beach Resort.

"The applicant's development is an on-going project, and the need for the quarry operations and the related uses allowed by the Special Permit will continue some time into the future. The 548-room Sheraton Royal Waikoloa Hotel is now under construction, along with the golf course, roads and related infrastructure. There remains at least three more increments of development which will take at least 10 years to complete.

"In addition, it is determined that approval of the continuation of the quarry operations and related uses will contribute to the applicant's compliance with the intent, purpose and requirements of land use changes which have been previously approved. The continuance of these operations and uses will have minimal adverse effects on the publich health and welfare."

"It is further recommended that approval of the extension request be subject to all conditions stipulated in the granting of the original Special Permit including compliance with applicable Department of Health regulations. In addition, every precaution must be taken by the applicant so as not to create any inconvenience to surrounding properties in regard to traffic, noise and dust problems during the quarrying operations. Should the quarrying operations have an adverse effect on surrounding properties, sufficient and documented evidence may be submitted to the Planning Director to support any claims which are made that the applicant is creating an inconvenience. If the Planning Director finds that the evidence submitted shows sufficient cause to re-evaluate the Special Permit, he shall transmit such evidence to the Planning Commission who shall hold a public hearing to gather evidence relative to the impact of the quarrying operations on surrounding lands. Upon receiving any complaint which is accompanied by documented evidence relative to the impact of the quarry operations, the applicant shall cease operations until a determination is made as to whether operations can continue or the Special Permit is to be revoked.

"Should the stated conditions not be met, the Special Permit may be deemed null and void."

JENKINS: My name is Claude Jenkins.

CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Claude. If the extension is given, do you think this will suffice all the construction that's going on in the area or will you have to come in again?

JENKINS: Temporarily, I think it will. We may have to come in. Judging from the past history, why, ten years is not a very long period for this type of construction.

CHAIRMAN: Okay, thank you. Commissioners, do you have any questions?

ORITA: Mr. Chairman.

CHAIRMAN: Go ahead, Commissioner Orita.

ORITA: Claude, let me ask you this.

JENKINS: Yes.

ORITA: Because you didn't anticipate it would be taking this long, is there enough materials within that quarry site for another ten years?

JENKINS: Very definitely. Yeah, we have supplied all of our, I'd say 80 percent of the construction materials used on Queen Kaahumanu Highway, plus all of the roads that we have developed makai of the village from that particular quarry. Yeah, there's ample material there.

ORITA: Thank you.

NISHIMURA: Mr. Chairman, staff would like to ask a question.

CHAIRMAN: Go ahead.

NISHIMURA: Will you be able to meet the conditions as recommended by the staff's recommendation?

JENKINS: Why, sure.

CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Mr. Corporation Counsel. Now, Commissioner Whitmarsh.

As we discussed I am submitting separate requests for 10-year extensions on our Makai and Mauka quarry permits. Because Waikoloa is an on going project and we foresee development over the next 10 years, it seems appropriate to request 10-year extensions on these permits and to consider them all at one time in the interest of saving time and effort by your department, the Planning Commission and the Land Use Commission.

As we have previously informed you, Waikoloa and its related permits have been transferred from the various Boise Cascade entities to Transcontinental Corporation and the development is now being carried on by Transcontinental Development Co., a partnership between Transcontinental Corporation and Bass Brothers Enterprises. Therefore, the new extension should be in the name of Transcontinental Development Co.

If you think it best, we can arrange to have all three quarry permits expire on the same time making village permit extension request for 11 years rather 10 years. Transcontinental Development Company has submitted a request for a time extension to Special Permit No. 71-117 (LUC 197) which allowed the establishment of quarry operations and allied uses on 309 acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The area involved is located mauka of the Queen Kaahumanu Highway and along the Waikoloa Road, Waikoloa, South Kohala, TMK: 6-8-01:Portion of 5.

Special Permit 71-117 was granted by the State Land Use
Commission on December 17, 1971 and allowed the operation of a
quarry and allied uses such as portable screening plant, rock
crusher and scales within the State Land Use Agicultural District.

In support of this request the petitioner stated, in part, the following:

"This quarry is currently supplying the material for the development of the infrastructure and golf course and Waikoloa Beach Resort. We anticipate the work on the first increment of development will be completed in the summer of 1981. However, there remains at least three more increments to be completed, which will be done as the resort developes [sic]. They are the balance of Increment 1, Waikoloa Beach Resort; Increment 2 for which incremental zoning has already been approved; and finally Increment 3 which lies between the Kaahumanu Highway and the King's Trail.

"This phased development was contemplated at the time our SMA and related permits were received.

"As you know, the 548-room Sheraton Royal Waikoloa Hotel is now under construction, along with the Robert Trent Jones golf course, roads and related infrastructure. We have just received the final bids on the golf course clubhouse and that should be under construction shortly.

"We look forward to a gradual development of Waikoloa Beach Resort over the next several years with the completion of Increment 1 followed by the development and completion of Increment 2 and finally Increment 3. This development will take at least 10 years. Therefore, we respectfully request a 10-year extension of Special Permit SP 71-117 from December 17, 1981 to December 17, 1991. All the conditions established by the Planning Commission at its meeting on October 14, 1971 and adopted by the Land Use Commission are being adhered to."

For the Commissioners' information, a five (5) year time extension to Special Permit 71-117 was previously granted by the Land Use Commission, as recommended by the County Planning Commission, on November 9, 1976. The reasons for granting the original time extension can be briefly summarized as follows:

- The quarry sites are a necessary and integral part of the applicant's overall development.
- 2. The applicant's development is an on-going project and the need for the quarry operations will continue some time into the future.

- 3. The approval of continued quarry operations will contribute to the applicant's compliance with the intent, purpose and requirements of land use changes previously approved.
- 4. The continuance of the quarry operations will have minimal adverse effects on the public health and welfare.

In addition, there is one other quarry site within the Waikoloa development. This quarry site was the subject of the time extension request of the previous item on the agenda.

None of the cooperating agencies had any comments on or objections to the subject request.

## RECOMMENDATION: TRANSCONTINENTAL DEVELOPMENT CO. - Time Extension (SP 71-117)

Upon review of the subject request for a ten-year extension until December 17, 1991, to continue the operation of a quarry and related uses on 309 acres of land, staff is recommending that it be approved based on the following findings:

That the subject quarry site is a necessary and integral part of the applicant's overall development. The material which is obtained from the site is used to meet various construction needs. The subject quarry is currently supplying the material for the development of the infrastructure and golf course at the Waikoloa Beach Resort.

The applicant's development is an on-going project, and the need for the quarry operations and the related uses allowed by the Special Permit will continue some time into the future. The 548-room Sheraton Royal Waikoloa Hotel is now under construction, along with the golf course, roads and related infrastructure. There remains at least three more increments of development which will take at least 10 years to complete.

In addition, it is determined that approval of the continuation of the quarrying operations and related uses will contribute to the applicant's compliance with the intent, purpose and requirements of land use changes which have been previously approved. The continuance of these operations and uses will have minimal adverse effects on the public health and welfare.

It is further recommended that approval of the extension request be subject to all conditions stipulated in the granting of the original Special Permit including compliance with applicable Department of Health regulations. In addition, every precaution must be taken by the applicant so as not to create any inconvenience to surrounding properties in regard to traffic, noise and dust problems during the quarrying operations. Should the quarrying operations have an adverse effect on surrounding properties, sufficient and documented evidence may be submitted to the Planning Director to support any claims which are made that the applicant is creating an inconvenience. If the Planning Director finds that the evidence submitted shows sufficient cause to re-evaluate the Special Permit, he shall transmit such evidence to the Planning Commission who shall hold a public hearing to gather evidence relative to the impact of the quarrying operations on surrounding lands. Upon receiving any complaint which is accompanied by documented evidence relative to the impact of the quarry operations, the applicant shall cease operations until a determination is made as to whether operations can continue or the Special Permit is to be revoked.

Should the stated conditions not be met, the Special Permit may be deemed null and void.

AMENDMENT TO SP78-305 HIROSHI MATSUYAMA KALAOA 5TH, NORTH KONA Application of Hiroshi Matsuyama for an amendment to SP78-305 (LUC 394) to allow the second floor addition for a fast foods outlet, beauty shop, manager's quarters, post office and a real estate or insurance office. The original permit was a country general store and a service

station facility on 0.85 acre of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The area involved is located along the mauka side of the Hawaii Belt Highway, approximately 300 feet south of the Kona Palisades Drive, Kalaoa 5th, North Kona, TMK: 7-3-05:27.

Staff noted the petitioner's November 14, 1980, letter limiting the second floor addition to a manager's quarters and storage area and the letter from the Department of Water Supply essentially saying they had no objections to the amended request. Staff then stated based upon these two letters, they had no objections to the amended request.

The petitioner's representative, Richard Ishida, assured the Commission that there has been no change to the building since the original application was approved. However, they would now like to lower the ceiling and add another floor. He added that no additional grading work will be necessary for the second floor.

The petitioner, Alvin Chee, showed a rendering of the project. He stated he would be able to comply with the conditions as amended by the staff, noting that instead of 34 units they are going with 25, at a selling price of approximately \$325,000 to \$425,000.

Upon the Director's questioning, Mr. Chee stated he was agreeable to the following added condition: "That a cash fee equivalent to the estimated cost of an 8-foot wide pedestrian easement and improvements thereon running the length of the subject property from Alii Drive to the shoreline shall be deposited with the County of Hawaii Finance Director prior to issuance of building permit. The amount of said fee shall be determined by the Planning Director or an independent land appraiser. Should an independent appraiser be used, the cost of the appraisal shall be borne by the petitioner. Said fee shall be deposited to a public access fund for the North Kona District and shall be used to acquire, maintain or improve shoreline accesses in the North Kona District."

The following is a recapitulation of those testifying on the application:

F. A. McCallum, representing Roy & M. Hargraves, Vernon Brown, and M. V. Finch, read and presented written testimony dated November 25, 1980, against the project, on file.

Elizabeth Von Beck, on behalf of the Kona Conservation Group, said she felt the traffic problem, overbuilding of condominiums, and ruining of hotel businesses should be considered very strongly before anymore condominiums are approved anywhere.

Bob Linderd expressed his concern that the model prepared by the petitioner was inaccurate and that a large portion of the project would be inundated if there is a storm of the magnitude that occurred last January.

It was moved by Commissioner Orita and seconded by Commissioner Ponte that the hearing be continued to allow the petitioner time to redesign their plans to meet with the staff's suggested conditions of approval; motion was carried with Commissioner Sakamoto voting no.

RECESS: The Chair called a short recess at 3:37 p.m.

RECONVENED: The meeting reconvened at 3:46 p.m. to take up the public hearings scheduled for 2:30 p.m.

Upon the staff's suggestion, it was moved by Commissioner Nakano and seconded by Commissioner Frias to dispense with the reading of the background report; motion was carried.

Staff presented recommendation for approval with conditions, on file.

The petitioner's representative, Claude Jenkins, noted that the lower quarry is located approximately 5/8 to 3/4 of a mile away from the village.

For the Commission's information, Mr. Jenkins pointed out that they are unable to obtain the same type of material by operating one quarry as these two quarries essentially have different types of material. He added that the boulders taken (possibly 1,500 cubic yards out of 60,000 cubic yards) are used to fill the voids and that they are required to contour the land back to normal shape after the operation.

There was no one testifying on the application.

Upon the Deputy Corporation Counsel's inquiry, staff pointed out that the extension was requested on October 10, 1980.

It was moved by Commissioner Nakano and seconded by Commissioner Kagawa to close the public hearing; motion was carried.

It was moved by Commissioner Orita and seconded by Commissioner Whitmarsh to send a favorable recommendation to the State Land Use Commission for the reasons and with the conditions as outlined by the staff. A roll call vote was taken and motion carried with nine ayes.

AMENDMENT TO NORTH KONA

Public hearing on the request by Charles SMA NO. 115 Chamberland for a time extension to Condition CHARLES CHAMBERLAND No. 115 which allowed the development of a Chamberland for a time extension to Condition 60-unit condominium project and related improvements. Staff summarized the background and presented recommendation for approval with conditions, on file.

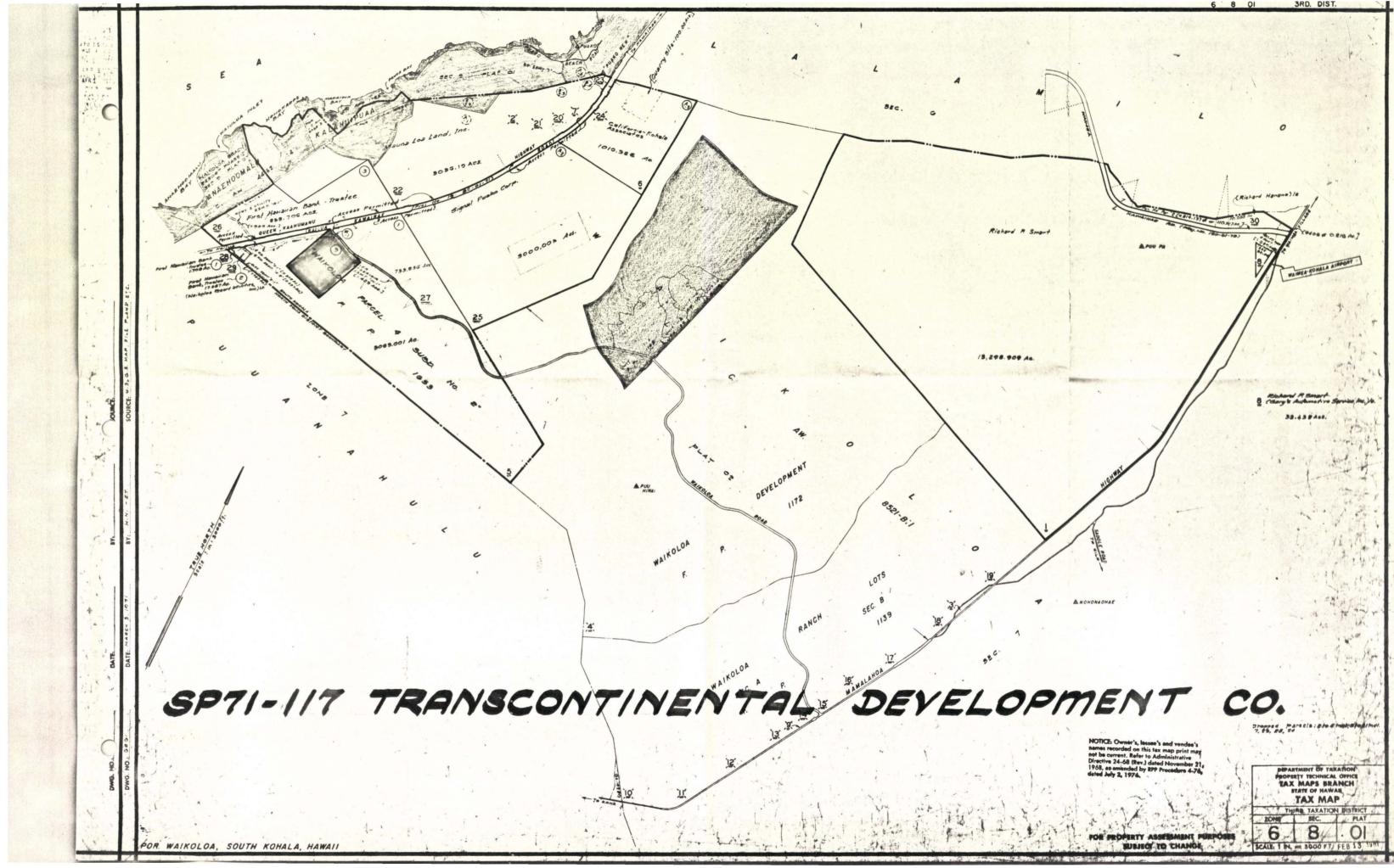
