The Hilton Head Company is requesting a second extension of the time condition stipulated within the Special Permit granted by the State Land Use Commission for the establishment of a temporary sales office on an 8.2-acre parcel of land in Kahua 1st, North Kohala (Tax Map Key: 5-9-5:12). The property is situated on the mauka side of the Akoni Pule Highway, approximately 2-1/2 miles north of Kawaihae Harbor, in the Kohala Estates subdivision.

The sales office is being used to receive prospective buyers and to disseminate sales information for the forty-three (43) agricultural lots in the subdivision. According to the applicant, almost two-thirds of the lots have been sold.

One of the conditions of approval of the Special Permit was "That the sales office be permitted for a period of no more than two (2) years from the official date of approval of this request or upon completion of the initial sale of the 43 lots, whichever is sooner." The Special Permit was approved by the State Land Use Commission on September 20, 1972.

On November 7, 1974, the State Land Use Commission voted to grant an extension of the time condition until June 1, 1975, pursuant to an action by the Hawaii County Planning Commission recommending approval of the request. This approval was based on the consideration that the Hilton Head Company had had to stop their sales program for a 9-month period in December, 1973, in order to resolve a complicated electricity situation. At that time 30 of the lots were still unsold.

By letter dated June 13, 1975, the Hawaii County Planning Commission advised that at its meeting on June 12, 1975, it considered the request for the second extension. It indicated that: "The Commission voted to recommend an extension of time until January 1, 1976, based on the consideration that the request is determined to be a reasonable one. The original sales program was subjected to a 9-month delay in 1973 and 1974 so that a complicated electricity problem could be resolved. That problem was resolved in the fall of 1974 and sales were resumed. The extension until January 1, 1976, will allow the applicant sufficient time to complete their sales of the remaining 16 lots and also in which to remove the structure and will obviate the need for any additional extension of time requests. It is further recommended that the approval of the extension of the time be subject to the condition that all other conditions stipulated in the original approval of the Special Permit be complied with."

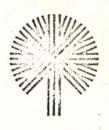

The staff reported that the Hilton Head Company, which took over interest in the company which was formerly known as Sampson-Miller Associates Co., Inc., is requesting an extension of the time condition stipulated within the special permit granted by the State Land Use Commission for the establishment of a temporary sales office on an 8.2 acre parcel. The property is situated on the mauka side of the Akoni Pule Highway, approximately 2 1/2 miles north of the Kawaihae Harbor.

The sales office is being used to receive prospective buyers and to disseminate sales information for the forty-three (43) agricultural lots in the area.

One of the conditions of approval was "that the sales office be permitted for a period of no more than two (2) years from the official date of approval of this request or upon completion of the initial sale of the 43 lots, whichever is sooner."

The date of approval of the request was on September 20, 1972, therefore, the expiration date was on September 20, 1974.

The attached letter was received from Mr. John Michael White, Director of real Estate for the Hilton Head Company requesting an extension until June 1, 1975.

According to Mr. Kenneth Griffin of Hirota, Griffin & Associates, brokers for the Kohala Estates Subdivision, thirteen (13) lots have been sold to date. There are twelve (12) 5 to 8-acre lots and eighteen (18) 20 to 28-acre lots still available.

The staff recommended that the request for a time extension until June 1, 1975, be given a favorable recommendation based on the attached considerations.

The Chairman asked about the reason for the problem with HELCO.

The staff reiterated that according to the letter submitted, the applicant had stated that they would have to provide electrical power to the site; however, because of the access problem, they had to go through the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to get their permission to put the lines through their property. This is the reason for the delay.

Mr. Asai inquired about the location of the sales office.

The staff replied that it is located on the mauka side of the Akoni Pule Road approximately 30 feet from the main highway. He mentioned that the sales office building is already existing on the property.

Mr. Sterling questioned about the applicant's statement to amend their Public Offering Statement after working things out with HELCO and whether that change would affect their special permit.

The staff mentioned that their representative is here today and he might be able to answer that question.

The Chairman called on the representative for further comments.

Mr. John Michael White explained that they did amend the Offering Statement in July of this year because the completion date of the utilities was originally set for December of last year. He stated that due to the fact that they had to obtain an environmental impact statement and also to obtain an easement to bring electricity on the site, they have not been able to obtain the easement by the original deadline and therefore that is why they made the amendment.

The Chairman asked from where they had to bring the power.

Mr. White stated that the power comes from the Kawaihae industrial site and about 1300 feet mauka from the highway to allow distribution throughout the subdivision.

Mrs. Jitchaku so moved to send a favorable recommendation to the Land Use Commission to extend the time condition to June 1, 1975 according to reasons set forth by the staff; seconded by Mr. Nagata and carried unanimously.

The staff presented the attached background information and read the attached letters dated September 24, 1974 and September 30, 1974 which were submitted in support of their request for a one (1) year extension to October 17, 1975 to commence construction.

The staff recommended that the one-year time extension to October 17, 1975 be given a favorable recommendation based on the following considerations:

That the applicant has proceeded with the planning studies for the development of the area. However, the actual construction of the project has been delayed primarily due to the present economic conditions. The applicant is still negotiating with a major hotel operator for the development of the proposed hotel.

In terms of planning, the applicant has thus far completed a comprehensive landscaping plan for the area, completed the second phase of the historical and archaeological study, and have also contacted and agreed with the State of Hawaii to provide a employee manpower training program.

Furthermore, the applicant has already contracted out the development and installation of the water system within the project site.

Based on the work already done by the applicant as described above, it is quite evident that substantial progress has been made in implementing the development plans. Therefore, it is determined that the requested extension of time is warranted.

In a letter of October 18, 1974 the Hawaii County Planning Commission advised that the Hilton Head Company has requested an extension of the time condition regarding SP72-134. This permit was for the establishment and operation of a temporary land sales office at Kahua 1st, North Kohala, Hawaii. The subject permit was granted by the Land Use Commission on September 20, 1972. Condition No. 1 of the special permit states "that the sales office be permitted for a period of no more than two years from the official date of approval of this request or upon completion of the initial sale of the 43 lots, whichever is sooner".

At its meeting of October 17, 1974, the Hawaii County Planning Commission voted to recommend an extension of the special permit until June 1, 1975 based on the following considerations:

APPLICATION BY OCEAN VIEW INVESTMENT CO. (SP72-132) TO ESTABLISH COMMERCIAL USES ON 25 ACRES AT KA'U, HAWAII

The Executive Officer, Mr. Fujimoto, presented the staff report recommending approval of the special permit request in concurrence with the findings and recommendations of the Hawaii County Planning Commission and the eight conditions imposed by the County.

Commissioner Kido suggested the feasibility of an incremental approach, rather than seeking approval of the total 25 acres, inasmuch there was such a well-defined time schedule. Mr. Earl Younker, Treasurer of Ocean View Investment Co. stated that it would be advantageous for the developer, as well as the total project, to obtain approval for the total area. Moreover, under the conditions imposed by the County, the petitioner's performance would be strictly regulated.

Mr. Glenn Miyao, staff member of the Hawaii Planning Department, elaborated that upon checking with the Water Department, it was felt

that two 20,000 gallon storage water tanks will be sufficient for the area and, therefore, this had been stipulated in their approval of the special permit.

Commissioner Kido moved that the special permit be approved, subject to the eight (8) conditions imposed by the County. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sakahashi and unanimously carried.

APPLICATION BY MARJORIE CORLEY (SP72-133) TO ALLOW A MEAT PROCESSING OPERATION ON 20 ACRES AT PUNA, HAWAII

In the staff memo presented by Mr. Gordan Furutani, staff planner, it was recommended that the special permit be approved subject to the conditions imposed by the Hawaii County Planning Commission.

Commissioner Mark moved that the special permit be approved subject to the conditions set forth by the County, seconded by Commissioner Kido, and it was unanimously passed.

APPLICATION BY SAMPSON-MILLER ASSOCIATED CO., INC. (SP72-134) TO ALLOW TEMPORARY SALES OFFICE ON 8 ACRES AT NORTH KOHALA, HAWAII

School Impact Kona

Rezoning Issue

KAILUA-Kona—Land Use Commissioners meeting here Thursday held public hearings on a controversial 100 acre expansion for Queen Liliuokalani Village on Palani Road, and considered an 86-lot Kahei houselots subdivision in North Kohala.

The Commission approved a motion by Eddie Tangen to reopen the hotly protested Waiawa Ridge petition from Bishop Estate on Oahu to new public hearings.

Kenny Young represented Palani Development at the hearing on a 216-unit addition to Liliuokalani Village. The Department of Education has objected to the impact of rapid housing development upon the already crowded Kealakehe School.

But County population projections show an estimated 12,400 residents in North Kona by 1975, the staff reported. This figure would almost triple the 1970 census.

"In order to accommodate the estimated increase of population for North Kona, the study states that 1,865 new dwellings must be constructed," said a land board staff member.

Young testified that in the first increment, 50 out of 60 units were low-cost housing, but that the Federal government wants a higher ratio of integration of low and medium cost units.

He said he would try for a 50-50 ratio in the 122 unit Phase II due to be finished in July, 1973. Young said that under his contract to Liliuokalani Estate, he must build at least 50 per year.

Kona Complex manager Kenneth Asato told the Commission that the DOE doesn't want to be the agency to stop the proposed development increment, because the need for additional housing is recognized. But District Superintendant Harry C. Chuck has urged that the developer pay for portable classrooms if Kealakehe School needs them.

In an action meeting, the Commission approved the incremental shopping center-post office complex requested by Ocean View Investment Company on a 25-acre site in it's Ka'u subdivision.

Earl Younker, Ocean View treasurer, testified that the investment group is financially sound and that development could proceed.

A grocery story, variety store, office space and a post office will be started immediately and finished within a year. Petitioners will lose their special permit unless County Planners' special conditions are followed, and if the construction timetable is not met.

During the second year construction will start on a service station, and warehouse; recreation facilities and light manufacturing structures will start the third year, a lumber yard and additional stores the fourth, and a motel complex before the end of the fifth year.

The 40-acre Kahei houselots subdivision in North Kohala would provide 80 lots of 15,000 square feet, in an area about one mile east of Kohala Schools.

It will provide home sites for some now living in plantation

camps which will be closed when Kohala Corporation ends sugar production in 1974.

"The Governor's Task Force, the Mayor's Task Force, Castle & Cook's Kohala Corporation, the ILWU, the Agricultural Extension Service and the people of Kohala have been working on developing new industries that would provide new jobs, broaden the agricultural base and improve the economic and social conditions of North Kohala," according to the staff.

The commission will take action on the special permit request in 45 to 90 days.

Marjorie Corley received a special permit to permit meat processing, packing, shipping and sales on a 20-acre parcel in Puna. Her plant will be located 300 feet mauka of the Keaau-Pahoa road, about one and one-half miles north of the Pahoa urban district.

About 80 per cent of her produce will be from pigs raised on the premeses, but no slaughtering will be done there.

Samuel K. Shimizu received a special permit to increase the size of Stan's Fishery in Honaunau.

Kona Realtor Ron Burla received another for <u>Sampson-Miller Associated Company</u>'s Kohala Estates, to locate a temporary sales office about two and one-half miles north of Kawaihae. He said the portable building would be removed as soon as 43 lots are sold in the first increment, or within two years, which ever occurs first.

The attorney for the Estate of Hannah H. Fukushima testified during a public hearing on land use boundaries for a 3.28-acre parcel three miles east of Waimea. Under the terms of the will dated October 3, 1967, the land is to be subdivided and sold, with the proceeds going to persons named in the will.

The staff report maintains that the reclassification would create a "scattered and sprawl type of urban growth." Attorney Bill Chillingworth told the Commission that under an alternative provision of the will, the property can be divided in two lots with, one going to one heir and the proceeds from the sale of the other going to the remaining nine inheritors.

The commission will take action upon the request within 45 to 90 days following a 15-day waiting period for the receipt of written testimony.

STAFF REPORT

SP72-134 - SAMPSON-MILLER ASSOCIATED CO., INC.

Mr. Ron Burla, agent for Sampson-Miller Associated
Companies, Inc., has petitioned the Land Use Commission for a
special permit to locate a temporary sales office on an 8.2-acre
parcel described as TMK 5-9-05: parcel 12, and situated within
the Agricultural District at Kahua 1st, North Kohala, Hawaii.
The petitioner intends to operate the sales office until all
of the 43 lots in the agricultural subdivision in which the
parcel is located are sold. He has submitted that the office
would serve to receive prospective buyers and to disseminate
sales information. The petitioner indicates that sanitary
facilities, a gas operated refrigerator, drinking water, and
refreshments will be available at this facility as well as the
necessary brochures, contracts, maps, and office equipment.

A small structure formerly used as a field office and which is intended to be used as the proposed sales office is presently located on the subject property. The parcel fronts the mauka side of the Kawaihae-Mahukona Road approximately 3 miles north of Kawaihae Harbor. Directly across the highway is a strip of vacant land along the shore which was designated Urban during

the 1969 five-year boundary review. Lands mauka of the highway lie within a vast Agricultural District generally used for pasture purposes. Soil classification by the Land Study Bureau indicates that the land is "E" or very poor for agriculture.

The slope ranges from 0 to 20 percent.

An access road to the subdivision is presently under construction. Lot sizes in this agricultural subdivision range from 5 acres to over 20 acres in area. The land is presently zoned unplanned and A-20a.

The Department of Transportation advises in a letter dated

June 21, 1972 to the Hawaii County Planning Department that:

- "1. The Kawaihae-Mahukona Road is a limited access highway and access to Lot 3 is permitted only off the subdivision road.
- "2. Also, upon completion of the access road connection, the Kawaihae-Mahukona Road will have deceleration-acceleration and left turn storage lanes."

The County Department of Water Supply had no objections to the proposal provided the petitioner "hauls his own water for use in the sales office".

County Recommendation

Approval of the special permit was recommended by the Hawaii County Planning Commission at its meeting of August 3, 1972 based on:

- "1. that the proposed temporary sales office would not be contrary to the objectives of the Land Use Law relating to the Agricultural District. The proposed use is of a temporary nature, and upon termination of the sales office use, the structure would be removed from the premises;
- "2. that the use would not adversely affect the surrounding area. Again, the use is of a temporary nature, and there are no residential units nearby;
- "3. that there would not be an unreasonable burden on public agencies to provide the necessary services. There will be no water or other facility requirement associated with the proposed use; and
- "4. that the subdivision for which the proposed structure is designed for is situated in a somewhat remote area and not in reasonable proximity to urban areas where real estate activities can occur."

Approval was contingent on the following:

- "1. that the sales office be permitted for a period of no more than two years from the official date of approval of this request or upon completion of the initial sale of the 43 lots, whichever is sooner;
- "2. that the sales operation be confined to only the selling of the forty-three (43) lots within that subdivision and not be used in any way for residential or quartering purposes;
- "3. that no other structure be erected to complement the temporary sales office operation;
- "4. that access to the temporary sales office be provided from the subdivision road and not off of the Mahukona-Kawaihae Road; and
- "5. that the temporary sales office be removed within 30 days upon completion of the lot sales."

Staff finds that the proposed temporary sales office substantially meets the guidelines established in the Land Use

District Regulations for determining an "unusual and reasonable" use and recommends that the special permit be approved subject to the five conditions established by the County.

The following comments are in response to your notification of boundary change applications A72-327, A72-329, A72-331 and special permit applications SP72-132, SP72-133, SP72-134, SP72-135:

A72-327 First Hawaiian Bank, Managing Trustee for Liliuokalani Trust and Palani Development Company Keahuolu, North Kona, Hawaii

Lands in this area are rated as Class E as they are either pahoehoe or aa lava flows, very poorly suited for agricultural uses. Rockiness of these lands combined with the uneven distribution of annual rainfall during the year make these lands unsuited for cropland uses.

The use of these lands for urban pursuits does not appear to entail any loss of productive agricultural lands.

A72-329 Estate of Hannah H. Fukushima South Kohala, Hawaii

This is predominantly in grazing and classified as Class c in that use. It is also rated as Class c for orchards. Soils are deep, well drained and nonstony with slopes less than 10 percent.

As this is in an Agricultural Zone, it might be a wise move to convass the area for undeveloped urban zoned lands before zoning more lands urban.

A72-331 Dept. of Land & Natural Resources North Kohala, Hawaii

The lands in the two parcels being considered for change of zoning from Agricultural to Urban Districts include the best agricultural lands found in the area. The lands are rated as Class B lands when irrigated. Soils are deep, nonstony, well drained on slopes less than 10 percent. All the lands in both parcels is suitable for cultivation.

Conversely, the soil and slope conditions make the area highly suitable for urban development provided there are adequate supporting facilities such as water, electricity and roads.

SP72-132 Ocean View Investment Company Ka'u, Hawaii

Lands are aa lava flows and not suitable for any agricultural uses. It would appear that this special permit application could be granted if the area is adequately serviced by all utilities and meets the zoning requirements of the County and State.

SP72-133 Marjorie Corley Puna, Hawaii

The lands are pahoehoe lava and are rated as Class E, very poorly suited for agricultural uses. The requested use appears acceptable as long as it conforms to the zoning requirements of the State & County.

SP72-134 Sampson-Miller Associated Co., Inc. North Kohala, Hawaii

The area is in grazing. It can be assumed that a temporary sales office would not be objectionable. However, a date should be included in the permit for the closing and removal of this office.

SP72-135 Samuel K. Shimizu South Kohala, Hawaii

The area is essentially pahoehoe lava. If the expansion of the facilities does not create a nuisance to existing structures, the expansion would appear to be allowable.

Land Use Commission Slates Meeting In Kona 9-13-7 H. Tiebene Hersel

KAILUA-Kona - State Land Use commissioners will meet here at the Kona Hilton at 1 p.m. Sept. 20 to take action on four special permit requests and to hold public hearings on three

zone changes.

On the action agenda is a special permit request by Ocean View Investment Company for a 25-acre shopping complex at its Ka'u subdivision, where people living in about 85 dwellings have to drive 14 to 32 miles for shopping, according to

testimony received during the County Planning Commission hearing Aug. 3.

Proposed is a five-year development plan which would provide a post office and grocery within a year, a service station and warehouse facility within two years, a playground and light manufacturing area in three, office space and an lumber yard in four and finally a motel and various shops.

County Planners have approved the proposal in incremental stages. Marjorie Corley of Puna has also asked for a permit to build a pork and meat processing operation including storage, packing, shipping and sales at Keonepoliniu.

The applicant told the Planning Commission recently that the processing plant would be a family operation with about six employees, that no slaughtering would be done at the site and that the processing plant would be 300 feet from the roadway.

Sampson-Miller Associated Company has also filed an application for a temporary sales office at its 4,155-acre Kohala Estates subdivision two and one-half miles north of Kawaihae Harbor.

Kona realtor Ron Burla is sales agent and Planning Commissioners were told the office would be needed for only two years. Out of an eventual offering of 210 lots from five to 25 acres in size, 43 are now ready for sale.

Samuel K. (Stan) Shimizu has received the County Planning Commission's support for a 12foot by 28-foot addition to Stan's Fishery in Honaunau.

His business is located oon the makai side of Mamalahoa Highway on approximately 10,000 square feet of land within Keei agricultural district. County Planners okayed the request Aug. 24.

Land Board members will hold public hearings on:

Urban zoning for 100 acres at Keahuolu, North Kona, for Phase III of the Queen Liliuokalani Village. Applicants told County Planners that they will try to build 150 units per year in the F.H.A.-insured, Act 108 development. Sixty units have been built.

Phase II proposes 122 more by July of 1973 and the area under consideration is planned for 216 more houses.

Developer Kenny Young told Planning County commissioners that 12 additional classrooms would be completed at Kealakehe School by 1975 to absorb the impact of the new housing.

Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) has applied for a boundary change for 40.16 acres agricultural to urban at Kahei in North Kohala for a residential subdivision. By March about 70 persons had signed up expressing interest in the 15,000 square foot lots. Bill Thompson of DLNR said at the time that the upset price for the 70 to 80 lots would probably be about \$7,000 depending upon how much improvement is required.

Hannah H. Fukushima of Waimea has applied also for urban zoning for 3.03 acres for a residential subdivision.

MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting of July 13, 1972 were approved as circulated.

SPECIAL PERMIT

DEPT. OF TRANSPORTATION

KEAUHOU 1st, NORTH KONA

Application of the Highways Division, State Department of Transportation for a special permit to allow the construction of a maintenance baseyard makai of the old Keauhou

School, Keauhou 1st, North Kona, TMK: 7-8-07:61.

The Chairman reported that this item has been pending for several months. Staff was requested to give the background again for the Commissioner's information.

Staff reported that the Department of Transportation, State of Hawaii, is requesting a special permit to allow the construction of a maintenance basevard consisting of a 4,800 square foot warehouse and a service station facility within a rural district.

The property in which the maintenance facilities are proposed to be located is a 0.973-acre parcel located fronting Kuakini Highway, makai of the old Keauhou School, in Keauhou 1st, North Kona, TMK: 7-8-7: 61.

The subject parcel is zoned for residential-agricultural use (RA-.5a) and designated for low density urban use on the land use pattern allocation map. This land use designation permits residential and ancillary community and public uses.

The parcel is presently vacant and surrounding land uses include the Kona Coast Kennels makai of Kuakini Highway, the Old Keauhou School property, the J. M. Tanaka quarry approximately one-fourth (1/4) mile north fronting the Mamalahoa Highway, the Baptist Church to the south at the entrance to Puuloa Subdivision and surrounding residential uses.

In support of the special permit request, the applicant has submitted the following:

A copy of this letter was sent to the attorney, who requested that action be deferred pending clarification from his client on whether the dwellings to be situated on this parcel would consitute farm dwellings as defined by the Land Use Commission or just basic residential units.

It was moved by Mr. Watt, seconded by Mr. Kawasaki and carried that this matter be deferred to a later date.

SPECIAL PERMIT

SAMPSON-MILLER ASSOCIATES for a special permit to allow a temporary KAHUA, WAIAKA, NORTH KOHALA sales office operation in conjunction with a subdivision located in Kahua lst, Kahua, Waiaka, North Kohala, TMK: 5-9-05:12.

Staff reported that a special permit application for a temporary sales office operation in conjunction with a subdivision has been submitted by Sampson-Miller Associated Companies, Inc. The proposed sales office is expected to be within a subdivision located in Kahua lst, Kahua, Waika, North Kohala, Hawaii.

The parcel, described as TMK: 5-9-05:12, is situated on the mauka side of the Kawaihae-Mahukona Road, approximately 2½ miles north of the Kawaihae Harbor.

The applicant proposes to use the temporary sales office to sell the lots within that subdivision. The land is presently zoned unplanned and A-20a, and the lot sizes range between seven to twenty-four acres. The applicant has currently received tentative approval on April 22, 1972 for a consolidation and resubdivision of the lands adjacent to the Kawaihae-Mahukona Road. The area for which tentative approval has been secured for consists of 22 lots ranging between 5 to 8.8 acres. The former area consisted of 14 lots with lot sizes ranging between 7 to 10 acres. Thus, the building would be used until the lots of the entire subdivision of 43 lots are sold.

The land is presently vacant of any residential structure. The soil classification rating is very poor, and the land is unsuited for machine tillability. There is an overall slope range of 0-20%.

In behalf of his request, the applicant has maintained that "the building for which this application for special permit is being submitted is to be used as a sales office for the duration of the sales. This is an unusual circumstance which will cease upon completion of the sale within this subdivision. We believe that it is not improper that a sales office be provided to receive the prospective buyers and disseminate information pertaining to the properties being offered for sale. We also believe that it's reasonable that this temporary sales office be permitted for the duration of the development and sale of Lot 2 of Land Court Consolidation 117. And, we also believe that this will not be in any way detrimental to the public health, safety, welfare, morals nor injurious to improvements or properties contiguous to or adjacent to the subject land."

The State Departments of Education and Health, as well as the County Departments of Research and Development, Fire, and Police had no pertinent comments to offer. The Department of Public Works commented that access from Lot 33 should be off of the Kawaihae-Mahukona Road and that a time limit for the special permit be imposed. Similarly, the Department of Transportation commented that since the Kawaihae-Mahukona road is a limited access highway, access to Lot 3 is permitted only off the subdivision road. They also added that "upon completion of the access road connection, the Kawaihae-Mahukona road will have decelerationacceleration and left turn storage lanes." The Department of Water Supply noted no objections to the request "provided the developer hauls his own water for use in the sales office." Mr. Kawasaki inquired whether any communications were received on this request after the public hearing. Staff reported that there were two letters received from the applicant himself and read the following letters for the Commissioner's information: "Gentlemen: "I appreciated the opportunity of appearing before the commission in regards to our special permit for a temporary sales office. "There is one point that I did not mention but feel is important to this temporary operation, and that is having sanitary facilities available at the site. We have had the opportunity over the weekend to have future clients look at the property and have noted the availability of drinking water and toilets greatly appreciated. "Again, I want to thank you for your consideration. "Very truly yours, /s/ RON BURLA Agent for Sampson Miller Associated Companies, Inc." "Dear Mr. Suefuji: "In addition to my letter dated July 19, 1972, same subject, I wish to add the following: In addition to the sanitary facilities for our customers and employees, we have secured a gas operated refrigerator in which to keep refreshments and cold drinking water. "Also, the office space is required in which to post the Master Control Sheet and tax map(s) for the area. We also will have literature, brochures, contracts, desks, and chairs. By having these facilities available actually on the site it will assist us immeasurably in expediting the sales of these lots and the construction of new homes in this area. The facilities are proposed to be located on approximately twenty (20) acres of land fronting the Keaau-Pahoa Road, Keonepoko-Nui, Puna, approximately one mile Keaau side of Kahakai Road, TMK: 1-5-08:portion 1.

Staff reported that an application has been submitted by Marjorie Corley requesting a special permit to allow the processing of pork and meat products; specifically sausages and European specialities and cold cuts, and the storage, packing, shipping, and sale of these products.

The applicant has stated that this will be a small family type operation employing approximately six (6) persons. The operation will be on a small scale in the beginning with the remainder of the land to be used for diversified agriculture.

The applicant proposes to raise the majority of the pork on the premises and will purchase the beef elsewhere. No slaughtering will take place on the premises. Their operation will consist of approximately 80% pork and 20% beef products.

The area under consideration is a twenty (20) acre area owned by the State and which is located adjacent to a five (5) acre parcel leased to the applicant. The Department of Land and Natural Resources has approved the sale of a lease contingent upon approval of the special permit. The lease would be a 55-year lease for general agriculture-residence purposes.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN of the public hearing to be held by the Planning Commission of the County of Hawaii to consider the following application for a special permit within the County of Hawaii in accordance with the provision of Section 98H-6, Revised Laws of Hawaii 1955, as amended:

The public hearing is for the purpose of allowing a special permit to establish a temporary sales office operation in conjunction with a subdivision located in Kahua lst, Kahua, Waika, North Kohala, Tax Map Key 5-9-05:12.

CHAIRMAN: The first special permit for a public hearing is on the application of Sampson-Miller Assoc. to allow a temporary sales office operation in conjunction with a subdivision located in Kahua 1st, Kahua, Waika, North Kohala.

We will have the staff give us background on this request.

STAFF PLANNER FUKE: Mr. Chairman and members of the Commission. A special permit application for a temporary sales office operation in conjunction with a subdivision has been submitted by Sampson-Miller Associated Companies, Inc. The proposed sales office is expected to be within a subdivision located in Kahua 1st, Kahua, Waika, North Kohala, Hawaii.

The parcel, described by Tax Map Key 5-9-05:12, is situated on the mauka side of the Kawaihae-Mahukona Road, Approximately 2-1/2 miles north of the Kawaihae Harbor.

The applicant proposes to use the temporary sales office to sell the lots within that subdivision. The land is presently zoned unplanned and A-20a, and the lot sizes range between seven to twenty-four acres. The applicant has currently received tentative approval on April 22, 1972 for a consolidation and resubdivision of the lands adjacent to the Kawaihae-Mahukona Road. The area for which tentative approval has been secured for consists of 22 lots ranging between 5 to 8.8 acres. The former area consisted of 14 lots with lot sizes ranging between 7 to 10 acres.

The land is presently vacant of any residential structure. The soil classification rating is very poor, and the land is unsuited for machine tillability. There is an overall slope range of 0 to 20 per cent.

In behalf of his request, the applicant has maintained that "the building for which this application for special permit is being submitted is to be used as a sales office for the duration of the sales. This is an unusual circumstance which will cease upon completion of the sale within this subdivision. We believe that it is not improper that a sales office be provided to receive the prospective buyers and disseminate information pertaining to the properties being offered for sale. We also believe that it's reasonable that this temporary sales office be permitted for the duration of the development and sale of Lot 2 of Land Court Consolidation 117. And, we also believe that this will not be in any way detrimental to the public health, safety, welfare, morals nor injurious to improvements or properties contiguous to or adjacent to the subject land."

The State Departments of Education and Health, as well as the County Departments of Research and Development, Fire, and Police had no pertinent comments to offer. The Department of Public Works commented that access from Lot 33 should be off of the Kawaihae-Mahukona Road and that a time limit for the special permit be imposed. Similarly, the Department of Transportation commented that since the Kawaihae-Mahukona Road is a limited access highway, access to Lot 3 is permitted only off the subdivision road. They also added that "upon completion of the access road connection, the Kawaihae-Mahukona Road will have deceleration-acceleration and left turn storage lanes." The Department of Water Supply noted no objections to the request "provided the developer hauls his own water for use in the sales office."

CHAIRMAN: All right, do the Commissioners have any questions you want to direct to the staff on this application?

COMMISSIONER VERIATO: What is the time limit proposed for the development of this?

STAFF PLANNER FUKE: No time limit. According to the applicant's written testimony, they claim that they want this sales office for the duration until all the land has been sold.

COMMISSIONER VALERA: Is this for the entire subdivision or for each increment of the subdivision?

STAFF PLANNER FUKE: Our understanding of the application was for the entire area, not only for the currently received plans for consolidation and resubdivision.

COMMISSIONER VALERA: How many parcels are involved?

STAFF PLANNER FUKE: There will be 22 lots. The area right now in the Agricultural - 5 acre section and the Unplanned section consists of 14

lots. For that plan which has been received for consolidation and resubdivision and when that subdivision receives final approval, they will have an increase of 8 lots from 14 to 22 lots. All right, any further questions to the staff? If not, is the applicant or representative here to give testimony? RON BURLA: My name is Ron Burla. I represent Sampson-Miller as their sales agent. There is not too much I can say about this thing. I just came in to it within the last two weeks. There seems to have been a number of slip ups in securing proper permits and we are ourselves in a position that whatever the department wants us to do, we will do. I will be glad to answer any questions that I can about the sales program. We have been restricted from any selling whatsoever when the application for the resubdivision of the 22 units were place. So, we have had

no sales activity of any nature whatsoever. The length of the sales program would be a guess. If they want to limit to a specific period of time, it is acceptable to us, and we will just have to live with whatever the Planning Commission wants us to do.

CHAIRMAN: If this permit were not granted, where would the sales probably have to take place?

BURLA: We would probably have to open an office - sales office, a branch office, office in Waimea or rent an office in Kawaihae.

CHAIRMAN: You will plan to have sales situated in this sales office at all times?

BURLA: Well, we probably will establish a broker as a branch office if this is required by the regulatory agencies and have it staffed whenever it is necessary to show the property to prospective buyers.

CHAIRMAN: If you did something like this, I take it that it would be related just to this particular property; or if you established a branch office there, you would have a sales clerk probably.

BURLA: No, it will be related only to this particular subdivision.

CHAIRMAN: Commissioners have any questions you want to direct to Mr. Burla?

COMMISSIONER WATT: This temporary office here is a model of a home you built or is it something special just for sale of lots?

BURLA: No Sir. This office was originally designated as a temporary field office. It is merely a one - it is a 2-room with a bathroom prefab type house that was put up. It was previously used as a working field office.

CHAIRMAN: So, actually it is a structure that you would like to use as a sales office. It is already in existence.

BURLA: It is in existence. It has its own water system and sewerage system.

STAFF PLANNER FUKE: Mr. Chairman, the staff would like to ask Mr. Burla several questions.

CHAIRMAN: All right.

STAFF PLANNER FUKE: The purpose of the sales office to be is for the selling of all the lots within the 20 acres as well as the 5-acre lots or at least for the 5-acre portion?

BURLA: Again, we be guided by whatever the Commission wants us to do.

STAFF PLANNER FUKE: What was the intent of your application? It wasn't clear to us.

BURLA: The intent or the time?

STAFF PLANNER FUKE: All you mention in your application was that for the selling of lots within that subdivision. We didn't know whether it referred to the area which has presently received tentative approval or included that area as well as the area of the 20-acre subdivision.

BURLA: We would like naturally to have it for the total of the 43 lots that are in the resubdivision and the 20-acre parcels. We have stopped all offerings, not only on the 5 and resubdivided portions but on the 20 acres and the 25-acre parcels.

STAFF PLANNER FUKE: Another thing, in a letter dated June 9, we requested a floor plan and preliminary construction drawing be submitted to this department for our review. Is it possible that we could get a copy of that?

BURLA: Yes, I have it here. The plans, again, were supposed to have been sent by the contractor and it was not followed up, but I have copies of the floor plan and the physical layout of its location. I was also requested to have 12 copies of the proposed sales office's actual location, so I have the location maps. (Mr. Burla presented the maps to the staff.)

CHAIRMAN: Do the Commissioners or staff have any further questions to direct to Mr. Burla? If not then, thank you very much for your testimony Mr. Burla.

Anyone else here who wishes to give testimony in favor of this application? If not, is there anyone who wishes to give testimony in opposition to this application?

Do the Commissioners have any further questions or discussion before we close the public hearing. If not, I will entertain a motion.

COMMISSIONER KAWASAKI: So move.

COMMISSIONER WATT: Second.

CHAIRMAN: Motion seconded that the public hearing be closed. All those in favor, would you signify by saying aye.

MEMBERS: Aye.

CHAIRMAN: Any opposed - no? Motion is carried. The public hearing is closed.

As stated previously, it will take until 15 days to pass; and during that time, a written testimony may be submitted in conjunction with this application.

The public hearing was adjourned at 5:13 p.m.

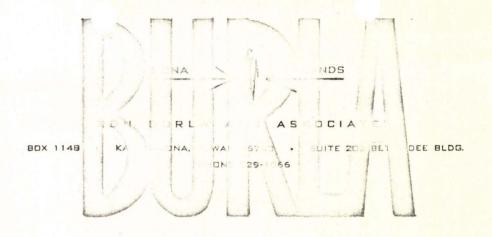
