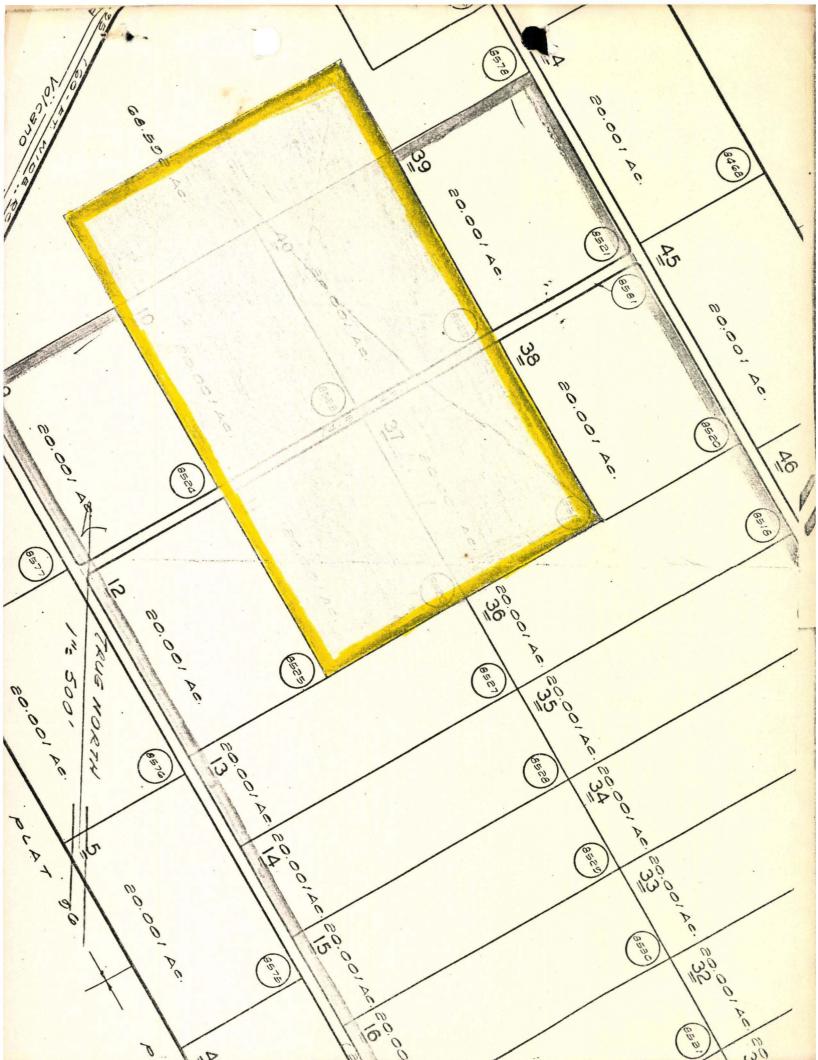

HILO - The State Land Use Commission denied two applications for changes from agricultural to rural use yesterday. The commission also conducted public hearings on three other applications.

Commissioners ran into a technical roadblock in reaching their negative decision on a request by John M. Mahi of North Kona who sought to subdivide his 3.3 acres of agricultural land into four rural lots.

First, a motion for approval by Commissioner A. J! Napier failed to win a second. Then, a motion to deny the petition resulted in a 4-2 vote with Napier and Chairman Goro Inaba of Kona opposed. However, the commission's rules require five votes for action.

THE COMMISSION adjourned and huddled with their legal adviser before resuming the meeting several minutes later to take a second vote. This time, Napier moved, for approval and Stanley Sakahashi of Kauai provided a second. The resulting vote was 3-3 which rendered a decision of denial for the request, according to a deputy attorney general.

The difficulty yesterday was caused by the absence Commissioners Eddie Tangen and Dr. Shelly Mark and by a vacancy on the commission.

Earlier, the commission turned down a petition by Tasuji Takasaki of North Hilo to reclassify 10.2 acres of land at Mauuma from agricultural to rural.

THE COMMISSION staff objected to the application.

The vote to deny carried 5-1 with Inaba objecting.

The commission approved a special permit for the Kohala Hongwanji Mission to build a new church in the agricultural district at Halaula, North Kohala, and a special permit to Hawaiian Anthuriums, Ltd., for a quarry operation on 100 acres in an agricultural district near Mountain View. A similar request for 600 acres was denied in November 1971.

Action was deferred on an agricultural to urban request by Harold Block and Ronald Harris to reclassify 10 acres of land near Laupahoehoe School in North

THE DECISION will be made at the next meeting to be held at 7:30 p.m. Friday at Lihue Library on Kauai.

Commissioners also held hearings on a request to change 62 acres from urban to agricultural in North Kohala as a result of a development change; a 1.5-acre agricultural to urban request by Mabel Davis of Waimea; and a 14,172square foot agricultural to urban request by W. H. Shipman Ltd., of Keaau.

There was no public testimony on any of the applications. Commissioners re-ceived staff reports and comments from the peti-.tioners.

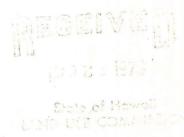

A special permit to allow the establishment of a quarry operation and water storage reservoirs for anthuriums and other agricultural uses within the State Land Use Agricultural District at Mt. View, Puna, Hawaii, has been requested by Hawaiian Anthuriums, Ltd. The subject property is situated approximately 2 miles makai of the Volcano Road and midway between the Eden Roc Estates and Crescent Acres subdivisions. The area includes approximately 100 acres of land and is described as Tax Map Key 1-1-100: parcels 40, 37, 11, 10 and portion of 8.

The applicant proposes to excavate and process the quarry material for use on construction projects. Open pit excavation is proposed and approximately 10 million cubic yards of material is estimated to be mined. The duration of the operation is projected to last ten (10) years. Upon termination of the quarry operation, the excavated sites will be converted into water reservoirs for agricultural uses.

The applicant owns the property upon which the quarry site is being proposed as well as the lands adjacent to the quarry site. The subject area is presently overgrown with vegetation and unused. Situated north of the subject property is Hawaiian Anthuriums, Ltd.'s 12 acre anthurium farm operation, the Eden Roc subdivision including approximately 1,000 one-acre lots and 1 dwelling is located to the west and Crescent Acres subdivision consisting of approximately 2,000 two-acre lots and 8 dwellings is situated to the east. The general area surrounding the subject property is substantially vacant or in cane cultivation.

The Land Study Bureau soil classification indicates that the land consists of almost base pahoehoe with no soil material; contains slopes from 0-35 percent; is located in an area where the rainfall exceeds 100 inches annually and is very poorly suited for overall crop use.

County zoning for the area is A-3a and the property has been designated for orchard development on the General Plan land use

pattern guide map. This designation refers to those lands which are rocky in physical make-up but are capable of supporting macadamia nut, papaya, citrus and other similar agricultural products.

COUNTY RECOMMENDATION

At its meeting of February 23, 1973, the Hawaii County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the special permit based on the following findings:

- "1. That the operation of the quarry and related uses is of a temporary nature, and as such, would not be contrary to the long-term objectives of the land use law; and
- "2. That it is recognized that the proposed use will substantially alter the character as, upon termination of quarry operations, the area will be converted into water storage areas. However, this change in character will result in positive improvement to the land. The converted use of the land would provide a more dependable source of water, making the general area more conducive for agricultural development. In this manner, the land use law's intent to preserve and promote agricultural use would be furthered."

Approval is subject to the following conditions:

- "1. All State and County standards and appropriate safety measures shall be exercised by the applicant to assure optimum vehicular traffic safeguards during the entire period of operation;
- "2. That the applicant prepare a plan indicating the areas proposed to be excavated and later converted into water storage areas and submit said plan to the Planning Department for review prior to beginning operation;
- "3. That the applicant obtain authorization for construction from the Department of Health prior to construction of any facilities;
- "4. That the applicant obtain a permit to operate from the Department of Health prior to operation and for continued operation of the facilities;
- "5. That every precaution be taken by the applicant to avert any inconvenience such as traffic, noise, and dust problems to surrounding properties;

"6. That the quarry operation be limited to the hours of 6:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays;

- "7. That the Planning Department shall make periodic inspections to see that no adverse effects are being created by the quarry operation such as dust, noise and indiscriminate excavation. If it is determined that adverse effects are created the Planning Commission shall have the authority to require the applicant to cease and desist the operation;
- "8. That the Planning Commission shall review the progress of the operation no later than five years from the date of approval and may declare the permit null and void if no reasonable progress is assured. The maximum period of quarrying operation shall be ten (10) years from the date of approval with the five (5) year mandatory review; and
- "9. That upon expiration of the quarrying permit, the applicant shall remove all temporary support facilities and equipment from the area."

No objections or comments were received from the Departments of Public Works, Water Supply, State Highways, Education, Police and Fire. The Department of Research and Development has endorsed this special use proposal.

On November 5, 1971, the Land Use Commission voted to deny a similar request by the same petitioner involving approximately 645 acres in the same location. The request was denied on the grounds that the petition was inadequate, tentative and too indefinite in nature to justify approval.

Many of the concerns of the Land Use Commission at that time have been considered and incorporated into the conditions recommended by the Hawaii County Planning Commission. It is further noted that the petitioner has reduced the area considerably, from 645 acres to 100 acres.

Upon evaluation of this request, staff finds that:

- it would not unreasonably burden public agencies to provide necessary services and improvements;
- the water reservoir system would enhance the agricultural development of the area;

- 3. adequate conditions have been recommended to be imposed by the County to take care of identified concerns related to the proposed use.
- 4. the surrounding areas will not be adversely affected in that much of the surrounding areas are unused, vacant and belong to the applicant.

Based on the above findings, staff recommends that this permit be approved subject to the conditions set forth by the Hawaii County Planning Commission.

CHAIRMAN: We are down to the last one. Public hearing on the application of Hawaiian Anthuriums, Ltd., for a special permit to allow a quarry operation on approximately 100 acres of land, Tax Map Key 1-1-100:8 (portion), 10, 11, 37 and 40, located approximately 1100 feet makai of the Volcano Road (16-17 mile post) midway between the Eden Roc Estates and Crescent Acres subdivisions, Mt. View, Puna. Estimated time of operation is ten years. The site is to be converted into water storage reservoirs for anthurium and other agricultural uses.

Staff presentation please.

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: Mr. Chairman and Commissioners. A special permit has been applied for by Hawaiian Anthuriums, Ltd., to allow quarry operations on property located within the State Land Use agricultural dis-

The proposed site consists of one hundred (100) acres located approximately two (2) miles makai of the Volcano Road. The site is located between the Crescent Acres and the Eden Roc Estates subdivision with access provided from South Kopua Road.

The applicant cwns the property upon which the quarry site is being proposed, as well as the lands immediately counding the proposed site. property is presently overgrown with native vegetation and vacant.

To the southwest is located the Eden Rcc subdivision consisting of 1809 one-acre lots and 1 dwelling and the Crescent Acres subdivision consisting of 2021 two-acre lots and 8 dwellings. An agricultural subdivision consisting of twenty-acre lots and owned by the applicant is located to the south. A twelve-acre anthurium farm operation and a dwelling both owned by the applicant is located to the north, adjacent to the proposed site. With the exception of a few scattered dwellings, the surrounding area is substantially vacant or in cane cultivation.

The overall productivity rating for the land is "F" or very poorly suited for agricultural production. The land in this area is topped by pahoehoe with no soil materials. The slope of the land is less than 20 per cent and there is moderate drainage of rainfall which averages 170 inches annually.

County zoning for the area is A-3a and the property has been designated for orchard development on the land use pattern guide map. designation refers to those lands though rocky in character can support, productive macadamia nuts, papaya, citrus and other similar products.

The applicant proposes to conduct quarry operations to excavate and process material for use on construction projects. Open pit excavation is proposed and approximately 10 million cubic yards is estimated to be excavated. Hours of operation will be 6:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday and occasionally on Saturday. Duration of the operation is expected to last ten (10) years.

Upon termination of the quarry operations, the excavated sites will be converted into water reservoirs for the anthurium nursery and other agricultural uses.

No objections or comments have been expressed by the departments of Public Works, Water Supply, State Highways, Education, Police, and Fire. The Department of Research and Development has endorsed the project, stating that "adequate water is one of the essential elements for successful agricultural operations. The County is striving to expand the diversified agricultural industry."

The Department of Health has requested additional data in order to evaluate the request. The applicant has been informed to supply the information to the Department of Health.

Thank you.

CHAIRMAN: Didn't we give favorable action on this once before?

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: Yes, a similar request involving 646 acres was considered for a quarry operation. At that time, this Commission endorsed the project but the Land Use Commission denied.

COMMISSIONER YASUTAKE: May I ask the staff a question?

CHAIRMAN: Sure, go ahead.

COMMISSIONER YASUTAKE: Did anyone of these people that are living out there have anything to say? Any remarks?

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: We have not received any written replies. There may be people here in the audience.

CHAIRMAN: Is the applicant here?

HAROLD TANOUYE: Mr. Chairman, Commission members. My name is Harold Tanouye. I am one of the officers for the Hawaiian Anthurium Corporation. The Secretary-Treasurer was supposed to be nere, but then he has to be in Kona for business and so I am pinch-hitting for him. Whatever was mentioned here has probably covered all the necessary area that we have in our mind.

CHAIRMAN: Is there any question?

COMMISSIONER YASUTAKE: May I ask one question Harold?

TANOUYE: Yes.

COMMISSIONER YASUTAKE: The question that our Chairman asked, we gave it a favorable answer the last time. Can you tell us why it was turned down by/Land Use Commission?

TANOUYE: So our people contacted the Land Use Commission in Honolulu and they said the reason why they turned down is because of 640 acres; but then our feelings were, of course like you take now even this 100 acres, it's a known thing that it's not going to be a 100-acre crater created and going to be one massive reservoir. It's going to be spotted here and there and the 640 acres that we previously applied which was turned down by the Land Use Commission was because they felt 640 acres were too large and they recommended that why don't you go in smaller; and you know you finish one block and you want to go to the next then you apply again. And so, this is what has come about. Thank you.

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: Could I make another comment. In going through the State Land Use Commission's minutes, there was also concern expressed about the safety of the bridge at the beginning of the South Kopua Road. It has been noted that the safe load on the bridge is only 6 tons. They felt that with the quarry material being daily passing through this bridge, there was some concern about the adequacy of the bridge. Could the applicant make a commitment to improve the bridge should that be required. It's possible that a condition like this will be attached to the application.

TANOUYE: Of course, I don't have the authority to go ahead; but then, of course, I can take this back to our people you know.

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: Yes. Well, could you ask your people to consider these conditions?

TANOUYE: But another thing too, Sir. Up at Eden Roc, there is a very sizable anthurium nursery that's going on. Now, they've hauled Pahoa cinders, not Pahoa, Kapoho cinders which is a little lighter material. But then, they have been putting those material in through this same access road - Kopua Road. One of those diesel tractors with a full 30-yard trailer and another huge semi-trailer and a full trailer you know; and that's way beyond the bridge capacity - I don't know. And, of course, I don't now see those trucks hauling them, but they were hauling them for months!

CHAIRMAN: I think that covers that end of it. In other words, if that stipulation was attached to it, you people would at least take some kind of action in response to that.

TANOUYE: I would imagine so.

COMMISSIONER STERLING: I have a question.

CHAIRMAN: Go ahead.

COMMISSIONER STERLING: After these reservoirs were established, would you sell the water to the various anthurium growers?

TANOUYE: No, we are the only growers there.

COMMISSIONER STERLING: In that area?

TANOUYE: Our group owns 2500 acres there and this is all for this company, so we are trying to expand.

COMMISSIONER STERLING: By putting in your own water service.

TANOUYE: That's right and of course there are water service way up on the Volcano Road.

COMMISSIONER STERLING: What elevation is this?

TANOUYE: Roughly speaking, I would say, I don't know the specific elevation but roughly speaking, about 1500 feet I think.

COMMISSIONER STERLING: With the staff, I am surprised that the Board of Water Supply didn't have any comments on this project.

TANOUYE: Board of Water Supply says they have no objection.

COMMISSIONER STERLING: As I was looking through the County General Plan, I don't know whether they wanted to acquire all the existing water systems but I can see where this is as good as far as you folks are trying

to provide your own water system. My other question is on the road that you've answered. Will the Land Use Commission's report be included in your report - the minutes of the Land Use Commission on the reducing of the area from 640 acres to 100 acres.

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: They are included in the original application that was processed a year or two ago.

TANOUYE: This is completely a new application.

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: Yes. This involves basically the same location but a smaller area.

TANOUYE: For your information gentlemen, we experienced the so-called drought. We have a small 50,000 gallon reservoir. We did not take permit when we excavated and the Yamada's tractor came and excavated that 50,000 gallon reservoir; but nevertheless, cleaning has to be done, then we brought in Pahoa cinders, lined them up fine and we put our below lava line and of course even in that 50,000 gallon, we got about 15 acres of anthurium under cultivation. Now, for day and night going and for days and weeks we don't have rain that this anthuriums aren't/to bloom; but it's a good thing we had that; and up at the hapuu mill, just about a quarter mile up, we had another 50,000 so we drained that water completely dry too and we have been having of course the slight sprinkle every now and then. Otherwise, it would have been disastrous thing for our corporation.

DEPUTY PLANNING DIRECTOR: Mr. Tanouye, have you or your representative contacted the Department of Health officials in so far as your request over here.

TANOUYE: I was told by Yutaka Imata and Associates that they have cleared this away also.

DEPUTY PLANNING DIRECTOR: Because, if I am not mistaken, the Department of Health has recently come forth with some new regulation regarding quarry operation relating to dust control and area control.

TANOUYE: And in this area of course, it is not one of those dense ohia forest you know; but there are quite a few ohia trees. You could consider that's an ohia forest you know.

DEPUTY PLANNING DIRECTOR: I am bringing this up particularly in relation to the water requirement. Quite possibly because the Department of Health might require to hose down the area for example to minimize the dust problem. So, I just thought of bringing it up so that you could probably make a preliminary work with the Department of Health.

TANOUYE: Ordinarily when it's not raining, we don't experience. Every year, we experience 30 days of drought. You know that you have very limited rainfall in the Mt. View area where we are located; but then ordinarily after that drought break, we get too much rain; and so far as the dust problem is concerned other than drought time, you know for about 3 weeks or a month, I don't think we will have because you are going to have all of these. Our rainfall are much heavier during the evening over the daytime rain. And, of course, I was informed by Yutaka Imata and Associates people that they have cleared this away with the Board of Health people also.

CHAIRMAN: Okay, thank you.

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: Just for Commissioners' information, on this presentation map, we have indicated the 100-acre site and these markings in red represent location of dwellings. The wind blows in this direction here (indicated on the map); so if any dwelling is affected, it would be this dwelling here and this is approximately 2,500 feet away or a little less than half a mile.

TANOUYE: Is that Crescent Acres?

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: This is Eden Roc.

TANOUYE: Oh, Eden Roc.

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: If any dust blows, assuming normal trade wind, it would be in this direction (indicated on the map).

TANOUYE: And Eden Roc belonged to our company at one time. We sold the land to the developer. The developer is Eden Roc. Now, I know exactly where the home is situated. All from around this area, this is the road or thereabouts (indicated on the map)./way up here it is heavily densed with ohia trees, so this guy has a home you know and ohia forest all around that acreage.

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: Yes, the forest line starts at about Eden Roc.

TANOUYE: Just about below that.

CHAIRMAN: When you word the special permit application, you will need to meet all the health laws.

STAFF PLANNER MIYAO: Yes, that has been the normal procedures. Just to clarify things, we have talked to the Public Health official representative here. According to his talk with us, this information was not provided, so Mr. Tanouye, could you recheck with Mr. Imata?

TANOUYE: I will check first thing in the morning.

CHAIRMAN: This is another special permit. We can't take any action for 15 days. Mr. Tanouye, thank you.

Is there anybody here wishing to give testimony here for or against this application? No further testimony?

COMMISSIONER YASUTAKE: Mr. Chairman, I move that we close the public hearing.

COMMISSIONER KAI: Second.

CHAIRMAN: It has been moved and seconded that the public hearing be closed. All in favor signify with aye.

COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

CHAIRMAN: I think we only got 3 votes.

COMMISSIONER STERLING: We voted to close public hearing.

COMMISSIONER KAI: I seconded so I said aye.

CHAIRMAN: Any nay? Okay, carried, closed.

Public hearing was adjourned at 6:35 p.m.

Action was deferred for the same foregoing reason.

DOLPHIN, INC. KAILUA-KONA Discussion on conditions of variance granted to Dolphin, Inc., in regards to proposed condominium/commercial building.

Conditions under consideration is that "the construction conform substantially to drawings as submitted" with variance request.

The Chairman read the following comments which were telephone in from Mokuaikaua Church:

- "1. We basically agree with keeping of the architectually pleasing existing building in front.
- "2. We hope that in the parking design, some form of trellis be installed on the north-facing side (where it'll face church)."

Staff made the following presentation:

On September 25, 1970, a variance was granted to Dolphin, Inc. by the Planning Commission, to allow the construction of an additional five (5) condominium apartment units over the maximum allowable number of ninety-two (92) units and to allow a ten (10) per cent reduction in the number of required parking stalls. The subject variances were in conjunction with the proposed Dolphin Condominium complex which was to be located in Kailua Village, on property described as tax map key 7-5-07:14, 16, 17, 41, 42, & 43.

In granting the subject variances, the Commission found that:

1. the developer had limited the height of the proposed structure to four (4) stories and a basement as opposed to the maximum height of seven (7) stories or ninety feet, whichever is less.

Inasmuch as the objective is to reduce height and bulk, a review of the submitted design did reveal that the height was being reduced and that the inclined open envelopes created from both the Mokuaikaua Church and Alii Drive did create vistas around the church and Alii Drive and did reduce the bulk of the building.
