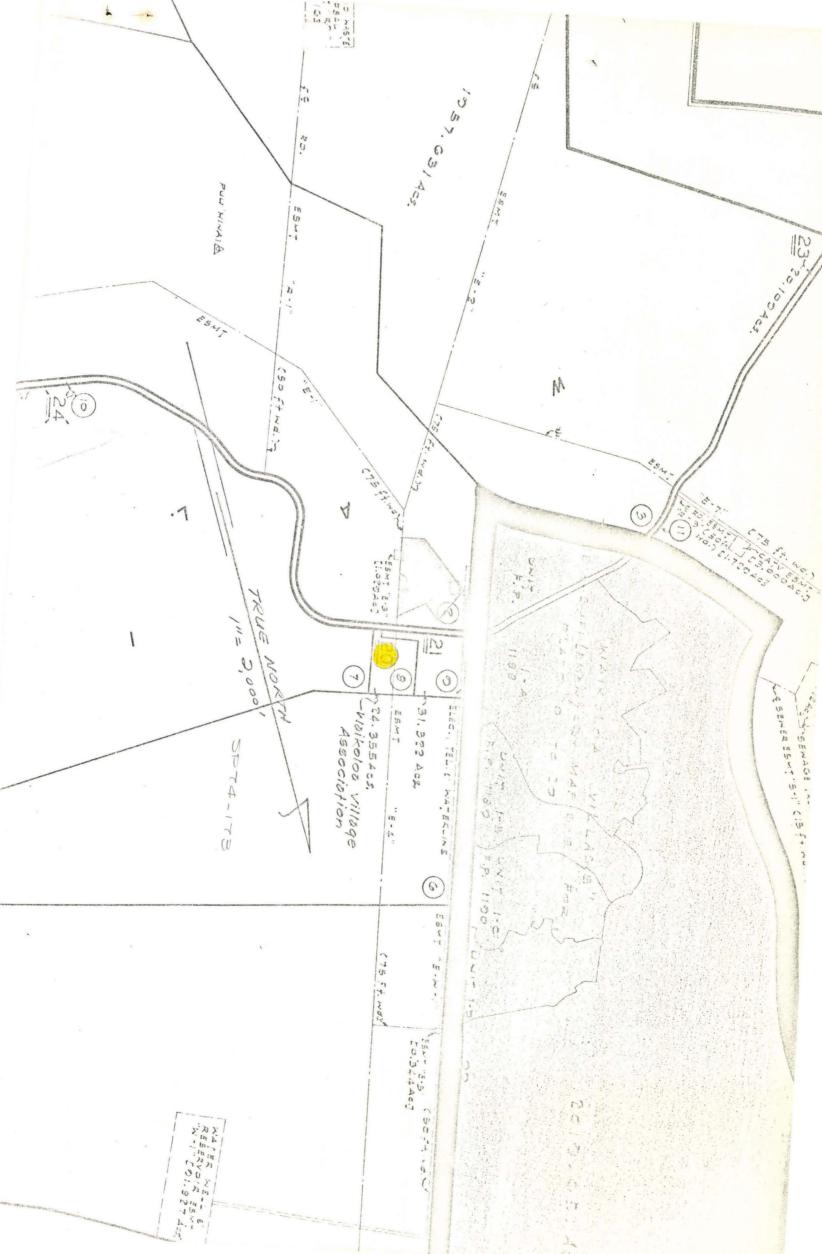

Pursuant to Section 205-6 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Hawaii County Planning Commission has transmitted the findings and decision on a special permit submitted by the Waikoloa Village Association to allow the expansion of an existing equestrian center to include a tack shop and a refreshment stand. The building is situated on a 24 acre portion of Tax Map Key 6-8-02: 20 which lies in the Agricultural District at Waikoloa, South Kohala, Hawaii.

The site fronts the north boundary of Waikoloa Road approximately 1,500 feet from the Waikoloa Urban District. Existing facilities presently include the stables, a storage area, and a sales pavilion. It is noted that the sales pavilion was approved under a special permit granted in January 1971 and will expire on August 15, 1974, unless an extension is approved.

The proposed tack and snack shops will be constructed in a walkway area which is presently roofed, and will involve only 546 square feet of the total 7,000 square feet comprising the equestrian center. Petitioner indicates that the facilities would allow greater public usage of the facility and would simply be an accessory to an existing facility. Riding accessories, equipment and attire will be sold in the tack shop which will occupy 420 square feet. The refreshment stand will take up the remaining 126 square feet of space. The facilities are not designed for everyday use but only for special rodeo and equestrian events. A recent horse racing event attracted about 2,000 people.

No adverse comments have been received from governmental or private agencies.

COUNTY RECOMMENDATION

On April 10, 1974, the Hawaii County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the request as the proposed use will be an accessory use which will meet consumer demand for

riding accessories; would not adversely affect surrounding property as it will be located in an existing building; will not burden public agencies as neededservices are available; and that the facilities will add to the convenience of the general public.

Conditions stipulated are:

- "1. That the applicant, Waikoloa Village Association, be responsible for constructing the facility and operating the facility within one (1) year from the official date of approval by the State Land Use Commission should such be granted; and
- "2. All applicable rules and regulations shall be complied with including 'Plan Approval'."

Staff concurs with the findings and recommendations of the Hawaii County Planning Commission and also recommends approval of the request subject to the 2 conditions stipulated.

CHAIRMAN: Item No. 9. Public hearing on the application of the Waikoloa Village Association for a special permit to allow the expansion of the existing equestrian center to include an area for a tack shop and a refreshment stand. The proposed uses will be situated on portions of a 24+ acre parcel, TMK: 6-8-02:20, Waikoloa, South Kohala.

Staff, when you are ready.

YAMASATO: Mr. Chairman and Commissioners. A special permit has been submitted by Waikoloa Village Association to allow the construction of a Tack Shop and a Snack Bar as an accessory use to an existing Equestrian Center at Waikoloa, South Kohala.

The Equestrian Center is situated approximately 6 miles makai of Mamalahoa Highway via the New Waikoloa Road and approximately 1,000 feet east or mauka of the 2,865 acre Waikoloa Urban district.

The subject area of approximately 24 acres is located within the State Land Use "Agricultural" district and because of the commercial aspects of the proposed use, a special permit is required.

The County zoning designation is "Unplanned" while the General Plan land use pattern allocation guide map designates the area for "Extensive Agricultural uses."

The Land Study Bureau's soil productivity rating for the area is "E" or very poor. The land is volcanic ash, well drained, relatively level and unsuited for machine tillability.

The proposed tack shop and snack bar will be located in an area that is presently under roof.

The applicant has submitted the following in support of the request:

"The special permit is for an accessory use to an existing permitted use, an equestrian center in an agricultural district.

"The special permit would allow the conversion of parts of the equestrian center to a tack shop and a refreshment stand.

"Involved would be some 546 square feet of space, most of which is presently under roof, of a total of 7,000 square feet existing in the equestrian center.

"The additions would not be contrary to the objectives of the Land Use Law, inasmuch as they would simply be accessory to an existing, permitted facility.

"The use would not adversely affect surrounding property, but would in fact permit greater public usage of a permitted facility.

"There would be no unreasonable burden on public agencies, and no additional utility facilities would be needed.

"Unusual trends that have arisen include increased usage of the permitted facility and growing demand for the accessory items.

"The petitioner believes that the proposed use, since it will be strictly accessory to the existing, permitted, use will not alter or change the character of the land.

"By making the existing equestrian center better able to serve the public, this accessory use would make a higher and better use of the land involved

"The tack shop would be approximately 420 square feet in size, and would be located in a walkway area of the existing building that is already under roof. It would be used to satisfy a growing demand for riding-related accessories, such as pants, footwear, cowboy hats, scarves and such, for visitors to the facility who need such items, and for accessories such as bits, reins, saddles and other items of riding equipment for people who board horses at Waikoloa.

"The refreshment stand, which would cover only 126 square feet of area, would replace the tables which presently are moved into the center on a make-shift arrangement for food service during equestrian events. This permanent setup would be more efficient and more sanitary and would be used only during equestrian events at the center."

All cooperating agencies had no comments or objections to the request.

Thank you.

CHAIRMAN: Any question to the staff? Mr. Sterling.

STERLING: What's the relationship between Boise Cascade and this application?

YAMASATO: We have the applicant here. They can answer the question better than I can.

JOHNSON: You had no comments from the Liquor Department?

YAMASATO: No, we did not.

CHAIRMAN: Any other question?

The applicant or the representative please.

WALT SOUTHWARD: Yes, Mr. Chairman and members of the Commission. I am two bodies - Manager of Waikoloa Village Association and the Boise Cascade Home and Land Corporation - to answer Commissioner Sterling's question. The Waikoloa Village Association is an agency made up also of the property owners. If you will remember, some of the land were given over to the property owners. Boise Cascade has a management agreement with the property owners to run these facilities.

With me today, who basically runs the Waikoloa Village Association are Albert Akana, Village Manager, and George Purdy, former Hawaii State cowboy roping champion, who is Assistant Manager and Director of our activities.

STERLING: In fact, the property owners can be treated the same for additional recreational facilities.

SOUTHWARD: In this particular instance, they are not asking for additional recreational facility.

STERLING: Just the stand and tack shop?

SOUTHWARD: These stables have been an operational unit for two and a half years. We are in the midst of a \$5,000 expansion. More people want to do these kind of things. We have a number of major activities. We are fortunate to get George Purdy, champion rodeo roper. Residents have increased. We have 11 boarder horses left there plus 14 horses we operate for riding and rodeo events. Boarders and owner/operators need riding equipment, pants, footwear and other accessories. The nearest available is 17 miles away - a long way when you need a new bit. If you happen to wander in and want to go horse riding and you don't have hats, long pants, scarves and footwear, you can arrange on a makeshift setup for the event. For the rodeo event, they will need to add a far more efficient arrangement for food service. The facility is not designed for everyday use but for special rodeo and equestrian events. Half a mile away, we eventually will have a general store and somebody wants to get something right away; and after going half a mile, they sometimes don't come back. The food and beverage is available one mile away. I can only say we are not building a new facility. We are taking an existing facility and we are just converting and adding the floor and the walls. We are strictly amending the present use and answer their demand we think that is growing. If there is any questions, I would handle them today.

STERLING: I think this is good!

JOHNSON: What's your sitting area - your cocktail area?

SOUTHWARD: This is a stand up cowboy thing. .

CHAIRMAN: Are people living down there now?

SOUTHWARD: Population is presently 30 people. At the end of the year, it may be doubled. We have recently had horse races and it attracted about 2,000 people. They are setting a demand from the public.

CHAIRMAN: Any other questions? Thank you very much Mr. Southward.

SOUTHWARD: Thank you.

CHAIRMAN: Anyone else would like to give testimony in favor or opposed to the application?

STERLING: I move to close the public hearing.

JOHNSON: Second.

CHAIRMAN: It has been moved by Mr. Sterling and seconded by Mr. Johnson. All those in favor say aye.

COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

CHAIRMAN: Opposed? Public hearing is closed.

This is a special permit. We have to wait 15 days before making a decision. Thank you for coming.

The public hearing was adjourned at 4:55 p.m.

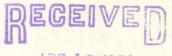

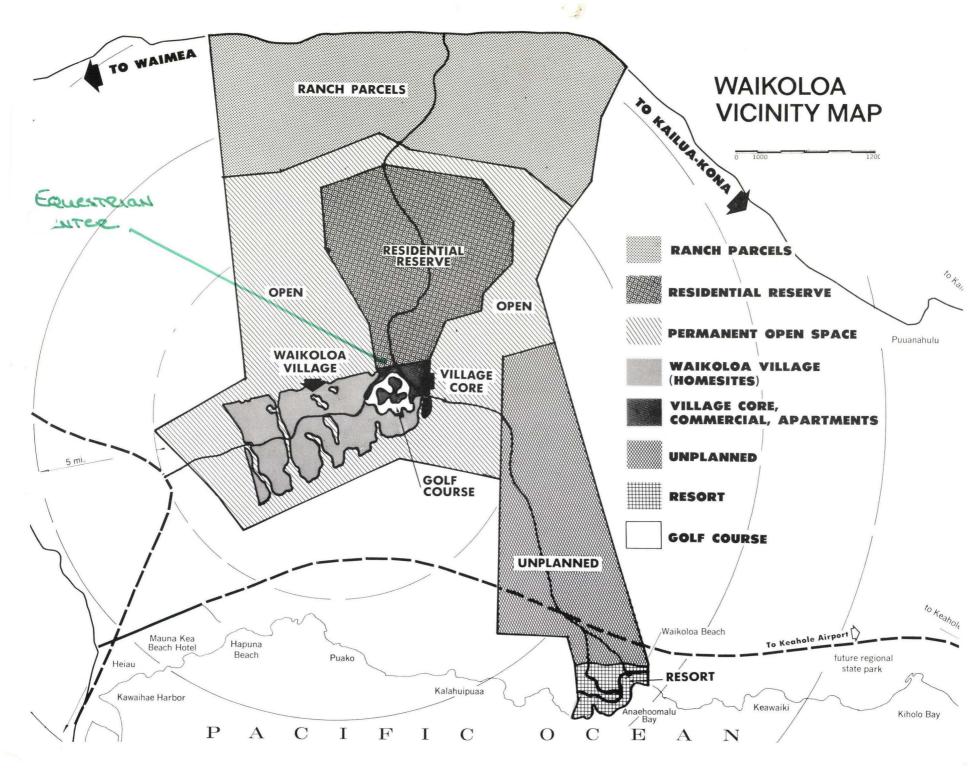

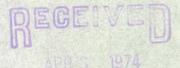

(I) (We) hereby request approval for a Special Permit to use certain property located at WAIKOLOA, SOUTH KOHALA, HAWAII in accordance with provisions of Section 98H-6, Act 205, SLH 1963 for the following described purpose. To expand existing equestrian center to include area for tack shop and refreshment stand.

Description of Property: Equestrian center designed by Val Ossipoff at Waikoloa; additions designed by Dudley Wynkoop. Existing building is of frame construction, one and two-story, with nine horse-stalls, feed and tack rooms, offices, lounge and restrooms.

Petitioner's interest in subject property: Owned in fee simple by Waikoloa Village Association.

Petitioner's reason(s) for requesting Special Permit:

APPLICATION FOR SPECIAL PERMIT AT WAIKOLOA, SOUTH KOHALA, BY WAIKOLOA VILLAGE ASSOCIATION.

Petitioner's reason(s) for requesting Special Permit:

The special permit is for an accessory use to an existing permitted use, an equestrian center in an agricultural district.

The special permit would allow the conversion of parts of the equestrian center to a tack shop and a refreshment stand.

Involved would be some 546 square feet of space, most of which is presently under roof, of a total of 7,000 square feet existing in the equestrian center.

The additions would not be contrary to the objectives of the Land Use Law, inasmuch as they would simply be accessory to an existing, permitted facility.

The use would not adversely affect surrounding property, but would in fact permit greater public usage of a permitted facility.

There would be no unreasonable burden on public agencies, and no additional utility facilities would be needed.

Unusual trends that have arisen include increased usage of the permitted facility and growing demand for the accessory items.

The petitioner believes that the proposed use, since it will be strictly accessory to the existing, permitted, use will not alter or change the character of the land.

By making the existing equestrian center better able to serve the public, this accessory use would make a higher and better use of the land involved.

The tack shop would be approximately 420 square feet in size, and would be located in a walkway area of the existing building that is already under roof. It would be used to satisfy a growing demand for riding-related accessories, such as pants, footwear, cowboy hats, scarves and such, for visitors to the facility who need such items, and for accessories such as bits, reins, saddles and other items of riding equipment for people who board horses at Waikoloa.

The refreshment stand, which would cover only 126 square feet of area, would replace the tables which presently are moved into the center on a make-shift arrangement for food service during equestrian events. This permanent setup would be more efficient and more sanitary and would be used only during equestrian events at the center.
