The Hawaii District Council of the Assemblies of God requests approval of a special permit to establish a church on 4.2 acres of land situated in the Agricultural District at Keei 2nd, South Kona, Hawaii described as Tax Map Key 8-3-13: 1.

The subject property is presently vacant and is located on the mauka side of the South Kona Belt Road approximately 2,000 feet south of Honaunau School in the vicinity of the Shimizu Store. Soils of the property in question have very severe limitations for agricultural production and which restrict their use largely to pasture, woodland or wildlife. The surface consists of a thin layer of organic soil over pahoehoe bedrock. Slopes range from 6 to 20% and the rainfall ranges from 60 to 90 inches annually. Surrounding land uses include coffee lands with scattered dwellings, Honaunau School, Shimizu store, a service station, churches, and the Honaunau Post Office.

Petitioner proposes a church building of approximately 3,000 square feet in area which would house the sanctuary, 6 classrooms, a nursery and a kitchen. He submits that the proposed use would not adversely affect surrounding property nor burden public agencies to provide services. The land is not productive and involves only a small acreage. The church is needed by the many residents in the area who are members of their faith.

At the public hearing held by the Hawaii County Planning Commission on November 26, 1974, it was indicated that:

- All essential utilities are available to the site in question, including an 8" water line.
- 2. The congregation is comprised of approximately 40 Filipino people in the community and services will be in the Filipino language.

3. In a letter dated December 4, 1974, Mr. Richard A. Nagata, a neighboring property owner situated approximately 100 feet to the north of the proposed site opposes the request as the church will be too close and the "church members make too much noise." 4. The State Departments of Agriculture, Transportation, Health, and Education and the County's Fire, Water and Police Departments have no objections to the proposed use. 5. Church services for the congregation are presently being held in a temporary structure pending construction of the new church under this special permit. COUNTY RECOMMENDATION On December 19, 1974, the Hawaii County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the special permit as it was found: That the proposed use is not in conflict with the objectives of the Land Use Law or County policies. The County General Plan indicates low density urban development which would allow community uses such as churches. The County's zoning code also allows churches in an Agricultural District. That the use would not be detrimental to the existing use 2. of the property which is vacant and not used for agricultural production. There are no permanent church facilities in this area for members of this faith. The effect on surrounding property will be minimal since the 3. surrounding area is basically residential-agricultural in nature and since only approximately 1 acre of the total 4 acres will be utilized for the facility. All essential services are available to the site. 4.

The following conditions were stipulated by the County agency:

- "1. That construction commence within one (1) year from the official date of approval of the Special Permit.
- "2. That 20-foot landscaping buffer strips be provided along both side property lines to lessen the effect of noise which may be transmitted to the adjoining properties. The landscaping plan shall be submitted to the Hawaii County Planning Director for review and approval.

"3. That all other applicable rules and regulations, including the 'Plan Approval' process, be complied with."

Evaluation of the request finds that the proposed use would fulfill a need in the area for a permanent facility to accommodate members of this religious faith. The property is unsuited for intensive cultivation and lands will not be taken out of agricultural production. Condition #2 imposed by the County will help to minimize any noise problems which may be generated by the proposed use.

Based on the above, it is concluded that the proposed use is an "unusual and reasonable" use in an Agricultural District.

Accordingly, it is recommended that the special permit be approved subject to the conditions imposed by the County.

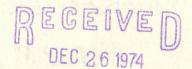

In accordance with Chapter 205, Section 205-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, we are transmitting the decision and findings of the County Planning Commission on the above application.

The special permit request was to establish a church on 4.207 acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The property is located on the mauka side of the South Kona Belt Road, approximately 2,000 feet south of Honaunau School, across from Shimizu Store and Fishing Supply and the Middle Government Main Road leading to Napoopoo, Keei 2nd, South Kona, Hawaii, Tax Map Key 8-3-13:1.

The Planning Commission at a duly advertised public hearing held on November 26, 1974 in the Kealakehe School Cafetorium, Kealakehe, North Kona, Hawaii, discussed the subject request. The Commission on December 19, 1974, voted to recommend the approval of the special permit to the Land Use Commission as it was found:

1. That the proposed use would not be contrary to the objectives sought to be accomplished by the State Land Use laws and requalitions. Furthermore, the request would not be in conflict with the County's policies. The General Plan land use pattern allocation guide map designates the area for Low Density Urban Development. Such a designation would allow single-family residential, as well as ancillary community and public uses such as churches. The County Zoning Code also allows churches and other institutions of a religious nature within the Agricultural zoned district.

- 2. That although the proposed use may somewhat alter or change the essential character of the land, it would not be detrimental to the present use inasmuch as the property is presently vacant and not being put into productive agricultural use. It is determined that the providing of a church on the land would be beneficial and best suited to accommodate the welfare of the public, in this particular case, the members of the church. Presently, church services are being conducted elsewhere in a temporary location as there are no church facilities of this faith available to the residents of the area. Therefore, the establishment of a church in this general area would best suit the needs of the residents.
- 3. That the proposed use would not adversely affect the surrounding properties. The area is basically residential-agricultural in nature, and also include the Honaunau School, Post Office and other churches. The State Department of Agriculture commented that any agricultural impact from the proposed church facility would be minimal. Therefore, it is determined that the effect on the surrounding properties would be quite negligible. Furthermore, the total land area of the property is 4+ acres, of which approximately one acre will be used for the church facilities. The remaining 3+ acres could still be utilized for agricultural activities should the applicant so desires. As a result, the agricultural goals of the area could still be realized should the need arises.
- 4. That the proposed use would not unreasonably burden public agencies to provide roads, streets, water, drainage, and police and fire protection. All of these essential services, including an 8-inch water line, are presently provided for in this area.

The favorable recommendation was also subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That construction commence within one (1) year from the official date of approval of the Special Permit.
- 2. That 20-foot landscaping buffer strips be provided along both side property lines to lessen the effect of noise which may be transmitted to the adjoining properties. The landscaping plan shall be submitted to the Hawaii County Planning Director for review and approval.

The staff recommended deferral on this application. It was stated that the EIS is just about completed and it will be forwarded to the Office of Environmental and Quality Control for their review.

Mr. Nagata asked about the progress on the development plan.

The staff mentioned that the Zoning Guide Map is being worked on and hopefully it would be adopted by this summer. He stated that the preliminary draft should be out by January or February.

The votes on the motion were recorded as six ayes and two noes and carried.

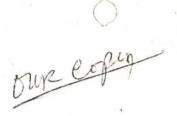

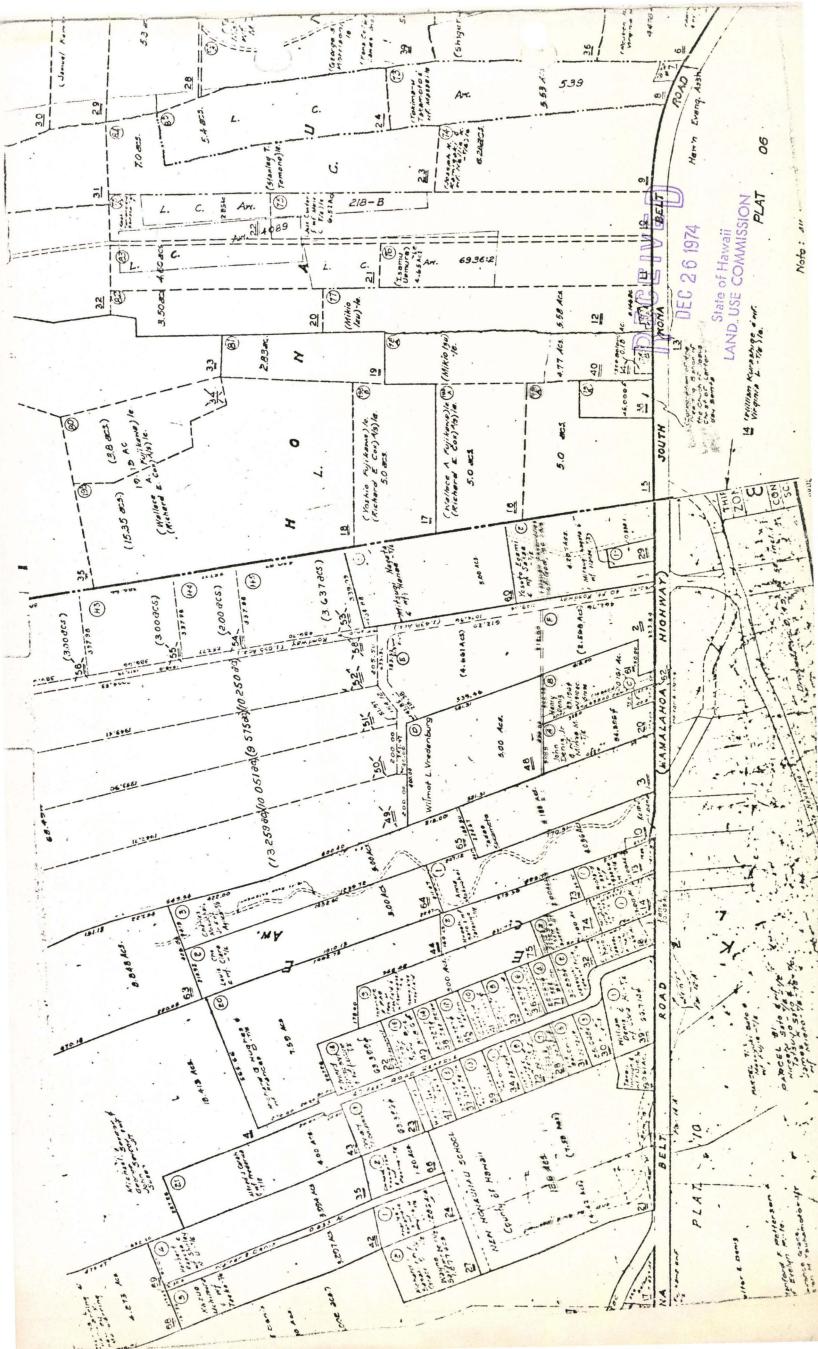

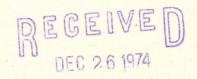

CHAIRMAN: We will now move to Item No. 3. Public hearing on the application of the Hawaii District Council of the Assemblies of God for a special permit to establish a church on 4.207 acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The property is located on the mauka side of the South Kona Belt Road, approximately 2,000 feet south of Honaunau School, across from Shimizu Store and Fishing Supply and the Middle Government Main Road leading to Napoopoo, Keei 2nd, South Kona, Tax Map Key 8-3-13:1.

Staff presentation please.

(The staff presented the back-ANTONIO: Mr. Chairman and Commissioners. ground information on file.) Thank you.

CHAIRMAN: Is this land owned.... Who owns the land?

HAYASHI: Mr. Chairman, the applicant does own the land - the Hawaii District Council of the Assemblies of God.

CHAIRMAN: Right. The Chair better mention right here that this is a special permit and so we cannot make a decision tonight on this particular application. We will hold the public hearing and then it will be fifteen days before we can make a decision. Chair wishes to say that before any questions come up so everybody understands the rules on a special permit.

Any questions? Any of the Commissioners would like to ask the staff? Commissioner Sterling.

STERLING: I am trying to locate. Where is the Church of the Latter-Day Saints from this?

HAYASHI: I believe the Church of the Latter-Day Saints is located next to the Honaunau School.

STERLING: The big one. I think it's quite a large church.

HAYASHI: Yes.

STERLING: Thank you.

CHAIRMAN: Any further questions?

Is the applicant present or the representative of the applicant? Please come forward and state your name.

DAVID SHOTWELL: I'm Reverend David Shotwell. In view of the fact that the officers of the organization could not be here, being based in Honolulu and being that I know the people involved, they asked that I speak for them. In this case, the church primarily will help a group of people, Filipino people in the community. The Pastor is here, Reverend and Mrs. Gulfan. The church services are conducted in the Filipino language. They have a nucleus of people that are meeting regularly with them; and for this purpose this property was purchased in the hope that a church could be established for their use. And so, I'm here to speak to the issue tonight.

CHAIRMAN: You said that this is basically a Filipino congregation?

SHOTWELL: Yes.

CHAIRMAN: And speaking in Filipino.

SHOTWELL: And the services are in the Filipino language.

CHAIRMAN: Are there any other churches at all in Kona where Filipino services are conducted or would this be the only one?

SHOTWELL: I'm not sure. It is the only one I know of.

CHAIRMAN: Maybe, Mr. Sterling can answer that.

STERLING: You folks are holding church services in the old coffee house way up there?

SHOTWELL: Yes.

STERLING: So, it is pretty much temporary?

SHOTWELL: Yes.

STERLING: There is one across the street. I think that they are holding services but I'm not sure.

You people are actually holding services now?

SHOTWELL: Yes.

STERLING: They are your people?

SHOTWELL: Yes.

STERLING: And that you are asking that they be given approval so that they can get a permanent home across the street.

SHOTWELL: So, we can get a permanent home. They've been meeting in kind of a house meetings up to this time; and Reverend Gulfan is a farmer-agricultural man - has leased property and is presently growing a number of agricultural products; and actually has helped a lot of Filipino people in marketing them here from the Kona area. And, so he has his own parcel which he has leased and which he is currently farming; and on this he put up a temporary structure that is going to be his home and they met there for a period of time. However, it wasn't zoned for that purpose. So, the real reason we didn't apply for a zone permit for that because we had permanent site planned that we filed for now and this is why we're applying at this present time.

CHAIRMAN: David, do you have any idea how large the congregation is now?

SHOTWELL: Right now, it's about forty people approximately.

CHAIRMAN: Would any of the nonclergy Commissioners like to ask any questions?

Commissioner Sterling and I are not part of this particular denomination.

HAYASHI: Mr. Chairman, I would like to ask Reverend Shotwell a question.

CHAIRMAN: Yes, staff.

HAYASHI: The area of the property is four acres. How does he plan to utilize the back portion of the property?

SHOTWELL: Well....

HAYASHI: In other words, will the entire four acres be needed for the church site?

SHOTWELL: For general church purposes and.....

HAYASHI: Yes.

SHOTWELL: One of the things that has been in the thinking is that there is a need for some minimal single-unit housing for older Filipino people and somewhere in the future. Right now, of course, the money thing has dried up. Initially, they are planning to make a master plan proposal. But since the money market is gone by the window, at this point they feel it's important they get them a place to worship, get them established and get that on the road and at a later date perhaps take up the issue for some kind of housing for elderly Filipino people. And it was felt that at least this is a good start in the right direction since, you know, he is able to deal with the people in their own language and according to their specific needs. So, at this point, we are restricting our application just to the church sanctuary itself. However, in the thinking was probably a low agricultural kind of thing where they can have a little plots and little housing unit for each one to live in and have a little land they can grow a little something. And

as this has already been pointed out, agriculturally from a commercial point of view, probably the property is not valuable agriculturally; but if you put individuals there who could grow a little vegetables and little whatnots, there could have a greatly increased value for them personally.

CHAIRMAN: Thank you. Any further questions? Thank you very much David.

Anyone present wished to give testimony on this particular application either in favor or opposed to this application?

There being none, the Chair will entertain a motion to close the public hearing.

STERLING: I so move.

JITCHAKU: Second.

CHAIRMAN: It has been moved by Commissioner Sterling and seconded by Commissioner Jitchaku that we close the public hearing. All those in favor say aye.

COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

CHAIRMAN: Opposed? Public hearing is closed.

Since this is a special permit, it is our recommendation to the State Land Use Commission.

HAYASHI: No action shall be taken tonight.

CHAIRMAN: Right. We will have to wait fifteen days before we can take any action. During those fifteen days, if anyone wishes to give any written testimony to send to us, they are welcomed to and they will be made a part of the record. Thank you.

The public hearing was adjourned at 7:45 p.m.

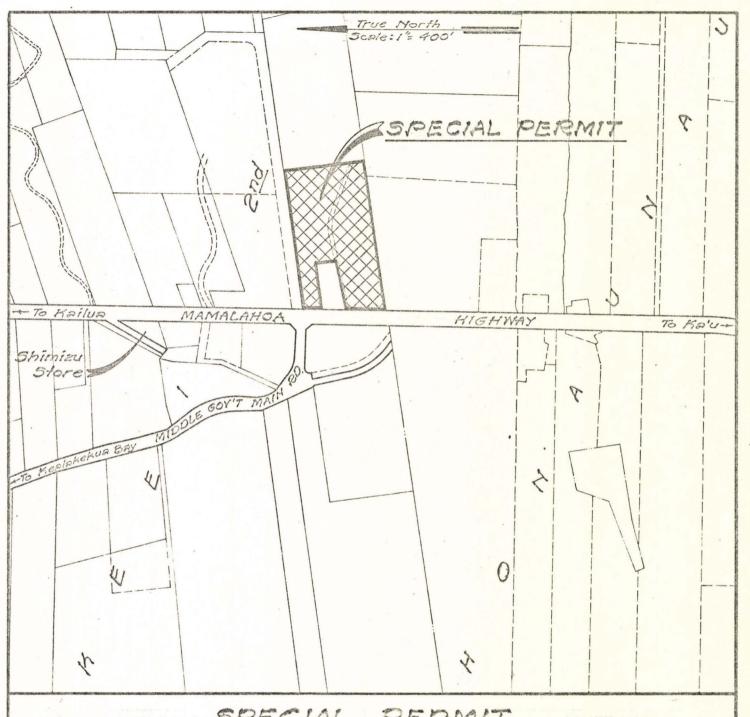

Reverend David Shotwell, in behalf of the Hawaii District of the Assemblies of God, has submitted a petition for a Special Permit to establish a church on 4.207 acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The area in question is located on the mauka side of the South Kona Belt Road, approximately 2,000 feet south of Honaunau School. It is also situated across from Shimizu Store and Fishing Supply and the Middle Government Main Road leading to Napoopoo, Keei 2nd, South Kona, Hawaii, (TMK: 8-3-13:1).

The General Plan land use pattern allocation guide map designates the area for Low Density Urban Development. Such a designation would allow single-family residential and ancillary community and public uses. The County zoning designation is Agriculture 5-acre (A-5a).

The Soil Conservation Service's land capability unit is Class VII or soils which have very severe limitations that make them unsuited to cultivation and that restrict their use largely to pasture or range, woodland, or wildlife. The area consists of well-drained, thin organic soils over pahoehoe lava bedrock. The surface Layer is extremely rocky muck about 5 inches thick. It is underlain by pahoehoe lava bedrock. The surface layer is slightly acid. Permeability is rapid in the soil, and water moves rapidly through the cracks of the lava. Runoff is medium, and the erosion hazard is slight. The slope of the land is between 6 to 20 percent, and the mean annual rainfall is 60 to 90 inches.

The property in question is presently vacamt of any structures.

Surrounding land uses include coffee fields with scattered single-family dwellings, the Honaunau School, Shimizu Store and Fishing Supply, a

service station, churches, and the Honaunau Post Office.

The proposed church will be approximately 3,000 square feet in size which would include the sanctuary, six (6) classrooms, a nursery, and a kitchen area.

In support of the request, the applicant has stated the following:

- "1. The land use is not contrary as Section 30 allows chruches to be built as "conditionally permitted uses" within this agricultural district.
- 2. Churches never should adversely affect the surrounding property, but add to the good of the area.
- * 3. All utilities are already installed. The use as a church would not effect a hardship on the public schools, police or fire department.
- "4. The growth in the area and there are many residents who are of our "faith" who need this church that they may worship God."
- *5. This is a very small acreage and has not been productive as agricultural land for many years. Even with a church there may still be a very small amount of fruit grown. But we plan to use it especially for religious purposes.
- *6. It will not alter greatly the character of the land. Due to this land not being used as agricultural land, then it will not greatly change its present use, outside of there will be religious services.
- "7. What greater use to mankind can we build than that which

> helps people to live a better life in our community by worshipping the Almighty God."

All essential utilities, including an 8-inch water line, are available to the area in question. There are no known historical or identifiable land form attributed to the property.

In review of the request, the Department of Agriculture commented that any agricultural impact from the proposed use will be minimal, and that they do not oppose the proposed special permit.

All other cooperating agencies had no comments on or objections to the subject request.

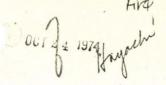

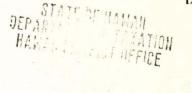
