This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter of July 3, 1978, regarding the above-mentioned Special Permit.

As you are aware, the State Land Use Commission (SLUC) approved the Special Permit on December 5, 1975, subject to several conditions. Condition No. 1 stated that "Construction of the chapel commence within one (1) yearffrom the date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two (2) years thereafter."

As a result of a request filed by Mr. Lester Hawthorne, on June 13, 1977, the SLUC approved a time extension to Condition No. 1 until June 5, 1978, which has since expired.

Per letter dated May 18, 1978, we were informed by the Executive Officer of the SLUC that that body will not approve requests for time extension which are filed after the stipulated commencement or expiration dates. Enclosed for your information is a copy of that letter.

However, since you have already filed a formal request for the extension of the time condition, may we present you with the following alternatives. The first alternative would be to forward your present request to the County Planning Commission for its consideration. Should the Planning Commission recommend approval of your request, it will then be forwarded to the SLUC for approval. Based on its letter, however, the SLUC would have to deny your request. Therefore, since the resultant action would be the denial of your extension request by the SLUC, another alternative would

Upon receipt of the new application, the Planning Commission will conduct a public hearing on this request within a period of not less than thirty (30) nor more than one hundred twenty (120) days from the receipt of the application. The Planning Commission will then act on the application not earlier than fifteen (15) days after the public hearing but within a reasonable time thereafter. Should the Planning Commission recommend favorably on the request, it will be forwarded to the State Land Use Commission for final action. The Planning Commission may deny the request if it deems that the proposed use does not meet with the special permit quidelines. In such a circumstance, its decision will be considered final. However, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 205-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, a Planning Commission denial may be appealed to the circuit court of the circuit in which the land is situated, in this case, the Third Circuit Court. Enclosed for your information are copies of the application form and Special Permit procedures. We would appreciate hearing from you within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this letter as to the route you intend to proceed with. If no word is received within that period, we will assume that you intend to proceed with the time extension and will process such. For your information, we have requested a meeting with the SLUC to discuss the subsequent procedural requirements for time extensions filed after the commencement or expiration date as a result of its present position. The petitioner, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, is requesting an extension of the time condition included in Special Permit (SP75-224) which was granted by the State Land Use Commission on December 5, 1975.

The Special Permit was approved to allow construction of a church within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The subject property encompasses seven (7) acres and is located adjacent to and immediately mauka of the Lono-Kona Subdivision, approximately 750 feet east of the Kalani Road and Lamaokeola Street intersection, Keopu 3rd, North Kona, Hawaii, Tax Map Key 7-5-3: 2 Lot B.

Condition No. 1 of the Special Permit states: "That construction of the chapel commence within one (1) year from the date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two (2) years thereafter".

Since the permit was granted on December 5, 1975, construction was to have commenced on December 5, 1976.

The letter requesting an 18-month time extension until June 5, 1978 was dated March 24, 1977.

It was determined by the Hawaii County Planning Department that: "Since the Permit was not officially nullified by the Planning Commission and the State Land Use Commission, even if the performance condition has not been met, a time extension request at this particular time is in order".

In support of his request, the petitioner has, in part, stated the following:

> "When the above property (TMK 7-5-3: 2 Lot B) was purchased by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (Mormons), it was cleared so the surveyors could go in and set all corner markers.

"At the time of purchase, the church members in Kona Hawaii Stake began a program to raise their share of the total price of the property. In April 1976 this amount was sent to Church Headquarters in Salt Lake City, Utah, which allowed us to begin the design and plans for the new chapel. The plans for the building are underway at this time and it is our sincere hope that we will be able to commence construction of the building early in the fall of 1977.

"The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints would like to request an extension of 18 months on the Special Permit to build a church...

"The construction plans are in the process of being drawn now. On completion, we must receive approval of the Church Building Department in Salt Lake City, before we can start construction.

"We therefore feel that the extension should be at least 18 months."

At the time the Special Permit was approved, HPM Development Corporation was the owner of the subject property and thus submitted the application in behalf of the church. However, since that time title to the land transferred to the church. The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints thus requested that the Special Permit be transferred to them. This request was granted by the Hawaii County Planning Commission.

At the public hearing held by the Hawaii County Planning Commission on April 28, 1977, the only person to testify was the applicant.

On April 28, 1977, the Hawaii County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the time extension request to the Land Use Commission. The Planning Commission also acted to amend the name of the petition on SP75-224 from HPM Development Corporation to The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.

The Planning Commission's action was subject to the condition that all other applicable conditions as stated in the Special Permit be complied with. Should the conditions not be met, the Special Permit may be deemed null and void.

The remaining three conditions originally imposed on this Special Permit include:

- "2. That occupancy of the proposed building shall not be granted until final subdivision approval has been given to Subdivision No. 75-124, which is for the Kalani Street extension.
- "3. That a landscaping buffer shall be established along the Kuakini Wall side of the property for the purpose of screening the proposed use from

existing residential uses. This buffer shall be incorporated into plans submitted for Plan Approval and shall be approved by the Planning Director.

"4. That all other applicable rules and regulations, including the Plan Approval process, shall be complied with."

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, Kona Hawaii Stake, is requesting a time extension to a Special Permit (SP 75-224) which was granted to HPM Development Corporation for the construction of a church within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The property involved, consisting of 7+ acres, is located adjacent to and immediately mauka of the Lono-Kona Subdivision, approximately 750 feet east of the Kalani Street-Lamaokeola Street Intersection, Keopu 3rd, North Kona, (TMK: 7-5-03:2, Lot B).

At the time of initial approval of the Special Permit, HPM Development Corp. was the owner of the subject property; thus, they submitted the application in behalf of the church. Since that time, however, title of the land has been transferred to the church. As such, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints is requesting that the Permit be transferred to them.

Condition No. 1 of the Special Permit states "That construction of the chapel commence within one (1) year from the date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two (2) years thereafter."

The Permit was granted on December 5, 1975; thus, the commencement date was on December 5, 1976. Procedurally, prior to the expiration date, the Planning Department does inform the petitioner that the expiration date is nearing. In this particular case, however, the department inadvertently failed to notify the petitioner of the expiration date of the performance condition relating to construction of the chapel.

Since the Permit was not officially nullified by the Planning

Commission and the State Land Use Commission, even if the performance

condition has not been met, a time extension request at this particular

time is in order.

The letter requesting the extension was dated March 24, 1977.

An 18-month time extension until June 5, 1978 is being requested. The petitioner has stated that the construction plans are in the process of being drawn. On completion, the plans must still be approved by the Church Building Department in Salt Lake City prior to construction.

In requesting the time extension, the petitioner has further stated the following:

RECOMMENDATION: THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER-DAY SAINTS, KONA HAWAII STAKE (HPM DEVELOPMENT CORP.)

Staff is recommending that the requested time extension until June 5, 1978, to commence construction of the chapel be given favorable consideration. It is felt that the petitioner has been sincere in its efforts of complying with the construction performance condition.

The construction plans are presently being drawn, and upon completion, they would still have to be reviewed by the Church Building Department in Salt Lake City, Utah, headquarters of the church. Additional time would be needed to have the construction plans completed, and reviewed and approved by the church's main office. It is therefore determined that the requested time extension is justified.

It is futher recommended that the request be given favorable consideration subject to the condition that all other applicable conditions as stated in the Special Permit be complied with. Should the conditions not be met, the Special Permit may be deemed null and void.

Honokaa Town, Ahualoa Homesteads, Hamakua, TMK: 4-5-11:3 and 11.

Staff presented background information and recommended that the request be denied based on the findings, on file; however, staff was agreeable to a variance request to allow the provision of a 14-foot wide oil-treated surface which would be able to accommodate for two-way vehicular traffic, subject to restrictions, on file, for future resubdivision.

Mr. Jon Giffin pointed out that there are no other paved roads in the area and essentially all the existing dirt roads are accessible by 4-wheel drive vehicles. He agreed that the staff's proposal for a 14-foot wide oil-treated road would be of some relief from the 20-foot pavement requirement. He stated that the land is presently used for cattle grazing, and that sometime in the future, a weekend cabin will be built.

Mr. Melvin Hewett mentioned that if they were to dedicate the roadway, they will pave it to County standards. However, as long as it is in private ownership, they would like to keep it in gravel. He stated that they both have homes in the Waimea area. He added that they have planted 300 trees on two sides of the property along the border for a buffer and have put in citrus and avocado trees. He then requested an opportunity to discuss the proposal of the oil base roadway further with Mr. Giffin before action is taken on their request.

The Hawaii County Planning Commission has transmitted a Special Use Permit request for the establishment of a LDS (Latter Day Saints) church on approximately 7.0 acres of land situated within the Agricultural District. The area in question is located adjacent to and immediately mauka of the Lono-Kona Subdivision, approximately 750 feet east of the Kalani Street and Lamaokeola Street intersection in Keopu 3rd, North Kona (TMK: 7-5-03 portion of 2).

The proposed church will include a worship hall with a seating capacity of 350 people, a cultural hall, classrooms, Bishop's office and President's office. Access to the church site will be via an extension of Kalani Street, to be developed by the church at their expense, and dedicated to the County.

The proposed extension of Kalani Street will require breaking a portion of the Great Wall of Kuakini, which borders the west side of the subject property. This wall was built by Governor Kuakini, second Governor of the Island, for the purpose of fencing cattle. Aside from the wall, there are no known historic or geologically significant features of the property.

Presently, there are no structures situated on the parcel. The land is currently being used for grazing. Surrounding land uses include the adjacent Lono-Kona Subdivision and other pastoral lands.

The General Plan Land Use Pattern Allocation Guide Map designates this area as Orchards and Alternate Urban Expansion. The County's zoning designation is Unplanned. The County zoning code allows churches, as conditionally permitted uses, in all zones, except Industrial and Open districts.

The subject site has soils which are of the Punaluu extremely rocky peat series with a slope of 6 to 20 percent. Rock

outcrops occupy 40 to 50 percent of the surface. The surface layer is about 4 inches thick and is underlined with Pahoehoe lava bedrock. This soil is rapidly permeable, runoff is slow, and the erosion hazard is slight. This soil is used for pasture and has a Capability class of VII. Class VII soils have very severe limitations that make them unsuited to cultivation and that restrict their use largely to pasture or range, woodland, or wildlife. Rainfall in the area is generally 30 to 40 inches annually.

In support of the request the applicant has stated the following:

"The proposed church site lies makai of the Kaahumanu Highway extension route and mauka of the Lono-Kona Subdivision. The property is not well-suited for agriculture and with the completion of the Kaahumanu Highway extension will be divided from the remaining agricultural property by a major highway. The present use is for pasture purposes, which use will be difficult and uneconomical to continue after the completion of the Kaahumanu Highway.

"The Proposed church site is amply large to accommodate the proposed use without significant effect on the adjoining Lono-Kona Subdivision. The Proposed use will not significantly affect the property rights of property owners in the immediate vicinity.

"Enforcement of the zoning code would result in the applicant's property being put to a use that it is not suited for physically or economically.

"The subject property is zoned unplanned under the County zoning code and the proposed use is a conditionally permitted use in an unplanned district. If the property was zoned agriculture under the County zoning code, the proposed use would still be a conditionally permitted use, and therefore not in conflict with the zoning code or General Plan for the County of Hawaii."

The Planning Department points out the following:

The seven (7)-acre area in question was a portion of a 144-acre parcel which was granted final subdivision approval on August 7, 1975.

There is also a pending subdivision application for the creation of a 1,643 square foot parcel which will be part of the Kalani Street extension. A tentative subdivision approval was granted on August 7, 1975 to the owner of this parcel, Arthur Nearon. The granting of this subdivision request will result in providing access to the subject property. Kalani Street has a right-of-way width of forty (40) feet with a 16-foot pavement.

Comments received from the Department of Water Supply were as follows:

"We have no objection to the subject request inasmuch as water was committed through a recent subdivision application involving the same parcel. However, the applicant should be informed that water shall be available only upon completion of the water system per approved construction plans of the said subdivision."

All other commenting agencies had no objections to the request.

In his letter to the Planning Department, N.B. McQuerrey objected to the request and questioned whether all 7 acres will be

In his letter to the Planning Department, N.B. McQuerrey objected to the request and questioned whether all 7 acres will be tax exempt, and what will the church be used for. He pointed out that the church is one of the largest landholders in the State and that he feels churches should only own the land the church sits on.

The Hawaii County Planning Commission held a duly advertised public hearing on the subject request on September 25, 1975.

At the hearing, Robert Carlsmith, representing the applicant, pointed out that the LDS church will be acquiring the property from Keopu Development Company Venture, who is present owner of the property. The application was signed by HPM Corporation on behalf of Keopu Development.

The County Planning Staff pointed out that the State Archaeologist has stated there is no objection to the 40' right-of-way break into the Great Wall of Kuakini for the proposed extension of Kalani Street.

In other tesitmony it was pointed out that the present chapel in Kailua is in poor condition, has inadequate parking areas, and is at a dangerous site because of its location near a heavy traffic area.

On October 16, 1975, the Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the Special Permit as it was found that:

1. That the proposed use will not be contrary to the objectives sought to be accomplished by the Land Use Law and Regulations. The purpose of the Land Use Law and Regulations is to protect, preserve, and encourage the development of lands in the State for those uses to which they are best suited in the interest of the public health and welfare of the people of the State of Hawaii. The area under consideration is classified

as agricultural by the Land Use Commission. The Agricultural District includes lands surrounded by or contiguous to agricultural lands and which are not suited to agricultural and ancillary activities by reason of topography, soils and other related characteristics. The subject property has soils which are in the Soil Conservation Service's Capability Class VII. Class VII soils have very severe limitations which make them unsuited to cultivation and restrict their use largely to pasture or range, woodland, or wildlife. Class VII soils are the second to the lowest of the Soil Conservation Service's ranking system for agricultural productivity. Although it is possible for the subject property to be used for some agricultural activities, it is determined that approval of the subject request will not be contrary to the objectives of the Land Use Law and Regulations, given the capability class rating of the property for agricultural productivity and the above cited criterion for determining the Agricultural District.

Further, the use of the subject property for nonagricultural purposes is expected to not have an adverse effect on the overall agricultural potential of the region or the island.

In addition, churches and institutions of a religious nature are permitted in the Unplanned and the Agricultural zones by the County Zoning Code.

That the proposed use will not adversely affect surrounding properties. Surrounding land uses include the Lono-Kona Subdivision and grazing lands. The Lono-Kona Subdivision, in the area adjacent to the subject property, is zoned for residential duplex uses. This subdivision is fairly built up and is urban in character. The area under consideration is designated for alternate urban expansion on the General Plan Land Use Pattern Allocation Guide Map. Should a need for urban expansion arise in the future, it would be directed to areas designated as such by the General Plan. The pasture lands which surround the subject property on its mauka side could possibly be cut off by the proposed Queen Kaahumanu Highway extension. It is thus determined that approval of the proposed use on the subject property will not have an adverse effect on surrounding properties, be they urban or agricultural in nature.

3. That although the proposed use may alter the essential character of the land, it would not be detrimental to the present use of the subject property. The subject property is a seven-acre portion of a 144-acre parcel. This portion was recently subdivided out of the larger parcel. At the present time it is used for grazing. It is undenying that the proposed use will alter the character of the land. However, it is determined that the provision of a church on the subject land would be beneficial and well-suited to accommodate the welfare of the public, in this particular case, the members of the church. At the present time, there is an existing meeting place for the members of this denomination. Due to the inconvenient location of the existing facility, however, it has become necessary for the church to relocate. The existing facility is located at an extremely busy intersection in Kailua and is subject to traffic, noise, and other similar nuisances. Aside from the existing facility, which would be phased out of use for worship services, there is no other facility of this denomination available to the residents in the general area of Kailua-Kona. Therefore, the establishment of the proposed use would suit the needs of the residents of the area."

The favorable recommendation was subject to the following conditions:

- "1. That construction of the chapel commence within one (1) year from the date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two (2) years thereafter.
- "2. That occupancy of the proposed building shall not be granted until final subdivision approval has been given to Subdivision No. 75-124, which is for the Kalani Street extension.
- "3. That a landscaping buffer shall be established along the Kuakini Wall side of the property for the purpose of screening the proposed use from existing residential uses. This buffer shall be incorporated into plans submitted for Plan Approval and shall be approved by the Planning Director.
- "4. That all other applicable rules and regulations, including the Plan Approval process, shall be complied with.

In accordance with Chapter 205, Section 205-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, we are transmitting the findings and decision of the County Planning Commission on the subject application.

The special permit request was to allow the establishment of an LDS church on 7.016 acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The area in question is located adjacent to and immediately mauka of the Lono-Kona Subdivision, approximately 750 feet east of the Kalani Street and Lamaokeola Street intersection, Keopu 3rd, North Kona (TMK: 7-5-03:portion of 02).

The Planning Commission at a duly advertised public hearing held on September 25, 1975 at the Sergeant Yano Memorial Hall in Captain Cook, South Kona, Hawaii, discussed the subject request. The Commission on October 16, 1975 voted to recommend the approval of the special permit to the Land Use Commission as it was found:

That the proposed use will not be contrary to the objectives sought to be accomplished by the Land Use Law and Regulations. The purpose of the Land Use Law and Regulations is to protect, preserve, and encourage the development of lands in the State for those uses to which they are best suited in the interest of the public health and welfare of the people of the State of Hawaii. The area under consideration is classified as agricultural by the State Land Use Commission. The Agricultural District includes lands surrounded by or contiguous to agricultural lands and which are not suited to agricultural and ancillary activities by reason of topography, soils, and other related characteristics. The subject property has soils which are in the Soil Conservation Service's Capability Class VII. Class VII soils have very severe limitations which make them unsuited to cultivation and restrict their use largely to pasture or range, woodland, or wildlife. Class VII soils are the second to the lowest of the Soil Conservation Service's

ranking system for agricultural productivity. - That although the proposed use may alter the essential character of the land, it would not be detrimental to the present use of the subject property. The subject property is a seven-acre portion of a 144-acre parcel. This portion was recently subdivided out of the larger parcel. At the present time, it is used for grazing. It is undenying that the proposed use will alter the character of the land. However, it is determined that the provision of a church on the subject land would be beneficial and well-suited to accommodate the welfare of the public, in this particular case, the members of the church. At the present time, there is an existing meeting place for the members of this denomination. Due to the inconvenient location of the existing facility, however, it has become necessary for the church to relocate. The existing facility is loated at an extremely busy intersection in Kailua and is subject to traffic, noise, and other similar nuisances. Aside from the existing facility, which would be phased out

> of use for worship services, there is no other facility of this denomination available to the residents in the general area of Kailua-Kona. Therefore, the establishment of the proposed use would suite the needs of the residents of the area.

Staff presented the final changes to the draft rules and regulations being brought up for consideration, further to those made at the last meeting.

Commissioner Sterling expressed concern over the absence of any representatives from the Board of Harbor Commissioners, State Parks, or Planning and Economic Development as well as small boat owners, commercial and others, at any of the public hearings. With the observation that this may be creating a rather expensive government which may well stifle future building, Commissioner Sterling called for a vote. Motion carried with six ayes and two abstensions.

CHAIRMAN: Next is Item No. 3, which is a public hearing on the application of the HPM Development Corporation for a Special Permit request to allow the establishment of an LDS Church on seven acres (I take it this is meant the Church of Latter Day Saints) of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The property is located adjacent to and immediately mauka of the Lono-Kona Subdivision, approximately 750 feet east of the Kalani Street and Lamaokeola Street intersection, Keopu 3rd, North Kona, TMK: 7-5-03:portion of parcel 02. Staff?

PIIANAIA: (Gave background information)

CHAIRMAN: Is there any question of the staff?

JITCHAKU: Can I get a clarification on the HPM Corporation? What does that stand for?

PIIANAIA: I believe that a representative of the applicant is here.

CARLSMITH: My name is Robert Carlsmith and I am representing the applicant. Actually the applicant should properly be called Keopu Development Company Venture. HPM Development Corporation is one of the ventures and Capital Investment is ... (inaudible) ... You will note that the application is signed by HPM Corporation for Keopu Development Company Venture. Mrs. Jitchaku, what was your question?

JITCHAKU: What the HPM stands for.

CARLSMITH: That is the name of the company; it does not have any particular/
... (inaudible) ... Keopu Development happens to be the owner of the property.

Property will be transferred to the Latter-Day Saints Church but under the regulations at the present time, since the property is still under the Venture Company, they must be the applicant. Now, the Latter-Day Saints Church ... (inaudible) ... tonight, Mr. Les Hawthorne, who will be available to answer any questions with respect to the proposed development. I would be happy to answer any questions ... (inaudible) ...

CHAIRMAN: Any further questions? Would you like to comment on the staff presentation?

CARLSMITH: Staff presentation seemed to be complete and ... (inaudible) ...

CHAIRMAN: As I understand what you said earlier that actually the Church of Jesus Christ Latter-Day Saints will be buying the property from the Keopu Development.

CARLSMITH: That's right. They will ultimately own it. I might say one thing more ... (inaudible) ...

CHAIRMAN: So you are really representing the present landowner and the building itself will be built by the Church after they have taken over the land.

CARLSMITH: Yes.

STERLING: To answer the letter, Mr. Carlsmith, one of the letters written against this, the property if this all goes through and according to what is hoped for, actually it's a church, or chapel as you call it, so it should quiet that letter.

CARLSMITH: That is correct.

STERLING: It will be basically a church.

CARLSMITH: ... (inaudible) ...

STERLING: The application itself is for the establishment of a church. It is not going to be used for any other purpose.

CARLSMITH: No. I might turn the mike over to Mr. Les Hawthorne ... (inaudible) ...

HAWTHORNE: Mr. Chairman, my name is Les Hawthorne and I am a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Probably it's more commonly known as the Mormon Church. We have for many years looked for a suitable site here in Kona to build a new chapel. Our present chapel is located on Kuakini Highway at Hualalai, a small chapel there that is standing ... (inaudible) ... difficult time finding a suitable piece of property to build a new chapel ... (inaudible) ... We think this is a fine piece of property and we are very happy with the location and we hope ... (inaudible) ... I will be happy to answer any questions.

STERLING: Mr. Hawthorne, just to give us ... (inaudible) ... and should go on the record. Approximately what would be the capacity of your new chapel?

HAWTHORNE: The chapel itself will seat 350 people. Then there is the cultural hall, classrooms, and the Bishop's office and the state president's office in the same building.

STERLING: What kind of traffic pattern are we going to be looking at that will be generated in that area?

HAWTHORNE: At the present time, the Church is planning on making the continuation of Kalani Road, coming up into here, establishing our own road. At the present time until this proposed highway does go through and then, all the traffic will come off the new Kaahumanu Highway.

STERLING: If that new road comes through, is it the proposal of the Church, just for clarification, to make the extension themselves or will they be petitioning the State for someone else to hook up the road?

HAWTHORNE: We will do that ourselves and we will dedicate it to the County.

STERLING: I can't remember whether that original subdivision plan, maybe Mr. Suefuji knows, that original subdivision plan, would that road be extended to the new highway when and if that thing went through, Raymond?

SUEFUJI: Is your question whether it will be extended to the ...

STERLING: I didn't know whether it was in the original subdivision plan or not because the church is going to extend a portion of it for their own traffic and Mr. Hawthorne just made the statement that if and when that new Kaahumanu realignment goes in, then they would be willing to extend it. My question was, is it in the original subdivision that it will be hooked up to the proposed extension? Or is it a moot question as far as Lono Kona is concerned?

SUEFUJI: In the original Lono Kona Subdivision plan, there was no possible Kuakini Highway. So it wasn't envisioned to be extended beyond the point where it ends at the present time. However, looking at the traffic circulation of this area, it would be desirable in the future. But not knowing where the firm alignment is going to be, it's very difficult to extend it anywhere right now, not until a permanent alignment is decided upon.

STERLING: Thank you very much. I was interested in getting an idea of the traffic that would be generated and how many people would be involved.

ASAI: Mr. Hawthorne, on this proposed new church, your members will come from both North and South Kona?

HAWTHORNE: No, just from the area itself. As a matter of fact, we have another chapel right down the road about another three miles, Keei. Bishop Wheeler could tell us the exact boundaries of the area, ... (inaudible) ... in the immediate Kailua District.

CHAIRMAN: Mr. Hawthorne, I notice that bounding the property is Kuakini Wall. I am just curious, does extension of Kuakini mean breaking down part of that wall?

PIIANAIA: Mr. Chairman, I think I can answerthat question. We discussed this with the State Department of Land and Natural Resources and the state archaeologist has permitted a 40' right-of-way break into the wall. There is now a cattle guard or fence there but it is only 40' wide.

CHAIRMAN: The cattle fence is at this point?

CARLSMITH: The Kuakini Wall in this area has been previously broken down for the purposes of cattle and also for the purpose of having a gate. There is an existing jeep road that is as you face mauka on the righthand side. There is roughly a 15' gate in there. A small section of the wall on the lefthand side, again facing mauka, and then there is a cattle chute and guard in that area. In totaling up the wall not in its original shape, you

get roughly 30 to 40 feet not existing in map shape in any way. A portion of the wall, in talking with the State people, they feel, it looks like maybe it was taken down and rebuilt. So a portion of it is already altered.

CHAIRMAN: To clarify in my mind for the record, there is a part that has been already torn down in the past.

CARLSMITH: It has already been altered in the past. And there may be a small portion of the wall that might have been the original wall, but again, it is unknown.

CHAIRMAN: Mr. Hawthorne, you call this a chapel, not a church. Could you explain to us?

HAWTHORNE: Actually the hall building is designated as a meeting house. We call the chapel where the worship service is held. This is the chapel wing over here. These are the classroom wing around here for our Sunday school classes and our young people where the ladies' society ... (inaudible) ... Right in the middle is the cultural hall. The Mormon Church features all of our people in their church all of the culture, the drama speech, for the very sportsminded this would be a full-sized basketball court in there. It's a youth-oriented cultural hall. The area in the chapel itself is called, you call it a meeting house.

CHAIRMAN: How would this differ from a church?

HAWTHORNE: The church is three and a half million people and only 650 people will meet in this one. The church is the entire body of the church all over the world. That is how we designate it.

CHAIRMAN: In other words, what you are saying is the building you go to are chapels; the church is not a building.

HAWTHORNE: The church is the people.

CHAIRMAN: I am just now seeing how that interpretation reflects one letter we got. You mentioned another chapel, and you said standing room only. Are you saying you are going to replace that chapel?

HAWTHORNE: This will be a new chapel.

CHAIRMAN: How about that other one?

HAWTHORNE: We don't know what will happen to it. It's right down on Kuakini and probably the noisiest corner in the whole town of Kailua, and when you are going to hold a sacred service in the morning and evening, with motorcycles and buses, it's almost impossible.

CHAIRMAN: How many chapels do you have now in the Kona area?

HAWTHORNE: We have five. No, only one in Kona, one in Keei, Waimea, Kohala, and one on the other side, in Naalehu. It's called the Kona Hawaii State, there are five chapels.

CHAIRMAN: Your Kona area is larger than our Kona District.

HAWTHORNE: That is right.

CHAIRMAN: Will all you people supporting this chapel stand up? For the record, let's say about 100. And this many more outside, I guess. We are

very appreciative when we have a hearing where many people come to it because usually it's the other way around.

MURAKAMI: I want to ask staff: we are talking about the 401 right-of-way. Let's say Kaahumanu goes through and you connect that. If they would dedicate to the public, does this 40' requirement meet our Zoning Code?

PIIANAIA: It was already subdivided and originally required to be 60' wide. Kalani Street is presently 40' wide and we are still trying to work out the problem of the Kuakini Wall encroachment situation with the State archaeologist.

CHAIRMAN: Mr. Hawthorne, thank you very much for coming up. Anyone would like to come up to offer testimony? We do have a workshop to go to and time is running short here, but we would like to hear from you people.

WHEELER: My name is Kenneth Wheeler and I am bishop of the Kona ward. ... (inaudible) ... because of the situation Les Hawthorne spoke about, the traffic condition and the noise at the corner. We have a membership totaling about 650 in the Kona area and attendance is about 175. Parking area is inadequate so we made arrangements with Bank of Hawaii so that we use their parking for Sunday and they use ours during the week for their employees. It's a temporary situation. Many of the people, I'm afraid, are not coming because there just isn't room to park or to sit down, and it's so noisy that it's impossible. We really need ... (inaudible) ...

CHAIRMAN: Anyone else would like to come up?

(Next testimony completely inaudible except the fact that he is "president of the state, Hawaii State ... This will be a beautiful building projected to be about \$1,420,000 for the building itself... But it will also be available for civic activities ... whatever needs of the community...)

CHAIRMAN: May I ask where most of this money will be coming from?

State President: Of the total, 70% will be coming from the Church of Hawaii; the other 30% from the members.

CHAIRMAN: Anyone else?

AUNA: My name is John Auna. I am a member of the church and I am always anxious for the youth program. The new proposed location will help us in one area because of our youth program. The existing chapel site at the corner in Kailua is a very dangerous one because of the children's program, starting with day care all the way up to high school youth program. Moving to the new site will eliminate the danger and exposure to traffic which is becoming very heavy and almost ... (inaudible) ... I am in favor of this application.

McINTOSH: I am Bob McIntosh. I am a surveyor by trade and Morman by conviction. I have surveyed in 37 different states and been in all but four, and of all the chapels of the other denominations I've been to since being converted to Baptist ... (inaudible) I think that I have not found any other chapel in such poor condition. They do need a new chapel.

CHRISTIAN (?): My name is Charlie Christian (?). As I listened, I think there is one item that has not been broughtup and that is one of those ... (inaudible) ...

AH SAM (?): My name is Henry Ah Sam (?). I am the bishop of the membership that is located north end of the Big Island, Kohala, and I represent about 350 members from Kohala, and we would like to have you Commissioners vote

in favor of this application.

ISBELL: My name is Donald Isbell and I would like to assure you that several hundred prayers are being made and I assure you there are going to be several hundred more prayers made tonight for ... (inaudible) ...

CHAIRMAN: And may I say to you that my prayers are also with you and your enterprise.

HUMUKINI: I know we have been having all the men up here and ... (inaudible) ... and my name is Althea Humukini and I am a teacher at Kealakehe and mauka member of the church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints and I am also the primary president for the church which encounters children from three years old to eleven, and I am also a cub scout den mother, and I feel that as a mother with seven youngsters it is important to have a more safety area. We service a lot of boys from Kealakehe Kuaina cub scouts and if we are to stress safety and build characters in the boys as well as lots of our youths in the church, I would really appreciate it if we can have something worth our while for our youngsters. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN: It is not my policy to shut things off at a public hearing but unless someone wants to say something different I feel, in view of the workshop, we must halt after this.

STERLING: Mr. Chairman, I move to close the public hearing.

CHAIRMAN: I didn't know I was going to be taken so literally.

MURAKAMI: I second.

CHAIRMAN: It has been moved by Commissioner Sterling and seconded by Commissioner Murakami that the public hearing be closed. Any discussion? If not, all those in favor please say aye.

COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

CHAIRMAN: Opposed? Motion carried. According to the rules and regulations we cannot vote until fifteen days have passed. We will let you know when we're holding our vote. Thank you.

SPECIAL PERMIT: HPM DEVELOPMENT CORP.

The applicant, HPM Development Corporation, is requesting a special permit to allow the establishment of an LDS church on 7.016 acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The area in question is located adjacent to and immediately mauka of Lono-Kona Subdivision, approximately 750 feet east of the Kalani Street - Lampokaola Street intersection, Keopu 3rd, North Kona (TMK: 7-5-03:portion of 2).

The General Plan Land Use Pattern Allocation Guide Map designates this area as Orchards and Alternate Urban Expansion. The County's zoning designation is Unplanned. The County zoning code allows churches, as conditionally permitted uses, in all zones, except Industrial and Open district.

Presently, there are no structures situated on the parcel. The land is currently being used for grazing. Surrounding land uses include the adjacent Lono-Kona Subdivision and other pastoral lands.

The proposed site has soils which are of the Punaluu extremely rocky peat series with a slope of 6 to 20 percent. Rock outcrops occupy 40 to 50 percent of the surface. In a respresentative profile the surface layer is about 4 inches thick and is underlined with Pahoehoe lava bedrock. This soil is rapidly permeable, runoff is slow, and the erosion hazard is slight. This soil is used for pasture and has a Capability class of VII. Class VII soils have very severe limitations that make them unsuited to cultivation and that restrict their use largely to pasture or range, woodland, or wildlife. Rainfall in the area is generally 30 to 40 inches annually.

Special Permit HPM Development Corporation Page 2

In support of the request the applicant has stated the following:

"The proposed church site lies makai of the Kaahumanu Highway extension route and mauka of the Lono-Kona Subdivision. The property is not well suited for agriculture and with the completion of the Kaahumanu Highway extension will be divided from the remaining agricultural property by a major highway. The present use is for pasture purposes, which use will be difficult and uneconomical to continue after the completion of the Kaahumanu Highway.

"The proposed church site is amply large to accommodate the proposed use without significant effect on the adjoining Lono-Kona Subdivision. The proposed use will not significantly affect the property rights of property owners in the immediate vicinity.

"Enforcement of the zoning code would result in the applicant's property being put to a use that it is not suited for physically or economically.

"The subject property is zoned unplanned under the County zoning code and the proposed use is a conditionally permitted use in an unplanned district. If the property was zoned agriculture under the County zoning code, the proposed use would still be a conditionally permitted use, and therefore not in conflict with the zoning code or General Plan for the County of Hawaii."

The seven (7) acre area in question was a portion of a 144-acre parcel which was granted final subdivision approval on August 7, 1975.

There is also a pending subdivision application for the creation of a 1,643 square foot parcel which will be part of the Kalani Street extension. A tentative subdivision approval was granted on August 7, 1975 to the owner of this parcel, Arthur Nearon. The granting of this subdivision request will result in providing access to the subject property. Kalani Street has a right-of-way width of forty (40) feet with a 16-foot pavement.

The west side of the property in question is presently bordered by the Great Wall of Kuakini. This wall was built by Governor Kuakini, the second Governor of the Island, for the purpose of fencing cattle. Aside from this wall, there are no other historical or geological features attributed to the property.

Upon review of the request, the Department of Water Supply stated the following:

"We have no objection to the subject request inasmuch as water was committed through a recent subdivision application involving the same parcel. However, the applicant should be informed that water shall be available only upon completion of the water system per approved construction plans of the said subdivision."

All other cooperating agencies had no objections or comments on the subject request.

The area under consideration is classified as agricultural by the State Land Use Commission. The Agricultural District includes lands surrounded by or contiguous to agricultural lands and which are not suited to agricultural and ancillary activities by reason of topography, soils and other related characteristics. The subject property has soils which are in the Soil Conservation Service's Capability Class VII. Class VII soils have very severe limitations which make them unsuited to cultivation and restrict their use largely to pasture or range, woodland, or wildlife. Class VII soils are

the second to the lowest of the Soil Conservation

Service's ranking system for agricultural producti
vity. Although it is possible for the subject pro
perty to be used for some agricultural activities,

it is determined that approval of the subject request

will not be contrary to the objectives of the Land Use

Law and Regulations, given the capability class rating

of the property for agricultural productivity and

the above cited criterion for determining the Agri
cultural Distict.

Further, the use of the subject property for nonagricultural purposes is expected to not have an adverse effect on the overall agricultural potential of the region or the island.

In addition, churches and institutions of a religious nature are permitted in the Unplanned and the Agricultural zones by the County Zoning Code.

2. That the proposed use will not adversely affect surrounding properties. Surrounding land uses include the Lono Kona Subdivision and grazing lands. The Lono Kona Subdivision, in the area adjacent to the subject property, is zoned for residential duplex uses. This subdivision is fairly built up and is urban in character. The area under consideration is designated for alternate urban expansion on the General Plan Land Use Pattern Allocation Guide Map. Should a need for urban expansion arise in the future, it would be directed to areas designated as such by the General Plan. The pasture lands which surround the subject property on its mauka side could possibly be cut off by the proposed Queen Kaahumanu Highway extension. It is thus determined that approval of the proposed use on the subject property will not have an adverse effect on surrounding properties, be they urban or agricultural in nature.

3. That although the proposed use may alter the essential character of the land, it would not be detrimental to the present use of the subject property. The subject property is a seven-acre portion of a 144-acre parcel. This portion was recently subdivided out of the larger parcel. At the present time it is used for grazing. It is undenying that the proposed use will alter the character of the land. However, it is determined that the provision of a church on the subject land would be beneficial and well suited to accommodate the welfare

the church. At the present time, there is an existing meeting place for the members of this denomination.

Due to the inconvenient location of the existing facility, however, it has become necessary for the church to relocate. The existing facility is located at an extremely busy intersection in Kailua and is subject to traffic, noise, and other similar nuisances. Aside from the existing facility, which would be phased out of use for worship services, there is no other facility of this denomination available to the residents of the general area. Therefore, the establishment of the proposed use would suit the needs of the residents of the area.

It is further recommended that a favorable recommendation be given subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That construction of the temple commence within one (1)

 year from the date of approval of the Special Permit. and
 be completed with two (2) years thereoffer.
- 2. That occupancy of the proposed building shall not be granted until final subdivision approval has been given to Subdivision No. 75-124, which is for the Kalani Street extension.

- 3. That a landscaping buffer shall be established along the Kuakini Wall side of the property for the purpose of screening the proposed use from existing residential uses. This buffer shall be incorporated into plans submitted for Plan Approval and shall be approved by the Planning Director.
- 4. That all other applicable rules and regulations, including the Plan Approval process, shall be complied with.

Should any of the foregoing conditions not be met, the Special Permit shall be deemed null and void.

This is in reply to your letter dated September 16, 1975, in which you expressed your concern on the subject application. We will try to respond to the questions which you raised.

The purpose of the Special Permit application is to allow the construction of a church in the State Land Use Agricultural District. Approval was granted on August 7, 1975 for the subdivision of a 7-acre lot from a larger parcel consisting of 144 acres. The 7-acre lot is where the church is proposed to be located. The land is presently owned by the applicant, HPM Development Corporation. If the Special Permit application is approved, the LDS church will purchase the lot from the applicant.

In regards to your questions concerning the tax exempt status of the property involved, we refer you to Section 246-32(b)(3) of the Hawaii Revised Statutes. This section of the Real Property Tax Law of the State relates to exemptions for "charitable, et., purposes". Under this section, property which is owned in fee simple, leased or rented for a period of one year or more is exempt from real property taxes when used for "church purposes, including incidental activities, parsonages, and church grounds...." whether the entire 7-acre lot will be exempt from real property taxes will have to be determined by the Tax Office.

We hope that the above answers some of the questions you raised. Thank you for expressing your concern.

Petitioner's reason(s) for requesting Special Permit:

The proposed church site lies makai of the Kaahumanu Highway extension route and mauka of the Lono-Kona Subdivision. The property is not well suited for agriculture and with the completion of the Kaahumanu Highway extension will be divided from the remaining agricultural property by a major highway. The present use is for pasture purposes, which use will be difficult and uneconomical to continue after the completion of the Kaahumanu Highway.

The proposed church site is amply large to accommodate the proposed use without significant effect on the adjoining Lono-Kona Subdivision. The proposed use will not significantly affect the property rights of property owners in the immediate vicinity.

Enforcement of the zoning code would result in the applicant's property being put to a use that it is not suited for physically or economically.

The subject property is zoned unplanned under the County zoning code and the proposed use is a conditionally permitted use in an unplanned district. If the property was zoned agriculture under the County zoning code, the proposed use would still be a conditionally permitted use, and therefore not in conflict with the zoning code or General Plan for the County of Hawaii.
