The Land Use Commission of the State of Hawaii, having duly considered the entire record in the above entitled matter, makes the following findings of fact and conclusions of law.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Petitioner, Church of Jesus Christ of
  Latter-Day Saints, is requesting a six (6) month time extension to allow the construction of a church on approximately seven (7) acres of land situated within the State Land Use
  Agricultural District at Keopu 3rd, North Kona, Hawaii, Tax
  Map Key 7-5-03: 22 (formerly portion of parcel 2).
- 2. The original Special Permit was approved by the State Land Use Commission on December 5, 1978.
- 3. Condition Number One (1) of the Special Permit required that construction of the church commence within one (1) year from the date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two (2) years thereafter.
- 4. Inasmuch as the permit use was granted on December 5, 1975, construction of the church was to have commenced by December 5, 1976.
- 5. In a letter dated March 24, 1977, the Petitioner requested an 18-month time extension for the commencement of construction until June 5, 1978.
- 6. That request for extension was granted by the Land Use Commission on June 13, 1977.

7. At the same time, the Special Permit was transferred from HPM Development Corporation (original applicant on behalf of the church) to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. 8. By letter from the Land Use Commission dated May 18, 1978, all County Planning Departments, including the Hawaii County Planning Department, were advised that the Commission will henceforth not approve requests for time extension, if the request is filed after the commencement or expiration dates stipulated in the permit had lapsed. 9. Construction of the church was to have commenced by June 5, 1978. On July 3, 1978, the Petitioner filed for a second time extension at a period of time nearly one (1) month after the expiration of the permit. The Petitioner stated that the person previously responsible for filing extensions of the permit let it lapse because of a probable oversight. It was also stated in the record that the previous delays in construction of the church was due to the necessity of the Petitioner to secure approval from church headquarters, the time needed to raise funds for construction, and a recent change in the leadership of the church. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW Rule 9-3(1) of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Land Use Commission require that a reasonable time limit for establishing the use be imposed as a condition of the Special Permit. The reasonable time limit for establishing the use as required in Special Permit Number 75-224 was not complied with. -2-

- 3. The Petitioner failed to request a timely extension of the time condition within the Permit.
- Therefore, Special Permit Number 75-224 expired by operation of law.
- The Land Use Commission of the State of Hawaii is, therefore, unable to approve the request for extension inasmuch as the permit has expired by operation of law.
- 6. The Commission's conclusions are not based upon any determination of the need, or the lack of need of the proposed facility.

#### DECISION AND ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Special Permit Number 75-224, requesting a six (6) month extension of the time condition for establishing the church on approximately seven (7) acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District at Keopu 3rd, North Kona, Hawaii, Tax Map Key 7-5-03: 22 (formerly portion of parcel 2), be and is hereby denied approval for the foregoing reasons.

November 6, 1978 Mr. Sidney Fuke, Planning Director Hawaii County Planning Department 25 Aupuni Street Hilo, Hawaii 96720 Re: Special Permit 75-224, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints Dear Mr. Fuke: At its meeting on October 19, 1978, the State Land Use Commission found that SP75-224 had lapsed and was already in an expired status at the time the extension request was made. The time extension request was made on July 3, 1978, nearly one (1) month after the expiration of the stipulated time period allowed to start construction of the proposed church. Therefore, the Land Use Commission is unable to approve this request because there is legally no permit for the Commission to act upon. The record reveals that SP75-224 was originally approved by the State Land Use Commission on December 5, 1975. As a condition of approval on the original permit, it was required of the petitioner that "... construction of the church commence within one (1) year from the date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two (2) years thereafter." Since the permit was approved on December 5, 1975, construction of the facility was to have commenced by December 5, 1976. However, an 18-month time extension for the commencement of construction until June 5, 1978 was granted by the Land Use Commission on June 13, 1977. In the present case, SP75-224 lapsed on June 5, 1978, inasmuch as the permittee failed to comply with the time requirements of the permit. The action of the Land Use Commission is not predicated on any decision that the need for the proposed use is not warranted, but is instead based entirely upon the failure of the applicant to make a timely request for extension. #### ADDITION TO AGENDA

Upon motion by Commissioner Pascua, seconded by Commissioner Carras, it was unanimously agreed to add to the agenda a discussion of the archaeological study which had been submitted by the Moana Corporation, A76-418.

### A76-418 - MOANA CORPORATION (Archaeological Study)

Mr. Walton Hong, representing the petitioner, noted that copies of the archaeological and biological surveys, prepared by the Archaeological Research of Hawaii, Inc., relative to the subject petition had been transmitted to the Commission. He recalled that the Commission, in approving the petition, had imposed a condition that archaeological and biological studies be conducted by the petitioner prior to development of the site. Thus, it was explained by Mr. Hong, he was appearing before the Commission to request a determination as to whether this condition had been satisfactorily met.

Following a lengthy discussion concerning Mr. Hong's request, Deputy Attorney General Allan Kawada counselled the

Commission not to take any action inasmuch as there was no requirement in the condition imposed that it be approved by the Commission. He advised that the main consideration here was the certification that the survey was a comprehensive one conducted by a qualified person.

In view of the foregoing comments, and at Mr. Hong's request, permission was granted the petitioner to withdraw the request and to have the Commission consider the studies as merely informational material.

Upon motion by Vice Chairman Nakagawa, seconded by Commissioner Carras, it was unanimously agreed to go into executive session to receive counsel regarding time extensions on Special Permits.

SPECIAL PERMIT REQUEST TO ALLOW A SIX MONTH TIME EXTENSION TO
COMMENCE CONSTRUCTION OF A CHURCH AT NORTH KONA, HAWAII

Mr. Daniel Yasui, staff planner, oriented the Commission to the location of the subject parcel and read pertinent portions of the staff memorandum.

At the Chairman's request, Mr. Yasui provided a chronological account of the Special Permit; i.e. the dates of the original permit, the first request for extension and its expiration, and the present request. It was also noted by Mr. Yasui that all county planning directors and commissions had been put on notice, via letter, that the "Land Use Commission will not approve requests for time extension which are filed after the stipulated commencement or expiration dates."

Mr. Kawada counselled that upon expiration of the time condition, the permit ceased to be a viable one and therefore the extension request was no longer discretionary with the Commission.

Mr. Duane Kahuha, Deputy Planning Director of the Hawaii Planning Department, read into the record a letter from the Hawaii Planning Director to the Executive Officer of the Land Use Commission, posing several questions regarding procedural requirements and requesting further discussion with the LUC in view of the Commission's position on time extension requests.

It was reminded by Chairman Duke that it was incumbent upon the petitioner to fulfill the requirements of the

conditions that are imposed on the Special Permit, and that the Land Use Commission should take a firm position when time conditions are not met in timely fashion by the petitioner.

Commissioner Whitesell moved that the time extension request be denied, which was seconded by Commissioner Carras.

The Executive Officer requested a short recess to discuss possible alternatives to the problem.

#### 11:50 a.m.

The Chairman called on the Executive Officer for a poll of the motion on the floor. The Commissioners voted as follows:

Ayes: Commissioners Pascua, Whitesell, Oura, Miyasato, Nakagawa, Carras, Chairman Duke

The motion was carried.

The Chairman directed the Deputy Attorney General to draw up a decision and order on the foregoing action of the Commission, clearly delineating the reasons for the denial of the extension request, and also indicating that the Commission was not denying the church the right to construct a building by this action.

Condition No. 1 of this Special Permit required that construction of the church commence by June 5, 1978. The petitioner filed for a time extension on July 3, 1978, nearly one (1) month after the expiration date. In a policy determination by the Land Use Commission regarding the expiration of time conditions, it was established that the Commission would not approve any requests for time extension which are filed after the stipulated commencement or expiration dates. The Commission also directed staff to advise the County Planning Directors of this policy. A copy of this follow-up letter is attached for your information. The pertinent information concerning this Special Permit includes the following:

The petitioner, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, is requesting a six (6) month time extension to allow the construction of a church on approximately seven (7) acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District at Keopu 3rd, North Kona, Hawaii, Tax Map Key 7-5-03: 22 (formerly portion of parcel 2). The subject property is located adjacent to and immediately mauka of the Lono-Kona Subdivision, approximately 750 feet east of the Kalani Road-Lamaokeola Street intersection.

The Special Permit was originally approved by the State Land Use Commission on December 5, 1975. Condition No. 1 of the permit stated: "That construction of the chapel commence within one (1) year from the date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two (2) years thereafter." Since the permit was granted on December 5, 1975, construction was to have commenced by December 5, 1976.

In a letter dated March 24, 1977, the petitioner requested an 18-month time extension for the commencement of construction until June 5, 1978. This request was granted by the Land Use Commission on June 13, 1977. Also at that time, the Special Permit was transferred from HPM Development Corporation (original applicant on behalf of the Church) to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.

The petitioner is now requesting a six month time extension for SP75-224, to be computed from the date of approval of the request, should it be granted. This request was filed with the Hawaii County Planning Department through a letter dated July 3, 1978, from the petitioner.

In support of the request, the petitioner has in part stated the following:

- "I would like to ask in behalf of our church that another extension be granted.
- "First of all, Lester Hawthorne, the person who handled these matters previously, has recently left for Indonesia on another assignment. It was probably an oversight on his part about the permit expiring.
- "Secondly, the funds for construction has been secured; the architect has completed the building plans which should be in your office for approval any day now.
- "With all that has been done thus far, please consider granting us an extension that we may start construction in the near future.
- "...Regarding my request for an extension of the above permit, it would be most appreciated if a (6) six month extension (sic) could be approved.
- "We have the funds to begin construction and several contractors have submitted bids for the project. Should the extension (sic) be approved, work will begin immediately."

On August 31, 1978, the Hawaii County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the time extension request to the Land Use Commission based on the following findings:

"That the requested extension is a reasonable one. The petitioner has made sincere attempts to comply with the performance condition stipulated in the granting of the Special Permit. At this time, the petitioner is ready to apply for a building permit and to commence construction of the proposed chapel. Noncompliance with the stipulated time limitations has been primarily due to a recent change in church leadership. Previous delay was due to the necessity of the petitioner to receive approval from church headquarters as well as to raise the funds for construction of the chapel. The requested six-month extension should provide the petitioner with sufficient time to accept a construction bid, to secure a building permit and to commence construction."

For the Commission's information, the meeting minutes of August 31, 1978 have been attached (County Exhibit I).

The favorable recommendation was subject to the condition that all other conditions stipulated in the Special Permit be complied with. It was further stated by the Planning Commission that: "Should any of the conditions not be met, action may be initiated to nullify the Special Permit."

For the Commission's information, the other conditions originally imposed on the Special Permit included the following:

- "2. That occupancy of the proposed building shall not be granted until final subdivision approval has been given to Subdivision No. 75-124, which is for the Kalani Street extension.
- "3. That a landscaping buffer shall be established along the Kuakini Wall side of the property for the purpose of screening the proposed use from existing residential uses. This buffer shall be incorporated into plans submitted for Plan Approval and shall be approved by the Planning Director.
- "4. That all other applicable rules and regulations, including the Plan Approval process, shall be complied with."

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints has submitted a request for a time extension to Condition No. 1 of Special Permit 75-224. Special Permit 75-224 allowed the construction of a church on approximately 7 acres of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The area involved is located adjacent to and immediately mauka of the Lono-Kona Subdivision, approximately 750 feet east of the Kalani Road-Lamaokeola Street intersection, Keopu 3rd, North Kona (TMK: 7-5-03:22, formerly portion of parcel 2).

The Special Permit was originally approved on December 5, 1975 by the State Land Use Commission. Condition No. 1 stated that construction of the chapel commence within one year from the date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two years thereafter.

On June 13, 1977, an extension of time until June 5, 1978 to commence construction was granted (SLUC). At the same time, the Special Permit was transferred from HPM Development Corp., to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. HPM Development Corp owned the subject property at the time of the initial approval of the Special Permit and had filed the application on behalf of the church.

Per a letter dated July 3, 1978, from Henry Ah Sam, President
Kona Hawaii Stake, a request for a time extension was filed with
the Planning Department. This letter stated, in part, the following:

"I would like to ask in behalf of our church that another extension be granted.

"First of all, Lester Hawthorne, the person who handled these matters previously, has recently left for Indonesia on another assignment. It was probably an oversight on his part about the permit expiring.

"Secondly, the funds for construction has been secured; the architect has completed the building plans which should be in your office for approval any day now.

"With all that has been done thus far, please consider granting us an extension that we may start construction in the near future."

The petitioner has further stated the following:

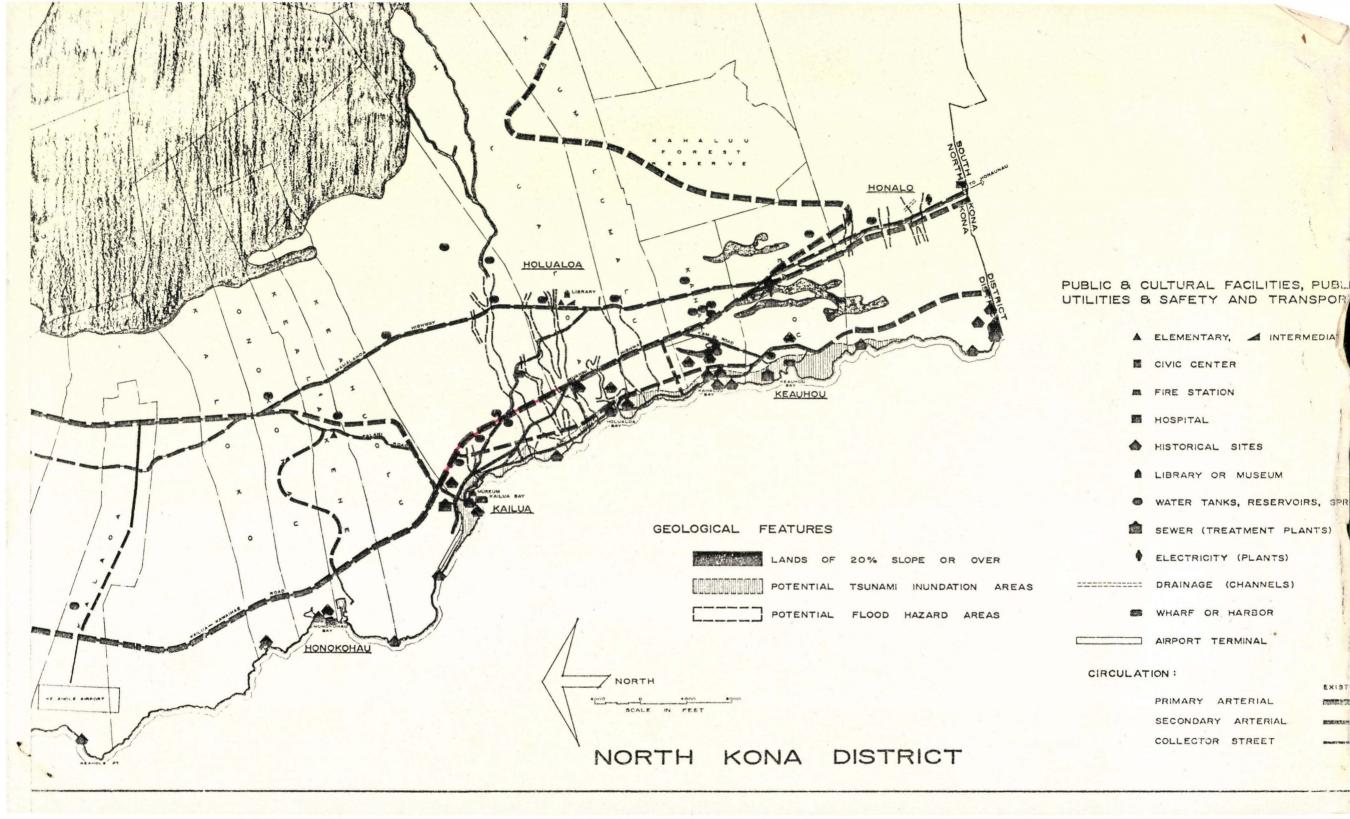
