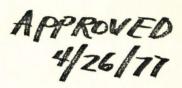
At the request of the Executive Officer, Commissioner Whitesell moved to add to the agenda 2 extension of time requests: one from Hawaii Land Corporation, SP73-157; and one from Mauna Ziona Church, SP75-230. It was seconded by Commissioner Duke and carried.

#### ACTION

SP76-254 - JOSEPH FILANCIA, JR.
APPLICATION FOR A SPECIAL PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE A
CHURCH AT PUKALANI, MAUI

Mr. Gordan Furutani, Executive Officer, summarized the staff report prepared for the subject request and described the property on the maps.

Commissioner Whitesell commented that the County of Maui should be requested to elaborate on questions which are raised at the County hearing such as the one concerning the disposal of the storm runoff posed by the Department of Transportation. She also commented on the restrictive nature of the term "use would be limited to church activities". Commissioner Duke agreed that



the legality of the proposed use. He also felt there was a serious question as to whether the County could issue a building permit for a single-family residence on an agricultural lot where there was no agricultural activity at all. He was of the opinion that a rural category might be a more logical solution.

Chairman Tangen directed that the parties meet together to come up with a single recommendation to the Commission within 45 days.

It was Mr. Lum's recommendation that, should the petition be approved, the Land Use Commission on its own initiative seek to reclassify the 8 lots which had been excluded from the petition.

The Chair requested that the petitioner submit proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law within 30 days to the Commission and to all parties, and that the parties will have 15 days from date of service to respond.

The hearing on A76-419 was closed thereafter.

#### ACTION

AR&R76-6 - AMENDMENT TO THE STATE LAND USE COMMISSION RULES OF PRACTICE AND PROCEDURE

The Chair called on Mr. Benjamin Matsubara, hearing officer hired to conduct the hearings on the amendments to the Rules, to present his report.

Mr. Matsubara's summary of the hearings, responses to questions from the Commission members, and discussion, are set forth in the transcript on pages 65 to 71.

Mr. Matsubara concluded that there were no objections to the proposed amendments by the Commission (see copy on file).

Commissioner Duke moved to adopt the proposed amendments and to incorporate it into the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Carras and passed as follows:

AP75-230 - MAUNA ZIONA CHURCH EXTENSION OF TIME REQUEST

Mr. Furutani read the letter from Mr. Norman Keanaaina, representing the Mauna Ziona Church, stating that he was not advised of the Special Permit approval of December 12, 1975 until a few days ago and therefore he was requesting a time extension of at least 6 months to allow them to proceed properly.

Mr. Furutani commented that although the records indicated that notification of the approval of the Special Permit was sent to the petitioner, it was possible that he may have not received it.

It was moved by Commissioner Oura to approve the extension request, which was seconded by Commissioner Carras and unanimously carried.

SP73-157 - HAWAII LAND CORPORATION EXTENSION OF TIME REQUEST

It was pointed out by Mr. Furutani that, rather than the actual consideration of the extension request, a legal matter was involved here over whether the procedure to be followed regarding a denial of request for extension of time for a Special Permit by the County Planning Commission was the same as that set forth in the processing of Special Permit petitions.

Mr. Marsh expanded on the procedures to be followed involving different situations on a Special Permit; i.e. extension requests approved by the Planning Commission, failure of the petitioner to perform according to condition imposed by either the County or the LUC, revocation proceedings, and modification of a condition attached to a Special Permit.

Mr. Marsh counselled that the LUC was powerless to waive the condition that 'construction shall be initiated no later than October 17, 1976" which had been imposed by the County. Moreover, rather than assuming that a Special Permit was null and void upon failure to fulfill certain conditions, it was Mr. Marsh's recommendation that the Commission take an affirmative action to revoke the Special Permit for failure to perform according to conditions.

Mr. Lum wondered whether the condition imposed by the County was not merely a recommendation to the LUC, to be considered as final only upon approval by the LUC.

Commissioner Duke observed that there seemed to be a slight disagreement on the legal interpretation concerning the procedures to be followed on the subject extension request. He, therefore, recommended that the matter be deferred until there was a consensus of the legal interpretation between the County and the State.

Mr. Furutani advised that the denial of the extension request had been received in the Commission office on January 10, 1977, and that a decision would have to be rendered within 45 days.

Commissioner Duke moved to defer action on the extension request pending a legal opinion from the Attorney General's Office. It was suggested by Mr. Lum that the AG's opinion be circulated to all county attorneys for comments. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Miyasato and unanimously passed.

The above Special Permit was approved by the Land Use Commission on December 5, 1975 to allow the construction of restroom facilities at the present Mauna Ziona Church site. The property comprises approximately 0.75 acres of land and is situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District at Kalaoa 4th, North Kona, Hawaii, Tax Map Key 7-3-04: 6.

One of the three conditions imposed at the time of approval was the following:

"That construction of the proposed restroom facilities commence by the applicant within one (1) year from the official date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within one (1) year thereafter."

In his November 24, 1976 letter requesting a 6-month extension until June 5, 1977, Mr. Norman Keanaaina, representing Mauna Ziona Church, states that:

"With reference to the request for construction of restrooms at Mauna Ziona Church, Kalaoa, North Kona, approved December 12, 1975, please be advised that I, as petitioner for my church, was not advised of the approval until a few days ago.

"Because of this situation, it would be extremely difficult for us to start construction within the next few days, before the deadline of the fifth (5th) of December.

"Therefore, on behalf of our church, I am requesting a time extension of at least six months to allow us to properly proceed."

With regard to Mr. Keanaaina's statement that he was not advised of the Land Use Commission's approval, the records on file at the Commission office reflect that a notification of the approval signed by Mr. Ah Sung Leong was transmitted to the applicant on December 9, 1975.

By letter dated December 27, 1976, the Hawaii County Planning Commission advised that at its December 22, 1976 meeting, it voted to recommend approval for a 6-month extension to commence construction of the proposed restroom facilities at the church site as it was found that:

"As the official notification was not sent by certified or registered mail, it is conceivable that the applicant, Norman Keanaaina, was not aware of the Land Use Commission's action. Additionally, the requested 6-month extension indicates some measure of effort on the part of the petitioner to complete his plans, secure a permit, and begin construction. These combined circumstances demonstrate the reasonableness of the applicant's request."

The Planning Commission further recommended that the requested time extension be subject to the condition that all other conditions of the Special Permit be complied with. The other two conditions imposed by the Land Use Commission at the time of approval include:

- 1. "That the existing outhouses be demolished after completion of the new facilities."
- 2. "That all other applicable rules and regulations be complied with."

Norman Keanaaina, in behalf of Mauna Ziona Church, is requesting a time extension to a Special Permit which was granted by the State Land Use Commission on December 5, 1975, to allow the construction of rest-room facilities at the present Mauna Ziona Church site.

The property involved is located adjacent and to the north of the former Kalaoa School, at the Old Government Mauka Road-Hawaii Belt Highway junction, Kalaoa 4th, North Kona (TMK: 7-3-04:6).

The Hawaii County Planning Commission has transmitted a Special Permit request by the Mauna Ziona Church for the construction of restroom facilities for an existing church situated within the Agricultural District. The subject property is the present Mauna Ziona Church site located adjacent and to the north of the former Kalaoa School, at the Old Government Mauka Road - Hawaii Belt Highway junction, Kalaoa 4th, North Kona, Hawaii (TMK: 7-3-04:6).

According to the applicant, the existing church and hall on the 0.75 acre property were constructed in the 1800's. These buildings presently exist under the non-conforming provisions of the State Land Use District Regulations. The existing outhouse facilities containing an area of 128 sq. ft. will be replaced by the proposed restroom facilities containing an area of approximately 540 sq. ft. and will be located on another portion of the church property.

The General Plan land use pattern allocation guide map designates the area for Extension Agricultural uses (pasture and range lands) and Alternate Urban Expansion. The County zoning is Agricultural 20-acres (A-20a).

Surrounding land uses include the former Kalaoa School, scattered single-family dwellings, and vacant lands. The Kona Palisades Subdivision is located to the west of the area in question, across from the Hawaii Belt Highway.

The Old Government Mauka Road, which provides direct access to the property, has a right-of-way width that varies between 40 to 50 feet. The pavement width is eight (8) feet. The Hawaii Belt Highway has a right-of-way width of eight (80) feet. All essential utilities are available to the subject property."

Comments received on the application are as follows:

Department of Water Supply

"We have no adverse objections to this Special Permit request. For your information, this church has been provided with public water through a 5/8 inch service connection installed in October 1973. Inasmuch as this permit is for the relocation and construction of new restroom facilities, we do not anticipate any increased in water usage."

All other cooperating agencies had no comments to or objections on the request."

## County Recommendation:

The Hawaii County Planning Commission held a duly advertised public hearing on the request on October 16, 1975.

On November 6, 1975, the Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the Special Permit on the following basis:

- 1. "That the requested restroom facilities will not alter or change the essential character of the land and its present use. The property is and has been used for a church since the early 1800's. Existing on the 0.75-acre parcel are a church, church hall, and two (2) outhouses. The request is to allow the construction of a 12'8" by 16'8" building for restrooms which would merely replace the existing outhouses.
- 2. "Immediately adjacent and to the north of the property is the former Kalaoa School site on which structures are already existing. Other surrounding land uses include scattered single-family dwellings and vacant lands. There are no agricultural activities being conducted in the immediate area. As such, it is determined that approval of the proposed facilities on the subject property will not have any adverse effects on the surrounding properties. It is further determined that the use of the property for nonagricultural purposes is not expected to have any adverse effects on the overall agricultural potential of the area.
- 3. "Furthermore, the proposed use will not unreasonably burden public agencies to provide or improve the existing public facilities and utilities. The granting

of the Special Permit for the construction of restroom facilities will not generate additional traffic to the existing church; thus, the present access to the site is deemed adequate. All essential utilities, including public water, are available to the property.

4. "One of the standards of the General Plan is that there shall be minimum of visual and odor pollution. The construction of the new restroom facilities will, in essence, complement this particular standard as it will, in fact, improve the existing situation. In addition, churches and accessory facilities of a religious nature are 'conditionally permitted uses' within the County's Agricultural zoned district. Thus, it will not violate the spirit and intent of the Zoning Code. It is therefore determined that granting of this Special Permit to allow the construction of the restroom facilities to replace the existing outhouses would be in the best public interest; and in this particular case, for the health and welfare of the members of the congregation."

The favorable recommendation was made subject to the following conditions:

- "1. That construction of the proposed restroom facilities commence by the applicant within one (1) year from the official date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within one (1) year thereafter.
- That the existing outhouses be demolished after completion of the new facilities.
- 3. That all other applicable rules and regulations be complied with."

"Should any of the foregoing conditions not be met, the Special Permit shall be deemed null and void."

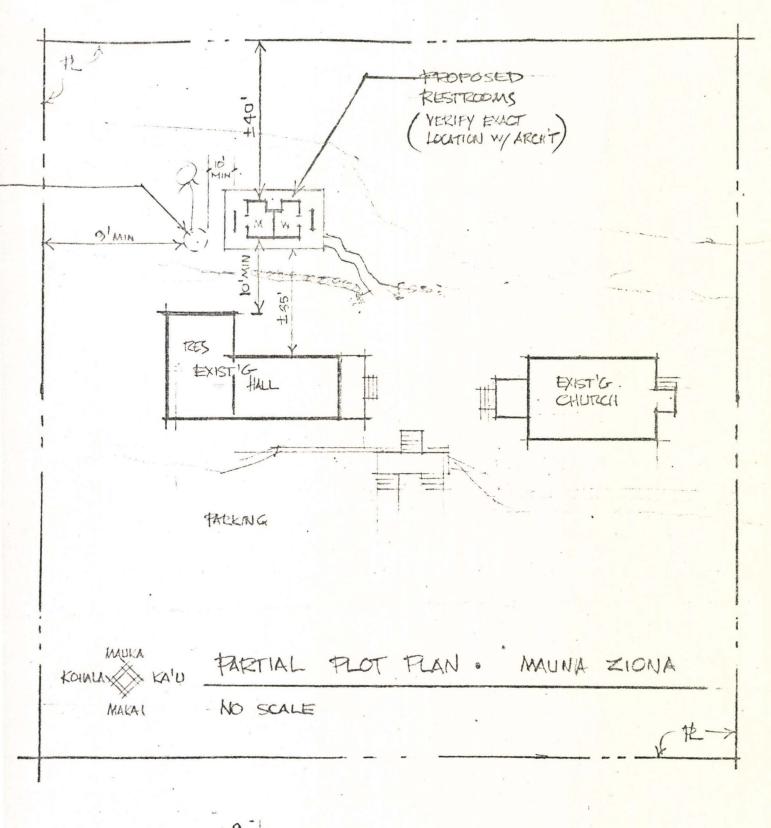

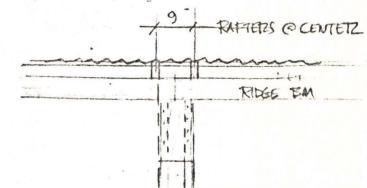

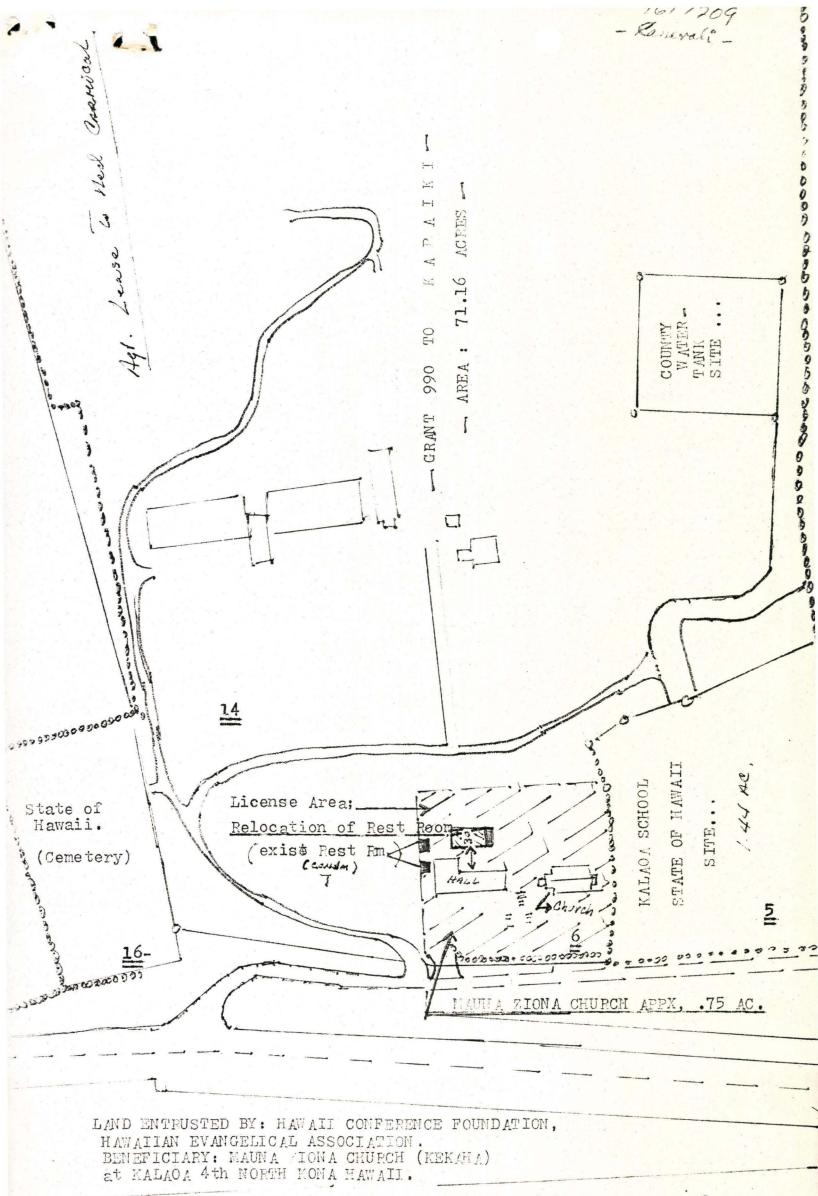

PRELIMINARY HEARING CHANGE OF ZONE FOREMOST HOMES HAWAII, LTD KAUMANA, SOUTH HILO Change of zone request in accordance with Chapter 8 (Zoning Code) Articlel, Section 6, Hawaii County Code, as amended, for 137 acres of land from Multiple Residential - 4,000 sq ft (RM-4), Single

Family Residential - 10,000 sq ft (RS-10) and Agricultural 20-acre (A-20a) zoned districts to Single Family Residential - 7,500 sq ft and Multiple Residential - 4,000 sq ft (RM-4) zoned districts. The area involved, referred to as Park Hokulani, is located adjacent to the 100-lot Hilo Country Club Estates Subdivision, about half a mile from Kaumana Drive, Kukuau 2nd, Kaumana, South Hilo, TMK: 2-5-46:Portions of 01 and 03.

Staff presented background report and several petitions from residents in and around subject area. Park Hokulani was originally referred to as Gentry Hawaiiana and, according to Harvey Gerwig, other than the change in name no other detail has been altered. Change was made last January and every agency on all islands was so notified.

Replying to the petitions, Gerwig asserted that swimming pools, etc., were understood from the start to be under the homeowners association. Although understood to come under the "umbrella of the Hilo Country Club, no such promises were made," he said, adding, "nor any advertising."

Gerwig stated this project has always been proposed as incremental low-cost housing but should not be construed as substandard homes. Under the Hawaiian Housing Authority plan, sale will be in the "very low \$40,000 but comparable housing under regular construction to about \$45,000."

With regard to comments about the passive park area being in the flood inundation area, Gerwig said there is only a two-foot slope and land is very flat with a stream going through it, minimizing the hazards.

In direct reply to a staff query, Gerwig declared "to the best of my knowledge," the Association will assist in developing the interim park area. He also said the five-acre natural park area will not cross the Saddle Road at any point. He observed that with the change of zone, the number of lots will not exceed 953; total allowable is 994. It was pointed out that the water supply is limited to 953 units.

Commissioner Sterling moved to set this up for a public hearing. Seconded by Commissioner Sakamoto, carried.

PRELIMINARY HEARING CHANGE OF ZONE DWIGHT MITSUNAGA KAUMANA, SOUTH HILO Change of zone request in accordance with Chapter 8 (Zoning Code), Article 1, Section 6, Hawaii County Code as amended, for 2.75 acres of land from a Single Family Residential - 15,000 sq ft (RS-15)

### SPECIAL PERMIT: MAUNA ZIONA CHURCH

The applicant, Mauna Ziona Church, is requesting a Special Permit to allow the construction of restroom facilities for the existing church situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The property is the present Mauna Ziona Church site located adjacent and to the north of the former Kalaoa School, at the Old Government Mauka Road - Hawaii Belt Highway junction, Kalaoa 4th, North Kona (Tmk; \$6-3-04:6).

The proposed 12' 8" by 16' 8" restroom facilities will merely replace the existing outhouses.

According to the applicant, the existing church and hall were constructed in the 1800's. These buildings presently exist under the non-conforming provisions of the State Land Use District Regulations.

The property is 0.75 acre in size, and is relatively level.

The General Plan land use pattern allocation guide map designates the area for Extensive Agricultural uses (pasture and range lands) and Alternate Urban Expansion. The County zoning is Agricultural 20-acres (A-20a). Churches and institutions of a religious nature are "conditionally permitted uses" within this zoned district.

Surrounding land uses include the former Kalaoa School, scattered single family dwellings, and vacant lands. The Kona Palasades Subdivision is located to the was of the area in question, across from the Hawaii Belt Highway.

The Old Government Mauka Road, which provides direct access to the property, has a right-of-way width that varies between 40 to 50 feet. The pavement width is eight (8) feet. The Hawaii Belt Highway has a right-of-way width of eighty (80) feet.

All essential utilities are available to the subject property.

Upon review of the request, the Department of Water Supply had the following comments:

"We have no adverse objections to this Special Permit request.

For your information, this church has been provided with public water through a 5/8-inch service connection installed in October 1973.

Inasmuch as this permit is for the relocation and construction of new restroom facilities, we do not anticipate any increase in water usage."

All other cooperating agencies had no comments to or objections on the request.

RECOMMENDATION: MAUNA ZIONA CHURCH

It is recommended that the Special Permit request be given a favorable consideration based on the following findings:

That the requested restroom facilities will not alter or change the essential character of the land and its present use. The property is and has been used for a church since the early 1800's. Existing on the 0.75-acre parcel are a church, church hall, and two (2) outhouses. The request is to allow the construction of a 12' - 8" by 16' - 8" buildings for restrooms merely to replace the existing outhouses.

Immediately adjacent and to the north of the property is the former Kalaoa School site on which structures are aleady existing. Other surrounding land uses include scattered single-family dwellings and vacant lands. There are no agricultural activities being conducted in the immediate area. As such, it is determined that approval of the proposed facilities on the subject property will not have any adverse effects on the surrounding properties. It is further determined that the use of the property for nonagricultural purposes is not expected to have any adverse effects on the overall agricultural potential of the area.

Furthermore, the proposed use will not unreasonably burden public agencies to provide or improve the existing public facilities and utilities. The granting of the Special Permit for the construction of restroom facilities will not generate additional traffic to the existing church; thus, the present access to the site is deemed adequate. All essential utilities, including public water, are available to the property.

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One of the standards of the General Plan is that there shall be a minimum of visual and odor pollution. The construction of the new restroom facilities will, in essence, complement this particular standard as it will, in fact, improve the existing situation. In addition, churches and accessory facilities of a religious nature are "conditionally permitted uses" within the County's Agricultural zoned district. Thus, it will not violate the spirit and intent of the Zoning Code. It is therefore determined that granting of this Special Permit to allow the construction of the restroom facilities to replace the existing outhouses would be in the best public interest; and in this particular case, for the health and welfare of the members of the congregation.

It is further recommended that the request be given favorable consideration subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That construction of the proposed restroom facilities be started by the applicant within one (1) year from the official date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within one (1) year thereafter.
- 2. That the existing outhouses be demolished after completion of the new facilities.
- 3. That all other applicable rules and regulations be complied with.

Should any of the foregoing conditions not be met, the Special Permit shall be deemed null and void.

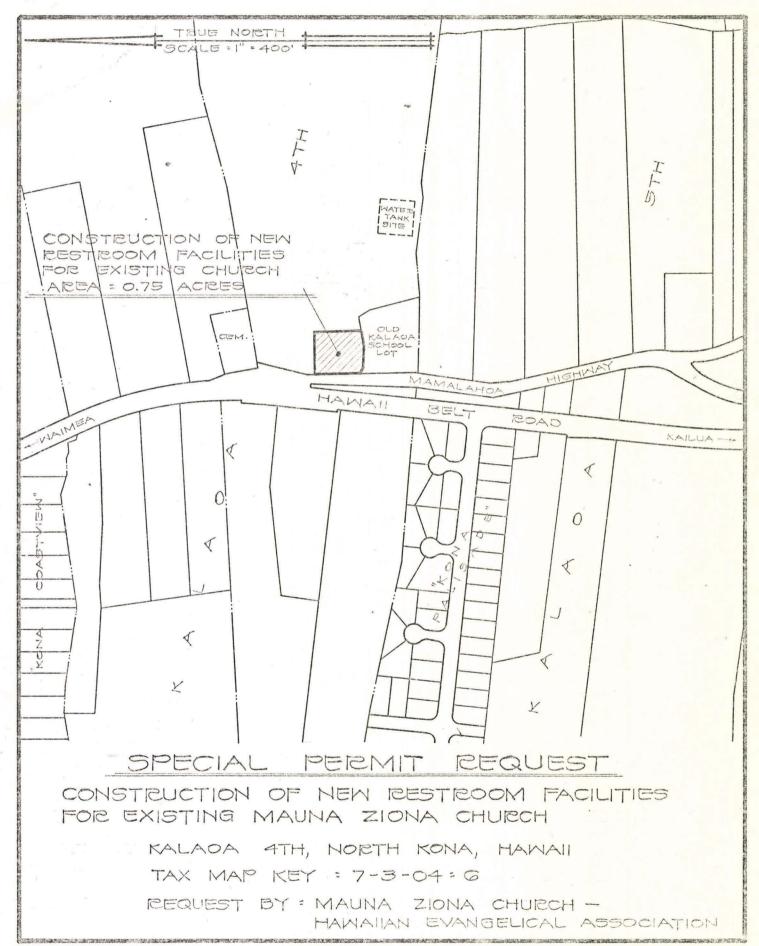

This is in reference to your letter of September 16, 1975 respecting the replacement of non-conforming facilities located in the State's Agricultural District.

As noted in your letter of September 16, Part II, Sub Part D, 2.81 (b) (2) of the Land Use District Regulations provides that non-conforming uses or structures shall not be expanded or increased in intensity of use. According to the plot plan, the new restroom facilities would not only be enlarged in total floor area but it is also proposed to be constructed on another portion of the property. Therefore, based on the data contained in your letter and enclosures, it is clear that the new restroom facilities for the Mauna Ziona Church should properly be considered under a Special Permit petition.

The situation respecting the Special Permit request by the St. Benedict's Church presently pending before the Land Use Commission is identical to the above described situation in that the proposed parish hall would be enlarged a total of over 500% of the original floor area and will be located on another portion of the church property.

An application was recently filed with our office for the construction of a new toilet facility to replace an old outhouse, which is an accessory use to the existing Mauna Ziona Church, situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The existing church and hall are situated on the property, were constructed sometime ago, thus, exist as non-conforming uses. According to Part II, Sub-Part D, 2.81 (b)(2)(Non-conforming uses of structures) of the State Land Use District Regulations, a non-conforming use shall not be expanded or increased in intensity of use. Inasmuch as the proposed toilet facility would replace an existing one, we would appreciate your response as to whether an application for a special permit is necessary.

Similarly, presently before you is a Special Permit request by the St. Benedict's Catholic Church to allow the construction of an all-purpose perish ball to replace an existing dilapidated hall. Since the proposed hall will basically be a replacement of the existing hall, would Part II, Sub-Part D, 2.81(b)(2) also apply.

This is to acknowledge receipt on September 12, 1975 of the above described special permit application.

The County Planning Commission shall conduct a public hearing on the request within a period of not less than thirty (30) nor more than onehundred twenty (120) days from the receipt of the application. The Planning Commission shall then act on the application not earlier than fifteen (15) days after the public hearing but within a reasonable time thereafter. Should the Planning Commission recommend flavorably on the request, it will then be forwarded to the State Land Use Commission for final action.

However, the Planning Commission may deny the request if it is found that the proposed use does not meet the special permit guidelines. In this case, their decision is final. In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 205-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, a denial by the Planning Commission may be appealable to the Circuit Couty of the circuit in which the land is situated, in this case, the Third Circuit Court.

Notice of the time and place of the public hearing shall be forwarded when the application is scheduled for Commission action.
