The petitioner, Bob Mason, on behalf of the National Organization of New Apostolic Churches, is requesting a Special Permit to allow the establishment of a church on 43,628 square feet of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District at Waiakea Homesteads, Waikea, South Hilo, Hawaii, Tax Map Key 2-4-47: 20. The subject property is located along the north side of Alani Street, approximately 650 feet east of the Alani Street and Malaai Road intersection at Waiakea Homesteads.

The petitioner intends to construct a 1,400 square foot church to accommodate approximately 100 persons on the subject property. The present church membership is 39. The subject parcel has a frontage along Alani Street of 113.32 feet and a depth of 385 feet. Plans for the proposed church structure indicate that the building would be set back 100 feet from Alani Street and a minimum of 35 feet from either property line to the east and west.

In support of the permit request, the petitioner has in part stated the following:

- "1. Chapter 8, Article 26, Section 2(C) 1 of the Hawaii County Zoning Code states that churches may be allowed to be built in agricultural areas of the County of Hawaii. The land in question is found within the State Land Use agricultural district and is zoned agricultural three acres, or A-3a. Being that this provision has been adopted by the zoning code, we are seeking this exception.
- "2. To locate a church in a residential or other allowable area would not be feasible in terms of cost of land and expansion needs. Also, in purchasing a smaller sized lot than one acre, a variance will have to be applied for which will consume time and money. The church also will be unable to expand the facilities in terms of playground and parking facilities on small RS-10 to RS-15 type lots.

"3. Mr. Inocencio Agasa, the former owner of the parcel in question, sold the property to the National Organization of the New Apostolic Church with the intention and the knowledge that a church would be constructed on the parcel. We also have attached signatures from 23 residents in the area (see map) who do not object to the establishment of the church in the area. In addition, all the residents on Alani Street on which the parcel is located have no objections to the church being built.

i - i

- "4. The existing roads, we believe, are adequate to serve the projected needs of the church. They believe that the maximum number of cars at any one time which will be driven to the church will be 10 cars. The philosophy of the church is to keep their congregation small--about 50--in order to achieve their goals. Historically, the churches throughout the nation have been about the size indicated above.
- "5. The hours of congregation will be on Sunday and on Thursday during the week.
- "6. In a residential district, a church would have the added disadvantage of being close to other houses and detract from the openness that would be desirable in any neighborhood. It is felt that a church is better suited to be away from any residentialtype districts.
- "7. It is also suggested that the State Land Use Code be amended to allow churches in State land use agricultural districts. This will conform to the present County Code which allows churches in those districts."

A petition containing 23 signatures supporting the permit request was submitted along with the Special Permit application to the Hawaii County Planning Department. A copy of the petition is attached (County Exhibits A-3, A-4, and A-5).

The Hawaii County General Plan Land Use Pattern Allocation Guide Map designates the subject area for orchard use. This General Plan classification includes lands which, though rocky in character and content, may support certain agricultural products. The County's zoning designation is Agricultural 3-acres (A-3a).

There had previously been a 2,500 square foot state triangulation station (survey reference point for mapping purposes) located within the subject property, however, that lot has since become a part of the property under consideration. There is a single family

dwelling situated on the adjacent lot to the east of the subject site. The adjacent parcel to the west is used for grazing. Other single family dwellings are scattered throughout the surrounding area.

Access to the property is from Alani Street which has a 40-foot right-of-way and a 16-foot wide pavement. All essential utilities, including water, electricity and telephone are available in the area.

According to the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service, the soil of the subject property is of the Olaa Series which consists of extremely stony silty clay loam. The surface layer and subsoil are 16 inches and 9 inches thick respectively. This soil has a medium acid surface layer and a slightly acid subsoil. Permeability is rapid, runoff is slow, and the erosion hazard is slight. The capability subclass rating for this soil is VII. Class VII soils have severe limitations that make them unsuited to cultivation and which restrict their use largely to pasture or range, woodland, or wildlife. This class is the second lowest in the Soil Conservation Service's ranking system for agricultural activity.

This Special Permit request had been previously denied by the Hawaii County Planning Commission in June, 1976. Prior denial was in part based upon the inadequacy of access roadways leading to the subject property. However, subsequent review by both the Department of Public Works and the Planning Department has indicated that roadways are adequate for the proposed church use, as only about 10 vehicles are expected to be using the roadway at any one time.

Another basis for prior denial was the availability of alternative lands which allow the establishment of churches and related uses. The Planning Department subsequently determined that "due to changing conditions and seeing that the petitioner did look at other possibilities of establishing a church within an urban zoned district and not being able to find suitable property,... that this particular location will be acceptable because churches are permitted within the County's Agricultural zoned district".

Pertinent comments from governmental agencies:

1. Hawaii County Department of Public Works

The Department of Public Works provided the following comments:

- "1. The State of Hawaii "Clark" trig. station shown on this parcel on the tax maps is not in use and have been abandoned.
- "2. Alani Street is a County maintained roadway with a 40 ft. right-of-way and 16 ft. wide A.C. pavement in good condition."

2. State Department of Health

The State Department of Health had the following comment:

"Provide sanitary facilities as required in the Public Health Regulations, Chapter 1, Sanitation, Section 79."

All other cooperating agencies, including the Hawaii Electric Light Company, Hawaii County Department of Water Supply, Hawaii County Fire Department, Hawaii County Department of Research and Development and Hawaii County Police Department had no comments on or objections to the subject permit request.

At the public hearing held by the Hawaii County Planning Commission on July 21, 1977, testimony was received from the petitioner and his wife. No one else testified in support or opposition to this request. A copy of the hearing transcript is attached (County Exhibit Q).

On August 11, 1977, the Hawaii County Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the permit request to the Land Use Commission based on the following findings:

"1. That the granting of the proposed use will not be contrary to the objectives sought to be accomplished by the State Land Use Law and Regulations. The purpose of the Land Use Law and Regulations is to protect, preserve, and encourage the development of lands in the State for the public health and welfare of the people of the State of Hawaii.

The area under consideration is classified as Agricultural by the State Land Use Commission. The Agricultural District does include lands surrounded by or contiguous to agricultural lands and which are not suited to agricultural and ancillary activities by reason of topography, soils and other related characteristics. The U.S. Department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service's capability class is VII. Class VII soils have very severe limitations that make them unsuited to cultivation and that restrict their use largely to pasture or range, woodland, or wildlife. This class is the second lowest in the Soil Conservation Service's ranking system for agricultural activity.

Although it is quite possible that some form of agricultural activity may be conducted on this 1+- acre lot, it is determined that the use of the property for nonagricultural purposes is not expected to have any adverse effect on the overall agricultural potential of the area or of the island and state. This particular area can be classified as "rural-

residential" in character due to the sizes of the lots. The lands along Alani Street are basically 1+ acre in sizes. Due to the overall character of the area and the physical attributes of the lands, it is acknowledged that the lots are and will be basically used as home sites with possibly some backyard farming activity. This situation presently exists with other lots within the general area which are already developed.

The establishment of the proposed use is determined to be compatible with the area and would not be in conflict with the surrounding uses. It is further felt that the granting of this particular request at its proposed location will not adversely affect the surrounding properties and their improvements.

- "2. That the granting of this particular request will also not be in conflict with the County's current land use policies. Institutions of a religious nature, such as churches, are allowed within the agriculturally zoned lands under the County of Hawaii's Zoning Code. As such, the granting of this particular Special Permit request for the establishment of a church on the subject property also will not be contrary to the County's policies regarding land usage.
- That although the proposed uses will somewhat alter the essential character of the land, it is determined that such a change may make the highest and best use of the land involved for the public welfare at the present time. At present, the land is vacant and is not used for agricultural purposes. Although the proposed use will undeniably alter the existing undeveloped situation of the property to some degree, it is determined that the provisions of a religious institution on a limited scale on the subject land would for the present time, be beneficial and wellsuited to accommodate the welfare of the public, in this particular case, the members of this faith. There presently are no facilities of this faith available for the residents or the area and the entire island.

Therefore, it is further determined that the establishment of the proposed use would meet the present needs of the members of this congregation.

"4. That the proposed use will not unreasonably burden public agencies to provide roads and other infrastructures and services. All essential services and facilities are available to the subject property. The area under consideration fronts Alani Street. Although concerns regarding the adequacy of this

roadway was expressed as one (1) of the reasons for the denial of the previous application, after further investigation, it is felt that the present improvements within the roadway will be able to accommodate the added traffic which will be generated by the proposed use. This is further justified by the Department of Public Works comment that the present pavement is in good condition."

The favorable recommendation was subject to the following conditions:

V 4

- "1. That construction of the proposed facility commence within one (1) year from the effective date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two (2) years thereafter.
- "2. That the requirements of the Building and Fire Codes and the State Department of Health shall be complied with.
- "3. That the driveway to and parking area for the proposed use be paved with all-weather, dust-free surface. The width of the pavement and the number of parking stalls shall be determined at the time of Plan Approval.
- '4. That all other applicable rules and regulations shall be complied with."

It was further stated by the Planning Commission that: "Should any of the foregoing conditions not be met, the Special Permit may be deemed null and void."

and about 5 people in attendance.

CHAIRMAN: We will go on to Item 4, the last one on our agenda for today. Public hearing on the application of Bob Mason, in behalf of the National Organization of New Apostolic Churches, for a Special Permit to allow the establishment of a church on 43,628 square feet of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The property involved is located on the north side of Alani Street, approximately 650 feet east of the Alani Street-Malaai Road intersection, Waiakea Homesteads, Waiakea, South Hilo, TMK: 2-4-47:20.

HAYASHI: Read background information on file.

CHAIRMAN: Thank you, Norman. Any questions to the staff's report?

ASAI: Norman, correct me if I am wrong; is there a piggery near

that area?

HAYASHI: Yes. According to our investigation, there are two piggeries

in this area; one is located on this property and another

here.

ASAI: Thank you.

MURAKAMI: Norman, can you tell us where the individuals who signed the

petition is situated?

HAYASHI: We have not had the chance to locate it on the map, however, we have identified certain areas; three residents here, another one there; several along this stretch here up along Ainaola Drive and above, five or six of them on Malaai Road. As the petitioner has indicated, as stated in their application, that the individuals along Alani Street stated no objections, however, those people did not sign the petition or there is no record showing that they have signed the petition indicating support of the request.

MURAKAMI: Correct me if I am wrong; at the last hearing when we denied this, there were several people from that area, right?

HAYASHI: Basically, if I recall, there was only one person that really objected to that request, however, he does not reside in that particular location; further mauka I believe.

CHAIRMAN: Any other questions of the staff's report? If not, at this time the Chair would like to call on the representative of the church. (Petitioner sworn in)

MASON: My name is Bob Mason.

CHAIRMAN: You are the applicant representing the church. Do you have any comments to the staff's report that was read? Do you have anything further to add for our information?

MASON: I think it was covered adequately.

CHAIRMAN: Are there any questions for Mr. Mason?

MARTIN: In the report you stated that the church will operate on Sunday and Thursday. Will this be Sunday morning?

MASON: Sunday morning and Sunday evening.

MARTIN: Thursday, in the evening; not during the day?

MASON: No.

MARTIN: Could you be able to give us any reason why those you have spoken to along Alani Street that none of them sign the

petition?

MASON: The people we talked to on Alani St. belong to a neighborhood organization there and they have one man who they said was their spokesman and they said that when they joined the organization they agreed that he will be the spokesman so they would not sign anything because of that. No one voiced any objection; in fact most of them said that they were in favor.

MARTIN: Do you know whether that particular person who is the spokesman was the one that appeared before us the last time we had the

meeting?

MASON: No sir, I understand that gentlemen who opposed the last time

has since left the island.

CHAIRMAN: Are there any other questions of Mr. Mason?

MURAKAMI: What is the total membership? If and when you build the church, what will be the total membership attending?

MASON: Our total membership at the present time is 39. The church will be built to seat 100 but usually it has been our way of doing things in the past, whenever we get to that particular number, we then relocate and build another church. In other words, we keep our congregation small. We look at an area where the majority of the members will be coming from and we would secure the land and build another church there.

MURAKAMI: Of the 39 members, that includes children and all?

MASON: Yes sir.

CHAIRMAN: It was also mentioned in the report that there are 50 members.

MASON: Madam Chairman, that 50 was referring to as a sort of number where we would like to keep the congregation at rather than get too large.

SAKAMOTO: It was mentioned that there are two piggeries up on the mauka side. Do you have the smell coming down to your church?

MASON: I have been up to the property many times and I have never smelled anything objectionable at all.

CHAIRMAN: Mr. Mason, I can't remember; did you also represent the church the last time?

MASON: No, I did not.

CHAIRMAN: You don't look familiar. How many churches of your faith are on the island?

MASON: On this particular island, just one; here in Hilo and we are meeting in a home until we build one. We do have a church on Molokai and Oahu.

CHAIRMAN: Are you a resident here?

MASON: Yes.

MURAKAMI: Can you tell me how many homes are around that church? People actually living there?

MASON: Right next door to the east of the property, Mr. Lee is constructing a home and across from us to the south, there are two homes across from us but they are pretty well scattered out. There is a home on the corner of Malaai and Alani.

MURAKAMI: All the property that are developed over there, what is the size of the property? One acre, three acres?

HAYASHI: Are you talking about the lots along Alani Street? Those are also one acre in size.

CHAIRMAN: Do you have anything further to add?

ASAI: Mr. Mason, you mentioned to Mr. Martin that you meet Sundays and Thursdays. Thursday evenings, about three hours?

MASON: We start our Thursday evening services at eight and end about

nine. Just for one hour.

CHAIRMAN: Any other questions? Staff, do you have any questions for Mr. Mason? If not, we thank you for your comments.

This is a public hearing. The Chair would like to call anyone here who wishes to speak on behalf of this application now before the County Planning Commission.

(Irene Mason sworn in).

MRS. MASON: My name is Irene Mason. My husband is the petitioner. I would like to say at this time that we have been here only for 11 months but that we are a permanent part of Hawaii. We will not be transferred out. My husband was asked to come and take over this congregation because there was no one here. We have since then found jobs; it hasn't been easy. My husband was laid off from a good job, he was a foreman and now he is working as a janitor on a temporary basis. My son also gave up a good job to come here. My son, at the age of 18, gave up a good job, an apartment and a chance for a brand new car. I don't think I could do it at 40.

We are working here; we do not intend to leave. We will not abandon this congregation. I think that these things are important but you should know that we do not come here merely to build this congregation; that church will be paid for before it is ever built. Money asked for in our churches are offerings from the heart. I will gladly answer any questions.

Right now I have a boss that says "your're lucky you come to Hawaii" and everyday he says "you're lucky you work for Japanese". He never lets me forget that. Everyone has been very good to us all. I have been entrusted with much. After working for a month and a half, my boss took off and gave me 12 signed checks. I said "Do you think I will be here when you get back" and he said "you wouldn't be?"

My son has also taken over Homelani, when Mr. Kutsunai left the island, so it is not like we're going to come in here and stay a short time.

CHAIRMAN: Are there any questions you would like to ask Mrs. Mason? If not, thank you very much and we appreciate your coming.

Are there anyone else here that would like to speak before the Commission?

HAYASHI: Madam Chairman, could we call Mr. Mason back. I would like to ask him a question.

CHAIRMAN: Mr. Mason, please come forward. Staff has a question for you.

HAYASHI: Mr. Mason, since your application was denied about a year ago, did you actively pursue, look at other sites to construct your

church on?

MASON: Yes, we did.

HAYASHI: Could you give us some areas that; or people you have contacted?

We talked to Nakahara Real Estate and Fujiyama plus various MASON: individuals that we became acquainted with that has property holdings and we looked into over a dozen different sites but either the cost was so prohibiting or so far out or in an area that wouldn't be a good place to build a church.

Thank you. HAYASHI:

Thank you, Mr. Mason. If there is no other, further testimony, CHAIRMAN:

the Chair would like to recommend the closing of the public

hearing.

I move that the hearing be closed. PARIS:

MARTIN: I second the motion.

It has been moved by Commissioner Paris and seconded by Com-CHAIRMAN:

missioner Martin that the public hearing be closed. All those

in favor?

COMMISSIONERS: Aye.

In accordance with Chapter 205, Section 205-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, we are transmitting the decision and findings of the County Planning Commission on the above application.

The special permit request was to allow the establishment of a church on 43,628 square feet of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District at Waiakea Homesteads, Waiakea, South Hilo, Hawaii, Tax Map Key 2-4-47:20.

The Planning Commission at a duly advertised public hearing held on July 21, 1977 in the Councilroom, County Building, South Hilo, Hawaii, discussed the subject request. The Commission on August 11, 1977, voted to recommend the approval of the special permit to the Land Use Commission based on the following findings:

1. That the granting of the proposed use will not be contrary to the objectives sought to be accomplished by the State Land Use Law and Regulations. The purpose of the Land Use Law and Regulations is to protect, preserve, and encourage the development of lands in the State for the public health and welfare of the people of the State of Hawaii.

The area under consideration is classified as Agricultural by the State Land Use Commission. The Agricultural District does include lands surrounded by or contiguous to agricultural lands and which are not suited to agricultural and ancillary

activities by reason of topography, soils and other related characteristics. The U. S. Department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service's capability class is VII. Class VII soils have very severe limitations that make them unsuited to cultivation and that restrict their use largely to pasture or range, woodland, or wildlife. This class is the second lowest in the Soil Conservation Service's ranking system for agricultural activity.

Although it is quite possible that some form of agricultural activity may be conducted on this 1+-acre lot, it is determined that the use of the property for nonagricultural purposes is not expected to have any adverse effect on the overall agricultural potential of the area or of the island and state. This particular area can be classified as "rural-residential" in character due to the sizes of the lots. The lands along Alani Street are basically 1+ acre is sizes. Due to the overall character of the area and the physical attributes of the lands, it is acknowledged that the lots are and will be basically used as home sites with possibly some backyard farming activity. This situation presently exists with other lots within the general area which are already developed.

The establishment of the proposed use is determined to be compatible with the area and would not be in conflict with the surrounding uses. It is further felt that the granting of this particular request at its proposed location will not adversely affect the surrounding properties and their improvements.

- 2. That the granting of this particular request will also not be in conflict with the County's current land use policies. Institutions of a religious nature, such as churches, are allowed within the agriculturally zoned lands under the County of Hawaii's Zoning Code. As such, the granting of this particular Special Permit request for the establishment of a church on the subject property also will not be contrary to the County's policies regarding land usage.
- 3. That although the proposed uses will somewhat alter the essential character of the land, it is determined that such a change may make the highest and best use of the land involved for the public welfare at the present time. At present, the land is vacant and is not used for agricultural purposes. Although the proposed use will undeniably alter the existing undeveloped situation of the property to some degree, it is determined that the provisions of a religious institution on a limited scale on the subject land would for the present time, be beneficial and well-suited to accommodate the welfare of the public, in this particular case, the members of this faith. There presently are no facilities of this faith available for the residents or the area and the entire island.

Therefore, it is further determined that the establishment of the proposed use would meet the present needs of the members of this congregation.

4. That the proposed use will not unreasonably burden public agencies to provide roads and other infrastructures and services. All essential services and facilities are available to the subject property. The area under consideration fronts Alani Street. Although concerns regarding the adequacy of this roadway was expressed as one (1) of the reasons for the denial of the previous application, after further investigation, it is felt that the present improvements within the roadway will be able to accommodate the added traffic which will be generated by the proposed use. This is further justified by the Department of Public Works comment that the present pavement is in good condition.

It is further recommended that the request be given favorable consideration subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That construction of the proposed facility commence within one (1) year from the effective date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two (2) years thereafter.
- 2. That the requirements of the Building and Fire Codes and the State Department of Health shall be complied with.
- 3. That the driveway to and parking area for the proposed use be paved with all-weather, dust-free surface. The width of the pavement and the number of parking stalls shall be determined at the time of Plan Approval.
- 4. That all other applicable rules and regulations shall be complied with.

Should any of the foregoing conditions not be met, the Special Permit may be deemed null and void.

THE NATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF THE NEW APOSTOLIC CHURCH

This application by the National Organization of the New Apostolic Church is a second request for a special permit to allow the construction of a church at the proposed site on Alani Street in the Waiakea-Uka section of Hilo (see attached map). They feel justified in asking for this special permit for the following reasons:

- 1. Chapter 8, Article 26, Section 2 (C) 1 of the Hawaii County Zoning Code states that churches may be allowed to be built in agricultural areas of the County of Hawaii. The land in question is found within the State Land Use agricultural district and is zoned agricultural three acres, or A-3a. Being that this provision has been adopted by the zoning code, we are seeking this exception.
- 2. To locate a church in a residential or other allowable area would not be feasible in terms of cost of land and expansion needs. Also, in purchasing a smaller sized lot than one acre, a variance will have to be applied for which will consume time and money. The church also will be unable to expand the facilities in terms of playground and parking facilities on small RS-10 to RS-15 type lots.
- 3. Mr. Inocencio Agasa, the former owner of the parcel in question, sold the property to the National Organization of the New Apostolic Church with the intention and the knowledge that a church would be constructed on the parcel. We also have attached signatures from 23 residents in the area (see map) who do not object to the establishment of the church in the area. In addition, all the residents on Alani Street on which the parcel is located have no objections to the church being built.
- 4. The existing roads, we believe, are adequate to serve the projected needs of the church. They believe that the maximum number of cars at

any one time which will be driven to the church will be 10 cars. The philosophy of the church is to keep their congregation small—about 50—in order to achieve their goals. Historically, the churches throughout the nation have been about the size indicated above.

- The hours of congregation will be on Sunday and on Thursday during the week.

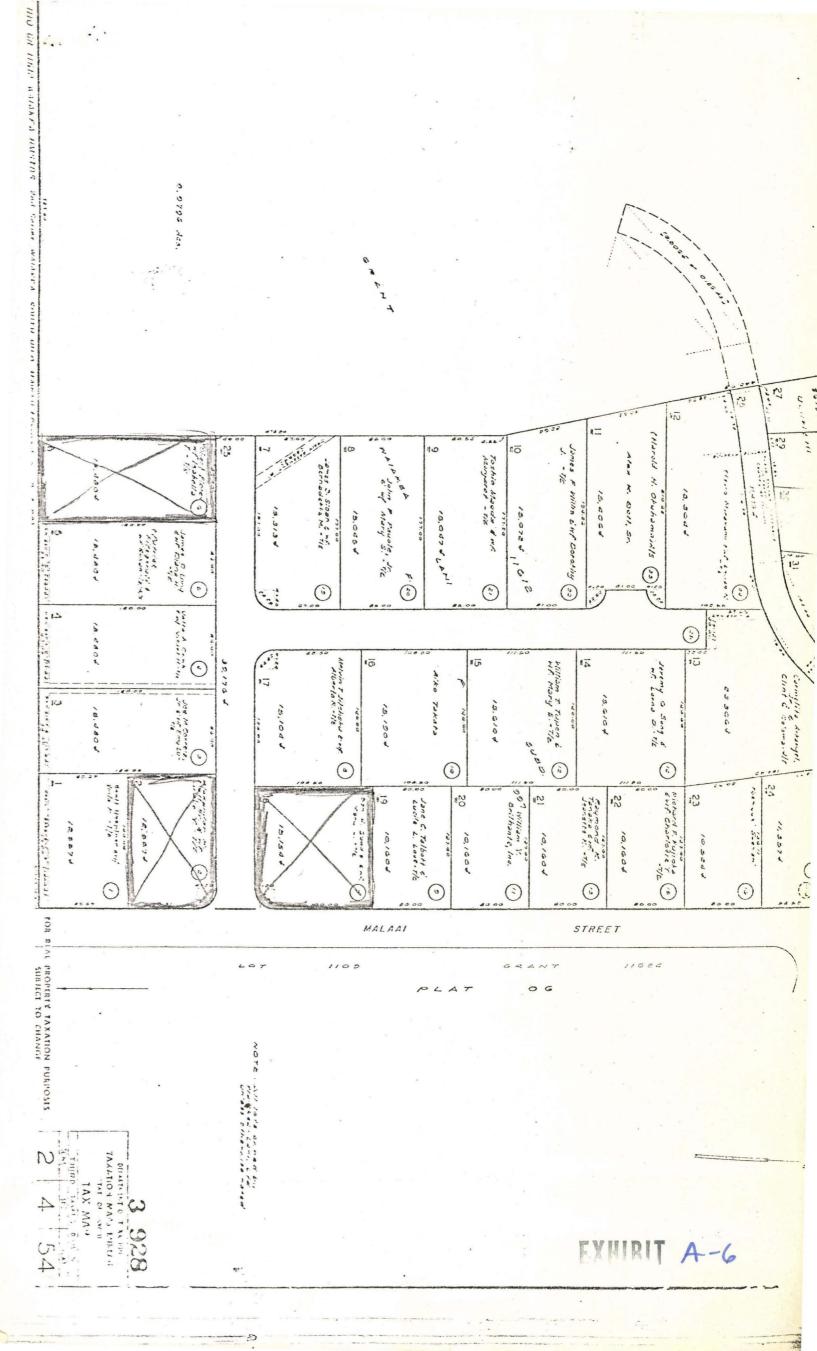

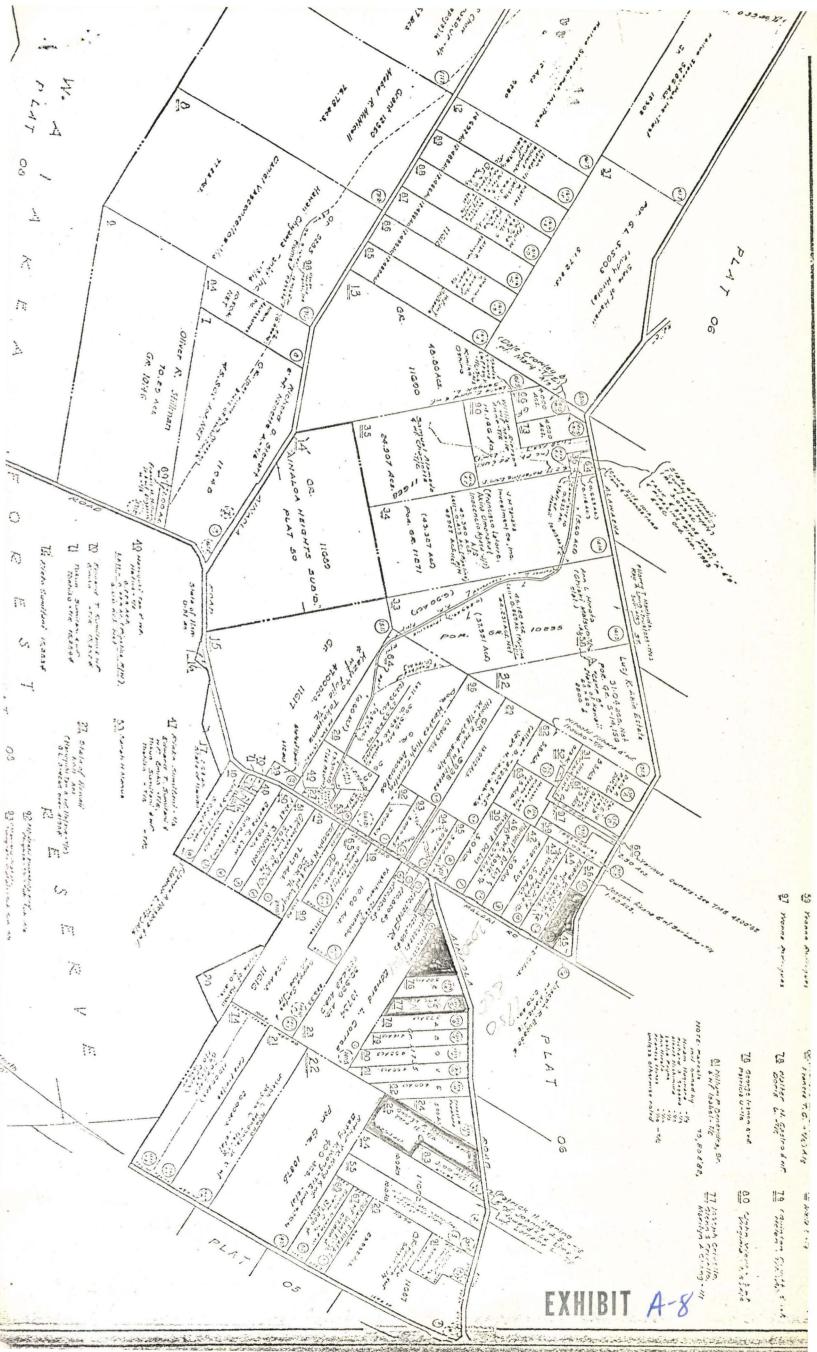

As per Waiakea Soil and Water Conservation District's request, our staff has completed the resource evaluation concerning Nat'l Organization of New Apostolic TMK 2-4-47:20 presently under consideration for development. For your convenience, the report is composed of two sections: Soil-Related Information and Other Factors Affecting Development.

Soil-Related Information

OlD Olaa extremely stony silty clay loam, 0 to 20 percent slopes.

In a representative profile, the surface layer is very dark-brown extremely stony silty clay loam about 16 inches thick. The subsoil is dark-brown extremely stony silty clay loam about 9 inches thick and is underlain by Aa lava. This soil dehydrates irreversibly into gravel-size aggregates. It has a medium acid surface layer and a slightly acid subsoil.

Permeability is rapid, runoff is slow, and the erosion hazard is slight.

The capability subclass rating for this soil is VII - stony.

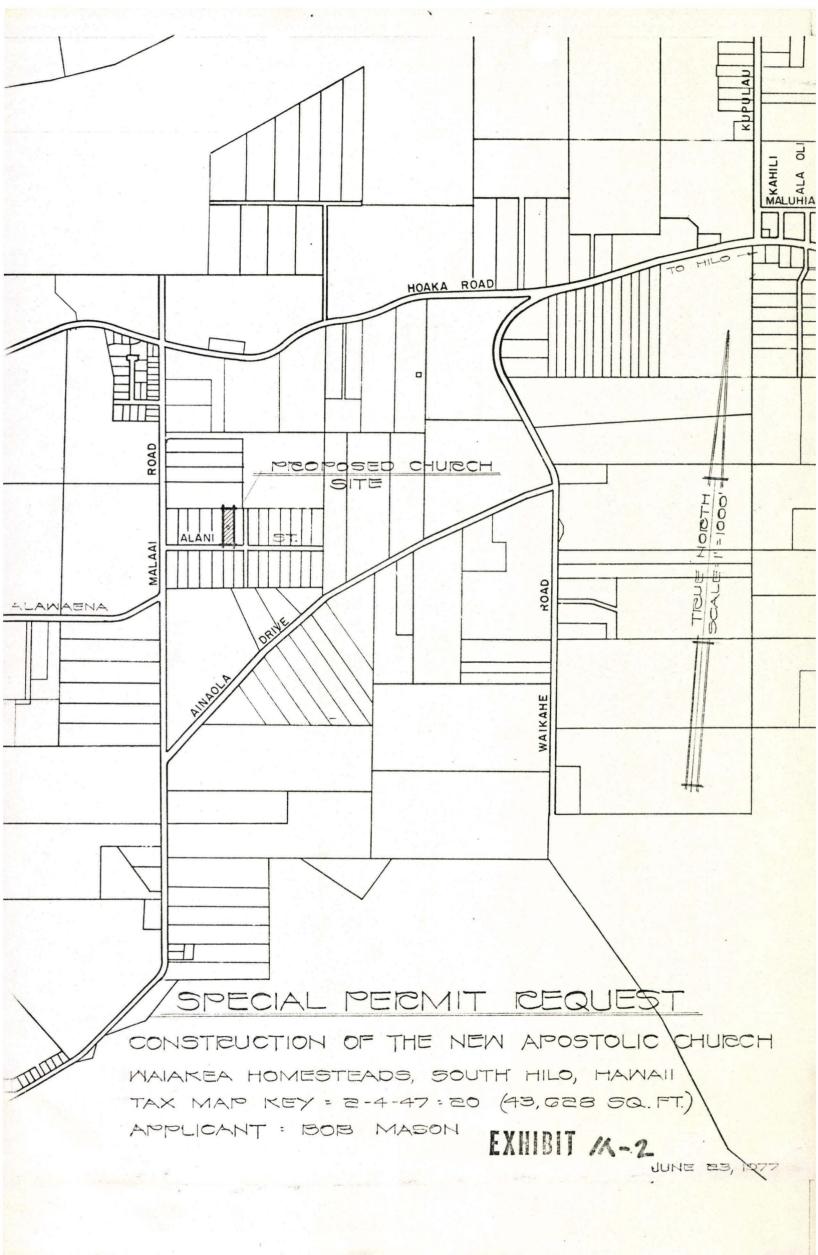

As the petitioner has indicated, as stated in their application, that the individuals along Alani Street stated no objections, however, those people did not sign the petition or there is no record showing that they have signed the petition indicating support of the request.

Correct me if I am wrong; at the last hearing when we denied MURAKAMI: this, there were several people from that area, right?

HAYASHI: Basically, if I recall, there was only one person that really objected to that request, however, he does not reside in that particular location; further mauka I believe.

Any other questions of the staff's report? If not, at this CHAIRMAN: time the Chair would like to call on the representative of (Petitioner sworn in) the church.

My name is Bob Mason. MASON:

You are the applicant representing the church. Do you have CHAIRMAN: any comments to the staff's report that was read? Do you have anything further to add for our information?

MASON: I think it was covered adequately.

CHAIRMAN: Are there any questions for Mr. Mason?

In the report you stated that the church will operate on MARTIN: Sunday and Thursday. Will this be Sunday morning?

MASON: Sunday morning and Sunday evening.

Thursday, in the evening; not during the day? MARTIN:

MASON: No.

Could you be able to give us any reason why those you have MARTIN: spoken to along Alani Street that none of them sign the

petition?

MASON: The people we talked to on Alani St. belong to a neighborhood organization there and they have one man who they said was their spokesman and they said that when they joined the organization they agreed that he will be the spokesman so they would not sign anything because of that. No one voiced any objection; in fact most of them said that they were in favor.

Do you know whether that particular person who is the spokesman MARTIN: was the one that appeared before us the last time we had the

meeting?

No sir, I understand that gentlemen who opposed the last time MASON:

has since left the island.

CHAIRMAN: Are there any other questions of Mr. Mason? MURAKAMI: What is the total membership? If and when you build the church, what will be the total membership attending?

MASON: Our total membership at the present time is 39. The church will be built to seat 100 but usually it has been our way of doing things in the past, whenever we get to that particular number, we then relocate and build another church. In other words, we keep our congregation small. We look at an area where the majority of the members will be coming from and we would secure the land and build another church there.

Of the 39 members, that includes children and all?

MASON: Yes sir.

It was also mentioned in the report that there are 50 members. CHAIRMAN:

MASON: Madam Chairman, that 50 was referring to as a sort of number where we would like to keep the congregation at rather than get too large.

SAKAMOTO: It was mentioned that there are two piggeries up on the mauka side. Do you have the smell coming down to your church?

MASON: I have been up to the property many times and I have never smelled anything objectionable at all.

Mr. Mason, I can't remember; did you also represent the church CHAIRMAN: the last time?

MASON: No, I did not.

CHAIRMAN: You don't look familiar. How many churches of your faith are

on the island?

On this particular island, just one; here in Hilo and we are meeting in a home until we build one. We do have a church on MASON: Molokai and Oahu.

CHAIRMAN: Are you a resident here?

MASON: Yes.

Can you tell me how many homes are around that church? People MURAKAMI:

actually living there?

Right next door to the east of the property, Mr. Lee is con-MASON: structing a home and across from us to the south, there are two homes across from us but they are pretty well scattered out. There is a home on the corner of Malaai and Alani.

MURAKAMI: All the property that are developed over there, what is the size of the property? One acre, three acres?

Are you talking about the lots along Alani Street? Those are HAYASHI:

also one acre in size.

Do you have anything further to add? CHAIRMAN:

ASAI: Mr. Mason, you mentioned to Mr. Martin that you meet Sundays

and Thursdays. Thursday evenings, about three hours?

MASON: We start our Thursday evening services at eight and end about

nine. Just for one hour.

CHAIRMAN: Any other questions? Staff, do you have any questions for

Mr. Mason? If not, we thank you for your comments.

This is a public hearing. The Chair would like to call anyone here who wishes to speak on behalf of this application now before the County Planning Commission.

(Irene Mason sworn in).

MRS. MASON: My name is Irene Mason. My husband is the petitioner. I would like to say at this time that we have been here only for 11 months but that we are a permanent part of Hawaii. We will not be transferred out. My husband was asked to come and take over this congregation because there was no one here. We have since then found jobs; it hasn't been easy. My husband was laid off from a good job, he was a foreman and now he is working as a janitor on a temporary basis. My son also gave up a good job to come here. My son, at the age of 18, gave up a good job, an apartment and a chance for a brand new car. I don't think I could do it at 40.

We are working here; we do not intend to leave. We will not abandon this congregation. I think that these things are important but you should know that we do not come here merely to build this congregation; that church will be paid for before it is ever built. Money asked for in our churches are offerings from the heart. I will gladly answer any questions.

Right now I have a boss that says "your're lucky you come to Hawaii" and everyday he says "you're lucky you work for Japanese". He never lets me forget that. Everyone has been very good to us all. I have been entrusted with much. After working for a month and a half, my boss took off and gave me 12 signed checks. I said "Do you think I will be here when you get back" and he said "you wouldn't be?"

My son has also taken over Homelani, when Mr. Kutsunai left the island, so it is not like we're going to come in here and stay a short time.

CHAIRMAN: Are there any questions you would like to ask Mrs. Mason? If not, thank you very much and we appreciate your coming.

Are there anyone else here that would like to speak before the Commission?

HAYASHI: Madam Chairman, could we call Mr. Mason back. I would like to ask him a question.

CHAIRMAN: Mr. Mason, please come forward. Staff has a question for you.

HAYASHI: Mr. Mason, since your application was denied about a year ago, did you actively pursue, look at other sites to construct your

church on?

MASON: Yes, we did.

HAYASHI: Could you give us some areas that; or people you have contacted?

MASON: We talked to Nakahara Real Estate and Fujiyama plus various individuals that we became acquainted with that has property holdings and we looked into over a dozen different sites but either the cost was so prohibiting or so far out or in an area that wouldn't be a good place to build a church.

The area under consideration is located on the north side of Alani Street, approximately 650 feet east of the Alani Street - Malaai Road intersection, Waiakea Homesteads, Waiakea, South Hilo (TMK: 2-4-47:20).

In request of the Special Permit, the petitioner intends to construct a 1,400 square foot church.

For the Commissioners' information, this is the same request which the Commission denied in June 3, 1976.

The General Plan Land Use Pattern Allocation Guide Map designates the area for Orchard uses. This General Plan classification includes lands which though rocky in character and content may support productive macadamia nut, papaya, citrus, and other similar agricultural products. The County's zoning designation is Agricultural 3-acre (A-3a).

According to the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Soil
Conservation Service's report issued in December of 1973, the
soil is of the Olaa series which consists of extremely stony
silty clay loam. The surface layer and subsoil are 16 inches
and 9 inches thick respectively. This soil has a medium acid
surface layer and a slightly acid subsoil. Permeability is
rapid, runoff is slow, and the erosion hazard is slight. According to the report, the land slopes from 0 to 20 percent.



The land in question is presently vacant of any structures. Until recently, there was a 50 feet by 50 feet triangulation station located with the subject lot. However, since the station is no longer in use, that 1,000 square foot lot was made a part of the property in question. A single family dwelling is situated on the lot adjacent and to the east of the property under consideration. The adjacent parcel to the west is used for grazing. There are other single family dwellings scattered throughout the area. Along Alani Street, there are twenty-seven (27) other lots of similar sizes (12 existing dwellings).

Access to the property is from Alani Street which has a 40-foot right-of-way with a 16-foot wide pavement. The Depart-of Public Works informs that the pavement is in good condition. All essential utilities, including a 6-inch water line and fire hydrants, are available to the area.

The Department of Agriculture informs "that the soil on a large portion of the subject parcel is rated by the U. S.

Department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service, as

Olaa silty clay loam (OaC). This soil type meets the criteria to considered as prime agricultural land by the SCS."

All other cooperating agencies had no comments on or objections to the subject request.

In support of the request, the petitioner has stated the following:

The petitioner also submitted a petition, consisting of 23 signatures, which stated the following:

"We, the undersigned residents of Waiakea-Uka Area do not oppose the establishment and building of the New

Apostolic Church in this area."

The individuals reside on properties indicated in Yellow on the presentation map.

RECOMMENDATION: BOB MASON/NATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF THE NEW APOSTOLIC CHURCH

Upon careful relivew of the subject request in light of new information and evidences presented since the previous denial of this same application, staff is recommending that it be given favorable consideration based on the following findings:

Mill

1. That the granting of the proposed use will not be contrary
to the objectives sought to be accomplished by the State
Land Use Rules and Regulations. The purpose of the Land
Use Law and Regulations is to protect, preserve, and encourage
the development of lands in the State for the public health
and welfare of the people of the State of Hawaii.

The area under consideration is classified as Agricultural by the State Land Use Commission. The Agricultural District does include lands surrounded by or contiguous to agricultural lands and which are not suited to agricultural and ancillary activities by reason of topography, soils and other related characteristics. The U. S. Department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service's capability class is VII. Class VII soils have very severe limitations that make them unsuited to cultivation and that restrict their use largely to pasture or range, woodland, or wildlife. This class is the second lowest in the Soil Conservation Service's ranking system for agricultural activity.

Although it is quite possible that some form of agricultural activity may be conducted on this 1+-acre lot, it is determined that the use of the property for nonagricultural purposes is not expected to have any adverse effect on the overall agricultural potential of the area or of the island and state. This particular area can be classified as "rural-residential" in character due to the sizes of the lots. The lands along Alani Street are basically 1+ acre is sizes. Due to the overall character of the area and the physical attributes of the lands, it is acknowledged that the lots are and will be basically used as home sites with possibly some backyard farming activity. This situation presently exists with other lots within the general area which are already developed.

The establishment of the proposed use is determined to be compatible with the area and would not be in conflict with the surrounding uses. It is further felt that the granting of this particular request at its proposed location will not adversely affect the surrounding properties and their improvements.

2. That the granting of this particular request will also not be in conflict with the County's current land use policies. Institutions of a religious nature, such as churches, are allowed within the agriculturally zoned lands under the County of Hawaii's Zoning Code. As such, the granting of this particular Special Permit request for the establishment of a church on the subject property also will not be contrary to the County's policies regarding land usage.

- 3. That although the proposed uses will somewhat alter the essential character of the land, it is determined that such a change may make the highest and best use of the land involved for the public welfare at the present time. At present, the land is vacant and is not used for agricultural purposes. Although the proposed use will undeniably alter the existing undeveloped situation of the property to some degree, it is determined that the provisions of a religious institution on a limited scale on the subject land would for the present time, be beneficial and well-suited to accommodate the welfare of the public, in this particular case, the members of this faith. There presently are no facilities of this faith available for the residents or the area and the entire island. Therefore, it is further determined that the establishment of the proposed use would meet the present needs of the members of this congregation.
- 4. That the proposed use will not unreasonably burden public agencies to provide roads and other infrastructures and services. All essential services and facilities are available to the subject property. The area under consideration fronts Alani Street. Although concerns regarding the adequacy of this roadway was

expressed as one (1) of the reasons for the denial of the previous application, after further investigation, it is felt that the present improvements within the roadway will be able to accommodate the added traffic which will be generated by the proposed use. This is further justified by the Department of Public Works comment that the present pavement is in good condition.

It is further recommended that the request be given favorable consideration subject to the following conditions:

- That construction of the proposed facility commence within one (1) year from the effective date of approval of the Special Permit and be completed within two (2) years thereafter.
- 2. That the requirements of the Building and Fire Codes and the State Department of Health shall be complied with.
- 3. That the driveway to and parking area for the proposed use be paved with all-weather, dust-free surface. The width of the pavement and the number of parking stalls shall be determined at the time of Plan Approval.
- 4. That all other applicable rules and regulations shall be complied with.

Should any of the foregoing conditions not be met, the Special Permit may be deemed null and void.

MINUTES:

Commissioner Martin requested that the minutes of the July 28 meeting be deferred until later in the evening as he did not have a chance to review it.

All those testifying were duly sworn in.

SPECIAL PERMIT BOB MASON NATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF NEW APOSTOLIC CHURCHES WAIAKEA, SOUTH HILO

Application to allow the establishment of a church on 43,628 square feet of land situated within the State Land Use Agricultural District. The property involved is located on the north side of Alani Street, approximately 650 feet east of the Alani

Street-Malaai Road intersection, Waiakea Homesteads, Waiakea, South Hilo, TMK: 2-4-47:20.

Public hearing was closed at the July 18 meeting so staff presented the recommendation on file.

On the question of what was the result of the Board of Appeals on the previous denial, staff reported that no further attempt was made by the petitioner to pursue the denial with the Third Circuit Court.

When asked what brought about this change of recommendation, staff stated that the first denial was based on the roadway being inadequate but upon conferring with the Department of Public Works personnel, it was felt that the roadway was adequate for the church's use as only about 10 cars will be using that roadway at any one time.

On further questioning of the previous denial by Commissioner Murakami, staff stated that due to changing conditions and seeing that the petitioner did look at other possibilities of establishing a church within an urban zoned district and not able to find suitable property, the staff felt that this particular location will be acceptable because churches are permitted within the County's Agricultural zoned district.

On the question of whether there was an improvement made on the roadway, staff reported that there were no improvements since the initial application but since no subdivision is planned for that area at the present time, they felt that the present roadway is adequate.

The parking question was clarified when the staff stated that no plans have been submitted for approval yet and that on-street parking is not permitted. Petitioner also stated that they will have no problems on parking.

When asked about membership and seating capacity, the petitioner replied that they have a total of 39 members in the Hilo area and that the seating capacity of the church will be 100 people.

On the question of whether residents in that area were against the church, the petitioner stated that they have talked to people in the general vicinity and no one objected to it.

It was moved by Commissioner Martin that the Commission send a favorable recommendation to the State Land Use Commission with the recommendation and conditions presented by the staff as he felt that churches are not businesses and should be where the people are.

It was seconded by Commissioner Paris. Motion carried with five ayes and two noes.

SPECIAL MANAGEMENT AREA (SMA) USE PERMIT ISLAND HOLIDAYS, LTD. KAHALU'U, NORTH KONA

Request for an extension to a time condition stipulated within Special Management Area (SMA) Use Permit No. 16 for the construction of a tennis complex at the Keauhou Beach Hotel, Kahalu'u, North Kona, TMK: 7-8-13:

Portion of 43.

Staff presented background information and recommendation on file.

On the question of why the applicant feels that they can now proceed with the project when they have not been able to do so this past year, the petitioner replied that due to the economic condition and the corporate structure of AmFac, it was decided that this project be deferred for one year.

In reply to the cost item, the petitioner stated that the cost of this project will increase about 10% from the original cost, somewhere around \$150,000+.
