KAUAI PLANNING COMMISSION HEARING MAY 25, 1988

Ladies & Gentlemen,

MY NAME IS WILFRED M. NISHIOKA. I WAS BORN ON OAHU AND CAME TO KAUAI IN 1951 AND HAVE SEEN MANY CHANGES HAPPEN FOR THE GOOD AND OTHERWISE. TODAY, YOU ARE CONSIDERING APPROVAL OF A GOLF COURSE. THIS IS ONE OF THE CHANGES FOR THE GOOD, AND I AM HERE TO URGE ITS APPROVAL.

THE HOTEL AND THE GOLF COURSE TOGETHER WILL CREATE OVER 1,000 PERMANENT JOBS. THIS WILL ALLOW KAUAI'S YOUNG PEOPLE TO REMAIN AND WORK ON OUR ISLAND, IF THEY SO CHOOSE. THE GOLF COURSE WILL ENHANCE THE SUCCESS OF THE HYATT HOTEL, AND SO WILL INCREASE JOBS BEYOND THOSE CREATED DIRECTLY BY THE GOLF COURSE.

THE GOLF COURSE WILL PROVIDE A LEGAL BEACH ACCESS WHERE NONE EXISTS TODAY. THIS IS A GOOD THING FOR OUR FISHERMEN AND SURFERS.

THERE ARE APPARENTLY SOME ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITES IN THE GOLF
COURSE. WE HAVE SEEN THAT THIS DEVELOPER IS RESPONSIVE. HE

STATE OF HAWAII

MOVED THE ENTIRE COURSE MAUKA, OUT OF THE CONSERVATION DISTRICT. I AM SURE THAT HE WILL DEMONSTRATE THE SAME RESPONSIVENESS AND SENSITIVITY TO THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITES.

IN SUMMARY, THIS GOLF COURSE IS A GOOD USE OF LAND, WILL ENHANCE THE RESORT AREA AND CREATE MANY JOBS. I HOPE THIS COMMISSION WILL APPROVE THE REQUEST.

For the record, my name is Arthur K. DeFries Jr. I live in Anahola, Hawaiian Home Lands. My address is 3822 Makaio Road and my mailing address is PO Box 42, Anahola, HI 96703.

I work for the Hawaii Laborers Union, Local 368 and our address on Kauai is c/o Hawaii Building and Trades Council, 3122 Kuhio Hwy #9, Lihue, HI 96766. Hawaii Laborers Union, Local 368 speaks in favor of application for a Special Use Permit, to develop a golf course at the Hyatt Regency Hotel at Poipu, Koloa, Kauai.

Koloa-Poipu Planning Area, General Plan for the Island of Kauai or page 53, paragraph 7:

The Grove Farm Lands along the shoreline are suitable for development. Because of the lack of vehicular access, water, sanitary and other services such as police and fire, we feel that development of these areas should come at a much later date and after the Poipu Beach Development.

Commissioners, it's been about 18 years and now we are in the Grove Farm Lands and need to develop of a golf course, so let us prepare and build for the economic future of Kauai because this project will have 60 or 70 people working in the golf course area after the project is done.

Commissioners, you know that we had a sound pineapple industry.

- 1. Hawaiian Canneries closed 1962
- Kauai Cannery or Lawai Cannery closed 1964
- 3. Hawaiian Fruit Packers closed 1971

And with it closed the pineapple industry on Kauai.

Kauai now faces the possibility of the closing of the Kauai Sugar Industry and its four sugar plantations:

- 1. Kekaha Plantation
- 2. Gay and Robinson
- 3. Olokele
- 4. McBryde

Because of the Farm Bill in congress, Hawaii faces a challenge and in the years to come we will see Kauai Sugar Industry close down.

Also, Commissioners, there is a lot of our young adults staying home on Kauai and also returning back to Kauai to work in the hotel industry and construction industry. We have many construction workers and many are

here today hoping and praying that the Grove Farm Lands along the Poipu shoreline are suitable for development. Because of the climate and access to the shoreline, Poipu should be developed as a principle visitor destination area and the Grove Farm Lands are the future for the four sugar plantations

- 1. Kekaha Plantation
- 2. Gay and Robinson
- 3. Olokele
- 4. McBryde

We the AFL-CIO Hawaii Laborers Union Local 368, ask that you approve of this project.

In closing we thank Mr. Mel Ventura for his committment to Kauai and for helping the economy of Kauai for many years.

And Commissioners, if you do have the time, look at pages 105 & 106 of the General Plan for the island of Kauai.

Specifically I object to the developers claim in his "environmental assessment" that the golf course he wants is consistent with broad objectives embraced in the Hawaii State Plan.

Even with the greatest stretch of the imagination, it is hard to conceive how a golf course consisting of manicured grass with holes in the ground and little carts running around can uphold the goals of the State Plan listed in the Garden Island Newspaper on 5/4/88.

If you can answer yes to any to any of the following questions, you've got a better imagination than I.

 Would a golf course enhance <u>natural</u> beauty and multicultural/historical resources?

I say this coast line is the last wild land area left in the south shore Poipu district.

2. Would a golf course manage population growth to increase opportunity for Hawaii's people to pursue their phusical, social and economic aspirations while recognizing the unique need of each county?

I say over time the public will feel like intruders. Where will local residents fish, swim,, camp and play.

- 3. Will a golf course assure protection of Hawaii's unique and fragil environmental resources?
- 4. Maintain prudent use of Hawaii's shoreline and marine resources.
- I say the Environmental Assessment completed for the golf course is inadequate as it does not extent to the shore line. Nor does it address the cumulative impact of all the developments.
- 5. Will a golf course provide activities and facilities to fulfill the cultural, artistic and recreational need of all diverse and special groups.

I say more tourist facilities at this time would just make traffic, lack of housing and crowded conditions worse.

Let's be clear. Today, we are talking about a 210 acre golf course, but the zoneing permit is being filed for 1,230 acres. WHERE IS THE MASTER PLAN?

If Kauai has no vision for the future, the islands beautiful children will never know the peaceful feeling of walking along a wild and wind swept beach. Our visitors who come to bask in Kauai's beauty will wonder why they came.

I am asking the planning commission to preserve what we have because when it's gone, it's gone forever.

Madame Chairperson:

Re: Special Permit SP-88-6, Use Permit U-88-31, SMA Use Permit (SMA) U-88-10, and Class IV Permit Z-4-88-39.

The Kaua'i Group of the Sierra Club wishes to go on record as opposing the approval of this application by Ainako Resort Associates, and Grove Farm Properties, Inc., at this time.

Approval or denial of this application will create a win/lose situation. One side will win and one side will lose. In order to create a Win/Win situation, this application could be withdrawn until such time that a Master Plan has been completed for the entire area from the existing state urban area to Kipu Kai.

This Master Plan could be developed by a committee consisting of members representing all interested groups, including but not limited to, the landowners and developers, the Planning Department, the Po'ipu Beach Resort Association, the Koloa Community Association, environmental and historical groups, and representatives of the watersports industry. This committee should be under the guidance of professionals in mediation, and conflict resolution. The recommendations and conclusions of the this Master Plan should represent a concensus among all interested parties.

No development of the agricultural, open, and coastal lands of Pa'a/Maha'ulepu should be allowed until the completion of such a Master Plan.

Therefore, the Kaua'i Group of the Sierra Club, respectfully requests the Planning Commission to abide by the recommendations of the Koloa-Po'ipu-Kalaheo Development Plan. This plan served as the basis of Ordinance No. 447 known as "the Koloa-Po'ipu-Kalaheo Development Plan Ordinance.". It states:

Development toward Maha'ulepu beyond the existing State Urban District should not occur and coastal lands particularly should remain undeveloped and restricted to compatible recreational uses that will maintain the unique environment character in perpetuity.

A revised Development Plan must be completed before any "development" is approved beyond the existing state urban district. Further, no SMA permits should be issued for the entire coastline from Keoneloa Bay eastward until a Master Plan has been developed, so that the "potential cumulative impact of individual developments" may be addressed. No golf course without a Master Plan! Where is the Master Plan?

Please attend the public hearing before the Kaua'i County Planning Commission next Wednesday, May 25, 1988, at 1:30 p.m. or soon thereafter at the War Memorial Convention Hall Meeting Rooms.



Turnout at this hearing is expected to be huge. Come early to sign up to testify. Plan on staying for a few hours.

If you don't testify—how will the commissioners know you care? If you can't testify at least write a letter to the newspapers or send a friend in your place. A County planner was heard to say, the only way to stop this developent from being approved is to have a huge turn out of people opposed to the proposed golf course at the public hearing.

The Kaua'i Group of the Sierra Club would like to see the unique character of the Maha'ulepu area preserved in perpetuity for the enjoyment of all.

There should be no development without a master plan for the entire area.

Here are some alternatives to the proposal:

- No golf course should be constructed.
- 2. Create a public park on the coastal lands east of the Hyatt.
- 3. Move the golf course mauka so that it would provide a buffer zone between Weliweli tract and the canefields.

The Planning Commission should abide by the recommendation of the Koloa-Po'ipu-Kalaheo Development Plan. It states:

"Development toward Maha'ulepu beyond the existing State Urban District should not occur and coastal lands particularly should remain undeveloped and restricted to compatible recreational uses that will maintain the unique environment character in perpetuity."

The applicants for this "Development" (Golfcourse) are required to apply for a Special Management Area Use Permit (SMA Permit) SMA regulations state:

"It is the State policy to preserve, protect, and where possible, to restore the natural resources of the coastal zone of Hawaii. Therefore, special controls on development within an area along the shoreline are necessary to avoid permanent loss of valuable resources and the foreclosure of management options, and to insure that adequate public access is provided to public-owned or used beaches, recreation areas, and natural reserves, by dedication or other means."

Some of the objectives and policies of the States Coastal Zone Management Act are, to:

"Protect valuable coastal ecosystems from disruption and minimize adverse impacts on all coastal ecosystems"...and to "Improve the development review process, communication, public participation in the management of coastal resources and hazards."

I address you as a resident of the Kiahuna Golf Village, a member of Malama Maha'ulepu, a member of 1000 Friends, and a member of Sierra Club. I live on the golf course and enjoy the greenbelt of nature around my home. It indeed is most beautiful and I would like to keep it that way. I am not against golf courses but I do oppose the placement of the proposed Hyatt 18 hole course on land that is designated by our general plan for uses that will, and I quote, "maintain the unique environmental character in perpetuity".

A golf course can be beautifully enhanced without using land that should be placed in a national park to uphold its very essential pristine character. People will not come to our island to look at a golf course, but they will come to Kauai to see the Waimea Canyon, the Na Pali coast, and hopefully the Maha'ulepu natural scenic park. The Pebble Beach golf course was put in before the Carmel people became active. What is left across from Point Lobos National Park is a 17 mile drive park. It makes a sort of fast food of a state park.

For those of you who have seen the wonders and beauty of Yosemite or Yellowstone National Park, try to envision what that would look like if there were a golf course on Yosemite Valley floor? Or an 18 hole link around Old Faithful in Yellowstone? Someone has to have the courage to say NO. Any developer would love to have his project on four star land but when the community says, as they did in 1984, no more development, they mean just that. Park land, yes; tourist accessories, no!

I wish to conclude by telling you what happened to the sister valley to Yosemite 75 years ago. Even though John Muir and other nature lovers desperately opposed the developers, the Hetch-Hetchy Dam and reservoir was approved in 1913 to completely flood the valley and supply water to San Francisco. Now 75 years later, Secretary of the Interior Donald Hodel is proposing that the dam be removed and the beautiful sister valley to Yosemite be restored to its pristine natural beauty. San Francisco can readily get all the water it needs from the American and Sacramento Rivers. TESTIMONY

Dear Chairwoman Costa and members of the Planning Commission of the Nauai Economic On May 16, 1988, the Board of Directors of the Kauai Economic Development Board voted to support the proposed golf course at Maha'ulepu. We feel the revised location of the golf course, out of the conservation area, is a significant compromise that will enable the development of a challenging golf course, and at the same time maintain the beauty of this area. The relocation of the golf course inland maintains the public access to the shoreline.

Recently, there have been insinuations that this golf course is the first of many developments in that area, and therefore, should be opposed to ensure that future development does not occur. Whether any planned developments occur or not will be a result of consumer demand, economic feasibility, and availability of capital to finance the project. A decision to approve or disapprove the use permits for any new project should be based solely on the land use merits of the project itself.

Our vote of support for the golf course is also our vote of confidence in the developers of this project. Ventura Development Corp. and Grove Farm Land Corp. have a demonstrated history of quality development. In each of their projects, they have been willing to ensure that the needs and concerns of the

community are addressed. Their decision to relocate the golf course indicates their respect for community concerns, as well as a willingness to compromise, to ensure that all parties are satisfied with the final product.

Grove Farm Co. are the developers of Kukui Grove Shopping Center, Ulu Ko, Ulukukui, Komohana and Puhi units I and II residential subdivisions. To meet the educational needs of Kauai, they generously donated 150 acres of land for the relocation and expansion of Kauai Community College. Ventura Development Corp. has responsibly developed many fine business and office buildings including the First Nationwide Plaza Building, Kukui Grove Executive Center, and the Kukui Health Center. In each of their projects they have used Kauai contractors and workers exclusively.

It is our sincere hope that a decision on the Maha'ulepu Golf Course will be based on the merits of this project, with the consideration for the reputation of the developers.

Golf Course Proposal for Maha'ulepu RE:

At its May 19, 1988 meeting, the Board of Directors of 1000 Friends of Kauaí unanimously decided to oppose the construction of a golf course or any other development encroaching the Maha'ulepu coastline in the absence of a long range plan for the area. The only long range plan for the area -- the Koloa-Poipu General Plan -- calls for no further development beyond Poipu Kai.

If it is the opinion of this planning body that the Koloa-Poipu General Plan is no longer applicable, then now is the time to reassess, revise and develop a new master plan for therarea--not pursued a piecemeal approach to planning and development.

There are two issues to be addressed today: 1) The proposed golf course which, if it follows the trend of other golf courses, would be the foot in the door for further urbanization of the Mahaulepu area. Even with the changes Mr. Mel Ventura has made to try to accommodate community concerns, parts of the golf courseare still too close to the coastline and at least two holes are on the sand dunes which ought to be protected and preserved.

Should this planning body approve construction of the golf course, we strongly recommend that Mr. Ventura move the golf course mauka to serve as a buffer from the cane fields for the people who live in Weliweli.

The second and more important issue is that of a lack of master plan based on community needs for the area. 1000 Friends of Kauai would like to see public consensus on the fate of Maha'ulepu. We have a proven track record for facilitating the process of soliciting public input and bringing diverse interest groups and individuals together for group decision-making on land use issues (e.g. General Plan Update, Hanalei projects).

We recommend that the decision on this project be deferred until a long range plan can be developed for Mahaulepu. We'd like to see a task for AO established which could include representatives from the Planning Commission, Planning Department, landowner, developer, and most importantly, from the community as well as from our organization. By pooling fiscal resources, expertise, and time, this task force could gather data, and public input; develop alternatives; come up with costs, benefits, impact and other significant information on which to base decisions such as this regarding land use issues for this area.

We'd like to avoid a polarization of our community. No one wants another Nukolii experience. Let's work together to create a vision for Maha'ulepu which we can all share and be proud of.

Tales of old and new Maha'ulepu

To the Forum:

On Maha'ulepu and Shipwreck area, my grandmother, Christine Mokuaikai Malao, formerly Mrs. Christine Miller of Koloa, passed on to me information about Maha'ulepu when I was younger. She told me that at one time it used to be a training area for ali'i warriors to practice the art of warfare. Also, the kahuna used to gather natural herbs to practice their lapaau medicine. Also, the kahuna anana used to send their akulele against other rival chiefs. That's why there used to be stone circles next to the beach and cliff sides. Also,

many major battles were fought against rival chiefs for control of fishing grounds and Kipukai Valley.

Also in the old days, it was one of the only places you could eat the mud like at Kawainui Marsh in Kailua. These are a few reasons I think this place should be saved now and forever, and not to turn it into another Lahaina or Waikiki for a playground at the expense of the local people.

Also, it seems to me nowadays poor and low-income people have to have a say. That's because of the almighty dollar and people with poor value systems. That's our state's fault, ever since Captain Crook -- no, Cook -- came here, dollars have led to the destruction of Hawai'i nei.

Values, examples: Stolen Hawaiian land, Great Mahele, overthrow of our Queen and decimation of the Hawaiian race by disease brought in; also illegal transfer of 1.75 million acres of land to State.

Values seem to have been thrown out the window. This society has created a monster. Tourism is a two-edged sword. It cuts deep, makes jobs low paying, and also crime, traffic, corrupt government, and family values get pushed out for dollar values to get ahead in this crazy world.

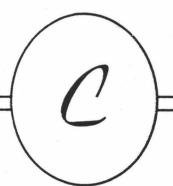

To the Planning Commission:

I want to express my opposition to the proposed golf course at Keoneloa and ask you to turn it down for these reasons:

1)VIOLATION OF GENERAL PLAN: The Koloa-Poipu- Kalaheo General Plan, supported by the final Kauai General Plan, states specifically that there should be no further development in this area. "Development toward Maha'ulepu beyond the existing State Urban District should not occur and coastal lands particularly should remain undeveloped and restricted to compatible recreational uses that will maintain the unique environment character in perpetuity."

It is clear that the General Plan intended to create an open area to buffer the hotel and condo area in Poipu. It is clear that the intention was no more development of any kind from the edge of the Hyatt - that is the State Urban District as mentioned above. How clear do we need it to be said to understand? "Development.....should not occur"

To disregard the General Plan without consideration for the community input is appalling to me. What is the purpose of having a General Plan unless it is valued by being used as a decision-making tool? Unless there is a review process that allows the general community to reassess the area, I believe you are instructed to follow the Plan. If you ignore this line and intention, it will leave this area utterly defenseless as there will no longer be <u>any</u> indication of a plan to stop development. Please do not change this General Plan statement without a review and reconstruction process.

- 2) URBAN ZONING BY STATE There is an extremely high probability that this land will be changed to urban, no matter what is said at this level. Golf course land is upzoned by the LUC to urban by a rate of 52:1. That is to say, of the 53 courses in the state there are 52 + of them that are zoned urban when they reach the LUC level. And the consequences of that zoning are extremely far reaching. Again this flies right in the face of the General Plan. It opens the door by setting a precedence for development when there has been no decision to allow it. Your right (and ours) to evaluate and plan has been removed by this manipulation. We <u>must stop it</u> right here!
- 3) NO MASTER PLAN: There must be a master plan for the whole 1230 acres NOW, while there can be time to evaluate the whole area. This proposal is an attempt, I believe, to avoid confronting the issue of what is planned for this area which we know from Grove Farm's own information to be 3 hotels, another golf course, a marina, and 4000 residences. But there is NO master plan being submitted to you. We are supposed to believe that this golf course just happened to pop into their heads. (Actually into the Japanese investors heads.) At least A&B has had the respect for you and the community to let us know what they have planned for the same amount of space.

I believe you must reject this request and tell them to go back and prepare a total plan. Let us all know what is in their design and let us see how the golf course fits into the whole.

I urge you for the health of the Southshore and the community that loves Maha'ulepu, to reject this plan as it is presented to you.

For the record, my name is Conrad Murashige. This afternoon I am here to represent the Contractor Association of Kauai in favor of the proposed Golf Course.

Our association is strongly in favor of the golf course. The golf course is an extremely important part of the Shipwreck Beach Hotel complex and will insure that the complex will proceed. Collectively the golf course and hotel will sustain the needed jobs for our people over a 24 month period.

Historically, we in our industry have experienced the peaks and valleys of an economy which in times of slowdown can cause cuts in working hours, layoffs, and in extremes forcing businesses to shut down. The average construction worker will work in relatively good times approximately 1560 hours out of 2,080 in full employment. This translates into a difference of \$13,500 income lost per year or about 75% of total potential.

The golf course project will employ 110 plus direct construction related jobs. It will also employ at least 120 indirect related jobs. If put together with the hotel project, there will be at least 500 to 600 full time jobs for a span of approximately 24 months. During its peak employment, Kauai would be close to full employment similar to the Westin Phase II period. The Westin Phase II during its peak employment was manned by a workforce of at least 82% Kauai people. The Kauai economy is still benefiting from this high cycle of employment.

The golf course will preserve open space and a green belt along the shoreline. It will not be affected by disappearing Federal subsidies as is the case of the cane land in and surrounding this area. Public access and use will be improved with a high level of maintenance in the area. Presently the area has been abused by many and conditions will not improve unless controlled.

Mel Ventura's track record of working with Kauai contractors and quality developments only show further the type of effort going in to this golf course. He has shown his willingness to work with the community concerns and is sensitive to outside input because of his roots here.

Commissioners, I urge you to support this golf course project. It is good planning and Kauai as whole will benefit from it's completion.

I am writing with regards to the request for re-zoning of lands in the vicinity of Keoneloa Bay by the Mel Ventura interests for use of Grove Farm lands as a golf course.

I WOULD URGE YOUR FINDINGS BE AGAINST SUCH RE-ZONING.

As a design professional, a member of a Kauai family kaamaina to the Koloa district, and as a member of the Ohana O Mahawlepu organization, I oppose such rezoning for numerous reasons.

1. THE DOMINO EFFECT; Golf Courses are zoned into Urban classifications. Such a classification of the narrow strip proposed behind Keoneloa Bay would create the opportunity for further re-classification of those lands held by Grove Farm at Mahablepu proper.

Given efforts more than a decade ago to bring the "Mahatelepu area into Urban classification, the current approach can hardly be innocent of such intentions in the future. The presence of contiguous Urban land in the newly re-zone golf course would help justify such an additional request.

2. DAMAGE TO LOCAL LIFE-STYLE: The *Golf Course Myth*
has been disproven so often in recent years that we
cannot allow it to be sold again at Maha*Ilepu,
Without doubt a golf course creates a gentryfication
of an area; an influx of one lifestyle into an area
which is created for their special interests alone.

Golf courses are not really open space. In fact, they are tightly controlled, dangerous to cross, and open space only for those who play golf.

On an island as small as Kauai the loss of open access to an area as unique and unspoiled as Mahawlepu would be a blow to the recreation and spiritual refreshment of a large number of local residents.

3.LOSSES TO THE FUTURE: It is a shame that those involved in decisions about our communities will most likely not live to see if they were valid. The long term effects of allowing urban zoning in the Mahamelepu region will slowly become known and their full negative effect not apparent until Mr. Ventura and his associates at Grove Farm have long spent their profits, retired, or even be no longer living.

But our Grandchildren will suffer these effects for us.

Mr. Shigemoto, what of your "small kid days' has gone the way of change? What do you personally regret having lost through improvement? What in our Island community would you regret loosing?

If you can project these feelings into an entire community and total the feeling of loss, you may begin to appreciate the magnitude of the price to be paid by letting Mahawlepu go.

As a design professional I cannot expect you to make impassioned decisions in your professional capacity, but I can expect you to make professional ones. In this case the professional decision must take into account the larger factors of impact for Kauai, and not just focus upon the immediate request at hand.

Avery Youn has spoken highly of you and I am sure you too feel the weight of this particular junction in the course of Planning for Kauai. I am writing only to add my comments and concerns to what must be a growing voice in the preservation of one of Kauai's last wild places.

It is good to see that there is beginning to be more of a furor and concern raised throughout these islands about the hoards of investors and land speculators, foreign and otherwise, who run amok to the detriment of "we the people" of Hawai'i. It is frightening to observe these past few years this rampant economic tidal wave moving to devour our aina and its people. Something has got to be done to stem this tide of greed at the expense of present and future generations!

Are we going to allow our home to be turned into a playground for the wealthy while more and more of us who were born and raised here are just struggling to get by?

There should be an uproar because farmers are being squeezed off the 'aina to accommodate golf courses when only two percent of Hawai'i's

As islands, it is suicide to import more than 90 percent of our food. Farmers must have special water rates and water priority over resort developments.

It is not enough for these investors and speculators to give token exchanges of money, Memoranda of Agreement, or socalled Aloha Agreements for the exploitation and destruction of out island home for golf courses, resport developments, and highways; nor should we be so accommodating. In the spirit of Aloha 'Aina, we must be stewards of this land. The desecration of the West Beach coastline continues to the demise of important historical sites and fishing grounds of that 'aina, the first area settled by our ancestors on O'ahu. The destruction of these fishing grounds which have fed our people all these generations will be an irreplaceable loss to the families of that coastline.

A so-called Aloha Agreement was struck on West Beach among local developer Campbell Estate, Japan investor Kumugai Gumi, the Governor's office and a few community people in exchange for a catfish project costing \$250,000 (how many locals even eat catfish?) and \$125,000, not for jobs, but to make a plan for the Wai'anae coastline. The developers also want to squeeze the farmers out of Wai'anae so that water can instead be diverted to the West Beach development and golf courses.

We cannot allow opposition and valid concerns to be bought off for scholarships to serve the tourists and other deals that only amount to a mere tax write-off for these big developers.

There is so little empathy from those who develop on our islands. I've seen it happen time and time again over the past 20 years, developers explaining to us how their resort, condominium or golf course will be of great value to our community. Each time they come, take our land and then leave with their profits. What they leave behind is traffic congestion, higher property taxes, an increase in the crime rate and above all else, a loss of identity and a loss of culture and history. If Mr. Ventura is allowed to develop his golf course then the sad truth is that the Maha'ulepu that we know will be gone, for development will not stop at just one golf course.

I was born and raised in Honolulu and am a 14 year resident of this island. In fact, I have not moved within a 4-mile. radius of the Kalaheo/Po'ipu

I am vehemently opposed to any kind of development at Maha'ulepu for several reasons. First and foremost, this is the last untouched "Hawaiian" place on the southside of Kaua'i. Many birds nest along the cliffs from Keoniloa Bay to Maha'ulepu. The endangered

I believe these are important hereditary factors which contribute to the education and enrichment of our children. 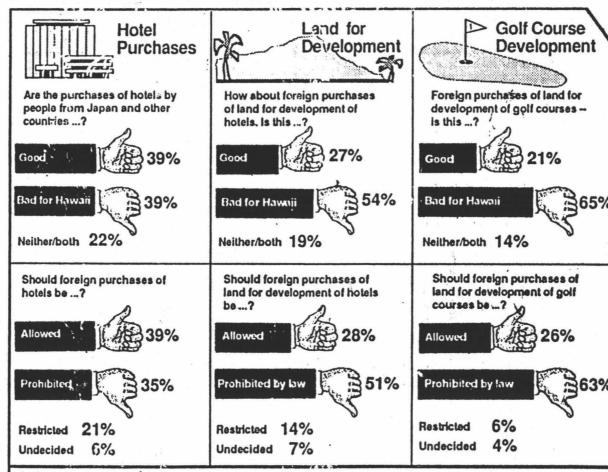

Mel Ventura's Ainako Resort Associates and Grove Farm Properties Inc. are asking the county Planning Commission for permits to construct a 210-acre, 18-hole golf course along the coastline between Shipwreck's Beach and Maha'ulepu.

The golf course would extend from Keoniloa Bay where Ventura is building the 605-room Hyatt Regency Hotel to the Grove Farm rock quarry. Part of the course would be mauka of the sand dunes near Shipwreck's Beach. More than half the length of the course would be along the ocean cliffs, from the dunes to the quarry. The developers say no part of the golf course would be closer than 40 feet to the high water mark and the golf course design avoids the sandy beaches used by the public.

A public pathway would run from a parking lot at Keoniloa

cost of \$153 million.

A Takenaka Komuten official, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said his company would be building the hotel and a golf course.

Takenaka Komuten and Tokyo Kosan will set up an equally owned joint venture, Kawa'iloa Development, in Hawai'i in April. Kawa'iloa will be capitalized at \$19 million, the official said.

The Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on Wadnesday, April 13, at 1:30 p.m. in the council chambers of

application says. It would be operated in conjunction with the new hotel and open to the public.

The proposed site is zoned Agriculture and Open by the county. The state Land Use Classification is Conservation and Agriculture. The strip within 300 feet of the shoreline is in the Special Management Area. In addition to an SMA permit, the developers are applying for a use permit, special permit and a zoning permit. The special permit is required for building the golf course and other



Mr. Shigemoto and members of the Kauai Planning Commission:

The Kauai group of the Conservation Council for Hawaii is in favor of bona fide use of agricultural land for agricultural purposes. A golf course is not an agricultural use, despite the special interest law passed in 1985.

Nearly 200 acres of land has been taken out of agricultural production, and is now being proposed for a golf course. The applicants have stated that only a few of the acres are prime ag, but State SA Agricultural Director Suzanne Peterson said that more than half of the lands are either "prime or of other significance".

Planner Mike Lauretta, at a meeting of the Koloa Community. Association, gave the opinion that it is likely the State Land Use Commission will require the parcel to be zoned Urban. The parcel do not forget, is a 1200 acre parcel, of which the golf course represents less than 20 %. The parcel extends up to McBryde's Koloa Mill. If the Planking Commission were to grant the permits for the golf course, it would give the wrong message to the State Land Use Commission, and would threaten the future of McBryde Sugar Co., whose leases come up for renewal in just a few years. The Planning Commission needs to give Grove Farm the message that Ag lands will be used for bona fide agriculture.

The Conservation Council is not saying Grove Farm can't use the land, nor are we saying that it must be used for growing sugar. We are saying Kauai's Ag land should be used for agricultural purposes. If sugar is not a good bet, then take a look at the alternatives.

We have looked at alternatives, and found some exciting possibilities. For example, a recent article in Facific Business News told of an organization looking for a site to set up a research facility for aquacultural systems using cold, nutrient-rich deep ocean waters. The article predicted a \$10 billion investment by private industry and government in so-called DORCUS or "Deep Ocean Recovery" systems in the next 15 years. That kind of investment makes these hotel plans look like peanuts.

We have also seen recent predictions in State planning documents that project a <u>doubling</u> of Hawaii's aquacultural gross income <u>each year</u> for the five year period between 1987 and 1992, from \$3 million in 1987 to over \$50 million in 1992. No other industry shows that kind of growth potential. Aquaculture is coming of age in Hawaii. Kauai has not had much luck with its fresh water prawns. But aquaculture in Hawaii has now found much better species to work with, species that already have a tremendous local, national, and world-wide market. The technology is known to raise these species through all life stages to commercially saleable size. The economic viability of raising marine shrimp, abalone, oysters, and even seaweed has been proven.

Marine shrimp productivity, for example, has produced gross revenues of a <u>quarter million dollars per acre per year</u>. A detailed analysis of the economics of such a project was recently published. It stated that the technology "has <u>outstanding commercial potential</u>." This study also determined that "production levels achieved in the experimental pond can be duplicated at commercial scale. " In other words, this is aquaculture that works, and that has excellent potential for producing profitable financial returns for someone willing to take advantage of the opportunity. There is a University of Hawaii professor who would develop a marine shrimp facility on Kauai if the opportunity were made available. This is the kind of use that we should preserve our ag lands for.

Another recent nationwide study determined that Mana was the number one best site in the United States for marine shrimp aquaculture based on weather, temperature, water, soil and other conditions. But Maha'ulepu is even better. Maha'ulepu has everything Mana has, and even more. Even solar radiation (i.e. sunlight), as recorded during a statewide survey by the University of Hawaii, was more intense during the study period at Maha'ulepu than at Mana. And sunlight makes shrimp and other aquacultured

organisms grow faster.

1

Maha'ulepu even has one great advantage over Mana, and that is wind. Maha'ulepu is a windy coastline, so windy that at one time Grove Farm has worked with a company that produced an artist's concept of a wind farm at the site. It is second best to Kilauea Point on Kauai. What does this have to do with aquaculture? Wind helps to cause a natural mixing of the water in aquacultural ponds, which is important to achieve maximum growth. If you don't have wind to do it for free, you have to use electricity to ensure proper mixing of water and even oxygen distribution within a pond.

Maha'ulepu could become an aquacultural center of worldwide significance. It has another key element for success, and that is land ownership under one land

owner.

If that one land owner, Grove Farm Corp., will stop this blind rusn into resort development that this island does not need, then there is a chance for a great future that will truly benefit those who will live here for generations to come.

There is a clear need for a masterplan for the entire Maha'ulepu coastline, and we ask the Planning Commission to deny this application until such time the applicant Grove Farm Co. has come up with such a plan.

We also ask that before any further consideration is given to this current proposal, that a full Environmental Impact Statement be required to give a much closer look at this special section of coastline than was given in the totally inadequate Environmental Assessment. We feel that the maps provided are not of sufficient quality to accurately locate the golf course boundary; that the golf course may still extend into shearwater nesting areas; that there are rare native plants near the boundaries of the golf course; that the proposal does not adequately consider archaeological sites along the proposed shoreline trail; and that the proposed alignment is way too close to the coastline.

The Conservation Council would like to make available the expertise of the many scientists and experts in our organization; please feel free to call on us if you would like further information about the unique environment and natural resources of the Mahaulepu coastline, or about agricultural and aquaculture possibilities for the area.

California

SAN FRANCISCO

REVOLT against growth and all the A problems that come with it is sweeping California. In many cities and suburbs the voters are placing curbs on the number and the size of new office blocks; in some places new houses are being limited. The rebellion is especially fierce in Orange County, where an initiative to discourage new development will go before the voters in June. But unlike other slow-growth drives, the one in Orange County plans to bring the developers to heel by putting limits on road traffic. Before a developer could obtain a building permit, he would have to produce plans for reducing the congestion of the roads that would serve the new buildings and for controlling the growth of traffic in the future. Both the number of cars and the rate at which they move would have to meet county standards.

Orange County, with a population of 2.2m, lies south of Los Angeles and is considered the core of Californian conservatism, not a place where a populist uprising would occur. But it is one of the fastestgrowing regions in the state. Prospering high-tech and defence industries have brought it low unemployment, a buoyant economy-and 15,000 or so new cars and other vehicles registered every month. The traffic has become a nightmare. To make matters worse, local spending on roadbuilding and repair has been negligible; for part at least of this the voters can thank their 1978 decision to cut taxes by passing

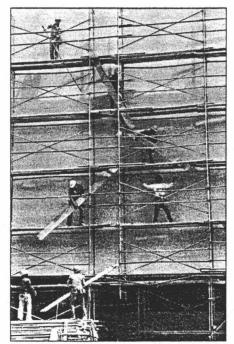
Proposition 13. The Citizens' Sensible Growth and Traffic Control Initiative needed 65,000 signatures to win a place on the ballot. It attracted nearly 90,000 and is expected to be approved in June. The initiative accuses local government of capitulating to developers so that "the very reasons for which citizens came to the county are fast disappearing. The sunshine, the trees, the handsome houses for well paid workers, easy access to the sea—all are threatened by traffic. The initiative seeks to preserve them through 'safe and efficient access to employment, housing and public and private services.".

The goal is to be obtained by traffic that

moves at an average pace of 35 miles per hour and delays at crossroads that last no longer than it takes the lights to change from red back to red. The initiative also sets a five-minute goal for the time it takes police, firemen and ambulances to reach their destinations 85% of the time. Road engineers have a rating system for traffic congestion that ranges from A for free flow to F for real paralysis. Orange County hopes to achieve C, but realists would settle for D at the most frequently blocked crossroads. At present F is the letter, and the word, at about 40 of them many times a day.

Critics of the plan fear that forcing developers to assume the costs of building new roads will damage local economies by keeping new businesses away. They point to legal challenges being brought against restrictive planning controls, some of which have been upheld by the Supreme Court in Washington. Alternatives favoured by the critics include a higher petrol tax and more toll The governor, Mr George Deukmejian, is proposing a large bond issue to pay for more freeways throughout the state.

Orange County's measures are only the most recent evidence of the demand in California for better control over commercial expansion. A nearby county, Riverside, is to vote this year on an initiative to curb the number of new houses in the county. Los Angeles has passed a law to limit the size of new office blocks and make developers pay for improving roads leading to their buildings. It also requires car sharing and the use of buses to reduce the number of cars on its roads. Mr Tom Bradley, the mayor, may even think better of running for a fifth term, partly because of opposition arising

In November 1987, 17 cities in California had growth-control measures on their ballots and 15 of them were approved. Critics call the growth-controllers selfish and accuse them of refusing to share California's good fortune. They reply that 4m more people are sharing California's bounty than in 1980, intensifying the demand for housing, jobs and services. A report to the legislature suggests that the state's population, now just under 28m, may reach 40m by 2020, putting a huge strain on water supplies, sewerage and roads, all already overburdened.

The navy Half a league backward.

PRESIDENT REAGAN'S budget for 1989, sent to Congress on February 18th, proposed defence spending of \$294 billion during the year beginning next October, a decrease of some \$2 billion after inflation. Four days later the secretary of the navy, Mr James Webb, resigned in a huff.

On his going hang a couple of tales. The first is the mystique of the 600-ship navy. When the Reagan administration came to power in 1981 determined to "make America strong again", the 600-ship navy became the symbol of the defence build-up, almost its centrepiece. From a low of fewer than 500, enough new ships were planned to boost the total to 605 by October 1989. But the new budget will put 16 frigates out of service earlier than planned, resulting in a total of only 580 by the end of next year (some other minor ship-shuffling accounts for the arithmetical discrepancy). The official line is that 600 is still the goal, but few people believe it will be reached.

The other tale is the management style of the secretary of defence, Mr Frank Carlucci, which clearly grates on Mr Webb. He claims that he and his admirals had found a way to save the required amount without putting the 16 ships out of commission, but that it was rejected without adequate consultation. At his farewell press conference, Mr Webb complained bitterly about Mr Carlucci, suggesting that he spent too much time on external politicking and too little in the Pentagon.

Mr Webb's detractors tell yet a third tale. The exciting and productive days of the Reagan administration are over, and no one remembers service secretaries who merely fade away. Mr Webb's noisy resignation thus costs him little but will surely bring his name to the mind of a future president if he is

looking for a big-defence man.

My name is Stephen Levine. I am a resident of Lihue and I visit the Mahalepu area at least 3 times a month to hike, dive, fly kites, take photographs, and watch the moon rise. I would like to offer testimony in opposition to the proposed golf course east of the Hyatt Hotel.

Kauai and the state of Hawaii have a unique and important system of land use planning. General planning the state, county, and regional levels allows all the people to get involved in the overall planning and development of land. These plans are the results of a great deal of money, but more importantly they represent the voice of the people. The people of Kauai have invested time and effort to participate in the drafting of both the Kauai General Plan and the Koloa-Poipu-Kalaheo plans, which have been adopted as ordinances. While only guides rather than outright limitations, it is the desire of the people that:

"Development toward Mahalepu beyond the State Urban District [the site of the Hyatt] should not occur and coastal lands particularly should remain undeveloped and restricted to compatible recreational uses that will maintain the unique environment character in perpetuity." page 9 of the Koloa-Poipu-Kalaheo Development Plan.

Some people grumble that as private property, the owner of this stretch of coast, in conjunction with Ainako Development Corporation, Hawaii Takenaka Development and Toko Development Hawaii, should be allowed to do whatever they want with their land. Zoning and land use restrictions AN Development is a Privilege are an accepted fact of life. We have extensive rules and

guidelines for making decisions on the use of land, and when something this dramatic is proposed the burden the applicant must meet is high.

Grove Farm and Mr. Ventura have each done quality development in the past here on Kauai. These projects have been beneficial to both themselves and the people of Kauai. What they seek here is to trade all the good projects they have done in the past for one bad one.

Clearly there is no need for the golf course. The hotel was planned and permits sought and approved without any mention of a golf course. Mr. Ventura has appeared before this commission twice before concerning what is to be the Hyatt Hotel at Ainako. He indicated at both the hearing new 1265

for a zoning amendment and SMA permits that extensive study went into evaluating the development of the Hyatt. When asked about the amenities he planned for the hotel, the only things mentioned were tennis courts, swimming pools, luau areas, horse-back riding, lawn bowling and health facilities. No mention was ever made of a golf course. Clearly, after all the feasibility studies had been done, the hotel development at Ainako could function without a golf course. Dear Commissioners.

The following is the testimony that I had prepared to present to the Planning Commission at the public hearing on May 25, but was unable to do so because of the late start and a previous commitment.

My name is Joel Leonard, and I live in Hanalei. I want to express my concerns about the proposed development at Maha u'lepu. Some people may say that because I live on the North Shore, what happens on the South Side is not my concern. I say when you live on an island as small as Kaua'i, what happens in one area affects other areas as well.

A golf course in itself does not seem like a bad thing. It has beautiful manicured lawns, transplanted trees, lakes, etc. What is not so good is that it is only for the enjoyment of those who play golf and can afford the greens fees. The average resident of Kaua'i can not afford to pay more than a days pay to chase a little white ball around an artificially created environment, where once they were able to go, free to enjoy the outdoors, to fish, swim, wind-surf, and picnic.

In Japan, golf has become a national passion. Business executives are expected to entertain their associates on the golf course. Golf Club memberships are at a premium and it is not unheard of for a membership to cost 100's of thousands of dollars. Land is scarce in Japan and very costly; Therefore they look to Hawai'i, where land is comparitivly cheap,to build their golf courses and hotels. Then they can bring over planeloads of their business associates at a fraction of the cost of a club membership in Japan. The money generated at the resorts goes back to Japan. Very little if any remains here to help our island economy. The menial tourist industry wages can in no way support island families with our high cost of living. On top of this the quality of life is deminished with the destruction of traditional recreational areas.

Development is not all bad, it provides jobs and housing for growing island families, but when the development proceeds at a pace that requires importing workers from off island, because there aren't enough people here to fill those jobs, it puts a strain on the island's infrastructure.

Golf courses require millions of gallons of water to stay green. In an area that has little rainfall it would make more sense to use that water to grow food crops so that island families would not have to pay the high cost of imported food. The roads in the Koloa-Poipu area are already over burdened. What about the additional trash generated by the proposed hotel at Shipwreck beach, with still others in the future. Our roads have been littered for months with junk cars and other trash; the only dump on the island is fast filling up. We should address these problems before new development is allowed. The Garden Island is fast becoming the Garbage Island.

If developers must develop to be happy, let them use their energy and resources to upgrade existing areas that have been allowed to deterioate; like the strip of stores along Kuhio hwy. in Lihue. Give them tax credits for refurbishing and major tax increases on new development. Since hotel development and tourism put the largest burden on the island, let them pay for it. Afterall they are profiting quite nicely, while the people struggle to make ends meet.

We need affordable housing, schools, hospitals, roads, sewer treatment, etc. There can be profit in providing these things. Maybe not as much as buying or leasing marginal lands and converting them into "World Class" Mega resorts, but how much profit does a man need to find happiness.

Unspoiled areas like Maha u'lepu are fast disappearing and must be preserved for future generations. Kaua'i has the opportunity to be an unspoiled paradise while the rest of Hawai'i disappears under concrete.

Let people come here in the future and marvel at our natural beauty and at how the people of Kaua'i had the foresight to preserve it.

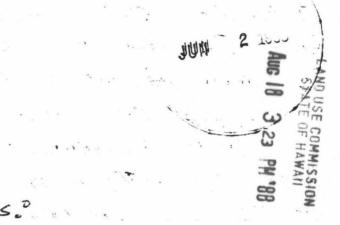

We are against the proposed golf course for the Hyatt, and would appreciate your help in stopping this development.

We feel very strongly that this area on the south shore should remain in its natural state: (1) for the protection of the special biological and archaeological resources there, and (2) for the local people and their recreation. This is the <u>last</u> stretch of quality beach on the south shore that has not been developed! Local people need this area to remain as it is.

In addition, the building of more tourist facilities at this time would do far more harm than good. At present, we certainly do not need more of the kinds of jobs such development would create. I am commenting on the Ainako Resort Association & Grove Farm Co., Inc. golf course proposal on my own behalf as a biologist interested in the biological prehistory of the Hawaiian Islands and because I feel that the Pa'a and Maha'lepu areas have tremendous scientific and educational value ...

This past Monday it was my unique privilege to accompany Smithsonian bird fossil expert Dr. Stors Olson on a field reconasaince of the Pa'a and Mahu'lepu areas. Since 1971 Dr. Olson has uncovered thousands of bird fossils which have in essence changed our understanding of endemic Hawaiian birds existing before the arrival of man (prior to 400 A.D.). The number of known endemic Hawaiian species has more than doubled because of these fossil finds. This list now includes flightless geese, flightless rails, a sea eagle, and an entire genus of owls to mention just a few.

The largest collections of fossil birds were found on Molokai, Oahu, and on our island of Kauai on the Makawehi Dunes. These geological features lie within the Conservation Zone but will definitely be impacted by increased pedestrian traffic generated by the hotel and golf course.

In addition to fossil birds the area contains rich deposits of fossil Hawaiian land shells. The Hawaiian land-snail fauna is exceptional and considered one of the most remarkable examples of adaptive radiation in the world. We found a 3 foot band of soil beneath a 100 foot lithified dune that had been excavated for sand. This layer of ancient earth contained great numbers of extinct Hawaiian land-snail species.

There are also special geological features in the area. The large sink hole just east of the project area was described by Dr. Olson as being unique in all of the Hawaiian Islands. This was also probably an important prehistoric habitation site and may yet yield a wealth of archaeological artifacts.

In short the areas of Pa'a and Maha'ulepu have tremendous scientific value that can provide insight into our prehistoric past. They also have an exceptional potential has training grounds for generations of future earth scientists. This is

sufficient reason to move very deliberately in allowing any development that may jeopardize these resources. Before deciding on this issue I recommend the following:

- 1/ The boundaries of the proposed project be staked out on the ground so that the physical impact on the site and adjacent resources can be objectively evaluated.
- $\,$ 2/ The developers provide detailed plans and mititgative measures to protect these resources.

Given the irreplaceable nature of these resources it would seem prudent to substantially widen the protected coastal zone and to intiate some form of permanent protection and management for the area. The State's Natural Area Reserve System or the Federal government's National Park System may be to suitable alternatives.

I thank you for the opportunity to comment on this issue and hope that you will recognize the irreplaceable value of these resources.

The Kaua'i Group of the Sierra Club wishes to go on record as opposing the approval of this application by Ainako Resort Associates, and Grove Farm Properties, Inc., at this time.

Approval or denial of this application will create a win/lose situation. One side will win and one side will lose. In order to create a Win/Win situation, this application could be withdrawn until such time that a Master Plan has been completed for the entire area from the existing state urban area to Kipu Kai.

This Master Plan could be developed by a committee consisting of members representing all interested groups, including but not limited to, the landowners and developers, the Planning Department, the Po'ipu Beach Resort Association, the Koloa Community Association, environmental and historical groups, and representatives of the watersports industry. This committee should be under the guidance of professionals in mediation, and conflict resolution. The recommendations and conclusions of the this Master Plan should represent a concensus among all interested parties.

No development of the agricultural, open, and coastal lands of Pa'a/Maha'ulepu should be allowed until the completion of such a Master Plan.

Therefore, the Kaua'i Group of the Sierra Club, respectfully requests the Planning Commission to abide by the recommendations of the Koloa-Po'ipu-Kalaheo Development Plan. This plan served as the basis of Ordinance No. 447 known as "the Koloa-Po'ipu-Kalaheo Development Plan Ordinance.". It states:

Development toward Maha'ulepu beyond the existing State Urban District should not occur and coastal lands particularly should remain undeveloped and restricted to compatible recreational uses that will maintain the unique environment character in perpetuity.

A revised Development Plan must be completed before any "development" is approved beyond the existing state urban district. Further, no SMA permits should be issued for the entire coastline from Keoneloa Bay eastward until a Master Plan has been developed, so that the "potential cumulative impact of individual developments" may be addressed. Please attend the public hearing before the Kaua'i County Planning Commission next Wednesday, May 25, 1988, at 1:30 p.m. or soon thereafter at the War Memorial Convention Hall Meeting Rooms.



Turnout at this hearing is expected to be huge. Come early to sign up to testify. Plan on staying for a few hours.

If you don't testify—how will the commissioners know you care? If you can't testify at least write a letter to the newspapers or send a friend in your place. A County planner was heard to say, the only way to stop this developent from being approved is to have a huge turn out of people opposed to the proposed golf course at the public hearing.

The Kaua'i Group of the Sierra Club would like to see the unique character of the Maha'ulepu area preserved in perpetuity for the enjoyment of all.

There should be no development without a master plan for the entire area.

Here are some alternatives to the proposal:

- No golf course should be constructed.
- 2. Create a public park on the coastal lands east of the Hyatt.
- Move the golf course mauka so that it would provide a buffer zone between Wellwell tract and the canefields.

The Planning Commission should abide by the recommendation of the Koloa-Po'ipu-Kalaheo Development Plan. It states:

"Development toward Maha'ulepu beyond the existing State Urban District should not occur and coastal lands particularly should remain undeveloped and restricted to compatible recreational uses that will maintain the unique environment character in perpetuity."

The applicants for this "Development" (Golfcourse) are required to apply for a Special Management Area Use Permit (SMA Permit) SMA regulations state:

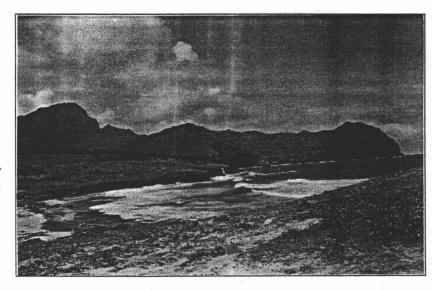
"It is the State policy to preserve, protect, and where possible, to restore the natural resources of the coastal zone of Hawaii. Therefore, special controls on development within an area along the shoreline are necessary to avoid permanent loss of valuable resources and the foreclosure of management options, and to insure that adequate public access is provided to public-owned or used beaches, recreation areas, and natural reserves, by dedication or other means."

Some of the objectives and policies of the States Coastal Zone Management Act are, to:

"Protect valuable coastal ecosystems from disruption and minimize adverse impacts on all coastal ecosystems"...and to "Improve the development review process, communication, public participation in the management of coastal resources and hazards."

SMA rules state that:

"No development shall be approved unless the Authority has first found that: The development will not have any substantial, adverse environmental or ecological effect...Such adverse effect shall include...the potential cumulative impact of individual developments, each one of which taken in itself might not have a substantial adverse effect..."



NO GOLF COURSE WITH-OUT A MASTER PLAN!

Here are a few of the issues and considerations which you might mention in your letter and testimony, in addition to your personal feelings about Maha'ulepu. We suggest selecting one or two issues that you are most familiar with.

- 1. Over time the public will feel like intruders. Where will local residents go to fish, picnic, camp, swim, and play?
- 2. This coastline is the last wild land quality area left in the south shore/Po'ipu district.
- 3. More tourist facilities at this time would just make traffic, lack of housing, and crowded conditions worse. We need to catch-up with our infrastructure first.
- 4. The revised golf course plan, which was published 2 days after the previously scheduled April 13 public hearing, does not represent adequate input from conservation groups.
- 5. This proposed golf course is part of a 1200-acre parcel owned by Grove Farm. If the county approves the golf course the State Land Use Commission's policy is to urbanize the ENTIRE parcel. This is a foot in the door for further urban development of the Maha'ulepu coast. WHERE IS THE MASTER PLAN?
- 6. Urbanization of agriculture land should be the result of community need not a favor extended to land owners.
- 7. The proposed access trail adjacent to the golf course presents a safety hazzard. Fishermen and casual strollers should not have to be on the lookout for errant shots.
- 8. The Environmental Assessment completed for the golf course is inadequate. The eastern end of the revised course may still intrude into wedgetail shearwater nesting grounds. No archaeological survey has been done along the proposed shoreline trail. There are known archaeological and paleontological sites along the proposed shoreline trail. The archaeological survey should go all the way to the shoreline. (There are no endangered plants or birds within the golf course area).
- 9. The entire area east of the existing urban district should be addressed in one master plan (Project District), before any development is allowed to proceed. An Environmental Impact Statement could then be drafted which would address the cumulative impact of all developments.
- 10. When planning is completed for the Maha'ulepu area in its entirety, it may be found that the area of the proposed golf course may serve the community better as a public park, and that another area would be more suitable for a golf course. WHERE IS THE MASTER PLAN?

They'd only just moved to Maui to work in this or that hotel and the cost of living was so high, they said, they'd probably move next year anyway.

Is this what we want for Kaua'i?

I say "NO!" The growth on this Island is getting out of hand.

Dear Commission members,

I am a resident of Koloa, a voter, and a tax paying property owner on Kauai. As the Ainako Resorts Golf Course is being considered for an SMA permit, many questions about the effect of this development comes to my mind, and I feel that the commission should consider them.

The need for another golf course on Kauai should be carefully considered. Does Grove Farm need more developments on this island? Does Mel Ventura need more money? Do we need more jobs on Kauai, when we don't have enough houses for the people who live and work here now? Who is this golf course for? A group of rich developers from Japan who have very little if any concern about the future well being of the island of Kauai, or it's inhabitants. Private property does belong to the owner to use, but zoning and other considerations effect the use of all properties. We just can't use our land any way we would like, it has to be in areas of consistent usage. This land borders on the ocean, which is used by the public, so these shoreline users should be considered.

If this golf is approved what will be the expense? The priceless access to the public ocean resource will lost to us and future generations. Recreational areas that have been used by Hawaiians and other local inhabitants for generations will be cut off, with no access or parking. These are the types of things that build tensions between the tourists and the residents. These animosities build as the resident's quality of life deteriorates, and their traditional habits and pleasures are reshaped by modern tourist developments, with little or no concern for the common good, just tourist dollars.

Where is the last resort? We were told that the Westin was the last, then the Hyatt, now it's this golf course. When is someone going to draw the line, and say no more until our infrastructure is in order? Do these projects really raise revenue for the county, or cost the taxpayers more through the increased use of roads and other public services? The traffic congestion in Koloa, all ready becoming a serious problem, will surely cause many people to question this project, and blame it for traffic jams.

These questions should be answered before any more developments are approved. Please think of the future generations before allowing people to squander our islands greatest resource, the ocean shoreline. It is a very valuable asset to use, and once it is gone it is gone forever.

The issuing of an SMA permit for this golf course is an example of spot zoning. A development of this type constitutes a change of use, and insures the zoning change for the area around it. All of this is a change of the existing plan for the area. In doing this the plan is no longer the same, but no formal changes to the plan or studies to their long term effect have occurred. The plan for the island of Kauai should be more than reactions to todays events, since it will shape our home for generations to come. Once these projects are completed they can not be erased by turning back the clock. Our Kauai Island Plan should be more comprehensive then to change piece meal for selfish interests of individual developers, it should reflect long term goals with balance growth, in prescribed areas. I am asking the the planning commission, and our other leaders to please consider these factors when making their decisions, it is very important not to forget our future generations, and our past traditions of beach and ocean access. Tough decisions have to be made, but if done correctly the entire community could benefit, and we could be building for a better future, not just another traffic jam. I know it is very difficult, but we must try to consider the entire plan, not just a small group of outside interests, and do the best thing for the common good, in the long run. If not us, who? If not now, When?

I would like to thank you very much for your time and consideration in this matter. I do realize great sacrifice that you make for the community with the dedication of your time and energy in these matters, and I sincerely do appreciate it.

This letter supercedes my previous letter to you dated 13 April 1988

Regarding the M. Ventura proposed development of the Keoniloa Bay-Mahaulepu area golf course, as a long time resident of the Koloa area. I would like to comment in general about this development. Mr. Ventura has shown his sensitivity to the desires of the people on his revised layout of the golf course, but I request that in your review of the project you consider what makes Kauai attractive to the vistor and whether the project would enhance or detract from the beauty of the area. I also urge you to assure that the third party of the development, the people of Kauai, be given due consideration.

Access to the beach/cliff areas that abound the golf course has been a prime area for us fishermen that do net fishing, pole fishing for ulua, limu picking and opihi picking. This has been a recreational area for the people in Koloa to take their young ones to learn about the sea and to fish. I learned about fishing and spent many days of my youth enjoying the area. I returned to Kauai in 1970 after spending 14 long years away, and fortunately we are still able to enjoy the area. My own son who is now attending college visits the area almost immediately upon his short visits home. This attests to the value that my family places on this area.

I oppose the golf course because it does not ensure that the Koloa-Lawai-Kalaheo development plan will be maintained. Also, even with the fact that Grove Farm lease (75 year) arrangements mandate renegotiations of the lease if a change in land use is sought, it does not prevent it from happening. The lease arrangement ensures Grove Farm revenues would be consistant with the use of the land. Access should allow for vehicular passage, foot paths and ample room for parking. Let access be secured ir such a way that it does not deteriorate to a mere culdisac as has occurred at the Koloa Sheraton access.

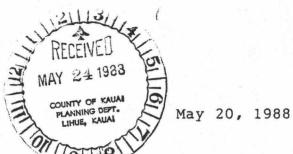

I regret being forced to write again so soon after my last lefter on the A & B/Kukuiula issue, but the unreasonable development put our the Southside continues with full force. To be brief, any golf course project related to the Hyatt Regency Hotel that extends east of Routina Bay should be denied for the following reasons:

- 1). There is no need for such a golf course. Kiahuna Golf Course has announced that it wishes to expand to 27 holes to cover future. Poipu resort area needs. The 36-hole Westin courses will open shortly reducing significantly any pressure on Kiahuna. Hyatt's stated position that it needs a golf course of its own to be competitive in the resort market is nonsense. Hyatt Waikiki, Hyatt Maui, and Hyatt Waikoloa use or will use nearby golf courses such as Kiahuna without any disadvantage. And there will be little or no local demand because of the expense of playing the course (e.g. \$125 per round at the Westin).
- 2). Even if there was a need for a new golf course, a far better location would be just to the east of Weliweli tract and mauka of Poipu Kai and the Hyatt itself. What a perfect buffer between the existing residential and resort areas and the dirt and smoke of cane operations. Less windy too. Placing a future golf course in this location if needed is what good planning is all about and could be accomplished by re-zoning the land.
 - 3). The problem of significant archeological sites in the proposed golf course area has not been resolved. Local people believe that there are major burial grounds which would be affected. Is this to be a repeat of the travesty that the Kauai Resort tried to pull at Wailua?
- 4). Finally, and most importantly, approval of any development east of Keoniloa Bay would be a major breach of trust and violation of the prior assurances contained in all relevent County plans. We have been promised repeatedly that eastward development in the Point area will stop at the Hyatt Regency hotel site, and construction of yet another tourist amenity such as this golf course would amount to a slap in the face to the people of Kauai by our own County officials. I hope that we are neither so naive nor so stupid as to tolerate such a betrayal.

Flacement of the golf course of proposed is obviously part of Grove Farm Co.'s commonly known plan to develop the entire Mahaulepu coast step by step with each prior step bootstrapping the next into existence. Mat starts as a golf course will end up as hotels, condo-

Dear Planning Commissioners:

I am writing to you to state my objections to the proposed golfcourse.

I do not feel another golf course is needed on Kauai at this time. There is an 18 hole golfcourse located at Kiahuna in Poipu approximately 3 miles from the proposed golfcourse (and Kiahuna is planning to add another 9 holes), a 9 hole course in Kalaheo approximately 10 miles away and two golf 18 hole courses presently under construction at the Westin in Lihue, approximately 15 miles away. It is also my understanding that the A & B project (which has not yet received final approval from the County Council) is planning to build a golfcourse. There are also golfcourses in other parts of the island. The only golfcourses which are operating at full capacity are the public course at Wailua and the course at Kukiolono Park in Kalaheo, as these are the only golfcourses which do not charge exorbitant green fees (and, therefore, are used by locals and tourists).

There is a lot of pedestrian traffic on the existing pathway from Keoneloa Bay to Maha'ulepu - hikers, fishermen, windsurfers and divers. I understand that the developer wishes access to this pathway and the ocean to remain open. However, golfcourses are not the safest places in the world for pedestrians; especially when downwind of errant golfballs. Also, what about the golf carts? Who will police them to keep them off the pedestrian pathway? As we all know, access in any resort area is not really encouraged; except for the paying guests, of course.

It is my understanding that the Kauai County General Plan states that development of the Poipu area ends at Keoneloa Bay, at least until further studies can be done to determine the impact of such development on our fragile island and to bring the County infrastructure to a level designed to handle such development. This golfcourse is beyond Keoneloa Bay, and, therefore, does not comply with the County General Plan.

Of course, the developers, realtors and anyone else who stands to gain from development of this area say "But it's just a golfcourse." However, I find it hard to believe that they aren't planning to build condos, hotels and expensive residential areas (cost prohibitive to most local folk) around or in the vicinity of this

golfcourse. Any further development will increase real property taxes, create more traffic and place more stress on our already overburdened infrastructure.

Grove Farm and other cane companies (major land holders on the island) should indeed look for money making investments other than growing cane, but instead of looking toward the tourist industry they should try to diversify our economy, i.e. growing other profitable crops. The 1000 (approximate) acre parcel on which the 210 acre proposed golfcourse will be built is mostly prime (Grade "B") agricultural land (as shown on Map 7-c of the Kauai Agriculture Master Plan prepared by Okahara, Shigeoka and Associates, Inc.)

Many endangered species of birds nest along the cliffs from Keoneloa Bay to Maha'ulepu. Construction of a golf course involves a lot of noisy, heavy equipment which would disturb the natural habitat of these endangered species. Also, it is my understanding that since this will be a links course, all of the existing ironwoods will be cut down. Don't these ironwoods inhibit drifting of the dunes? Where exactly is the million gallons of water needed daily to irrigate this golfcourse going to come from?

The reason most tourists like to come to Kauai is its natural beauty - so let's leave some of it natural - not just the remote areas of the Na Pali, Kokee and Polihale, but some of the easily accessible areas like the Keoneloa/Maha'ulepu Coast for both the tourists and local residents alike.

Please consider every aspect of this and any other proposed development. Thank you for your attention.

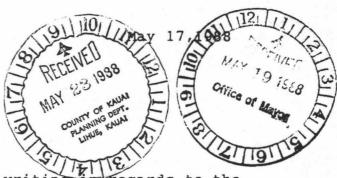

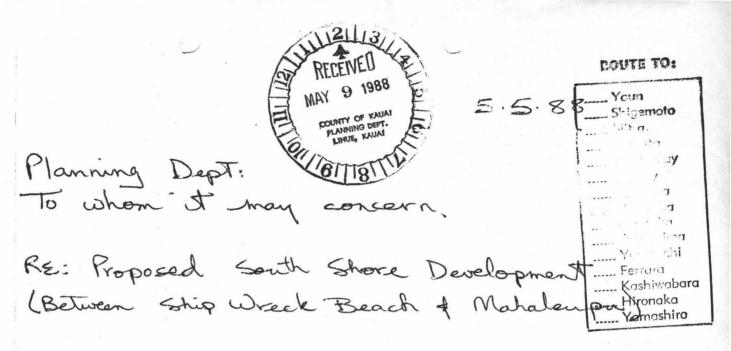

Dear Mr. Shigemoto;

I am writing with regards to the request for re-zoning of lands in the vicinity of Keoneloa Bay by the Mel Ventura interests for use of Grove Farm lands as a golf course.

I WOULD URGE YOUR FINDINGS BE AGAINST SUCH RE-ZONING.

As a design professional, a member of a Kauai family kaamaina to the Koloa district, and as a member of the Ohana O Mahaolepu organization, I oppose such rezoning for numerous reasons.

1. THE DOMINO EFFECT: Golf Courses are zoned into Urban classifications. Such a classification of the narrow strip proposed behind Keoneloa Bay would create the opportunity for further re-classification of those lands held by Grove Farm at Mahaolepu proper.

Given efforts more than a decade ago to bring the Mahaolepu area into Urban classification, the current approach can hardly be innocent of such intentions in the future. The presence of contiguous Urban land in the newly re-zone golf course would help justify such an additional request.

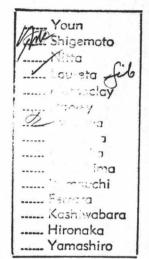
2. DAMAGE TO LOCAL LIFE-STYLE: The "Golf Course Myth" has been disproven so often in recent years that we cannot allow it to be sold again at Mahaolepu. Without doubt a golf course creates a gentryfication of an area; an influx of one lifestyle into an area which is created for their special interests alone.

Golf courses are not really open space. In fact, they are tightly controlled, dangerous to cross, and open space only for those who play golf.

On an island as small as Kauai the loss of open access to an area as unique and unspoiled as Mahaolepu would be a blow to the recreation and spiritual refreshment of a large number of local residents.

3.LOSSES TO THE FUTURE: It is a shame that those involved in decisions about our communities will most likely not live to see if they were valid. The long term effects of allowing urban zoning in the Mahaolepu region will slowly become known and their full negative effect not apparent until Mr. Ventura and his associates at Grove Farm have long spent their profits, retired, or even be no longer living.

But our Grandchildren will suffer these effects for us.

Mr. Shigemoto, what of your "small kid days' has gone the way of change? What do you personally regret having lost through improvement? What in our Island community would you regret loosing?

If you can project these feelings into an entire community and total the feeling of loss, you may begin to appreciate the magnitude of the price to be paid by letting Mahaolepu go.

As a design professional I cannot expect you to make impassioned decisions in your professional capacity, but I can expect you to make professional ones. In this case the professional decision must take into account the larger factors of impact for Kauai, and not just focus upon the immediate request at hand.

Avery Youn has spoken highly of you and I am sure you too feel the weight of this particular junction in the course of Planning for Kauai. I am writing only to add my comments and concerns to what must be a growing voice in the preservation of one of Kauai's last wild places.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

If the proposed golf course at Maha'ulepu were guaranteed to be the last development in that area, there might be some consolation in accepting it, especially with changes to keep it back from the coast and to assure an extensive public area. There are worse uses of agricultural land than golf courses. At least they are green, open, and cared for. There are also better uses, for example, for agricultural purposes, as was intended, or better yet, in this case, as a major public park. If this course were the final private project in the area, I and many others could readily accept the golf course.

But we all know that the specter of three hotels and major development hovers like a hurricane over the shoulders of this golf course. Let's be absolutely clear that approval of this does not condone further development. Your resolve on this issue must be clearly stated and recognized by the applicants.

There are hundreds of people on this island who will not tolerate another hotel in the Maha'ulepu area! Perhaps, if you held an evening hearing, you would hear more of the working voices. As loudly as we can, we just say NO to major development at Maha'ulepu.

We seem to have a strange pendulum swinging in hotel development here on Kauai. Right now, there is no need for the jobs this golf course would create nor even for the jobs created by the approved Hyatt at Shipwreck, which crept quietly in while attention focused elsewhere. We don't need any more hotels. Period. And we don't need the golf course. Let the Hyatt guests play at Kiahuna, if they wish, or at the Westin. If need is a factor here, why not put a golf course at Hanapepe, as was in the works many years ago? Residents would be delighted to see one there, and tourists would be welcome.

But we all know <u>need</u> has very little to do with the planning process. There is the distinct impression that no one is watching the big picture. No one is adding up the total affect on the infrastructure, on the traffic, on housing, on the loss of scenic beauty, on the rising rental rates, on the effects to the quality of life on Kauai--not just money, but the quality of existence. What ultimate value is there in becoming a bedroom community to California and Japan?

My plea is that you, the Planning Commission, will have the courage to look at the big picture, will become more active in preserving Kauai, the real Kauai, for the generations to come and for us, now. As members of the Planning Commission, that is your charge, to be responsible for the overall picture. Kauai doesn't need this golf course. But, if it's approved, make it absolutely the last development at Maha'ulepu. No more hotels!

The best use of the entire Maha'ulepu area would be an extensive public park with limited access so as to maintain the unique feeling and wild nature of the area. Can we work together toward that goal?

If Mr. Ventura's plan is allowed to come to fruition, the stage will the start for the total development of the area by Grove Farm. This can not be allowed to happen. My name is Joel Leonard, and I live in Hanalei. I want to express my concerns about the proposed developement to Maha u'lepu. Some people may say that because I live on the North Shore, what happens on the South Side is not my concern. I say when you live on an island as small as Kaua'i, what happens in one area affects other areas as well.

A golf course in itself does not seem like a bad thing. It has beautiful manicured lawns, transplanted trees, lakes, etc. What is not so good is that it is only for the enjoyment of those who play golf and can afford the greens fees. The average resident of Kaua'i can not afford to pay more than a days pay to chase a little white ball around an artificially created environment, where once they were able to go, free to enjoy the outdoors, to fish, swim, windsurf, and picnic.

In Japan, golf has become a national passion. Business executives are expected to entertain their associates on the golf course. Golf Club memberships are at a premium and it is not unheard of for a membership to cost 100's of thousands of dollars. Land is scarce in Japan and very costly; therefore they look to Hawai'i, where land is relatively cheap, to build their golf courses and hotels. Then they can bring over planeloads of their business associates at a fraction of the cost of a club membership in Japan. The money generated at these resorts goes back to Japan. Very little if any remains here to help our island economy. The menial tourist industry wages can in no way support island families with our high cost of living. On top of this the quality of life is deminished with the destruction of traditional recreational areas.

Development is not all bad, it provides jobs and housing for growing island famalies, but when the development proceeds at a pace that requires importing workers from off island, because there aren't enough people here to fill those jobs, it putsa strain on the island's infrastructure.

Golf courses require millions of gallons of water to stay green. In an area that has little rainfall it would make more sense to use that water to grow food crops so that island families would not have to pay the high cost of imported food. The roads in the Koloa-Poipu area are already over burdened. What about the additional trash generated by the proposed hotel at Shipwreck beach, with still others in the future. Our roads have been littered for months with junk cars and other trash; the only dump on the island is fast filling up. We should address these problems before new development is allowed. The Garden Island if fast becoming the Garbage Island.

If developers must develop to be happy, let them use their energy and resources to upgrade existing areas that have been allowed to deterioate; like the strip of stores along Kuhio hwy. in Lihue. Give them tax credits for refurbishing and major tax increases on new development. Since hotel development and tourism put the largest burden on the island, let them pay for it, after all they are profiting quite nicely, while homeowners and farmers are struggling to make ends meet.

We need affordable housing, schools, hospitals, roads, sewer treatment, etc. There can be profit in providing the things. Maybe not as much as buying cheap marginal lands and converting them into Mega Resorts, but how much profit does a man need to find happiness.

Unspoiled areas like Maha u'lepu are fast disappearing and must be preserved for future generations. Kaua'i has the opportunity to be an unspoiled paradise while the rest of Hawai'i disappears under concrete.

Let the people come here in the future and marvel at our natural beauty and at how the people of Kaua'i had the foresight to preserve it.

The Board of Directors of the Kauai Board of Realtors has adopted a resolution in favor of the golf course proposed by Ainako Associates to be constructed adjacent to the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Poipu.

As one member of the Board of Directors, I wanted to let the Planning Commission know some of the reasons behind the Board's formal expression of its opinion that the golf course is a proper and desirable use of this land.

Foremost is the strongly-held, conventional concept that is the very foundation of property ownership in the United States. This is the concept that private property carries with it a "bundle of rights". These rights are the right to use, the right to enjoy, and the right to dispose and encumber. The major limitation to those owner's rights is what is handed to our government. It is apparent that the limitations given to the government in this particular case are those related to zoning and special districts.

According to what I know of this case, there is no current zoning change required and the special district requirements are taken care of. The developer apparently has taken large and not required steps of redesigning the golf course improvements to take care of the concerns of people who actually have no right to this privately owned land.

It appears that the vocal minority who oppose the development do so as a rallying point for reasons not directly related to this development at all. I realize that no parcel of land is entirely separable from other land anywhere in the country, but to stop well conceived progress for this reason is a threat to the very foundation of private property ownership. I believe that, to deny the use of this land as the owner wishes would be a dangerous action and contrary to the highest interests of the majority of people in this Country, this State, and this Country.

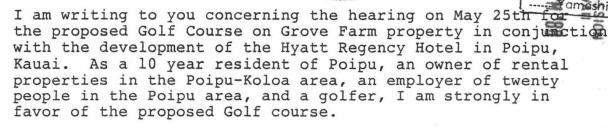

To the Forum:

I was interested (and somewhat disturbed) to read the letter in the April 4th Garden Island regarding the Hyatt Golf Course. It appears that, at least among some beople, there is still considerable misunderstanding of the Hyatt Golf Course proposal and a lack of appreciation of Grove Farm's contributions to Kauai.

The Golf Course itself extends from the Hyatt Hotel to the East. It does not extend to Gillan's Beach, however. At its closest point it is approximately 2,200 feet (almost half mile) from the drainage stream at the west end of Gillan's. The Golf Course is not in the Conservation District at all. Mel Ventura and Grove Farm, in response to community concerns, withdrew the application and resubmitted with a design which avoids the Conservation District entirely. The course is now in an area which is Agricultural District, and has been cultivated for many years. There should be no threatened or endangered species of plants or animals in the area because of years of sugar cultivation on it. Further, the developers do not want Urban Districting, so the threat of further urbanization based on this Golf Course is illusory.

The Golf Course itself will preserve shoreline open space, a cleaner and a much more beautiful environment than what presently exists.

The Golf Course proposal will provide a legal access to and along the shoreline that does not exist today. A shoreline trail will provide everyone a permanent access along the shoreline no matter who owns the property. Grove Farm has left the entire shoreline from Shipwreck's to Hauula Bay wide open to public use for many years. The public, for its part, has done a thorough job of abusing the land by stealing sand and rock, running motorcycles and 4-wheel drive vehicles over the delicate sand dunes, and leaving an extraordinary amount of trash. Grove Farm has not done what other landowners have done in this situation. They have left the land open. They have done this out of generosity, the same generosity which motivated Grove Farm to provide hundreds of acres of land for free to build Kauai Community College, the same generosity which prompted Grove Farm to initiate Wilcox Hospital, and the same generosity which motivated their recent substantial contribution to expansion of that Hospital. There are numerous other instances of Groves Farm's generosity as well.

There needs to be a recognition of the landowner's rights and past community spirit, there needs to be a rational evaluation of this Golf Course proposal. Reference is made to the above site plan being submitted to you for your consideration.

The Koloa Community Association called a general membership meeting early April allowing its membership an opportunity to review the original plans. At that meeting, a motion was passed that there should be no development beyond the present Hyatt site. A general concern was that the property from the approved Hyatt to the end of Mahaulepu be obtained and reserved as a public trust for the enjoyment of the people of Kauai which shall include all conservation areas to reflect what is being used today. However, we stated that should the Planning Commission elect to approve the original plans, the following concerns were to be considered:

- 1) That public paths of at least 8-10 feet wide be established along the coastline, marked and be recorded easements.
- 2) That public parking be established close to fishing access which are marked.
- 3) That additional 30 parking stalls be established for others to use near the club house. These should be marked.
- 4) That the sand dunes be preserved and obtained for natural park purposes and vehicular traffic prohibited.
- 5) That all flora and "fauna" deemed threatened be preserved.
- 6) That Kamaina rates be provided to holders of valid Hawaii Driver's License holders.
- 7) That archaeological studies locate and define sites for preservation.
- 8) That golf holes be realigned out of conservation district; in particular No. 14-17.

9) That dust control plans be strictly enforced.

10) That this property remain under agriculture zoning.

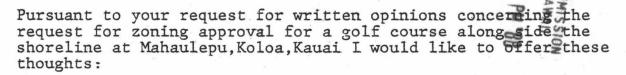
