


This letter provides the State Historic Preservation Division's (SHPD's) review of the draft archaeological inventory survey (AIS) report titled *Archaeological Assessment Report for the Hawaiian Cement New Mining Area Project, Pūlehunui Ahupua'a, Pū'ali Komohana Moku, Wailuku District, Maui*. TMKs: [2] 3-8-004:001 and 002 por. (Ueki et al., July 2025). SHPD previously reviewed the project following the submittal of a HRS 6E Submittal Form, a letter from the project proponent, a TMK map, aerial photographs of the project area, a map depicting the proposed project area, and a proposed archaeological inventory survey (AIS) testing plan prepared by Cultural Surveys Hawai'i, Inc. (CSH; Yucha, January 9, 2025; HICRIS Submission No: 2025PR00133.001). SHPD agreed with the testing strategy on April 9, 2025, via HICRIS and email notification. SHPD received the draft archaeological assessment (AA) report for review on September 18, 2025 (HICRIS Submission No: 2025PR00133.002).

Hawaiian Cement proposes to develop a new mining area adjacent to its current quarry, concrete batching, asphalt production, and concrete casting facility that operates as the Pu'unēnē Quarry. The project area consists of 125 acres. Ground disturbance associated with the proposed project will include the removal of soil deposits overlying bedrock across the entire project area.

CSH conducted 100% coverage pedestrian survey of the project area in January 2025, which was accomplished through systematic sweeps along 5-meter-interval transects across the project area. CSH conducted subsurface testing in April 2025, which included the excavation of forty backhoe test trenches distributed across the project area. No historic properties or subsurface cultural deposits were identified during the survey and no further historic preservation work is recommended for the project. The negative AIS findings were presented in an archaeological assessment. The AA report (Ueki et al., July 2025) includes summaries of historic land use practices and previous archaeological studies that have occurred in the vicinity of the project area. The results of the survey indicate that soil within the project area includes a modern agricultural plow zone surface (Ap horizon) overlying natural alluvial soil and

chemically eroded bedrock. Naturally deposited volcanic cinder was encountered in excavations near the northeastern boundary and in one excavation in the western portion of the project area.

SHPD requests the following minor revisions be included in the Final AA report:

1. Title page. Pūlehunui Ahupua'a and the project are located in Kula District, which is reflected in the background portion of the report, please revise Pū'ali Komohana Moku and Wailuku District to Kula here and where needed (Executive Summary) throughout.
2. Title page. Please revise the project TMK to (2) 3-8-004:001-002 por. here and where needed throughout.

The AA report (Ueki et al., July 2025) meets the requirements of HAR §13-276-5. **It is accepted.** Please send one hard copy, clearly marked Final, along with a text-searchable copy of the AIS report and a copy of this acceptance letter, to the Kapolei SHPD office, attention SHPD Library, and a second hard copy to the Maui SHPD office, attention April Greenberg. Also submit a text-searchable PDF copy of the Final AA report to HICRIS Project No. 2025PR00133 in response to SHPD's HICRIS request, and a PDF copy to: SHPD.Archaeology.Library@hawaii.gov.

Based on current information, SHPD's determination is "**No historic properties affected**" for the proposed project. Pursuant to HAR §13-284-7(e), when the SHPD agrees that the action will not affect any significant historic properties, this is the SHPD's written concurrence and the HRS Chapter 6E historic preservation review ends. The HRS Chapter 6E historic preservation review process is ended.

SHPD hereby notifies the County of Maui that the AA report (Ueki et al., July 2025) has been reviewed and accepted, and the permit issuance process may continue.

Please annotate on the construction plans: In the unlikely event that subsurface historic resources, including human skeletal remains, structural remains, cultural deposits, artifacts, sand deposits, or sink holes are identified during the demolition and/or construction work, cease work in the immediate vicinity of the find, protect the find from additional disturbance, and contact the State Historic Preservation Division, at (808) 692-8015.
