Good to see you folks again. 6 First order of business is the adoption of 7 the December 6th, 2012 meeting minutes. 8 Commissioners, do we have a motion to approve? 9 COMMISSIONER BIGA: So moved. 10 COMMISSIONER TEVES: Second. 11 VICE CHAIR McDONALD: The minutes have been 12. moved and seconded. Those all in favor? 13 COMMISSIONERS VOTING: "Aye". 14 VICE CHAIR McDONALD: Any opposed? 15 minutes are adopted. Executive Officer Orodenker can 16 you please cover the tentative meeting schedule for the Commissioners. 17 18 MR. ORODENKER: Thank you, Mr. Chair. 19 January 24th is our next meeting. It will once again 2.0 be here at this location for the Ko Olina Development 21 status report. Thursday, February 7th, we'll be on 2.2 Maui for the Ka'ono'ulu Ranch oral argument and 23 decision-making. 24 February 8th we'll be on Kaua'i for 25 Important Agricultural Lands Petition, site visit and

then the hearing.

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Then February 21st and 22nd we'll be on Maui for the Waiko Industrial Investment, LLC commencement of hearings. March 7th and 8th once again Waiko Industrial Investment on Maui.

VICE CHAIR McDONALD: Thank you,
Mr. Orodenker. At this time I'd like to entertain a
Motion to Amend the Agenda and go into executive
session to discuss some issues with our attorney.

COMMISSIONER MAKUA: Moved.

COMMISSIONER INOUYE: Second.

VICE CHAIR McDONALD: Moved and seconded.

At this time the Commission will go into executive session. I think if you folks could step outside,

give us a few minutes and Riley will come and gather you folks after the executive session.

VICE CHAIR McDONALD: We're back on the record. This is an action meeting on Docket No.

20 A12-795 West Maui Land, LLC to approve the form of the 21 order in this matter. Will the parties identify

22 themselves.

23 MR. GEIGER: Good morning, Chair 24 Commissioners. James Geiger on behalf of Petitioner. 25 With me is Heidi Bigelow, Petitioner's representative.

1 MR. GIROUX: Good morning. James Giroux on 2 behalf of the Department of Planning, County of Maui. 3 MR. YEE: Good morning. Deputy Attorney 4 General Bryan Yee on behalf of the Office of Planning. 5 With me is Rodney Funakoshi from the Office of 6 Planning. 7 MS. BOLOMET: Aloha. I'm Routh Bolomet 8 Intervenor and this is Clare Apana. 9 VICE CHAIR McDONALD: Thank you. Let me 10 update the record in this matter. On December 6, 2012 11 the Commission met in Kahului, Maui, Hawai'i and voted 12. to deny the petition for district boundary amendment in Docket No. A12-795. 13 14 Is there anyone in the audience who wishes 15 to provide public testimony at this time? Please come 16 forward. 17 CLARE APANA 18 being first duly sworn to tell the truth, was examined 19 and testified as follows: 20 VICE CHAIR McDONALD: Please state your 21 name, your address and proceed for the record. 22 THE WITNESS: Clare Apana. Wailuku, Maui. 23 VICE CHAIR McDONALD: Please proceed. 24 THE WITNESS: Thank you. I'm sorry. I was 25 told that there would not be any public testimony.

Thank you for the opportunity. An article came out recently in the Maui News which spoke about this Kahoma Project. The people who are doing the bringing it forth said they were perplexed about why it hasn't got through.

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I find that very interesting because as we went through all of these proceedings with the neighborhood and with Ms. Bolomet as Intervenors, there were so many things that were shown where this Project was done in the way that is not up to the standards of the laws of Hawai'i.

Even as it was pointed out so many times that the parts of this land are in land court — I know this is not your jurisdiction, but it just shows how many things are not yet done, how many things were done poorly to have an Archaeological Assessment with properties listed from a whole 'nother area, I mean all the way across Lahaina Town to the other side of it, like, at least seven miles away.

It just shows the work that was not done to prepare this application. And I was very surprised and happy to see that you Commissioners thought perhaps the same thing, that it was not adequately done, and it was not adequate to pass the standards of the state and of your body. And I hope that you will

uphold that.

And speaking personally I have seen the hard work that Ms. Bolomet and Michele Lincoln have done on their own without anything but their own passion for seeing that the right thing happens and protecting their land holdings.

And I hope that you will not prolong this. They do these things on their own with their own time without legal — without being able to afford legal counsel.

And I think your first decision, the decision you made, showed that this application was not adequate. And thank you for doing that.

I hope that you will allow Ms. Lincoln and Ms. Bolomet to go home and rest knowing that they have done their job. And I think they did a super job even though there were many times where they were definitely not knowing exactly what they were supposed to, what the laws are of this quasi-body.

So I thank you. I hope that you will uphold your decision. Thank you very much.

VICE CHAIR McDONALD: Thank you,

Ms. Apana. Any questions from the parties?

MR. GEIGER: No questions.

MR. GIROUX: No questions.

1 MR. YEE: No questions. 2 MS. BOLOMET: No questions. 3 VICE CHAIR McDONALD: Commissioners? 4 Anyone else in the audience wishing to provide public 5 testimony? Seeing none, Commissioners before you is the Form of the Order denying the Petition of this 6 Docket No. A12-795. Let me remind you, Commissioners, 8 that what we are voting on today is the actual Form of 9 the Order. So the Chair at this time will entertain a 10 motion to approve the form. 11 Excuse me, Chair, if I could. MR. GEIGER: 12. I do need to place on the record an objection. 13 behalf of the Petitioner we would object to the 14 Commission taking action because this would be in violation of HAR 15-15-82(b) and (c) in that we were 15 16 just served with the Proposed Findings of Fact, 17 Conclusions of Law, Decision and Order prepared by the 18 Commission today. And that doesn't comply with your 19 rules. 20 MR. GIROUX: County joins the objections. 21 MR. YEE: Just to explain. I believe the 22 objection is based upon the rule which says that if a 23 Commissioner proposes a Decision and Order the 24 parties' given three days to review the document.

I think the idea is that since this Order was prepared

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by the LUC, not sure exactly who, obviously, but it's presumably staff, that would effectively come within the ambit of the rule requiring or allowing the parties three days to review it.

This is normally — normally this doesn't occur because the parties are drafting the orders, and then you're just adopting some form of the order adopted by the parties. But apparently this case you're not adopting the order submitted by one of the parties but have drafted an entirely new document. I think that's the argument being presented to you.

MR. GEIGER: Chair, if I could, there's actually two arguments. 1. Any proposed findings, conclusions, decision and order prepared by a Commission member — in this case this is proffered by the Commission — has to be submitted at least seven days before the hearing or the meeting at which action will be taken on the proposed findings and conclusions.

The second part is that all the parties, each party can provide its position on the proposed findings, conclusions, at least three days before or within three days from the date of service of the proposed findings and conclusions.

MR. YEE: I stand corrected.

MR. GEIGER: There are actually two 1 2 timeframes both of which have not been met. 3 VICE CHAIR McDONALD: The Chair's going to 4 move for executive session at this time. 5 COMMISSIONER TEVES: Second. 6 (Recess was held. (9:34-10:50) 7 VICE CHAIR McDONALD: We're back on the 8 record. Mr. Geiger, your objections have been noted 9 for the record. Please understand that we, the 10 Commission, has voted on the substantive matter in 11 this Petition. Right now we're going to move forward 12. with the approval with a vote of the form of the 13 order. 14 MR. GEIGER: Just so the record is clear, 15 then, I understand that the Chair is denying or 16 overruling my objections, is that correct? 17 VICE CHAIR McDONALD: That's correct. 18 MR. GEIGER: Thank you. 19 VICE CHAIR McDONALD: Again, Commissioners, 20 before you is the form of the order denying the 21 Petition in this Docket No. A12-795.
