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2 CHAIRMAN ACZON: Thank you and good morning, 3 everyone.

Let me update the record:

On April 26, 2017, the Commission began its hearing on this Docket at the Lana'i Community Center, Lana'i City, Hawaii, and received written and public testimony from individuals whose names are on file.

On April 27, 2017, the parties made arguments on exceptions to the Hearing Officer's Recommended Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Decision and Order, which was adopted and treated as the Commission's Proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Decision and Order. After arguments on the exceptions were heard, deliberations on the matter ensued. A motion was duly made and seconded, and was carried to adopt the Proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Decision and Order with amendments. Further deliberation ensued. After deliberations concluded, the motion was passed by the Land Use Commission, 6-1-1, six in favor, one against, one recused, and one excused. There are currently eight seated Commissioners.

On May 22nd, 2017, the Commission mailed the May 31st, 2017 meeting agenda notice to the parties and those on the statewide and Maui County mailing lists.

Let me briefly run over our procedure for the 1 2 day. 3 First, I will first call for those desiring to provide public testimony for this docket to identify 4 5 themselves. All such individuals will be called in turn 6 to our witness box where they will be sworn in prior to 7 their testimony. 8 At the conclusion of the public testimony, the 9 Commission will conduct formal deliberations on this 10 matter. 11 Are there any questions on our procedure for 12 today? 1.3 Hearing none, are there any individuals desiring 14 to provide public testimony on this docket? 15 MR. KOPPER: If there's an opportunity -- if 16 there's no opportunity planned in the record for LSG to 17 make their comment, then I would like to do that for LSG. 18 But if there's opportunity then --19 CHAIRMAN ACZON: It depends on the content of 20 the comments so. 21 MR. KOPPER: In what way? 22 MS. ERICKSON: Public witnesses can make 23 comments, but the parties aren't going to be having 2.4 comments at this point. 25 MR. KOPPER: Well, then, if there's nothing

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planned, then I'd like to say objections at this time.

    LSG wasn't allowed to make comments at the last hearing
    while there were other parties who got to raise issues.

    So I'll do that now then first. So I believe, Chair

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              CHAIRMAN ACZON: We'll make sure you get a copy.

              MR. KOPPER: Thank you for that.
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I do object to any Commissioner voting on this matter that was not present at the last hearing. My understanding is that this vote is on the form of the Order to ensure that it accurately reflects what was voted on April 26 and April 27. So all due respect to Commissioner Mahi, he was not present there, and we would object to his vote.

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And finally, just one issue as to procedure that we were not allowed to raise at the last hearing. The last hearing was on the Hearing Officer's Decision and Order. And the Commission addressed every party's exceptions which were filed on the record and in detail one by one, except for Lana'ians for Sensible Growth. It is true that you looked at our objections to the Resort's exceptions side by side. But those don't cover all the issues that were raised in our exceptions.

So if you remember the history of the case, the reason we came back here is because LSG was not given a fair shake. They were not allowed to present all their evidence. And this --

CHAIRMAN ACZON: Mr. Kopper, I believe we went through one by one all those proposed --

MR. KOPPER: You did not. And the record reflects that. But you did not. Every other party, exceptions --

CHAIRMAN ACZON: As I remember, we went back again to cover that.

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MR. KOPPER: Okay. So what I recall, every other party had their exceptions go over one by one. We went on a break, and when we came back from break, Commissioners Wong and Chang said that they reviewed the exceptions on the break and they believed that we covered them.

Now, first of all, that's not possible because, again, our exceptions raise issues which were not discussed by any of the parties' exceptions or discussed by the Commission. But it was not covered one by one.

And second, when we returned from that lunch break, the Commission already had typed changes to the Order waiting for the Commission members. So before there was any discussion on LSG's actual exceptions -- not objections -- but exceptions, the changes were already typed out and on the Commission -- on the Commission's table.

So, you know, again, just like the last time, this is an issue of fairness. Contested case hearings, as the Appellate Court says, has to be fair to all parties, especially groups that act as the community's voice. So how is it fair to go through everyone else's exceptions, every party's legal arguments, but not ours, and just say,

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First of all, I just want to make a correction for the record on the voting. It should be five in favor, one recused and two excused.

Five in favor, one opposed and two excused. Okay.

Diane?

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MS. ERICKSON: In response to a couple of things that Mr. Kopper raised, I believe that, under Chapter 91, Commissioner Mahi is entitled to vote. I assume he is going to make a response when the Chair asks him to confirm that he has reviewed all the transcripts and the record. And as soon as he does that, then I believe he's entitled to vote.

The other thing that you had raised, Mr. Kopper, was something about a revised Decision and Order ready after lunchtime. What that was, was just a list of issues that the staff had put together that they thought had been covered by the Commission; for example, "add this item," "delete this item," things like that. So there was no revised Decision and Order at the last meeting.

CHAIRMAN ACZON: Commissioner Cabral.

COMMISSIONER CABRAL: And I'd also like to state that I'm hurt or offended, because, as I recall, I -- I felt that we all really tried to make the entire hearing, the entire situation, open to everybody. I know we all

read an enormous amount of information before we got 1 2 there. We had all of that information in front of us. took detailed notes on the different suggestions and 3 concerns that we, as Commissioners, had raised in that. 4 5 And I sort of take offense to the idea that we didn't 6 provide opportunity for consideration of all points. 7 Thank you. CHAIRMAN ACZON: Thank you, Commissioner Cabral. 9 MR. KOPPER: And I want to just say there's no 10 offense intended. To respond -- the response is just that 11 you never talked about our exceptions, and that's the only -- and you simply did not. Just our objections, but 12 1.3 our exceptions were never talked about. So that's what I 14 wanted to say, not any personal attacks or offense. But 15 our document was never reviewed on the record. 16 CHAIRMAN ACZON: Thank you, Mr. Kopper.

Since Mr. Kopper opened up the discussion, I want to give the parties at least two minutes to comment.

Mr. Kudo.

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MR. KUDO: You know, I believe that -- not to render any legal advice here, but I believe that any Commissioner is able to vote on any matter, so long as that Commissioner has reviewed the transcripts of the proceedings and is knowledgeable about the matters before himself or herself.

Secondly, in regard to exceptions, exceptions are filed by parties as -- either by way of it to improve upon a D&O, an anticipated D&O, or to object to an anticipated D&O. It is, in my opinion, not necessary for every single exception from any party to be discussed. I think that so long as the Commission has reviewed the exceptions and considered them in their deliberations, without even discussing the specifics, I think that is sufficient and -- because I don't -- I don't know of any legal requirement that every single exception that is filed has to be discussed, you know, back and forth between the Commission members before a decision is reached.

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And in addition, when you have opposition exceptions, opposing exceptions, generally, if the Commission is leaning toward an approval, to discuss the opposition issues ad infinitum might be counterproductive and not efficient use of the Commission's time since they're going in the other direction. So I would take issue with Mr. Kopper saying that this Commission is required to discuss every single exception from every party.

I have been to hearings where there has been no discussion of the exceptions, and Commission members, after review of all the pleadings and the exceptions, go

into deliberations and vote on a particular D&O. 1 2. So, with that, thank you. 3 CHAIRMAN ACZON: Thank you, Mr. Kudo. Mr. Hopper? 4 5 MR. HOPPER: I do not have much to add, 6 Mr. Chair, other than I do think that, as long as the 7 Commission did receive the exceptions from all the parties into the record and reviewed them, I think that that's 9 sufficient. As a matter of record, the Commission did hear 10 11 from all the parties. The parties had the opportunity to present the witnesses that they wanted and cross-examine 12 1.3 the witnesses presented by the other parties. So along 14 those lines, the County wouldn't have an objection in that 15 process. 16 CHAIRMAN ACZON: Thank you, Mr. Hopper. 17 Mr. Yee? 18 MR. YEE: Thank you. I join and agree with the 19 statements made previously by both your counsel as well as 20 Mr. Kudo and Mr. Kopper. I would only add, with respect to Mr. Kopper's request for a copy of the proposed 21 22 decision in this case, consistent with your practice over 23 at least the 10 years that I've been here, the Land Use

Commission has never provided those copies to the parties,

although there is a provision in the rules where one -- if

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- one Commissioner wanted to propose a Decision and Order, 1 2 that that document be made available to the parties. It has not been interpreted or applied when the proposals 3 from the Commission as a whole or from the staff on behalf 4 5 of the Commission as a whole. So none of the parties 6 received a copy of your -- of any proposed decision that 7 you would be approving today. We all received the 8 Hearings Officer's proposed decision. We all submitted 9 our exceptions, you considered those documents, and I 10 don't think that there's any -- and sorry -- and you also 11 went through the process that we would be following in adopting -- in your adoption of a final order, and no one 12 1.3 had any objections to your description of that process at 14 the time. 15 Finally, I just want to comment that it is my 16 recollection that the typed changes that were made after 17 the recess was simply putting into writing what was orally 18 discussed. So there was no decision made by a staff 19 member, no pre-decisions made for -- by anyone. It was 20 simply, you know, the articulation or the writing down of 21 what had already been discussed by the Commissioners so
