               The application basically was filed to coincide

    the zoning with the County General Plan designation.
17
    There are no current development plans on the books.
18
    major developments are being proposed for the near future.
19
    This application was merely or solely to be able to
20
    coincide the designation with our General Plan.

               Unfortunately, enrollment is declining.
22
              And my last point is that there were two major
23
    points of failure to agree with the Office of Planning and
2.4
    the applicants at our evidentiary hearing, which I believe
25
    have been resolved by stipulation. The first one was the
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Report. And there was a lot of back and forth about when would be an appropriate time to do that, and we have since stipulated that that will be done prior to development of a major project triggering an EA or EIS. So, in other words, when the community college is ready to come forth with a new building or any other plan for a major development, at that time, the TIAR will be updated. And of course, that is subject to your consideration.

The second area of failure to agree was relating to Puhi Cemetery, which parcel the State does not own, but the community college does occupy the property around that cemetery. And we have stipulated with the Office of Planning that, in the meantime, the school will agree to a buffer of 100 feet around the cemetery. And in fact, that was an easy stipulation because there are no plans for development anywhere near the cemetery. But in the interim, the college has agreed to a buffer. Nothing will occur within that area. And at the time when there are —when future plans come into being, where development will be proposed anywhere near that area, of course, we would have to come in with a plan.

So I believe that we have stipulated with the Office of Planning the only two major areas that were sort of left hanging at our last hearing.

               Secondly, for the Lihu'e Airport condition, we
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agreed, based on DOT comments, that Petitioner shall

conduct a glint and glare analysis for the proposed solar photovoltaic facility, subject to DOT comment and approval.

Thirdly, we agreed that, for Puhi Cemetery, in cooperation with the landowner, Grove Farms, Petitioner shall complete an archeological preservation plan for review and approval by SHPD, which shall include subsurface testing outside of the cemetery lot and shall determine whether a buffer area should be located on the KCC land. Until such time that the plan is prepared and approved by SHPD, no facility development or ground disturbance activities shall occur within a hundred feet of the perimeter of the cemetery.

Lastly, we agreed that an endangered species awareness program shall be developed to include information on the Endangered Species Act and protected species, specific restrictions on the job site to protect species, and protocols on how job site personnel will respond to any downed or injured endangered species that may occur on the site. These conditions are supported by the Findings of Fact, which include relevant State agency review and comments.

OP would like to also point out that, although the Petition Area was set to be amended to exclude

Parcel 6 of the TMK, through Petitioner testimony --
