CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Good morning. 1 2 is November 14th, 2018, Land Use Commission meeting 3 being conducted via video conference from network 4 meeting centers on Maui, Hawaii and Oahu. Our first order of business is the adoption 5 6 of the October 24th-25th, 2018 minutes. 7 Can you hear me, Hawai'i Island? VICE CHAIR CABRAL: Yes. 8 9 CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: I would note that I 10 did send in some non-substantive corrections to what 11 was electronically sent out correcting spelling on 12 certain names. 13 What we are approving is slightly different 14 than what you received, but not substantially. 15 COMMISSIONER ACZON: Move for approval. CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Commissioner Aczon 16 17 has moved to approve the minutes. Is there a second? 18 VICE CHAIR CABRAL: I'll second it. 19 CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Commissioner Cabral 20 has seconded. Any discussion? All in favor say 21 "aye". Any opposed? The minutes are adopted 22 unanimously. 23 Our next agenda item is the tentative 24 meeting schedule. Mr. Orodenker. 25 EXECUTIVE OFFICER: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

On November 28th, we will be in Kona for status report on HHFDC, Lanihau matter, and for continuation of the Waikoloa Mauka matter.

On the 29th, we will be on Maui for matters associated with -- several motions associated with Emmanuel Lutheran, and for adoption of the Hale Mua order.

On December 12th, we will be on Maui again for status report on Ka'ono'ulu Ranch.

On December 13th, we will be at Oahu
Airport, Honolulu, HNL, for Kapolei Harbor, Motion to
Amend.

We have no further meetings in December.

In January, January 9th, we will be having site visits on Oahu for a couple Waiehu motions.

January 23rd and 24th we will also be in

Honolulu for DR18-64 which is Important Land

Designation and another Oahu IAL Designation, if need

be, we'll hold hearings on Oahu, Honolulu Airport on

January 24th.

February 6th, we will be holding a meeting on Kaua'i for Kealia Properties. That meeting is also scheduled for February 7th.

On March 13th and 14th, we will be on Oahu at the airport for Hawai'i Memorial Park FEIS.

1 That takes us far enough.

2 CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Thank you, Dan.

Commissioners, are there any questions for the Executive Officer, Maui, Hawai'i, Oahu?

Our next agenda item is to consider the Land Use Commission rules amendment status and authorization to proceed with the amendments.

Mr. Orodenker, can you please provide the Commission with a status update on the progress of the amendments to the administrative rules and what remains to be done?

EXECUTIVE OFFICER: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

We have held hearings on all islands with regard to the proposed rule amendments. We have also received written testimony.

We received written testimony that indicated that -- I actually have to take responsibility for this error -- 15-15-93 was supposed to be amended to track the language from the Supreme Court decision in the Bridge Aina Le'a case with regard to "substantial commencement".

The language that is in the current draft of the rules says "substantial commencement of construction". The actual Supreme Court decision says "substantial commencement of use of the land."

1	Therefore, we are proposing to make that change to
2	the proposed amendments, and that will also require
3	us to hold hearings on all the other islands since
4	our attorney general has advised us that it's a
5	substantial change.
6	CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Thank you. Any
7	questions for Dan?
8	EXECUTIVE OFFICER: We would need
9	authorization to make that change and to hold
10	additional hearings.
11	CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: At this point I'm
12	going to call for any individuals desiring to give
13	public testimony. Mr. Arakawa. I'm going to swear
14	you in first.
15	Do you swear or affirm that the testimony
16	you're about to give is the truth?
17	THE WITNESS: The whole truth, nothing but
18	the truth. Yes, I do.
19	CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Please state your
20	name and address for the record and proceed.
21	DAVID ARAKAWA
22	Was called as a public witness, was sworn to tell the
23	truth, was examined and testified as follows:
24	DIRECT EXAMINATION
25	THE WITNESS: David Arakawa, Executive

Director of Land Use Research Foundation testifying on behalf of LURF, 1100 Alakea Street, Suite 408, Honolulu, Hawai'i 96813.

At the risk of bearing the lead, I have two preliminary matters. First is the notification of Land Use Commission meetings. It's great and, you know, we support and commend the LUC for having these teleconferences, so that's fantastic.

But in the agenda notice that went out, I wasn't sure where the meeting was, so I went to the State Office Tower, and I know another Commissioner went to another location. So I finally figured out that it would be at the Kalanimoku Building, but it's not stated in the notice. So maybe future notices up top you can say where the actual physical meeting will be so people will know, then keep the same information as to the video conferencing. That's a great idea that the LUC is going forward with.

The second comment, again, bearing the lead, is notice of public hearing. The notice of public hearing that's dated November 2, 2018, there's a sentence at the bottom of the first page that says, "comments or testimony will be restricted solely to the proposed amendment and not to the benefit/disadvantages of the underlying program".

So we're not really clear what that is.

And sometimes Native Hawaiian practitioners want to give oli or give testimony, you know, through song or verse or whatever. So we're not sure whether that would restrict that kind of testimony at the hearing.

We're not sure what that sentence means.

So perhaps -- I don't even know if it's necessary -- but perhaps some explanation of how your testimony could be restricted by the Commission would be good. We're not sure what that sentence means.

So we'll probably, before the December hearings, be asking for clarification of exactly what that sentence means.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: If you wanted to offer an oli, Mr. Arakawa, I would be certainly happy to allow it.

THE WITNESS: I've been present at many commissions and many meetings where people have given that and they haven't been stopped, so I'm wondering whether this Commission would stop that kind of presentation based on that sentence, right? So can you tell me what it means?

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Why don't we just continue with your testimony.

THE WITNESS: I would have expected that

the Chair would be able to explain it, but anyway, our testimony is consistent with what the Executive Officer has talked about, the difference in language between the Supreme Court case and the HRS which uses "substantial commencement of the use of the land" in accordance with the representation to the Commission.

And substantial commencement with the use of the land is an important term, and we're very happy and glad that the Commission is going to go back and change that language. Substantial construction may not be the correct term, because if it is Ag to Conservation or Conservation to Ag, there will be no construction, right? So, that -- and that is not a term that is used in the HRS and that's not a term used by the Supreme Court.

The LUC's index of proposed changes refers to "substantial compliance", so that's yet another term. So perhaps in a future index of proposed changes the Land Use Commission AG's could clean that up to -- because it adds another term that is not defined or not addressed in the HRS or the Bridge Aina Le'a decision.

So that's in your index of proposed changes which is on the website and describes the changes.

And the third and probably final -- not

final thing, but the third issue is that the rules, the changes in the rules appear to be based on a mere footnote in the Aina Le'a decision, a footnote in the Aina Le'a decision, and that's okay.

But we would argue and will be submitting testimony urging the Commission to make further rules that actually addressed the important parts of the Bridge Aina Le'a decision, and the legislative intent of the HRS 205-4(g).

So instead of just taking that mere footnote, which is okay, you know, use the other parts of the LUC decision, the important parts of the LUC decisions to help direct not only the Commission but the public in how the Commission will address issues where, you know, they have to revoke or rescind a land use boundary amendment based on failure to substantially commence the use of the land in accordance with the Petitioner's representation to the Commission.

And the last point that we wanted to make is that perhaps the Commission could consider some way of working with stakeholders. Affected stakeholders in this case would be the landowners, counties and maybe other interested parties.

The OEQC does a very good job of that in

the rules, and we have been part of that process, so we would encourage the LUC to do the same.

In the past the LUC has gone out and done outreach to affected stakeholders. In this case we would urge them to do so, because if they did so, you folks probably wouldn't have to go out for a second round of hearings.

8 CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Thank you very much,
9 Mr. Arakawa.

Commissioners, are there any questions for Mr. Arakawa? Starting with Maui.

COMMISSIONER OHIGASHI: No question.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Hawai'i Island?

VICE CHAIR CABRAL: No questions.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Oahu?

COMMISSIONER ACZON: No.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Thank you very much.

THE WITNESS: Just as a note, in working with the Mr. Orodenker and LUC staff, they've been very cooperative. They return phone calls and talk to us. So we don't mean this to be any slight on them.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Understood. Thank you very much.

Are there any other individuals wishing to

provide public testimony on this agenda item? 1 none of the counties are here. Office of Planning? 2 3 MR. FUNAKOSHI: No. CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Commissioner Cabral? 4 VICE CHAIR CABRAL: We have with us county 5 6 representatives both Ron and Darrow. 7 MR. KIM: Good morning. Present on Hawai'i Island, Deputy Corporation Counsel Ron Kim along with 8 Jeff Darrow from the Planning Department. 9 10 VICE CHAIR CABRAL: We have a public member 11 also. 12 MS. TUMMONS: Pat Tummons, Environment 13 Hawai'i. 14 CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Thank you. 15 Can I just clarify. Is there anybody on Hawai'i Island wishing to testify on the agenda item 16 17 relating to the rule amendments? 18 VICE CHAIR CABRAL: None present. 19 CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Thank you. So I will entertain a motion for LUC Executive Officer and 20 21 staff to move forward on hearings and other 22 preparations to have the rule amendments adopted. 23 COMMISSIONER ACZON: So moved. 24 COMMISSIONER MAHI: So seconded. 25 CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Commissioner Aczon

moved to authorize the LUC Executive Officer and staff to move forward on hearings and other preparations, and Commissioner Mahi has seconded the motion.

Is there any discussion on the motion?

Maui or Hawai'i, I just want to make sure that I'm not missing you. Any discussion?

COMMISSIONER OHIGASHI: No discussion.

VICE CHAIR CABRAL: Chairman, yes. I would like to thank our last public testifier -- sorry for names -- because I appreciate that it's a really complex matter, and clearly we're trying to get better the use of words to describe our rights, that's really a complicated matter. And I appreciate -- we hopefully are getting -- change will clarify and make things better with the understanding that they may be able to be found better in the future, but for now at least this will be an improvement.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Thank you.

Commissioners, any other discussion?

Hearing none, all in favor say "aye". Any

opposed? The motion carries.

Our next agenda item is to consider a motion to correct the September 6, 2018 meeting

transcript. Let me update the record.

It was brought to the attention of the Commission by public witness Cindy Kester via email on October 19th, 2018, that an error in the transcript for the September 6th, 2018 meeting in Kailua-Kona for Docket A06-767 Waikoloa Highlands had been discovered.

On the same date, Land Use Commission staff notified court reporter Jean McManus via email that there might be an error in the transcript of Ms.

Kester's reading of Julia Aslo's testimony of that day on page 13, line 21.

The sentence which reads, "roundabout has now been constructed" needs to be corrected to "roundabout has not been constructed".

Also on October 19th, our court reporter

Jean McManus reviewed her recording and confirmed via

email that an error had been made and that the word

quote, "not" end quote, was correct and the written

testimony reads correctly, and the transcript needed

to be corrected to match.

On November 5th, today's meeting agenda today was mailed to the Statewide, Oahu and Hawai'i mailing list designating agenda item V for the Commission to consider an action motion to correct

1 the transcript accordingly.

Is there anybody who wishes to provide public testimony on this agenda item? Not seeing anybody on Oahu, and there's no one other than Commissioner Ohigashi on Maui, does anyone on Hawai'i Island wish to provide testimony on this item? Seeing none.

Commissioners, is there anyone who desires to make a motion?

COMMISSIONER MAHI: I'll move.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Commissioner Mahi has moved to make the correction. Is there a second?

COMMISSIONER ACZON: Second.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Commissioner Aczon has seconded the motion. Is there any discussion on the motion? Hearing none, all in favor say "aye".

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Commissioner Cabral?

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Commissioner Cabral,

I believe we will actually need you to participate in
this for the motion to carry.

VICE CHAIR CABRAL: Okay. I approve then based on all of my learned colleague's knowledge.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Commissioner Cabral,

have you understood the correction to be made? 1 2 VICE CHAIR CABRAL: Yes, I do understand 3 the correction. And I have read those minutes and I 4 understand that the missing word makes a significant 5 difference, so it was just an honest mistake, so I will approve that change. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: And you're comfortable with making a vote on this? 8 VICE CHAIR CABRAL: Yes, I am. 9 10 CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Thank you. It's been 11 unanimously passed. Commissioner Aczon. 12 COMMISSIONER ACZON: I want to move for 13 executive session. 14 COMMISSIONER MAHI: Second. 15 CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: There's been a motion 16 made by Commissioner Aczon to go into executive 17 session, and there is a second by Commissioner Mahi. Is there any discussion on the motion? 18 19 MS. TUMMONS: There has to be a reason 20 stated for the executive session. 21 COMMISSIONER ACZON: Sorry about that. 22 want to make a motion to go into executive session to 23 discuss matters regarding Waikoloa.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: The motion has been amended to state that Commissioner Aczon moves to go

into executive session to discuss matters related to
the current Waikoloa Mauka docket in front of us.

MS. SUMMONS: I don't think that's sufficient. I think there has to be a reference to the statute.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: I'm going to take a five-minute recess.

(Recess taken.)

We're back on the record. Commissioner Aczon, could you restate your motion, please?

COMMISSIONER ACZON: I would like to make the motion to go into executive session to discuss matters regarding Waikoloa with our counsel.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Our attorney general says that's good enough.

COMMISSIONER MAHI: Second.

CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: Sorry to the folks in Hawai'i Island. I understand the frustration that you're experiencing, but I don't believe we procedurally have a chance at this point in the agenda for a member of the public to opine on the appropriateness of our motion.

So there has been a motion made and seconded to go into executive session to discuss the Commission's powers and duties specifically as

related to the Waikoloa Mauka docket and seconded. All in favor say "aye". Any opposed? We are going into executive session. (Executive session.) CHAIRPERSON SCHEUER: The last item of business, since our November 28th and 29th meeting are going to be held in remote locations and appear to require a working lunch to complete the scheduled items for each day, I'm going to direct staff to arrange for meals to facilitate the meeting and accommodate the Commission's needs. There being no further business, I'm going to adjourn this meeting. Thank you all. (The proceedings adjourned at 10:12 a.m.)
