We're 16 17 going to limit your timeframe to three minutes. 18 DWIGHT VICENTE 19 Was called as a public witness, was sworn to tell the 20 truth, was examined and testified as follows: 21 DIRECT EXAMINATION 22 MR. VICENTE: Good morning. My name is

The lands we are dealing with was not ceded in 1898 by the Banana Republic of Hawai'i. The only

Dwight Vicente representing the Hawaiian Kingdom.

lands ceded was the 1 million, 750,000 acres which became the Territory of Hawai'i in 1900, and was rebranded -- the crown government land was rebranded as Hawaiian Home Lands in 1920; and in 1959 it became the State of Hawai'i/Hawaiian Homes by compact.

The Commission was designed, I think, I believe in 1955, that was to use their power over the land that was not ceded. It's over 2 million acres. Under King Kalakaua the leases was bumped up from three to five years to 25 years. That would bring it up to about 1915. That's why I did not include it as ceded lands.

So the lands properly belong under the jurisdiction of the Hawaiian Kingdom. The Commission cannot be created to use their powers beyond the limits of what was actually ceded by the Banana Republic of Hawai'i. Why they call it the Banana Republic, you got to remember, the United States, the reciprocity, the treaty between King Kalakaua and the U.S. president in 1875 was not signed by either King Kalakaua or the U.S. president. So the treaty was invalid. Instead, they had three U.S. citizens doing the treaty. So the U.S. became illegal in this Kingdom from 1875 to the present day.

So these lands cannot be under the control

of U.S. government, the State of Hawai'i, and even the County of Hawai'i, because these lands are not included in 1898, the so-called ceded lands. So the Commission cannot do either take it out of Agriculture, or put it back to Urban and put it back in into Agriculture because the Commission has no authority outside of the 1 million, 750,000 acres.

So these lands are still under the jurisdiction of the Hawaiian Kingdom, and it's a political question for the Hawaiian Kingdom what to do with these 2 million-plus acres.

With that, I'll reserve the rights of the Kingdom under the Queen's protest of January 17, 1893. It has yet to make its way to the U.S. Supreme Court, Article 3, Section 2, Clause 2, original but limited jurisdiction.

And the other one is the 1898 joint resolution. The joint resolution is based on Article 4, Section 3, Clause 2 of the U.S. Constitution, which they claim was the 1 million, 750,000 acres was incorporated under, no amendment, Mulberry versus Madison.

And the other one is the 1875 Reciprocity

Treaty which King Kalakaua and the U.S. President did

not sign. And you can go all the way back to 1820,

the U.S. President Monroe appointed John C. Jones as 1 2 the agent for the U.S., and he was discharged of the 3 missionary family and U.S. Navy, which was sent here 4 to do what the colonial policy. Thank you. PRESIDING OFFICER CABRAL: Anyone else like 5 6 to provide public testimony? Any questions? Any 7 questions of our speaker? Thank you.
